## Setting up your Ekster Tracker

- 1. Download the Chipolo App
  - Go to the App Store, download and install the Chipolo mobile application.
- 2. Create an account/log in
- . When you open the app for the first time you will see the instruction screen. Create an account or if you

already have an account please select 'Log in'

- a. You can sign in with your Google or Facebook account.
- b. Or login in with your e-mail address and password.
- c. If you created a new account, open your email and confirm your email address (essential for password reset).
- 3. Add (+) your tracker
  - . Once signed in press (+) in the app to add your Ekster Tracker.
  - a. Now tap on 'Partner Products' and select Ekster Wallets in the next step
- 4. Pairing your tracker
  - . Place your tracker next to your device
  - a. Firmly Push the button twice on your Tracker (you will hear a beep sound)
  - b. Once connected you will see the checkmark icon and the text 'Success!'.
