2.2 MPE Calculation Formula

 $Pd = (Pout*G) / (4*pi*r^2)$

where

Pd = power density in mW/cm²

Pout = output power to antenna in mW

G = gain of antenna in linear scale

Pi = 3.1416

R = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm

2.3 Classification

sub-band.



CONCULSION:

Both of the WLAN 2.4G & WLAN 5G & BT LE can transmit simultaneously, the formula of calculated the MPE is:

CPD1 / LPD1 + CPD2 / LPD2 +etc. < 1

CPD = Calculation power density

LPD = Limit of power density

Radio 1 + Radio 2 + Radio 3 (2.4G) + Radio 3 (5G) + Radio 4

= 0.220+0.285+0.083+0.051+0.001=0.639

Therefore, the maximum calculation of this situation is 0.639, which is less than the "1" limit.
