## FCC §1.1307 (B) & §2.1091- MPE-BASED EXEMPTION

## **Applicable Standard**

According to subpart subpart 2.1091 systems operating under the provisions of this section shall be operated in a manner that ensures the public is not exposed to RF energy level in excess of the communication guidelines.

According to KDB 447498 D04 Interim General RF Exposure Guidance

MPE-Based Exemption:

General frequency and separation-distance dependent MPE-based effective radiated power(ERP) thresholds are in Table B.1 [Table 1 of § 1.1307(b)(1)(i)(C)] to support an exemptionfrom further evaluation from 300 kHz through 100 GHz.
