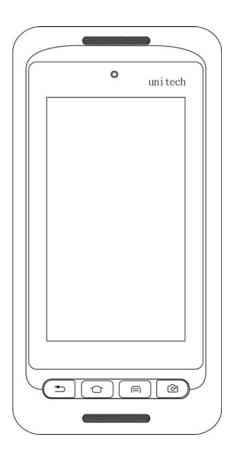

## **Battery Notice**

- To guarantee optimal performance, it is recommended that rechargeable batteries be replaced every year, or after 500 charging cycles are completed. It is normal for the battery to balloon or expand after one year or 500 cycles. 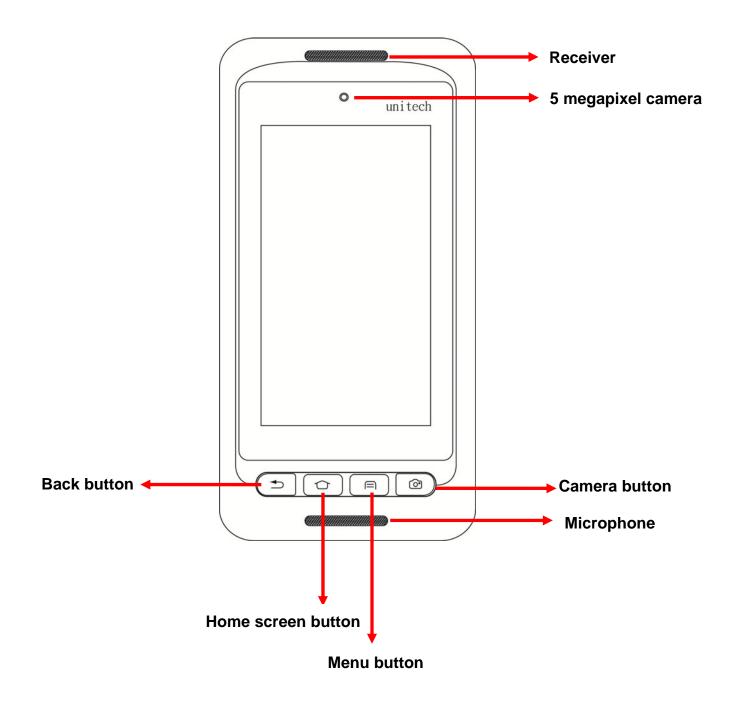

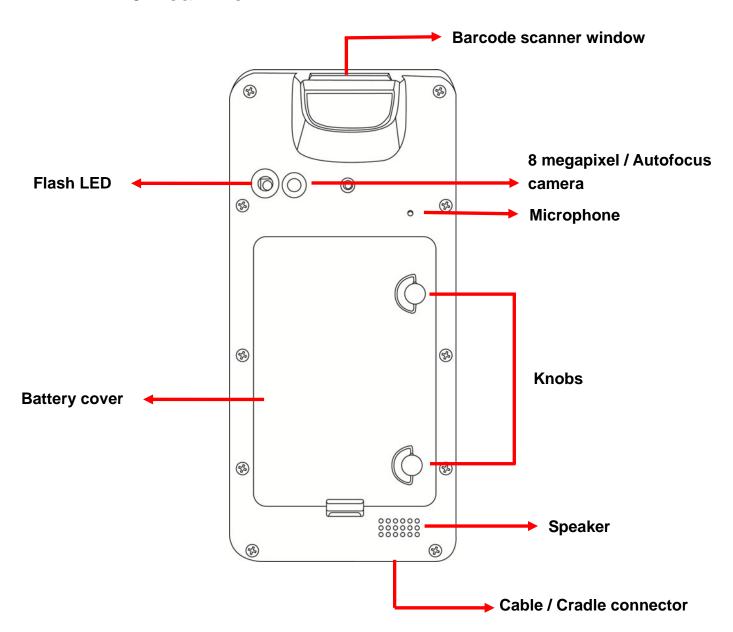

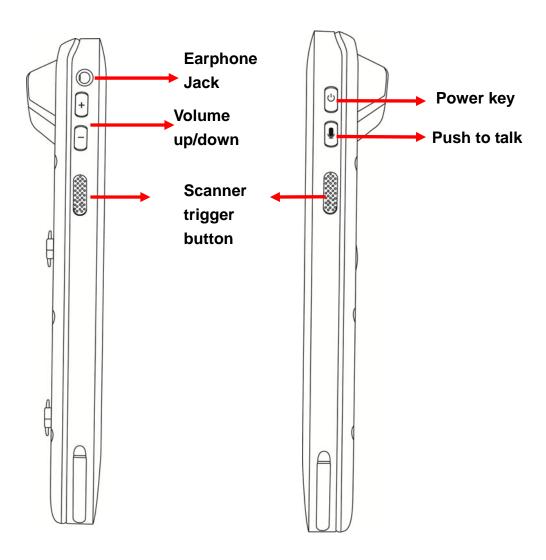


## **PA726 Rear View**

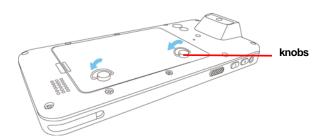

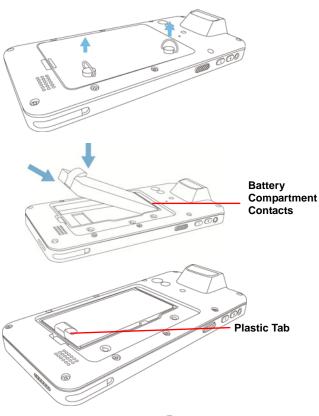
## 1.4 Getting Started

## 1.4.1 Installing the Battery

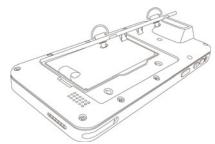
 To loosen the two knobs on the battery cover by turning counterclockwise.
 And pull the two knobs up to remove the battery cover.



- Slide and position the battery pack, making sure the battery contacts are aligned with the contacts in the compartment.
- 3. Use your thumb to snap the battery in place.



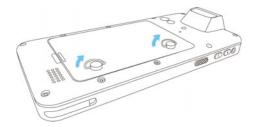
4. Put back the battery cover.





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5. To tighten the two knobs on the battery cover by turning clockwise.



NOTE: After installing the battery, make sure the battery cover is securely closed, or you may be unable to turn ON the terminal.

WARNING! There is a risk of fire and burns if the battery pack is handled improperly. DO

NOT disassemble, crush, puncture, short external contacts, or dispose the

battery pack in fire or water. DO NOT attempt to open or service the battery pack.

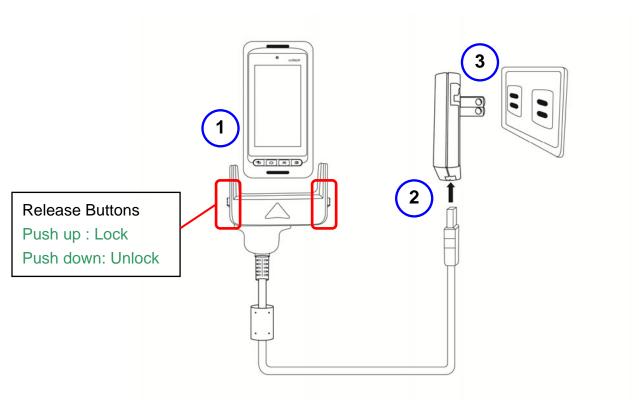

## 1.4.2 Charging the Battery

Before using the terminal for the first time, you need to charge it for about 24 hours. After that, you can charge the terminal for 4 hours to recharge the battery to full capacity. Charge the terminal using the USB charging cable or the docking station.

- 1. After PA726 is connected to the charging cable, push up the release buttons on the both sides of the USB charging cable to lock PA726.
- 2. Use USB charging cable to connect the AC adapter.
- 3. Plug the AC adapter cord into an electrical outlet.

## 1.4.3 Turning on the terminal for the first time

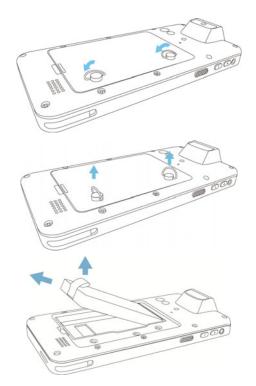


## 1.4.5 Using the Micro SD/ Micro SIM Card

The PA726 has Micro SD/ Micro SIM card slots inside the battery compartment.

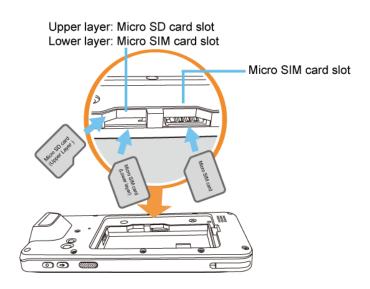

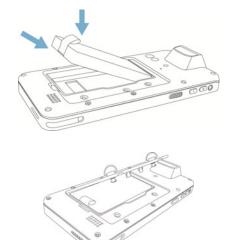

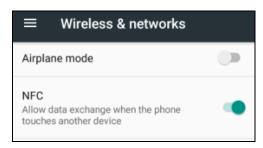






## 2.2 HF Setting

- 1. Tap go to APPS, and tap Settings and then under Wireless & networks, tap More...
- 2. Tap **NFC** check box to Enable / disable NFC function.

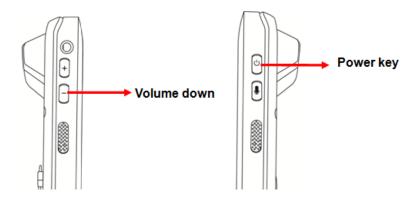




# 2.11 Performing a Hardware Reset

You may have to perform a reset if the device freezes (i.e., the terminal no longer responds to the buttons or tapping on the screen).

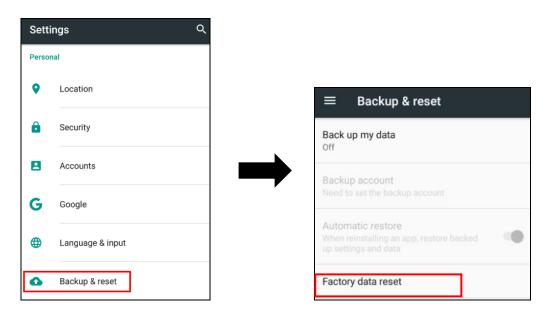

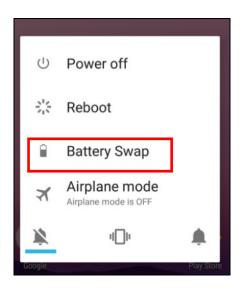




## 2.14 Battery Swap

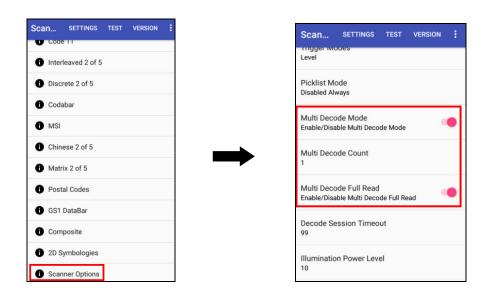




#### 3.1.2 Multi Decode Scan

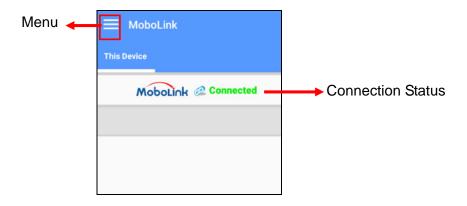


## 3.6 MoboLink

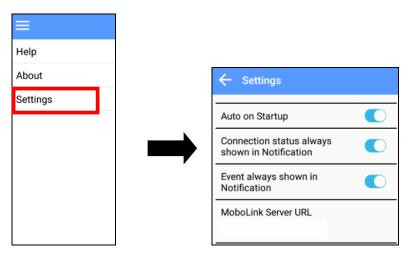

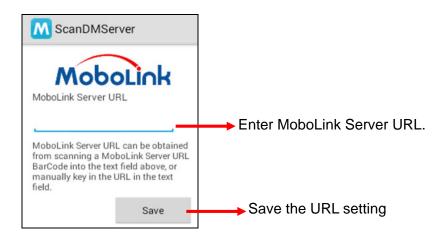
