## Environmental evaluation and exposure limit according to FCC CFR 47part 1, §1.1307, §1.1310

The transceiver is classified as fixed, the calculation was done to check a safe distance.

Limit for power density for general population/uncontrolled exposure is 1  $\,\mathrm{mW/cm^2}$  for 1500 -100000 MHz frequency range.

The power density P (mW/cm<sup>2</sup>) = P<sub>T</sub> /  $4\pi$  r<sup>2</sup>, where

 $P_{\mathsf{T}}$  is the transmitted power, which is equal to the peak transmitter output power plus maximum antenna gain. The maximum equivalent isotropically radiated power EIRP is

$$P_T = 36.9 \text{ dBm} + 9.5 \text{ dBi} = 46.4 \text{ dBm} = 43652 \text{ mW}, \text{ where}$$

36.9 dBm is the EUT maximum output power (per port), 9.5 dBi – antenna gain.

The minimum safe distance "r", where RF exposure does not exceed FCC permissible limit, is

$$r = sqrt \{ PT / (Px4\pi) \} = sqrt \{ 43652 / 12.56 \} = 59 cm.$$

A warning about a safe distance is contained in the user manual.
