# Your phone

### **Keys and connectors**







#### OK key

- Press to confirm an option.
- Press to access the App Menu from the Home screen.

#### **Navigation Ring**

From the Home screen, use the **Navigation Ring** to perform shortcut functions.

- Press Up to access the Settings.
- Press Down to access the Recent Apps.
- Press Left to access the Clock.
- Press Right to access the Calculator.

#### Messages key

• Press to access the **Messages**.



#### Back/Clear key

- Press to return to the previous screen, close a dialog box, or exit a menu.
- Press to delete characters when in Edit mode.



#### Call/Answer key

- Press to dial or answer an incoming call.
- Press to enter the **Call Log** from the Home screen.



#### End/Power key

- Press to end a call or return to the Home screen.
- · Press and hold to power on/off.



### **Getting started**

### Setup


#### Removing or attaching the back cover

- 1. Gently remove the back cover via the notch at the bottom left corner.
- 2. Reattach the back cover, pressing firmly on the sides to ensure the cover snaps back into place.




#### Removing or installing the battery

- 1. Insert a fingernail into the small slot and gently pull up to remove the battery.
- Insert the battery, making sure the gold contacts align. Gently push down on the battery until it clicks into place.



#### Inserting or removing the Nano SIM card and microSD™ card

- To insert a Nano SIM or microSD card, push the Nano SIM or microSD card into the corresponding card slot with the gold-connectors facing down.
- 2. To remove the Nano SIM or microSD card, push down the plastic clip and pull the Nano SIM or microSD card out.





Your phone only supports Nano SIM cards. Attempting to insert a Mini or Micro SIM card may damage the phone.

#### Charging the battery

Insert the Type-C USB cable into the phone's charging port and plug the charger into an electrical outlet.





To reduce power consumption and energy waste, disconnect your charger when the battery is fully charged and switch off Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and other wireless connections when they are not in use.

#### Powering your phone on

Press and hold the **End/Power** key until the phone powers on.

If a SIM card is not installed, you will still be able to power your phone on, connect to a Wi-Fi network, and use some device features. You will not be able to make calls using your network without a SIM card.

If screen lock is set up, enter your PIN or Password to access your phone.

Note: Store your PIN or Password in a safe place that you can access without your phone. If you do not know your PIN or Password or have forgotten it, contact your service provider. Do not store your PIN or Password on your phone.

#### Setting up your phone for the first time

- 1. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select a language and press the **OK** key to confirm. Press the **Left Select** key to enable Readout function. Press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 2. View the important notifications on network data usage. You can press the **Right Select** key to continue to the next screen after 3 seconds.
- 3. Use the Navigation Ring to select a Wi-Fi network. Press the OK ok key and enter the password (if needed), then press the Right Select key to connect. When connected, press the Right Select key to continue to the next screen. If you do not want to connect to a network, press the Right Select key to skip.
- 4. Use the **Navigation Ring** to scroll down to set date, time, timezone, and time format. Press the **Right Select** key to continue.

Note: Use network-provided time and Automatic time zone are not available without a Wi-Fi connection.

5. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select the network you prefer to use and press the **OK** or key to confirm. Press the **Right Select** key to continue.

6. Setup is complete. Press the **Right Select** key to go to the Home screen.

#### Powering your phone off

Press and hold the **End/Power** key, then select **Power Off**.

#### **Quick settings and Notification panel**

To access the quick settings and notifications, press the **Left Select** key from the Home screen.

- Select a setting to enable or disable it.
- Select a notification to view details and perform further operations.

### **Changing Home screen wallpaper**

- 7. From the Home screen, press the **OK** ok key to access the App Menu. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select **Settings** .
- 8. Use the Navigation Ring to select Display > Wallpaper. Choose from Gallery, Camera, or Wallpapers.
  - Gallery: Choose a photo from the Camera Gallery.
  - Wallpapers: Choose from a variety of high-quality wallpapers.
- 9. When choosing a photo from the **Gallery**, use the **Navigation Ring** to select the photo you would like to use. Press the **OK** or key to view the photo. Then press the **Right Select** key to access the options menu and select **Set picture as**. Finally select the screens you want this photo to be set as.
- 10. When browsing the **Wallpapers** gallery, use the **Navigation Ring** to select the wallpaper image you want to use. Press the **OK** key to select the screens you want this photo to be set as.
- 11. Your new wallpaper will be displayed on the Home screen.

### **Using Navigation**


The **Navigation Ring** is located above the number pad and frames the **OK** ok key.

- Press Up, Down, Left, or Right on the Navigation Ring to navigate the screen.
- From the Home screen, press the **OK** ox key to access the App Menu.
- From other screens, press the OK OK key to make a selection.

#### **Navigation Ring shortcut functions**

From the Home screen, use the **Navigation Ring** to perform shortcut functions.

- Press Left to access the Clock.
- Press Right to access the Calculator.
- Press Up to access the Settings.
- Press Down to access the Recent Apps.



## **Entering texts**

- When entering text, press the key to switch between Abc (Sentence case), ABC (Caps lock), abc (Lower case), 123 (Numbers), or Predictive (Predictive text mode).
- For normal text input, press a number key (2-9) repeatedly until the desired character is displayed.
- To quickly enter a number, press and hold the corresponding number key.
- To insert a punctuation mark or special character, press the key, then select a character and press the OK key.
- To use Predictive text mode, press the key and enter the characters.
   Use the Navigation Ring to select the correct word. Press the OK ox key to confirm.
- To delete characters, press the Back/Clear key once to delete one character at a time, or press and hold to delete the entire message.





# Call Log

### Making a call

Dial a number using the keypad. Press the **Back/Clear** key to delete incorrect digits. Press the **Call/Answer** key to place the call. To hang up the call, press the **End/Power** key, or close the phone.

#### Calling a contact

To make a call from the **Contacts** app, select the contact you would like to call and press the **Call/Answer** key. Choose from a voice call or a Real-Time Text (RTT) call, and press the **OK** key to place the call.

#### Making international calls

To dial an international call, press and hold the key to enter "+" in the dial screen, then enter the international country prefix followed by the phone number. Press the Call/Answer key to place the call.

#### Making emergency calls

To make an emergency call, dial the emergency number and press the **Call/Answer** key. This works even without a SIM card, but requires network coverage.

### Answering or declining a call

Press the **OK** or the **Call/Answer** key to answer.

Press the **Right Select** key or the **End/Power** key to decline. To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press up or down on the **Volume** key at the side of your device.

### **Call options**

During a call, the following options are available:

- Press the Left Select key the mute the microphone.
- Press the OK OK key and select Speaker to use the external speakers during the call. Select Phone to turn the speaker off.
- Press the Right Select key to access the following options:
  - Add call: Dial another number and make another call. The current call will be placed on hold.
  - Hold call: Place the current call on hold. To resume the call, press the Right Select key again and select Unhold call.
  - Switch to RTT: Switch the call to a Real-Time Text call.

### Call waiting

If you receive a call during another call, press the **Call/Answer** key to answer or the **End/Power** key to decline. You can also press the **Right** select key to access **Options** and select **Answer**, **Decline**, or **Quick** message. Answering the incoming call will put the current call on hold.

### Calling your voicemail

Press and hold the key to set up voicemail or listen to your voicemail.

Note: Contact your network operator to check service availability.



### Using the Call Log

- To access the Call Log, press the Call/Answer key from the Home screen.
- Press the OK ok key to call a selected number.
- From the Call Log screen, press the Right Select key to view the following options:
  - Call details: View more information about the call(s) from the selected number. Press the **Right Select** key to delete the call entry.
  - Send a message: Send an SMS or MMS message to the selected number.
  - Create new contact: Create a new contact with the selected number.
  - Add to a contact: Add the selected number to an existing contact.
  - Block number: Block the selected number.
  - Edit call log: Delete the selected calls from your Call Log, or clear your phone call history.
  - Settings: Adjust call settings.


Answer options	Set <b>OK key</b> or <b>Flip open</b> as an answering method.
Sounds and vibration	Adjust call and ringtone volume, change your alert tones, activate Do Not Disturb, and more.
Quick responses	Edit or create quick response text messages.
Calls	Set call forwarding, call barring, and more.
<b>Blocked numbers</b>	Manage numbers and contacts you have blocked.
Voicemail	Set up voicemail, manage notifications, and more.
Accessibility	Configure RTT settings, enable or disable hearing aid compatibility, and enable or disable noise reduction.



### Contacts

The **Contacts** 📘 app provides quick and easy access to your contacts.

To access Contacts, press the **Right Select** key from the Home screen, or press the **OK** key from the Home screen and select **Contacts** from the App Menu.

### Adding a contact

- From the Contacts screen, press the Left Select key to add a new contact.
- You can choose to save your new contact to the Phone memory or SIM card memory.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select information fields and enter the contact information.
- 4. Press the **Right Select** key to save your contact.

### Editing a contact

- 1. From the Contacts screen, select the contact you would like to edit.
- 2. Press the **Right Select** key to access options.
- 3. Select Edit and make the desired changes.
- 4. Press the **Right Select** key when finished to save your edits, or press the **Left Select** key to cancel and exit the Edit Contact screen.

### **Deleting a contact**

- 1. From the Contacts screen, select the contact you would like to delete.
- 2. Press the **Right Select** key to access options, then select **Delete**.
- 3. Press the **OK OK** key to delete the contact.

### Sharing a contact

- 1. From the Contacts screen, select a contact you want to share.
- 2. Press the **Right Select** key to access **Options**, then select **Share**. You can share the contact's vCard via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.

### Contact settings

From the Contacts screen, press the **Right Select** key to access options and select **Menu** > **Settings**.

# Messages

Use the **Messages** app to send and receive text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

To access Messages, press the **Messages** key on the keypad or press the **OK** key from the Home screen and select **Messages** from the App Menu.

### Sending a text (SMS) message

- From the Messages screen, press the Left Select key to write a new message.
- 2. Enter the phone number of the recipient in the **To** field at the top of the screen or select from the saved Contacts.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select and press the **OK** key to confirm.
- 4. Use the **Navigation Ring** to scroll down to access the text bar and type your message.
- 5. Press the **Left Select** key to send the message.
  - An SMS message of more than 145 characters will be sent as multiple messages. Certain characters may count as 2 characters.

### Sending a multimedia (MMS) message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, contacts, and sounds.

- 1. When writing a message, press the **Right Select** key to access the options list and select **Add attachment**.
- 2. Select to add an attachment from Camera, Gallery, Contact, or Recorder.
- 3. Select a file and follow the prompts to attach the file to the message.
- 4. Press the **Left Select** key to send the message.

Note: An SMS message will be converted to MMS automatically when media files are attached or e-mail addresses are added in the **To** field.

### Message settings

From the Messages screen, press the **Right Select** key to access options and select **Settings**.

- Outgoing message sounds: Enable or disable sounds when sending messages.
- Notifications: Enable or disable notification icons when messages are received.
- Sound: Choose your messaging audio alert. This can only be accessed when Notifications are enabled.
- Vibrate: Enable or disable vibration when receiving messages. This can only be accessed when Notifications are enabled.

Menu	Description
Group messaging	Enable or disable the ability to send MMS messages to multiple recipients in a group.
Your phone number	View the phone number on the SIM card. If the number cannot be retrieved from the SIM card, it will need to be added manually.

Roaming auto- retrieve	Automatically download incoming MMS messages when roaming.

### E-Mail

Compose, send, and receive e-mails with the **E-Mail** app.



- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** or key to access the App Menu and select **E-Mail**. The e-mail wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an e-mail account.
- 2. Enter your email address and press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 3. Select your account type and press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 4. Enter the email password and press the **Right Select** key to continue.
- 5. Check the email details and confirm by pressing the **Right Select** key.
- Once complete, you will be able to access your email account from this device.

### Writing and sending e-mails

- From the E-Mail inbox, press the Left Select key to compose a new e-mail.
- Enter the recipient(s) e-mail address(es) in the To field, or press the Right Select key to add a contact.

- 3. When in the **Subject** or **Message** field, press the **Right Select** key to add CC/BCC, or add an attachment to the message.
- 4. Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5. Press the **Left Select** key to send the message immediately. To send the e-mail at another time, press the **Right Select** key and select **Save as draft** or **Cancel**.




### Camera

Take photos and record videos with the **Camera** 🍨 app.

#### **App Permission**

Upon first use of the Camera, you will be asked for permission to know your location. Press the **Right Select** key for **Allow** or the **Left Select** key for **Deny**.



### Taking a photo

- To access the Camera, press the OK ox key from the Home screen to access the App Menu and select Camera .
- 2. Position the camera so that the subject of the photo is in view. Press up or down on the **Navigation Ring** to zoom in or out.
- 3. Press the **OK** or the **Camera** key at the right side of the device to take the photo. Photos are automatically saved to the Gallery app.
- 4. Press the **Left Select** key to view your photo.

### Shooting a video

- From the Camera screen, use the Navigation Ring to switch to the Video mode.
- 2. Press up or down on the **Navigation Ring** to zoom in or out.
- Press the OK ok key or the Camera key at the right side of the device to record a video.
- 4. Press either key again to stop the recording. Videos will be automatically saved to the Gallery app.

### Camera settings

From the Camera screen, press the **Right Select** key to access the options.


- **Self Timer**: Select a 3 or 10 second delay after pressing the **OK** key.
- Picture size: Set the photo quality and aspect ratio.



# Gallery

View and organize your photos in one location with the **Gallery** \_\_\_ app.

- From the Home screen, press the OK ok key to access App Menu and select Gallery \_\_\_\_\_.
- 2. Select an album to view pictures or videos.



# Album options

From the selected album screen, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- **Share**: Share the selected photo or video via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- Select Multiple: Select multiple photos or videos in the album to delete or share.
- Delete: Delete the selected photo or video.

## Individual photo options

When viewing an individual photo in the album, press the **Left Select** key to access zoom screen, then press the **Left Select** key to zoom in and press the **Right Select** key to zoom out.

When viewing an individual photo in the album, press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:

- Edit: Adjust the exposure, rotate, crop, add filters, and apply borders to the selected photo. When done, press the Right Select key to save.
- Set picture as: Set the selected photo as your phone wallpaper.
- Details: View the file name, saved location, date taken, and size.
- Share: Share the selected photo/video via E-Mail, Messages, or Bluetooth.
- Delete: Delete the selected photo/video.



# Music

Use the **Music** app to play music files stored on your phone. Music files can be downloaded from your computer to your phone using a USB cable.

To access the your music, press the **OK** key from the Home screen and select **Music** from the App Menu.

# Listening to a song

- From the Music screen, use the Navigation Ring to select the Artists, Albums, Songs, or Playlists tab.
- 2. Select the artist, album, or song you wish to hear.
- 3. Press the **OK** ok key to play the selected song.

- 2. Enter the web address and press the **OK OK** key.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Ring** to move the cursor on the screen and press the **OK** ok key to click.
- 4. Press the **Right Select** key to access the following options:
  - Refresh: Reload the website.
  - Stop: Stop loading the website.
  - Home: Go to the homepage.
  - Save to bookmarks: Add the current website to your bookmarks.
  - Close: Minimize or quit the current website.
  - Share page: Share the current website address via Bluetooth or Messages.
  - Bookmarks/History: View the bookmarks or browse history.
  - Request desktop site: View the desktop version of this page on mobile.
  - Settings: Select options to customize the browser.

# Calendar

Use the **Calendar** app to keep track of important meetings, events, appointments, and more.

To access the Calendar, press the **OK** ok key from the Home screen and select **Calendar** from the App Menu.

# Using multimode view

You can display the Calendar in Day, Week, or Month View. Press the **Right Select** key to change your Calendar view.







# Creating a new event

- 1. From any Calendar view, press the **Left Select** key to add new events.
- Fill in the event information, such as event name, location, start and end dates, and more.
- 3. When finished, press the **Right Select** key to save.

# **Useful options**

From any Calendar view, press the **Right Select** key to view the following options:

- View: Display the Calendar in Day, Week, or Month View.
- Go to date: Select a date to go to in the Calendar.
- Refresh: Refresh the Calendar.
- Search: Search your scheduled events.
- Clear events: Clear your events.
- Settings: Adjust Calendar settings.



# myAT&T

Manage your account, pay your bill online, and more with the myAT&T app.

To access myAT&T, press the **OK** or key from the Home screen and select myAT&T from the App Menu.



# **Tools**

Access the FM Radio, File Manager, Sound Recorder, Calculator, Clock, and Device Unlock from the Tools folder.

To access the Utilities folder, press the **OK** or key from the Home screen and select **Tools** from the App Menu.

# **FM Radio**

- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** OK key to access the App Menu.
- 2. Use the Navigation Ring oto select Tools > Clock = ...
- You must plug in a wired headset (sold separately) into the phone to use the radio. The headset works as an antenna for your phone.
- 3. Press the **OK** ok key to turn on FM Radio.
- Press the Left Select key to search local radio stations. Favorite stations will have a star added and will be displayed in the Stations list for easy access.
- 5. From the Favorites screen, press left or right on the **Navigation Ring** to tune the station by 0.1MHz.
- 6. Press the Right Select key to access options. From here, you can select Add to favorites to add the current status to your favorites list, and you can select Switch to speaker to switch from the headphone mode to speaker mode.

# File Manager

Manage your files with the File Manager 📑 app.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** ox key to access the App Menu.
- 2. Use the Navigation Ring oto select Tools > File Manager :
- 3. You can manage your files from the Internal memory or the SD Card.

# Sound Recorder

Use the **Sound Recorder** 👤 app to record audio.

# Recording audio

- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** ox key to access the App Menu.
- 2. Use the Navigation Ring  $\square$  to select Tools  $olimits_{\square} >$  Sound Recorder  $olimits_{\square} = 1
  olimits_{\square} = 1
  olimits_{\square}$
- Press the OK OK key to begin recording. Press the OK OK key again to pause the recording.
- 4. When finished, press the **Right Select** key to save.
- 5. From the Sound Recorder screen, press the **Right Select** key to view the audio list. You can play, delete, rename or share audios.

# Calculator

Solve many mathematical problems with the Calculator 🎎 app.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** ox key to access the App Menu.
- 2. Use the Navigation Ring to select Tools > Calculator ::
- 3. Enter numbers using the keypad. Press the key to add a decimal. Press the key to add a percentage symbol. Press the Right Select key to add or remove negative values. Press the Back/Clear key to delete the current entry, or press the Left Select key to clear all.
- Use the Navigation Ring to select the mathematical operation to be performed (add, subtract, multiply, or divide).
- 5. Press the **OK OK** key to solve the equation.

# Clock

The Clock app allows you to set alarms, view different world times, use a stopwatch, set a timer, and use your phone as a desk clock.

- 1. From the Home screen, press the **OK** ox key to access the App Menu.
- 2. Use the Navigation Ring \_\_\_ to select Tools \_\_\_\_ > Clock \_\_\_\_.

## Set the date and time manually

Your phone uses the wireless network to receive the current date and time automatically. You can also set the date and time manually.

- 1. From the Clock screen, press the **OK OK** key to set data and time.
- 2. Select Use network-provided time > Off.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Ring** to select **Set date** and **Set time** to set them manually.

#### World clock

The World clock lets you keep track of the current time in multiple cities around the globe.

- From the Clock screen, press the Left Select key to access the World clock screen.
- Select the city you want to add from the list. The added cities are now displayed on the Clock screen.
- To remove a city, press the Left Select key from the Clock screen to access the World clock screen and uncheck the city you want to remove.

### Alarm

## Setting an alarm





- 2. Press the **Left Select** key to add a new alarm.
- 3. Use the Navigation Ring of to set the alarm time and press the OK ox key to confirm.
- 4. Select the alarm you've just added from the Alarm screen and adjust the following options:
  - ON: Turn the alarm on or off.
  - Select Time: Set the alarm time.
  - Repeat: Set what days you want the alarm to repeat, if desired.
  - Ringtone: Select a sound to play for the alarm.
  - Vibrate: Activate alarm vibration.
  - Delete: Delete the current alarm.

#### **Timer**

1. From the Alarm screen, use the **Navigation Ring** [11] to select the **Timer** [12]



- 2. Enter the hour, minute, and second using the keypad. When finished, press the **OK** ok key to start the Timer. Press the **OK** ok key to pause the Timer. Press the **OK OK** key again to resume the Timer.
- 3. Press the **Left Select** key to reset and clear the Timer.

# Stopwatch

- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

#### RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This mobile phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

The highest SAR value for the model phone as reported to the FCC when tested for use at the ear is 0.76 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.21 W/kg (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements.).

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. For body worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets the FCC RF exposure guidelines for use with an accessory that contains no metal and positions the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines. If you do not use a body-worn accessory and are not holding the phone at the ear, position the handset a minimum of 1.5 cm from your body when the phone is switched on.

#### Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) for Wireless Telecommunication Devices

This phone has a HAC rating of M4/T4.

#### What is hearing aid compatibility?

The Federal Communications Commission has implemented rules and a rating system designed to enable people who wear hearing aids to more effectively use these wireless telecommunications devices. The standard for compatibility of digital wireless phones with hearing aids is set forth in American National Standard Institute (ANSI) standard C63.19. There are two sets of ANSI standards with ratings from one to four (four being the best rating): an "M" rating for reduced interference making it easier to hear conversations on the phone when using the hearing aid microphone, and a "T" rating that enables the phone to be used with hearing aids operating in the tele-coil mode, thus reducing unwanted background noise.

#### How will I know which wireless phones are hearing aid compatible?

The Hearing Aid Compatibility rating is displayed on the wireless phone box. A phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for acoustic coupling (microphone mode) if it has an "M3" or "M4" rating. A digital wireless phone is considered Hearing Aid Compatible for inductive coupling (tele-coil mode) if it has a "T3" or "T4" rating.

# **Troubleshooting**

Before contacting the service center, follow the instructions below:

- Make sure your phone's battery is fully charged for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your phone, as this may affect its performance.
- Use Reset and the Software Update to perform phone formatting or software upgrading. ALL Users phone data (contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications, etc.) will be permanently deleted. It is strongly advised to fully backup the phone data and profile before formatting and upgrading.

Note: This phone uses cellular data for certain services, applications and functions. If not connected to Wi-Fi, standard data charges will apply. Please connect to a Wi-Fi network to limit data charges.

If you are having the following issues:

## My phone has not responded for several minutes.

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the End/Power key.
- If you are unable to turn the phone off, remove and replace the battery, then turn the phone on again.

#### My phone turns off by itself.

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure the End/Power key is not being pressed due to an unlocked screen.
- · Check the battery charge level.

#### My phone cannot charge properly.

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery
  power is empty for a long time, it may take around 12 minutes to display the
  battery charger indicator on the screen.
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) to 45°C (113°F)).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

#### My phone cannot connect to a network or "No service" is displayed.

- Try connecting in another location.
- Verify the network coverage with your service provider.
- Check with your service provider that your SIM card is valid.
- · Try selecting the available network(s) manually.
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

## My phone cannot connect to the Internet.

- Check that the IMEI number (press \*#06#) is the same as the one printed on your warranty card or box.
- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- · Check your phone's Internet connecting settings.
- Make sure you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

#### My phone says my SIM card is invalid.

Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see <u>"Inserting or removing the Nano SIM card and microSDIM card" on page 12</u>).

Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched.

Make sure the service of your SIM card is available.

#### I am unable to make outgoing calls.

- Make sure the number you have dialed is correct and valid, and that you
  have pressed the Call/Answer key.
- · For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your service provider (credit, SIM card is valid, etc.).
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

#### I am unable to receive incoming calls.

- Make sure your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your service provider (credit, SIM card is valid, etc.).
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

# The caller's name/number does not appear when a call is received.

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your service provider.
- Your caller has concealed his/her name or number.

#### I cannot find my contacts.

- · Make sure your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure your SIM card is inserted properly.
- Import all contacts stored in SIM card to phone.

#### The sound quality of the calls is poor.

- You can adjust the volume during a call by pressing up or down on the Volume key.
- · Check the network strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector or speaker on your phone is clean.

#### I am unable to use the features described in the manual.

- Check with your service provider to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure this feature does not require an accessory.

#### I am unable to dial a number from my contacts.

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.
- If Make sure that you have entered the correct country prefix if calling a foreign country.

#### I am unable to add a contact.

 Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files in the phone contacts.

#### Callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail.

Contact your service provider to check service availability.

#### I cannot access my voicemail.

- Make sure your service provider's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

#### I am unable to send and receive MMS messages.

- · Check if your phone memory availability is full.
- Contact your service provider to check service availability and check MMS parameters.
- Verify the server center number or MMS profile with your service provider.
- · The server center may be swamped, try again later.

#### My SIM card is PIN locked.

Contact your service provider for the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key).

#### I am unable to download new files.

- Make sure there is sufficient phone memory for your download.
- · Check your subscription status with your service provider.

#### The phone cannot be detected by others via Bluetooth.

- Make sure Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

#### How to make your battery last longer.

- Fully charge your phone for a minimum of 3 hours.
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 12 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.

- Extend the e-mail auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Exit applications running in the background if they have not been used for a long time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or Location when not in use.

# The phone will become warm following prolonged calls, playing games, using the browser, or running other complex applications.
