
2.4G Remote Control Off-Road Car User Manual

1. Know your remote control



2. Installing batteries and pairing the Controller




Pairing Instructions:

Turn on the remote control. At this time, the light will flash. Turn on the RC car. The remote light will stay on, indicating that the pairing is complete.

The remote uses 2x1.5V "AA" batteries (batteries not included)

3. Driving with the remote control



1. Forward Push the left and right control levers upward, the RC car moves forward

2. Backward Push the left and right control levers downward, the RC car Backward
