I have a few comments on this Application.

1. It is not clear from the pictures and description if the rf card used in the device is removable by the user, or if it requires tools etc to remove. If it is removable (as in a typical PCMCIA card in a laptop) then the system is not certifiable as (i.e. the PCMCIA card would have an ID and it would be used like any PCMCIA device). If it requires disassembly and the use of tools indicating the rf card is not intended to be removed, then the device is certifiable. Please clarify if the transmitter is a permanent part of the unit or if it is easily removed by the user.
2. Please note that a drawing of the transmitter location is not sufficient as an operational description. The operational description should provide an indication of the use of the device. Please provide an adequate operational description for the device in question as it pertains to the transmitter.
3. Please note that the frequencies listed on page 7 of the report (particularly channel 11 listed as 2468MHz) and the actual measured frequencies (particularly channel 11 at 2462MHz) do not match. Please correct page 7 of your report to reflect the actual frequencies involved in the device.
