

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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Scope

Measurement and determination of electromagnetic emissions (EMC) of radio frequency devices including intentional and/or unintentional radiators for compliance with the technical rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada.

1.2 Element Materials Technology Morgan Hill Test Location

These measurement tests were conducted at the Element Materials Technology Morgan Hill facility located at 18855 Adams Court, Morgan Hill, CA 95037. The measurement facility is compliant with the test site requirements specified in ANSI C63.4-2014 and KDB 414788 D01 v01r01.

1.3 Test Facility / Accreditations

Measurements were performed at Element Materials Technology located in Morgan Hill, CA 95037, U.S.A.

Note: The maximum achievable duty cycles for all modes were determined based on measurements performed on a spectrum analyzer in zero-span mode with RBW = 8MHz, VBW = 50MHz, and detector = peak per the guidance of Section 6.0 b) of KDB 558074 D01 v05r02 and ANSI C63.10-2013. 2.5 Test Configuration

The EUT was tested per the guidance of ANSI C63.10-2013 and KDB 558074 D01 v05r02. ANSI C63.10-2013 was used to reference the appropriate EUT setup for radiated spurious emissions testing and AC line conducted testing. See Sections 3.2 for AC line conducted emissions test setups, Section 3.3 for radiated emissions test setups, and, 7.2, 7.3, 7.4, 7.5, and 7.6 for antenna port conducted emissions test setups.

For emissions from 1GHz – 18GHz, low, mid, and high channels were tested with highest power and worst case configuration. The emissions below 1GHz and above 18GHz were tested with the highest transmitting power and the worst case channel.

The EUT was manipulated through two orthogonal planes of X-orientation (flatbed) and Y-orientation (landscape) during the testing.

For AC line conducted and radiated test below 1GHz, following configuration were investigated and EUT powered by AC/DC was the worst case.

- EUT powered by AC Power Cable

Higher and lower data rates were investigated for different test cases and the worst case data is reported in Section 7.0.

2.6 Software and Firmware

The test was conducted with firmware version 20J373 installed on the EUT.

2.7 EMI Suppression Device(s)/Modifications

No EMI suppression device(s) were added and/or no modifications were made during testing.

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3.0 DESCRIPTION OF TESTS

3.1 Evaluation Procedure

The measurement procedures described in the American National Standard of Procedures for Compliance Testing of Unlicensed Wireless Devices (ANSI C63.10-2013) and the guidance provided in KDB 558074 D01 v05r02 were used in the measurement of the EUT.

3.2 AC Line Conducted Emissions

The line-conducted facility is located inside a 7m x 3.66m x 2.7m shielded enclosure. The shielded enclosure is manufactured by AP Americas. The shielding effectiveness of the shielded room is in accordance with MIL-Std-285 or NSA 65-6. A 1m x 1.5m wooden table 80cm high is placed 40cm away from the vertical wall and 80cm away from the sidewall of the shielded room. Two 10kHz-30MHz, $50\Omega/50\mu$ H Line-Impedance Stabilization Networks (LISNs) are bonded to the shielded room floor. Power to the LISNs is filtered by external high-current high-insertion loss power line filters. The external power line filter is EPCOS 2X60A Power Line Filter (100dB Attenuation, 14kHz-18GHz) and the two EPCOs 2X48A filters (100dB Minimum Insertion Loss, 14kHz - 10GHz). These filters attenuate ambient signal noise from entering the measurement lines. These filters are also bonded to the shielded enclosure.

The EUT is powered from one LISN and the support equipment is powered from the second LISN. If the EUT is a DC-powered device, power will be derived from the source power supply it normally will be powered from and this supply line(s) will be connected to the second LISN. All interconnecting cables more than 1 meter were shortened to a 1 meter length by non-inductive bundling (serpentine fashion) and draped over the back edge of the test table. All cables were at least 40cm above the horizontal reference groundplane. Power cables for support equipment were routed down to the second LISN while ensuring that the cables were not draped over the second LISN.

Sufficient time for the EUT, support equipment, and test equipment was allowed in order for them to warm up to their normal operating condition. The RF output of the LISN was connected to the spectrum analyzer and exploratory measurements were made to determine the frequencies producing the maximum emission from the EUT. The spectrum was scanned from 150kHz to 30MHz with a spectrum analyzer. The detector function was set to peak mode for exploratory measurements while the bandwidth of the analyzer was set to 10kHz. The EUT, support equipment, and interconnecting cables were arranged and manipulated to maximize each emission. Once the worst case emissions have been identified, the one EUT cable configuration/arrangement and mode of operation that produced these emissions is used for final measurements on the same test site. The analyzer is set to CISPR quasi-peak and average detectors with a 9kHz resolution bandwidth for final measurements.

Line conducted emissions test results are shown in Section 7.9. Automated test software was used to perform the AC line conducted emissions testing. Automated measurement software utilized is Rohde & Schwarz EMC32, Version 10.50.40.

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3.3 Radiated Emissions

The radiated test facilities consisted of an indoor 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber used for final measurements and exploratory measurements, when necessary. The measurement area is contained within the semi-anechoic chamber which is shielded from any ambient interference. The test site inside the chamber is a 6m x 5.2m elliptical, obstruction-free area in accordance with Figure 5.7 of Clause 5 in ANSI C63.4-2014. Absorbers are arranged on the floor between the turn table and the antenna mast in such a way so as to maximize the reduction of reflections for measurements above 1GHz. An 80cm tall test table made of Styrodur is placed on top of the turn table. For measurements above 1GHz, an additional Styrodur pedestal is placed on top of the test table to bring the total table height to 1.5m.

Per KDB 414788 D01 v01r01, radiated emission test sites other than open-field test sites (e.g., shielded anechoic chambers), may be employed for emission measurements below 30MHz if characterized so that the measurements correspond to those obtained at an open-field test site. To determine test site equivalency, a reference sample transmitting at 149kHz was measured on an open field test site (asphalt with no ground plane) and then measured in the 3m semi-anechoic chamber. A calibrated 60cm loop antenna was rotated about its vertical axis while the reference device was rotated through the X, Y and Z axis in order to capture the worst case level. A maximum deviation of 2.77dB at 149kHz was measured when comparing the 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber to the open field site.

For all measurements, the spectrum was scanned through all EUT azimuths and from 1 to 4 meter receive antenna height using a broadband antenna from 30MHz up to the upper frequency shown in 15.33 depending on the highest frequency generated or used in the device or on which the device operates or tunes. For frequencies above 1GHz, linearly polarized double ridge horn antennas were used. For frequencies below 30MHz, a calibrated loop antenna was used. When exploratory measurements were necessary, they were performed at 1 meter test distance inside the semi-anechoic chamber using broadband antennas, broadband amplifiers, and spectrum analyzers to determine the frequencies and modes producing the maximum emissions. Sufficient time for the EUT, support equipment, and test equipment was allowed in order for them to warm up to their normal operating condition. The test set-up was placed on top of the 1 x 1.5 meter table. The EUT, support equipment, and interconnecting cables were arranged and manipulated to maximize each emission. Appropriate precaution was taken to ensure that all emissions from the EUT were maximized and investigated. The system configuration, mode of operation, turntable azimuth, and receive antenna height was noted for each frequency found.

Final measurements were made in the semi-anechoic chamber using calibrated, linearly polarized broadband and horn antennas. The test setup was configured to the setup that produced the worst case emissions. The spectrum analyzer was set to investigate all frequencies required for testing to compare the highest radiated disturbances with respect to the specified limits. The turntable containing the EUT was rotated through 360 degrees and the height of the receive antenna was varied 1 to 4 meters and stopped at the azimuth and height producing the maximum emission. Each emission was maximized by changing the orientation of the EUT through two orthogonal planes and changing the polarity of the receive antenna, whichever produced the worst-case emissions.

3.4 Environmental Conditions

The temperature is controlled within range of 15°C to 35°C. The relative humidity is controlled within range of 10% to 75%. The atmospheric pressure is monitored within the range 86-106kPa (860-1060mbar).

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4.0 ANTENNA REQUIREMENTS

Excerpt from §15.203 of the FCC Rules/Regulations:

"An intentional radiator antenna shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party can be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section."

- The antennas of the EUT are permanently attached.
- There are no provisions for connections to an external antenna.

Conclusion:

The EUT unit complies with the requirement of §15.203.

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5.0 MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY

The measurement uncertainties shown below were calculated in accordance with the requirements of ANSI C63.23-2012. All measurement uncertainty values are shown with a coverage factor of k = 2 to indicate a 95% level of confidence. The measurement uncertainty shown below meets or exceeds the U_{CISPR} measurement uncertainty values specified in CISPR 16-4-2 and, thus, can be compared directly to specified limits to determine compliance.

Notes:

- 1. All modes of operation and data rates were investigated. The test results shown in the following sections represent the worst case emissions.
- The analyzer plots shown in this section were all taken with a correction table loaded into the analyzer. The correction table was used to account for the losses of the cables and attenuators used as part of the system to connect the EUT to the analyzer at all frequencies of interest.
- 3. All antenna port conducted emissions testing was performed on a test bench with the antenna port of the EUT connected to the spectrum analyzer through calibrated cables and attenuators.
- 4. For conducted spurious emissions, automated test software was used to measure emissions and capture the corresponding plots necessary to show compliance. The measurement software utilized is ELEMENT "WLAN Automation," Version 5.0.
- For radiated band edge, automated test software was used to measure emissions and capture the corresponding plots necessary to show compliance. The measurement software utilized is Element "Chamber Automation," Version 1.3.2.

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7.2 6dB and 99% Bandwidth Measurement §15.247(a.2); §2.1049; RSS-247 [5.2]; RSS-Gen [6.7]

Test Overview and Limit

The bandwidth at 6dB down from the highest in-band spectral density is measured with a spectrum analyzer connected to the transmitter antenna terminal of the EUT while the EUT is operating at its maximum duty cycle, at maximum power, and at the appropriate frequencies. All data rates were investigated and the worst case configuration results are reported in this section.

The occupied bandwidth, that is the frequency bandwidth such that, below its lower and above its upper frequency limits, the mean powers radiated are each equal to 0.5 percent of the total mean power radiated by a given emission shall be measured. All modes of operation were investigated and the worst case configuration results are reported in this section.

The minimum permissible 6dB bandwidth is 500 kHz.

Test Procedure Used

ANSI C63.10-2013 – Subclause 11.8.2 Option 2 KDB 558074 D01 v05r02 – Section 8.2 RSS-Gen [6.7]

Test Settings

- 1. The signal analyzers' automatic bandwidth measurement capability of the spectrum analyzer was used to perform the 99% occupied bandwidth and the 6dB bandwidth measurement. The "X" dB bandwidth parameter was set to X = 6. The bandwidth measurement was not influenced by any intermediate power nulls in the fundamental emission.
- 2. RBW = 100kHz
- 3. $VBW \ge 3 \times RBW$
- 4. Detector = Peak
- 5. Trace mode = max hold
- 6. Sweep = auto couple
- 7. The trace was allowed to stabilize
- If necessary, steps 2 7 were repeated after changing the RBW such that it would be within 1 5% of the 99% occupied bandwidth observed in Step 7

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

Plot 7-4. 6dB BW and 99% OBW Plot (802.11g - Ch. 1)

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
Plot 7-5. 6dB BW and 99% OBW Plot (802.11g - Ch. 6)




Plot 7-6. 6dB BW and 99% OBW Plot (802.11g - Ch. 11)

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Plot 7-9. 6dB BW and 99% OBW Plot (802.11n (2.4GHz) - Ch. 11) - MCS0




Plot 7-10. 6dB BW and 99% OBW Plot (802.11n (2.4GHz) - Ch. 1) - MCS7

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7.3 Output Power Measurement

Test Overview and Limits

A transmitter antenna terminal of EUT is connected to the input of an RF power sensor. Measurement is made using a broadband power meter capable of making peak and average measurements while the EUT is operating at its maximum duty cycle, at maximum power, and at the appropriate frequencies.

The maximum peak conducted output power of digital modulation systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band is 1 Watt.

The conducted output power limit on paragraph above is based on the use of antennas with directional gains that do not exceed 6 dBi. If transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6 dBi are used, the conducted output power from the intentional radiator shall be reduced by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6 dBi.

For DTSs employing digital modulation techniques operating in the band 2400-2483.5 MHz, the maximum peak conducted output power shall not exceed 1 W. The e.i.r.p. shall not exceed 4 W.

Method PKPM1 (Peak Power Measurement)

Peak power measurements were performed only when the EUT was transmitting at its maximum power control level using a broadband power meter with a pulse sensor. The pulse sensor employs a VBW = 50MHz so this method was only used for signals whose DTS bandwidth was less than or equal to 50MHz.

Method AVGPM-G (Average Power Measurement)

Average power measurements were performed only when the EUT was transmitting at its maximum power control level using a broadband power meter with a pulse sensor. The power meter implemented triggering and gating capabilities which were set up such that power measurements were recorded only during the ON time of the transmitter. The trace was averaged over 100 traces to obtain the final measured average power.

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Plot 7-13. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11b - Ch. 1)




Plot 7-14. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11b - Ch. 6)

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Plot 7-15. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11b - Ch. 11)




Plot 7-16. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11g - Ch. 1)

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
Plot 7-17. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11g - Ch. 6)




Plot 7-18. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11g - Ch. 11)

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Plot 7-19. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 1)




Plot 7-20. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11n MCS0- Ch. 6)

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
Plot 7-21. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11n MCS0- Ch. 11)




Plot 7-22. Power Spectral Density Plot (802.11n MCS7- Ch. 1)


Figure 7-4. Test Instrument & Measurement Setup



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
Plot 7-25. Band Edge Plot (802.11b - Ch. 1)




Plot 7-26. Band Edge Plot (802.11b - Ch. 2)


Plot 7-28. Band Edge Plot (802.11b - Ch. 10)

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
Plot 7-29. Band Edge Plot (802.11b - Ch. 11)

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


Plot 7-36. Band Edge Plot (802.11g- Ch. 6)

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Plot 7-37. Band Edge Plot (802.11g- Ch. 7)




Plot 7-38. Band Edge Plot (802.11g- Ch. 8)

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
Plot 7-39. Band Edge Plot (802.11g- Ch. 9)




Plot 7-40. Band Edge Plot (802.11g- Ch. 10)





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
Plot 7-47. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 4)




Plot 7-48. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 6)


Plot 7-50. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 8)

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
Plot 7-51. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 9)




Plot 7-52. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 10)

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
Plot 7-53. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0- Ch. 11)




Plot 7-54. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS0 - Ch. 12)


Plot 7-56. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 1)

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
Plot 7-57. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 2)




Plot 7-58. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 8)

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
Plot 7-59. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 9)




Plot 7-60. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 10)

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
Plot 7-61. Band Edge Plot (802.11n MCS7 - Ch. 11)

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



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
Plot 7-64. Conducted Spurious Plot (802.11b - Ch. 1)




Plot 7-65. Conducted Spurious Plot (802.11b - Ch. 1)

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
Plot 7-66. Conducted Spurious Plot (802.11b - Ch. 6)




Plot 7-67. Conducted Spurious Plot (802.11b - Ch. 6)




Figure 7-6. Radiated Measurement Setup


