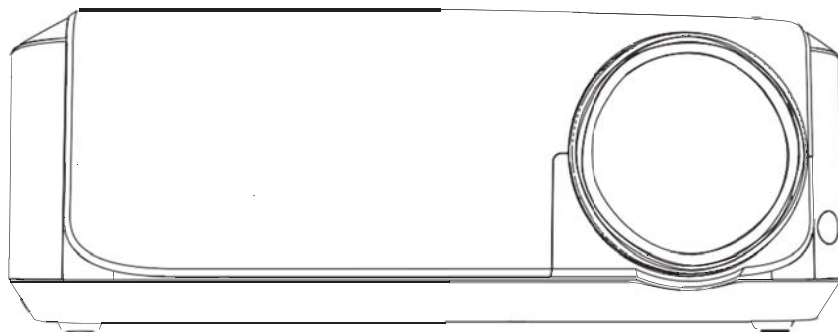

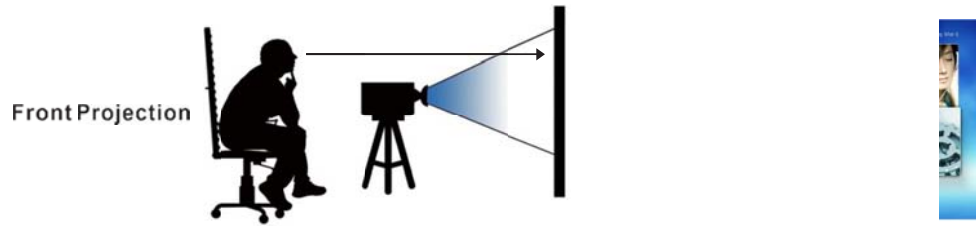
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Part I: Projection Methods

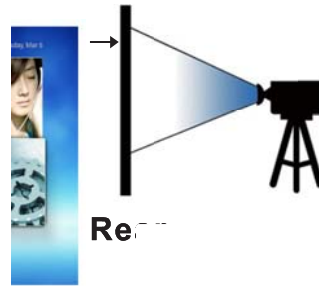
4 Projection methods: Depending on how you place the projector, you may need to change the projection mode so your images will be projected correctly.

1.1 Factory defaults: The projector is mounted on the same side of the screen as the viewer.

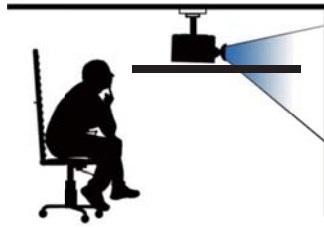


1.2 Rear: The installation position of the projector and the audience are located on the two sides of the screen.

You can change the projection mode to Rear with the remote control by clicking MENU → SETTING → PICTURE → Projection Mode (Rear on Desk) as the following pictures show:

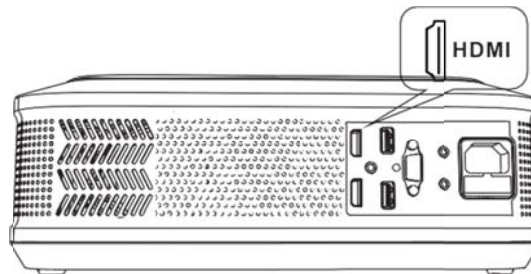
Part 2: HDMI Connection

How to use the HDMI cable to connect the projector with a computer/ PS4/ xbox/ DVD to display images?

2.1 Identifying available connections

The first step of connecting your computer to the projector is to find the matching ports on both devices. Then use the HDMI cable to connect them and make sure they are matched well and tightly.

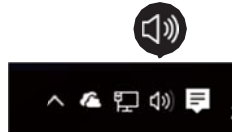

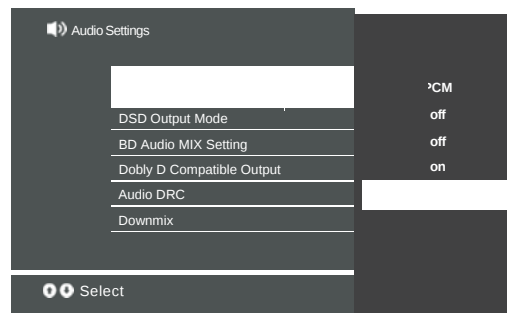
Use HDMI connect to PS4/XBOX:

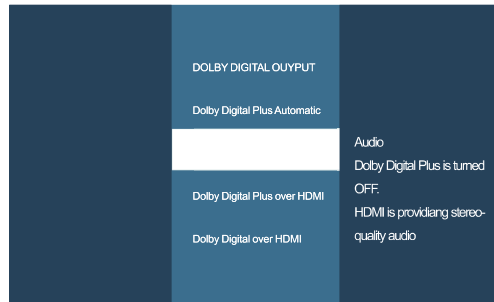

Part 3: USB SD TF Card Connection

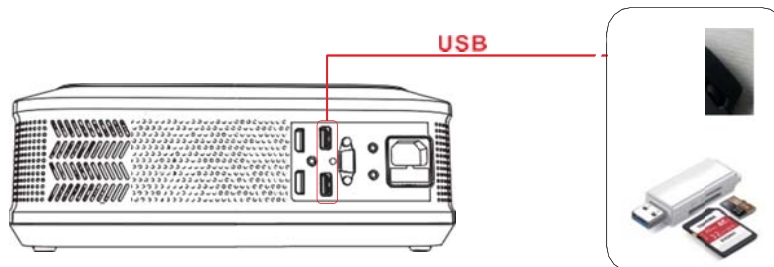
Connecting a USB device or TF card to the projector

3.1 You can connect your USB device or TF SD card to the **USB port on the side of the projector** and use it to project images and other content.

3.2 Connect the USB cable(or USB flash drive or USB memory card reader) to the **USB port on the side of the projector**.

3.3 Connect the other end of the cable(if Applicable) to your device.

Connecting TV box, DVD etc.to the projector

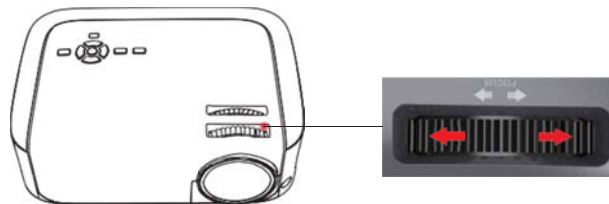
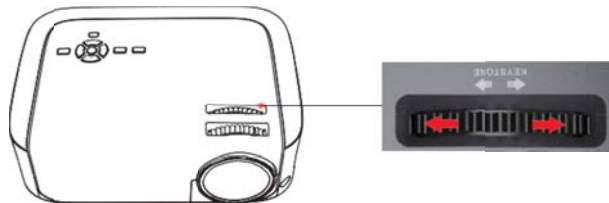
- 4.1 You can connect your TV box,DVD to the AV or YPbPr port on the side of the projector.

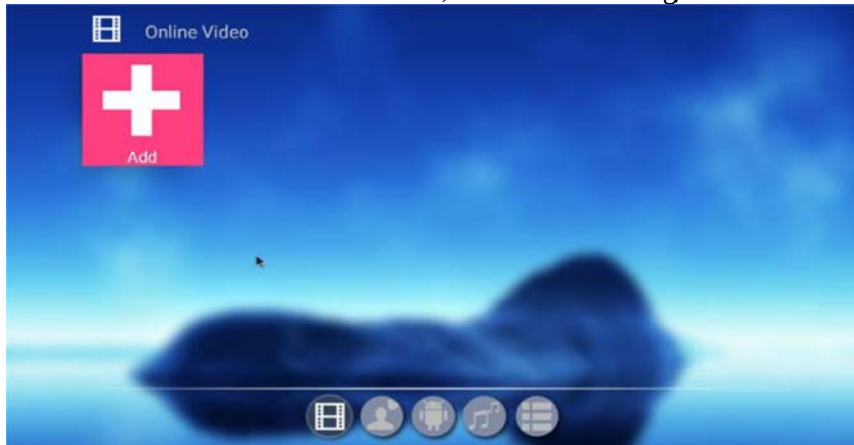
Part 6: Use of android functions

There are six options for local play in the desktop window. As shown in the desktop window below:



1. Online video

During online video playing or web browsing, click the "+" button to add some shortcuts to the online video window, as shown in the figure below.



2. Recommended

Contain all favorite apps.

3.Music

Click the "+" button to add a music player to play songs

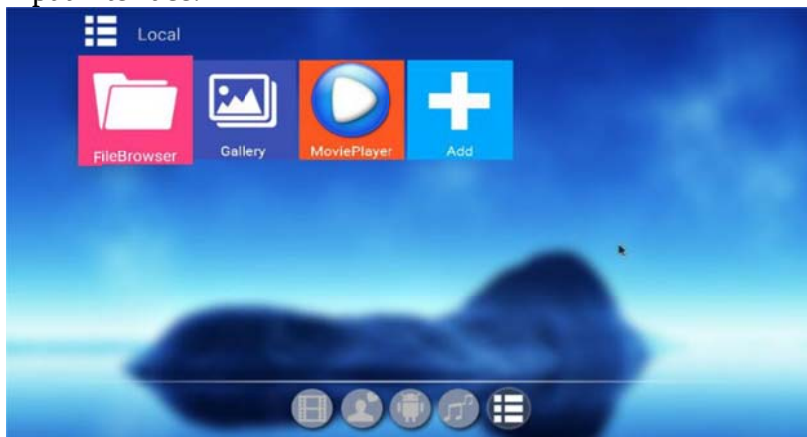
4.My Application

Display all apps installed on the system. Click the corresponding shortcut to enter the app.



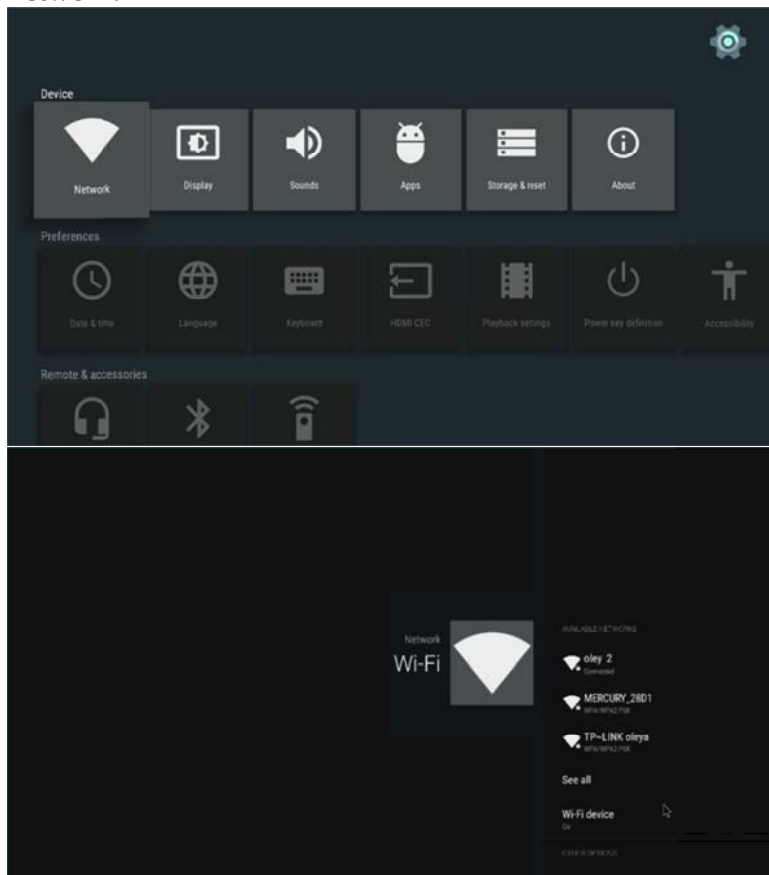
5. Local Play

Menu gallery, allowing users to browse the pictures stored on the native disk. Media, allowing users to play audio files stored on the native disk. File management, allowing users to manage files stored on the native disk and files on the mobile hard disk connecting to the device with the USB signal input interface.



6. Settings

Manage the network connection of the system, and select the wireless network.



Select the wifi name and enter the correct password to complete the wireless network connection.。
