Safety Warnings

Be sure to keep the following instructions. Otherwise, it may cause serious injury or accident.

Driving

Keep traffic regulations while driving.

- Relying solely on the navigation system may cause violation of traffic rules and regulations, resulting in an accident.

In order to check the vehicle speed, see the speedometer first, not the speed on the navigation system.

- The speed on the navigation system may differ from actual vehicle speed.

While driving, refrain from watching the screen.

- An accident may occur by negligence in keeping your eyes forward.
- To manipulate the screen or buttons requiring multiple steps, be sure to stop your vehicle.

To use your mobile phone, first stop your vehicle.

- If you use your mobile phone while driving, it may disperse your attention, resulting in an accident.
- When making a call while driving, use the Bluetooth Hands-free function and if possible, minimize the call time.

Make sure that the volume of the phone is sufficiently low so that the external sound is audible.

- When you drive with no external sound present may cause a traffic accident.
- When you use the product with excessively high volume for a long time, it may affect your hearing.

For emergency services (e.g. hospital, fire station), do not rely solely on the navigation system.

- Some emergency services may not be included in the navigation map. Obtain information in advance for emergency situations.

System Handling

Operation

Use the system with the engine started.

- When you use the system for a long time with the engine stopped, it may cause battery discharge.

System Handling

Do NOT apply excessive force to the system.

- When you apply excessive pressure to the screen, the LCD panel or touch panel may get damaged.

To clean the screen or button panel, first turn off the vehicle. Use a dry, soft cloth when wiping the screen or panel.

- Do not wipe using a rough or hard cloth, chemical fiber, organic solvent (e.g. alcohol, benzene, thinner), or air freshener. The panel surface may become scratched or damaged due to chemical reaction.

When you install an air freshener on the air conditioner vent, the surface may be deformed due to leakage.

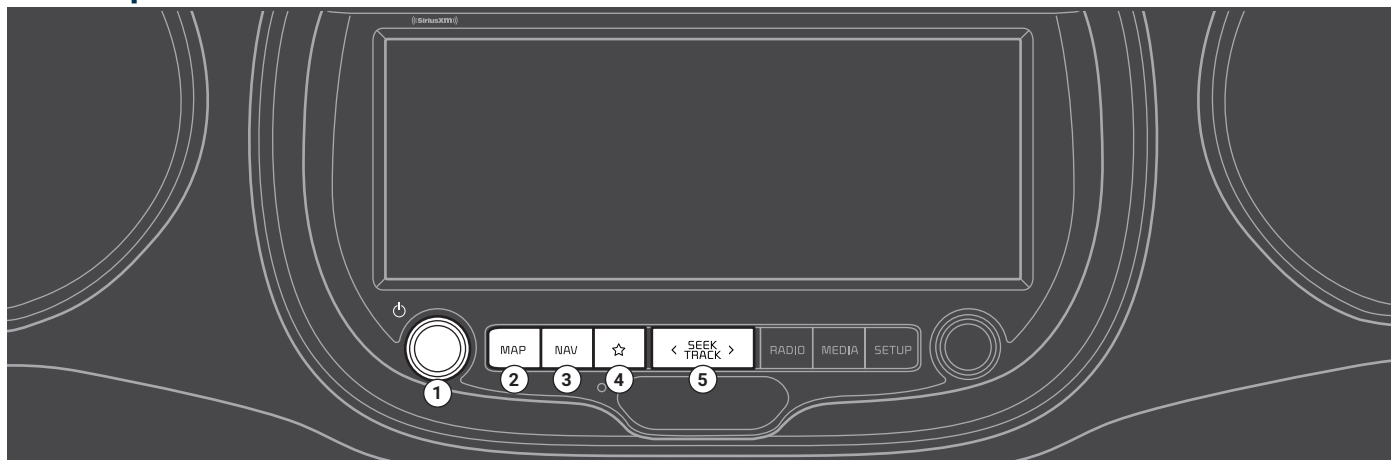

Turning the System On or Off

Component Names and Functions



❶ PWR button/VOL knob

- Press the button to turn on or off the AVN (radio/media).
- Press and hold the button to turn off the screen and sound.
- Turn the knob left or right to adjust the system volume.
- Turn the knob while hearing a guidance message to adjust the volume.

❷ MAP button

- Returns to the current location on the map.

❸ NAV button

- Moves to the navigation menu screen.

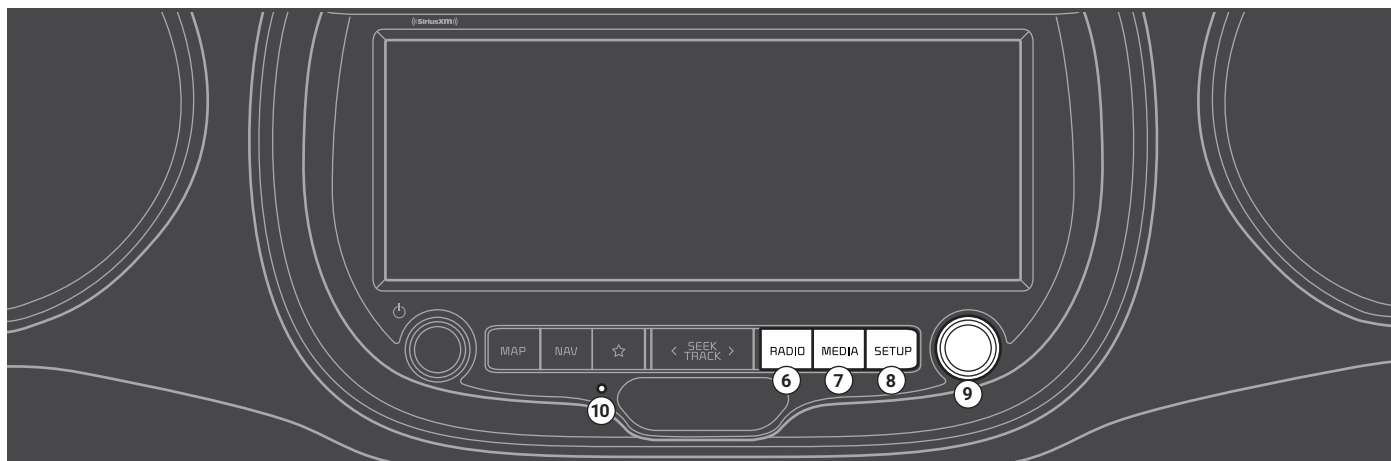
❹ Custom button (☆)

- Runs the user-defined function.
- Press and hold the button to display the custom settings screen.

❺ <SEEK/TRACK> button

- Changes the broadcast program, channel, music, or file while using the AV function.
- Press and hold the button to search a broadcast program while listening to radio.
- Press and hold the button to fast forward or rewind during playback (not applicable in Bluetooth audio mode).

Note: The system shape and menu arrangement may differ depending on the vehicle model and specifications.



6 RADIO button

- Turns on the radio.
- When you press the button repeatedly with the radio turned on, it toggles between FM and AM modes.

7 MEDIA button

- Runs the connected medium.
- When multiple media are connected, the selection window appears.

8 SETUP button

- Displays the Settings screen.

9 TUNE knob/FILE knob/ENTER button

- Turn the knob to change the frequency and channel while listening to radio.
- Turn the knob to search music or file while playing media.
- Press the button to select a channel, music, or file during a search.
- Turn it on the map screen to zoom in or out (if equipped).

10 System Reset button

Note: The system shape and menu arrangement may differ depending on the vehicle model and specifications.

① MODE button

- Press the button repeatedly to toggle among radio and media modes.
- Press and hold the button to turn on or off the AV function (e.g. radio, media).

② Move lever (^/▽)

- Changes the broadcast program, channel, music, or file while using the AV function.
- Push and hold the lever to search a broadcast program while listening to radio.
- Push and hold the lever to fast forward or rewind while playing media (except for Bluetooth Audio mode).

③ Volume lever (+/-)/Mute button (🔇)

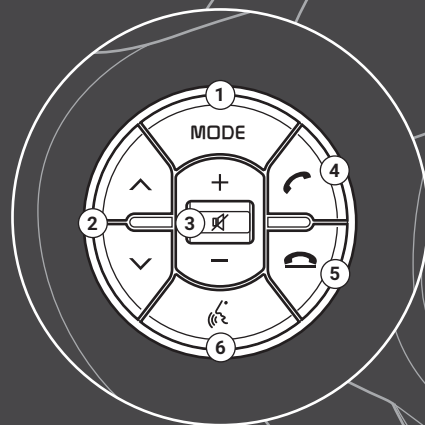
- Push the lever up or down to adjust the volume.
- Press the button to mute or unmute the volume (except for navigation sound).
- Press the button to pause or resume during playback.

④ Call button (📞)

- Before connecting the Bluetooth, press the button to display the Bluetooth connection window.
- After connecting the Bluetooth, press the button to display a list of recent calls.
- Press and hold the button to redial the latest number with the Bluetooth connected.
- Press the button to answer a call with the Bluetooth connected.
- During a call, press the button to place the call on hold.
- Press and hold the button to switch between the system and mobile phone.

⑤ End Call button (📞)**⑥ Voice Recognition button (🗣️)**

- Activates voice recognition.
- If voice recognition is not supported, it activates voice recognition on your smartphone through the phone projection.
- Press and hold the button to end the function.



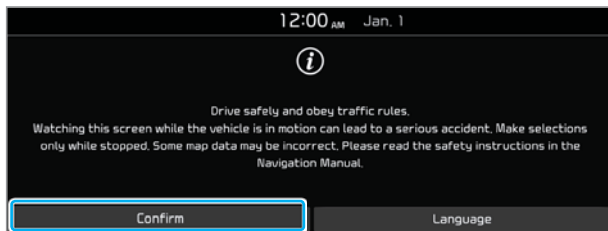

Turning the System On or Off

Turning on the system

- 1 Start the engine.
- 2 When a safety warning message appears, read it and tap **Confirm**.

 To change the display language, tap **Language**.

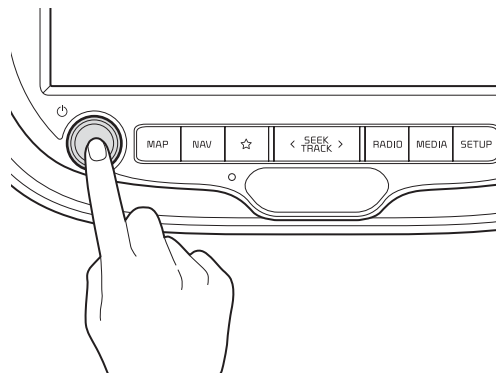


Turning off the system

To turn off the system, select any of the following methods:

- To turn off the system while driving, press and hold the [PWR] button on the panel. The screen and sound are turned off.

 To use the system again, press the [PWR] button.



- To shut down the system completely, park the vehicle in a safe place and stop the engine. The system automatically shuts down.

⚠ Warning

- When driving, the video screen does not appear to ensure safety. In order to watch video, first stop the vehicle. In case of a vehicle with the manual transaxle, video is played after you engage the parking brake. In case of a vehicle with the automatic transaxle, move the shift lever to “P” (Park) or engage the parking brake to watch video.
- Some functions may not be active while driving to ensure safety. Those functions run only when the vehicle is stationary. In order to use them, first stop the vehicle.
- When the screen is not displayed, the volume is muted, or other system failures occur, immediately stop using the system. When you use the faulty system continuously, it may cause fire, electric shock, or fatal system failure.

⚠ Caution

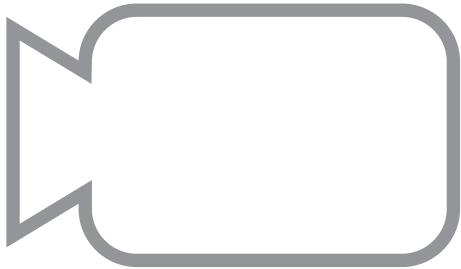
- The system can be turned on even when the ignition switch is in “ACC” or “ON.” However, when you use the system without starting the engine for a long time, it may cause battery discharge. To use the system for a long time, be sure to start the engine.
- When you use the system with the engine off, the battery warning message appears. The warning message disappears as soon as you start the engine.



- If you stop and start the engine, the system is turned on with the mode and settings used when the engine was stopped.
- To prevent audio from playing loud when you start the engine, adjust the system volume to a moderate level.
- To automatically decrease the system volume on the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Sound ► Priority ► Start-up Volume Limit** to set the function.

Viewing Driving Assist Video

Driving assist video

You can see the view outside the vehicle through the system screen.



The displayed screen may differ depending on the vehicle model.



Caution

The distance shown on the screen may differ from the actual one. Be sure to check the rear and left and right sides with your own eyes for safety.

Using the rear-view video

- 1 Move the shift lever to “R” (Reverse) with the engine started.

The system automatically displays the rear view with parking assist guide lines.

- 2 Safely park your vehicle while checking the rear view and guide lines.

1 Moving direction lines (yellow)

Displays the vehicle's moving direction based on the steering angle. The two horizontal lines display 1 m and 3 m positions respectively from the rear bumper.

2 Neutral steering lines (blue)

Displays the moving direction if you reverse the vehicle in neutral. Noting these lines, you can determine whether the vehicle is stopped in correct direction and the distances to the neighboring vehicles are adequate.

3 Collision warning lines (red)

Used to prevent collision. At an interval of about 0.5 m from the rear bumper, the lines are displayed on the screen.

4 Parking distance warning

The warning message appears when the vehicle approaches obstacles in the parking area.

5 Camera image adjustment

Used to adjust the brightness and contrast of camera images.



- After reversing is completed, rear-view video remains displayed even when the shift lever moves to a position other than “R” (Reverse) and “P” (Park). When you drive at over 15 km/h, the rear-view video disappears and the previous screen appears.
- Noting the parking assist guide lines based on the steering, you can see the moving direction.



- A warning sound is heard when the vehicle approaches obstacles while reversing. When you have set to automatically lower the audio volume. It can prevent accidents caused by failure to hear warnings. On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Sound ► Priority ► Proximity Warning**.

Using the steering-linked camera

■ Viewing the rear top view video

You can look down the rear view from the top through the rear-view video.

- 1 On the rear-view screen, tap
- 2 Check the top view video and assist guide lines.
 - 1 Displays the space required to open the trunk (tailgate). After a parking, check whether the space is sufficient to open the trunk and there is no obstacle.
 - 2 Displays the extension line from the center of the vehicle. According to the steering direction, the moving direction of the center is displayed on the screen.

■ Viewing the rear-view video while driving

Even while driving, you can see the rear view through the system screen.

To see the rear view while driving, press the  button.

The screen displays the  icon.



To turn off the rear-view video, press the  button again.

Surround View Monitor (* If equipped)

You can check the surroundings by using multiple cameras on the vehicle.



Use the +/- button on the right of the screen to zoom in or out.

■ Viewing the surround view while driving

- 1 In order to see the surround view, press the  button.

The screen displays the front view and surround view at the same time.



The surround view monitor function operates only when any of the following conditions is met.

- The shift lever is in “D” (Drive) and the vehicle drives at a speed of less than 15 km/h.
- The vehicle is stationary and the shift lever is in “D” (Drive) or “N” (Neutral).

- 2 Tap the icon to get a view in the desired direction.

	Displays the zoom-in front top view and top view (default).
	Displays the front wide view and top view.
	Displays the front-side view and top view.
	Moves to the rear-view screen while driving. The screen displays the  icon.
	Adjust the brightness and contrast of the camera images.

-  When any door or trunk (tailgate) is open or outside rear-view mirrors are folded, an alert icon appears on the right of the screen.
- To turn off the surround view screen, press the  button.

Viewing the surround view while reversing

- 1 Move the shift lever to “R” (Reverse).

The screen displays the rear view.



The surround view monitor function is not available when the shift lever is in “P” (Park).

- 2 Tap the icon to get a view in the desired direction.

■ Configuring the surround view monitor settings

- 1 On the surround view screen, tap .
- 2 Select the desired item and change the settings.
 - **Display Contents:** Set the content to display on the video screen.
(e.g. Rear view distance guidance, top view parking guidance, rear view parking guidance, parking distance warning).
 - **Top View Default Mode:** Select any of default, zoom-in, and zoom-out top views for the surround view monitor function.
 - **Front View Default Mode:** Select a default view for the surround view monitor function while driving.
 - **Rear View Default Mode:** Select a default view for the surround view monitor function while reversing.

- 2 Select an item and adjust the climate setting.
 - Can set the temperature in the rear seat.
 - Can set the air direction in the rear seat.
 - Can set the fan speed in the rear seat.
 - Can automatically adjust the climate system in AUTO mode.
 - Can turn off the climate system in the rear seat.
 - Can lock to prevent any occupant from controlling the climate system.

Using the touch screen

This system is equipped with a touch-type screen. You can use various practices by using this feature.

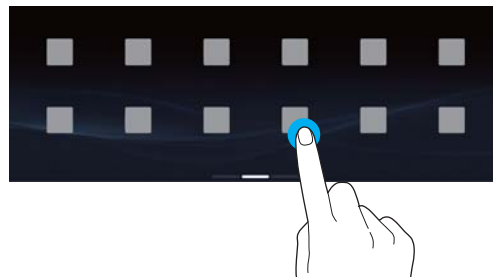
Caution

- Do not press the touch screen with excessive force or a sharp object. The touch screen may become damaged.
- Be careful for the touch screen not to contact any electrically charged object. Static or other electric shock may cause the system to malfunction or damage the touch screen.

 The touch screen will not respond when you are wearing gloves. Take off the gloves or wear electrostatic touch gloves.

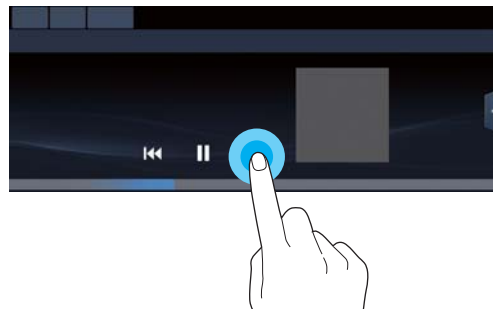
“Tap” gesture

Lightly tap the desired item and release the finger.
The corresponding function is run or the corresponding menu is selected.



“Touch and hold” gesture

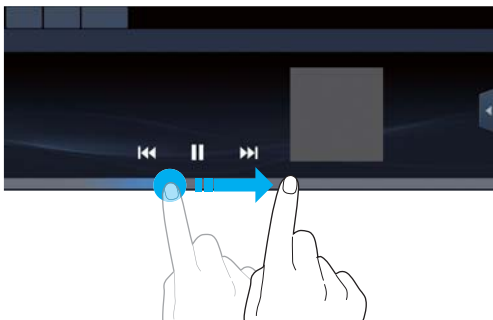
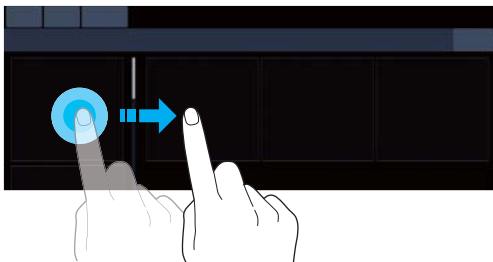
Touch and hold the desired item.

Touch and hold the desired item and drag it to another position.

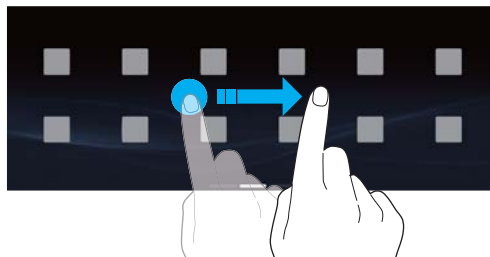
It is used to move the selected item or change the playing location during playback.

Lightly swipe the screen in the desired direction.

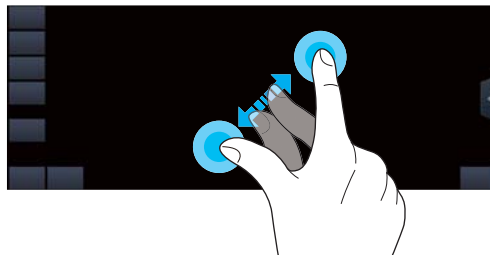
It is used to move fast vertically or horizontally across the menu screen or options list.

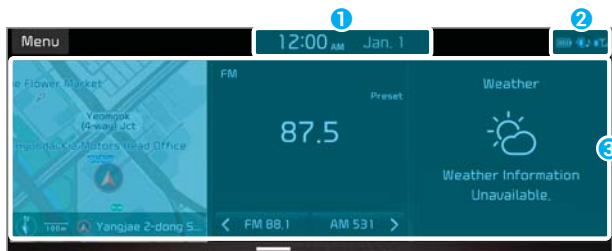

- 4 Displays the map widget. When the map widget is tapped, the map appears in full screen.
- 5 Displays the All Menus screen. In this case, all menus appear on the Default Home screen.
- 6 Displays the Call screen.
- 7 When the phone projection is connected, the corresponding screen appears.
- 8 Displays the Search screen. You can search the desired destination through this unified search function. ▶ See page.5-2“Finding a route quickly.”
- 9 Displays the Favorites screen. ▶ See page.4-8“Adding a favorite menu.”

- 1 Displays the current date and time.

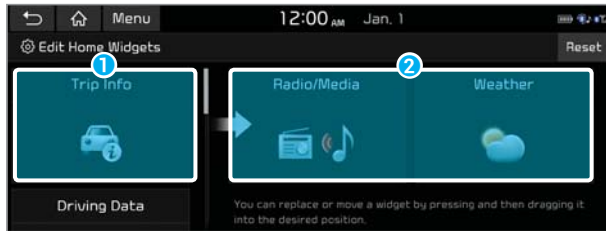
Editing the Home screen

Editing the widgets on the Home screen

You can edit the types and positions of the widgets on the Home screen.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap **Menu ▶ Edit Home Widgets**.
 - 2 Edit the widgets on the Home screen by using available functions.
 - To change the type of the widget, tap and hold, and drag the desired widget from the list to the widget area.
 - To change the location of a widget, tap and hold, and drag the widget to the desired position in the widget area.
-  You cannot change the map widget to another one on the Default Home screen.

- To change the location of an icon, tap and hold, and drag the icon to the desired position in the icon area.

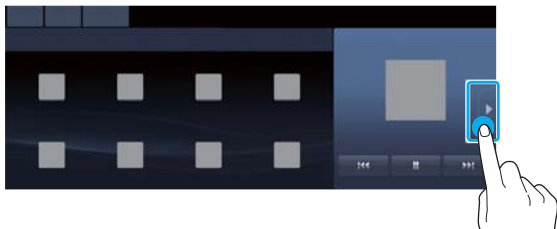

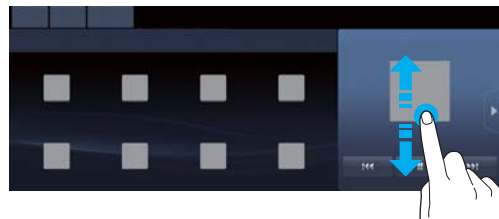

Finding a route quickly

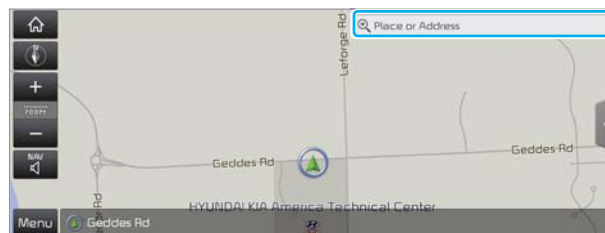
You can find a route to your destination quickly and start the navigation.

1 On the Home screen, touch the map area.

Alternatively, if your system has the [MAP] button on the control panel, press the [MAP] button.



2 On the map, touch **Place or Address**.



The **Place or Address** field appears only when the transmission shift lever is in the "P" (Park) position.

3 Enter location information, such as a place name, an address, or coordinates, and touch **OK**.

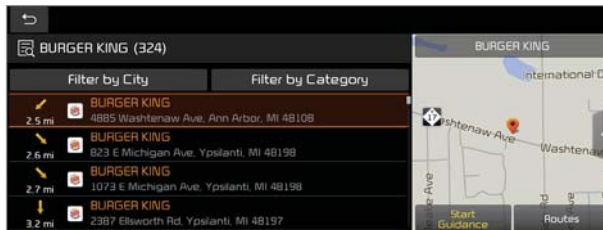


- ▼: View the recent keywords list.
- MI: Narrow the search range to a desired region. Touch ▼ to view the recent states list.
- ↑: Switch to the uppercase mode.
- ✕: Delete the entered characters.

- **&#**: Switch to the symbol input mode.
- **ABC**: Switch to the alphabet input mode.
- **AAA**: Switch to the accent input mode.
- **—**: Enter a space.
- **·**: Enter a punctuation mark.
- **⚙**: Change the keyboard settings.

4 Select a location from the search result list.

- To filter the search results by region, touch **Filter by City**.
- To filter the search results by POI category, touch **Filter by Category**.



5 Touch **Start Guidance**.



- You can use various search methods available in the navigation menu. On the All Menus screen, tap **Navigation Menu**. ▶ See p.5-8 "Finding a route with various search methods."
- If the HD Radio or SiriusXM service is available for traffic information, the corresponding icon will appear at the top of the navigation screen.

Caution

Depending on the region you are driving in or the driving conditions, information on the map may differ from the actual road conditions.

- When converted to an electronic map, the road shape may be altered. If the navigation guidance is different from the actual road, use your judgment and take the appropriate road.
- The navigation guidance may differ from the actual road due to the time difference between the map production and your driving. Drive according to the current road conditions and traffic regulations. When you reach the section of the route that matches the actual road, the navigation will resume your route correctly.

Notes on navigation

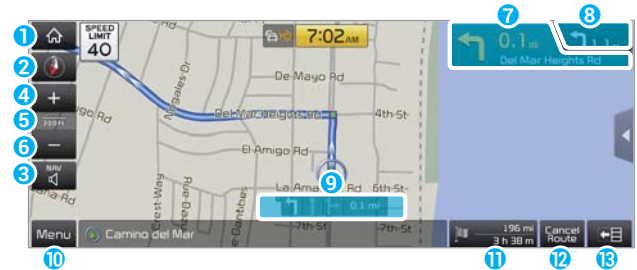
- The location of your vehicle displayed on the screen may temporarily differ from the actual location in the following situations:
 - When you are driving on a narrow Y-shaped or spiral road
 - When another road is located close to the current road
 - When you are driving on a road with a lot of high buildings nearby

- When you are driving on a road under construction or a new road
- When your vehicle is transported by a car ferry or a towing car
- When you are driving on a road on a steep mountain or a road with a sharp curve
- When your vehicle enters a road after rotating on a turn table of an underground parking lot or a multistory parking lot
- When you start and stop repeatedly or drive slowly at an intersection
- When you turn on your system just after charging or replacing the discharged battery
- When you are driving in slippery conditions, such as in heavy sand or snow
- When the tires have been replaced recently or when studless tires or spare tires are used
- When improper-sized tires are used or the pressure of each tire is different
- When the replacement tire is worn, especially studless tires that have been used for more than two seasons
- When a roof carrier has been installed on your vehicle
- While a long distance route is being calculated on a highway. In this circumstance, continued driving will enable the system to conduct map matching or use updated GPS information to provide the current location information.

- The navigation guidance may be incorrect temporarily depending on search conditions or your driving position:
 - The navigation may instruct you to go straight when you are driving on a straight road.
 - The navigation guidance may stop while you are driving an intersection or just after turning at an intersection.
 - The navigation may instruct you to take a U-turn at a location where a U-turn is prohibited.
 - The navigation may instruct you to take prohibited roads, such as roads marked as no trespassing or roads under construction.
 - The navigation may instruct you to a distant location from your destination when there is no road or where only narrow roads to the destination exist.
 - The navigation guidance may be incorrect when you are off your route.
 - The navigation estimate to your destination may differ from the actual distance due to the difference in the starting point of the road on a overpass or an underpass.
 - When you are driving at high speeds, route recalculations may take longer.

Getting to know the navigation screen

You can use the following functions and information on the navigation screen.



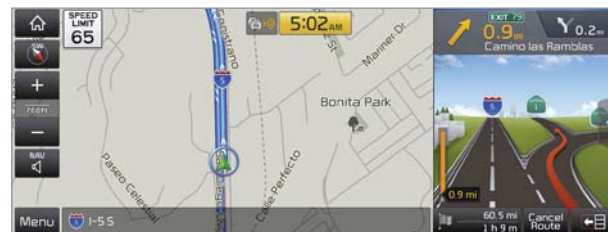
- 1 Move to the Home screen.
- 2 Change how the map is displayed.
- 3 Adjust the navigation sound volume.
- 4 Zoom in.
- 5 Set to fix the map scale or to set it to change automatically according to driving conditions.
- 6 Zoom out.
- 7 Information about this turn point
- 8 Information about the next turn point

- 9 Lane guidance
 - Yellow: The recommended lane
 - White: Lanes you can choose
 - Gray: Lanes to avoid
- 10 Display the quick menus you can use for navigation guidance.
- 11 View the distance to your destination and the estimated arrival time. Touch to view detailed destination information.
- 12 Stop the navigation guidance.
- 13 Hide or display the split screen.

Viewing the split screen

The screen splits automatically when you need to take a turn or change lane and displays detailed information.

To hide or display the split screen, touch  or .



On the split screen, you can view brief or detailed information about each section of the route.

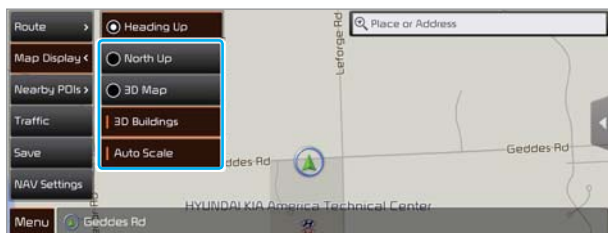


- 1 Set to view additional information about highway exits or rest areas on the split screen.
- 2 Access information about POIs around the highway exit.

Changing the default map view settings

You can change the default view mode of the map screen.

On the navigation screen, touch **Menu ► Map Display** and select a view mode or set to display nearby buildings.



 To change the navigation settings other than the default map view settings, touch **Menu ► NAV Settings**.

Adjusting the navigation sound volume

You can adjust the sound volume of the navigation guidance including GPS alert beeps.

Touch  on the navigation screen and touch **+** or **-** or drag the adjustment bar to adjust the volume level.

To mute the voice guidance, touch . You can also set to hear the voice guidance prior to the AV audio.



 You can set to use the [VOL] knob or the [VOL +/VOL -] lever to adjust the navigation sound volume while the voice guidance is playing. On the Home screen, touch **All Menus ► Setup ► Sound ► Navigation Volume** and select **Use Map Screen Volume Buttons or Volume Knob**.

Canceling the navigation

To stop the navigation guidance and cancel the set destination, touch **Cancel Route ► Yes**.

The destination mark at the bottom of the screen disappears.

UVO services

UVO provides connected car services, such as roadside assistance and emergency rescue, via the latest IT and communication technologies.

Once subscribed, you can access UVO services via the buttons on the inside rearview mirror. You can also access other useful features using the UVO menu on your system.

Refer to the UVO Service Manual for more UVO features.



- You must be an active UVO subscriber or within the initial free trial period to receive UVO services, including Auto Crash Notifications.
- Depending on conditions, such as the vehicle type, the system type, or the subscribed service package, available services may vary.
- Some services may incur additional charges.
- Services may be modified, added, or deleted according to changes in the company's policies.

Activating the service

Once you sign up for UVO, you must activate the service to use it on the system.

On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► UVO Settings ► Service Activation**.



Caution

Do not stop the engine while the activation is in progress. Doing so may cause a system malfunction.



- If the activation fails, contact the UVO Center.
- While the activation is in progress, the system buttons will be locked.

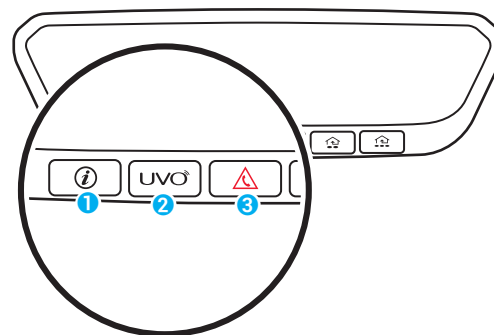
Service limitations

Because the UVO service is provided via mobile networks, the use of the service may be restricted depending on the mobile network status. Check the network signal icon (📶) at the top line of the screen to see if the network signal strength is proper.

- It is recommended to use the service when the network signal icon has more than four signal bars.
- Depending on the mobile network status, the use of the UVO service may be affected in the following places:
 - In a building or tunnel
 - In a mountain or dense forest
 - On a road close to cliffs
 - In an area with a lot of high buildings
 - On a highway or a road under overpass
 - Out of a service area based on the mobile network service provider's coverage policy

Locating the UVO buttons

You can access UVO services via the buttons on the inside rearview mirror.

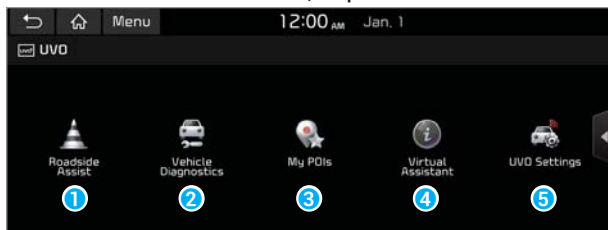


- ❶ Call the UVO Center.
 - ❷ Start Voice Local Search to search for locations with voice commands.
 - ❸ Call for an emergency service.
- Depending on vehicle models and specifications, the illustration may differ from the product's actual appearance and layout.

Using the UVO menu

You can use the UVO service via the UVO menu on the system.

On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO**.



- 1 Provides services including emergency assistance and vehicle towing in case of a vehicle anomaly or emergency through a connection to the UVO center.
- 2 Diagnoses anomalies in the vehicle and checks diagnostic results.
- 3 Displays the POI information transmitted via webpages, the user's smartphone, etc.
- 4 Connects to the UVO center and provides information about the UVO features.
- 5 Displays Service Activation, 911 Connect, and Modem Information.

Viewing driving information

You can see your driving patterns by checking information such as driving time, distance, idling time ratio, and speed distribution. Use driving information for safe and economical vehicle operation.

1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Driving Info**.

2 View your vehicle's driving information.

To view the latest information, touch **Update**.



You can use this function only when your vehicle is stationary with the engine is running.

Using the Roadside Assist

Roadside Assist provides services including emergency assistance and vehicle towing in case of a vehicle anomaly or emergency through a connection to the UVO center.

You can still use the Roadside Assist feature without activating in UVO. However, the Roadside Assist feature is not available if your UVO period is expired. When your service period is expired, please reactivate your service to use the Roadside Assist feature.

Use the desired method.

- On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► Roadside Assist**.
- On the inside rearview mirror, press the [] button.



- You can still use the Roadside Assist feature without registering for UVO.
- If you have no network coverage, please move to a new location and try again.

Diagnosing your vehicle

■ Manual Diagnostics

Vehicle Diagnostics diagnoses anomalies in the vehicle and provides diagnostic results. UVO Activation(Enrollment) is needed to use Vehicle Diagnostics. This feature is only available when the vehicle is stationary because there are controls that are undiagnosable when the vehicle is in motion. If you switch to another screen during Vehicle Diagnostics, Vehicle Diagnostics will be cancelled.

1 On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► Vehicle Diagnostics**.

2 Select the desired item.

- **Schedule Service** : Requests a service from your preferred dealership or a nearby dealership.
- **Roadside Assist** : Connects to the center for Roadside Assist. (For more information, see the Roadside Assist section.)

3 If you select **Schedule Service**, choose your desired option.

- **Preferred** : Sends vehicle diagnostics results to the registered dealer on MYUVO.com to request a phone appointment.
- **Nearby** : Receives a list of nearby dealers, and after you have selected a dealer, sends vehicle diagnostics results to the dealer to request a phone appointment.



To send a Schedule Service request to a preferred dealer, please register the dealer on MyUVO.com first.

Auto Diagnostics

The Vehicle Diagnostics (Auto Diagnostics) feature automatically performs diagnostics on your car when a warning light comes on the cluster panel and displays the details of the vehicle malfunction on the screen for the driver.



If Vehicle Diagnostics (Auto Diagnostics) was unsuccessful, the diagnostics is automatically performed again when you turn on your vehicle.

My POIs

My POIs allows you to check a list of POIs that were transmitted via a webpages or your smartphone, etc.

You need to sign up for UVO to use My POIs.

When a list of POIs is downloaded, a notification pop-up appears on the screen. (Not applicable to the Rear View Camera screen and the Agree screen.)

Up to 200 POIs can be stored. If the available storage space is exceeded, the oldest POI is automatically deleted.

1 On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► My POIs**.

2 Select the desired POI to view detailed information about it.

- **Phone Number** : If you select Phone Number, a call is made to the phone number.
- **Address** : If you select Address, the address is plotted on the on-screen map.



If the address of the desired POI is located outside the U.S., the map screen is not displayed.

Deleting My POIs

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► My POIs ► Menu ► Delete**.
- 2 Select a POI you wish to delete and select **Delete**.
 - **Mark All** : Description Mark All
 - **Unmark All** : Deselects all the selected POIs.
 - **Delete** : Deletes the selected POIs.

Virtual Assistant

Virtual Assistant connects to the UVO center and provides information about the UVO features.

The Virtual Assistant feature is not available if your UVO period is expired. When your service period is expired, please reactivate your service to use the Virtual Assistant feature.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **UVO ► Virtual Assistant**.
- 2 Select the desired POI to view detailed information about it.
 - **Keypad** : Displays the numeric keypad.
 - **End** : Ends Call.



The Virtual Assistant is not available during a Bluetooth call.

UVO Settings

For more details, refer to **Settings ► UVO**.

Using Voice Local Search

With UVO, you can search for locations from the online map database by using voice commands.

If you did not update the map or system or you cannot find your destination in the navigation, you can use the latest information from the online server to search for locations and receive guidance.

- 1 On the inside rearview mirror, press the [UVO] button.

Voice recognition starts with a voice guidance.

- 2 After the voice guidance ends and you hear a beep, say a command.

To search for a location by entering a keyword manually using the keyboard, touch .

- 3 To end voice recognition, touch  on the screen or press the [UVO] button on the inside rearview mirror.



- This feature operates separately from voice recognition that is activated by the [UVO] button on the steering wheel.
- Depending on the system language, voice recognition may not be supported.

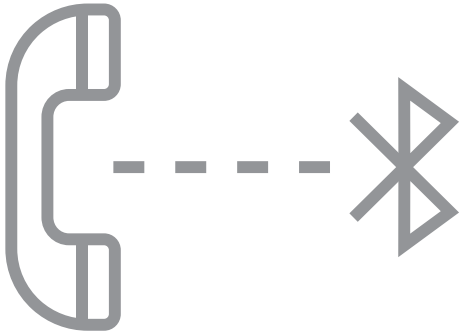

Bluetooth function

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless networking technology. The Bluetooth function allows you to exchange data by connecting a Bluetooth device to another neighboring Bluetooth device without a cable connection. With this function, you can use multiple devices more efficiently.

Warning

Pull over the vehicle at a safe place before connecting a Bluetooth device to the system. When a traffic accident occurs while attempting connection, it may cause severe or fatal injury.

-  To use the Bluetooth function, connect a device that supports Bluetooth communication such as mobile phone or MP3 player. Make sure that the device supports Bluetooth communication.
- The Bluetooth connection function supports only the hands-free and audio related functions. Connect your mobile phone, MP3 player, or device that supports the hands-free or audio function.
- For more information about compatible devices, visit the company website at <http://www.kia.com>.

Registering a device

To connect a Bluetooth device to the system, first add the device to the list of Bluetooth devices on the system.

 You can add Bluetooth devices up to 6.

1 Use the desired method.

- On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Device Connections ► Bluetooth ► Bluetooth Connections ► Add New**.
- On the steering wheel, press the [] button.
- On the All Menus screen, tap **Phone**.

2 Select the function to connect.



3 Turn on Bluetooth on the Bluetooth device to connect and select the vehicle system on the list of searched devices.

 The system's Bluetooth name can be seen on the Add New window.



4 Check that the authentication code on the Bluetooth device screen matches the one on the system screen and approve the connection on the device.



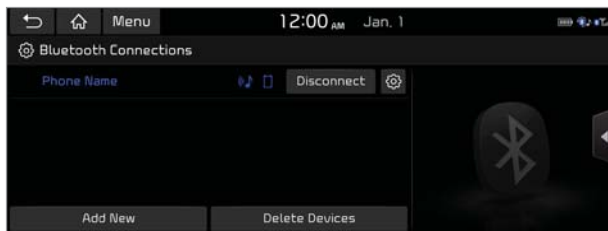
- When your Bluetooth device is a mobile phone, to download the contacts and messages from the phone, you must allow the access request on the mobile phone.
- After the access request is approved, it may take a while until Bluetooth connection is completed. As soon as Bluetooth connection is completed, the Bluetooth connection indicator icon appears at the top of the screen.
- Access to data can be enabled or disabled by using the Bluetooth Settings menu on the mobile phone. For more details, refer to the mobile phone's user manual.
- You cannot register another device while operating a Bluetooth device.
- In order not to use the automatic Bluetooth connection, turn off the Bluetooth function on the device.

Connecting a registered device

To use a Bluetooth device, first connect a registered Bluetooth device to the system.

 You can connect a single Bluetooth hands-free kit or two Bluetooth audio devices.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Device Connections ► Bluetooth ► Bluetooth Connections**.
- 2 Tap the device name to connect or tap **Connect**.



- 
- When the connection is terminated abnormally due to being out of range or device failures, the connection is automatically restored as soon as the device returns to the connection range or normal state.
 - When connection is unstable due to a Bluetooth communication error, on the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Device Connections ► Bluetooth ► Reset** to reset the Bluetooth function and connect the device again.

Disconnecting a registered device

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Device Connections ► Bluetooth ► Bluetooth Connections**.
- 2 Tap the connected device name or tap **Disconnect**.

Deleting a registered device

If you will no longer use a Bluetooth device or you want to add a new device when 6 devices are already registered, delete an existing registered device.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Device Connections ► Bluetooth ► Bluetooth Connections ► Delete Devices**.
- 2 Select a device to delete and tap **Delete**.
To delete all registered devices, tap **Mark All ► Delete**.
- 3 Tap **Yes**.

Sending or receiving a call via Bluetooth

You can connect to Bluetooth and make a call without manipulating your mobile phone. See the call information on the system screen and make a call easily by using the embedded microphone and speaker.

Warning

- Pull over the vehicle at a safe place before connecting your mobile phone. When a traffic accident occurs while attempting connection, it may cause severe or fatal injury.
- While driving, do not make a call by dialing a phone number or do not pick up your phone to talk. Distraction by the use of a mobile phone may cause you not to recognize traffic flow around and not to cope with unexpected situations. As a result, a traffic accident may occur. If necessary, use the Bluetooth hands-free function and make the call as short as possible.



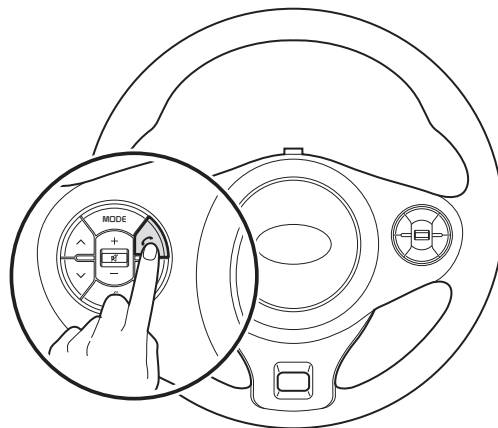
With voice recognition, you can make a call easily without manipulating the system screen while driving. ▶ See page 11-1 “Voice Recognition.”

Making a call via Bluetooth

You can connect a Bluetooth device with the hands-free function to use a Bluetooth phone.

1 Use the desired method.

- On the All Menus screen, tap **Phone**.
- On the steering wheel, press the  button.



2 Tap .

3 Use the keypad to enter a phone number and tap .

 When contacts are on the system, search for the desired contact by entering the initial letters or number on the keypad (e.g. John Doe ► JD).



Using the connection menus

You can use the Bluetooth call-related menus.

On the Bluetooth call screen, tap **Menu** and use the desired option.

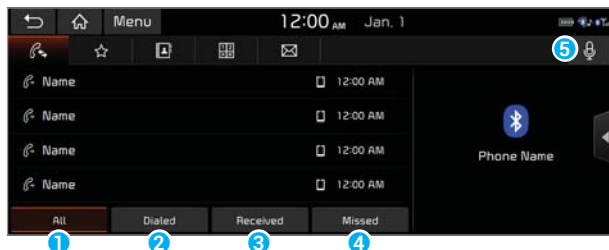
- **Change Device:** Can change the connected device. This option is available when multiple Bluetooth devices are registered.
- **Privacy Mode:** Can hide the lists for contacts, recent calls, favorites, and messages on the screen.
- **Bluetooth Preferences:** Can configure the settings for Bluetooth connection. ► See page 7-2 “Bluetooth function.”
- **Bluetooth Settings:** Can change the Bluetooth settings.
- **Split Screen:** Can turn on or off the split screen mode.

Using the recent calls list

1 On the Bluetooth Call screen, tap .

2 Tap a desired call from the list.

 You can move to a desired number by pushing the [^/▼] lever on the steering wheel without tapping on the screen.



1 Can see all the call records.

2 Can see only sent calls.

3 Can see only received calls.

4 Can see only missing calls.

5 Can use the voice recognition to make a call.

3 Tap the contact to make a call.



- To download the recent call records, tap **Menu** ► **Download**. You can download up to 50 call records for each list.

- You cannot download call records when the download is prohibited by the phone. Some phone models may require approval for a download. When a successful download is not made, check the phone screen or its settings.
- When call records are newly downloaded, the previous records are removed.
- The sending, reception, and call times do not appear on the system screen.

Using the contacts list

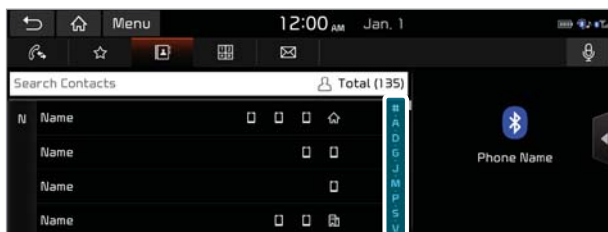
You can use the contacts list on the connected phone.

■ Making a call to a contact

1 On the Bluetooth call screen, tap .

2 Tap a contact to make a call.

 You can search for a desired contact from the contacts list after tapping the index.



■ Loading contacts

You can download contacts from the connected phone.

1 On the Bluetooth call screen, tap .

2 Tap **Menu ► Download**.

The contacts on the connected phone and its SIM card are downloaded at the same time.

-  • The contacts on the SIM card may not be downloaded in case of some phone models.
- You can download only the contacts that can be displayed on the connected Bluetooth device. The contacts may not appear in some applications.
- You can download up to 5,000 contacts for each device.
- The download may not work in some phone models. For more information about compatibility, visit the company website at <http://www.kia.com>.
- The downloaded contacts may be lost depending on the system specifications.
- When speed dial numbers are set to contacts on the phone, press and hold a speed dial number on the keypad to make a call easily. Some mobile phone models may not support the speed dial function.



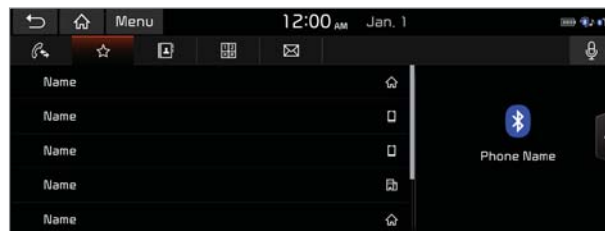
- You cannot download contacts when the download is prohibited by the phone. Some phone models may require approval for a download. When a successful download is not made, check the phone screen or its settings.
- Depending on the phone model or operation status, downloading may take longer than usual.
- When a new contacts list is downloaded, the previous records are removed.
- The downloaded contacts cannot be edited or deleted from the system.
- When another mobile phone is connected, the screen does not display the contacts downloaded from the previous phone but they are kept in the system until the phone is deleted from the list.

Using favorite contacts

You can register a list of frequently used phone numbers and use it to make a call easily.

■ Adding a favorite contact

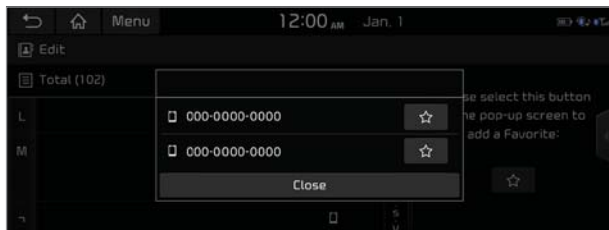
- 1 On the Bluetooth call screen, tap ☆.



- 2 On the favorites screen, tap **Add New** and select a name from the displayed list.

- 3 Tap the gray star button (☆) next to the phone number to add to the favorite contacts list.

The color of the button becomes orange and the phone number is added to the list.



- To edit or delete a phone number in the favorite contacts list, tap **Menu ► Edit** or **Delete**.
- You can add up to 10 favorite contacts for each device.
- In the favorite contacts list, the default emergency phone number is set for use upon emergency.
- When another mobile phone is connected, the screen does not display the contacts from the previous phone but they are kept in the system until the phone is deleted from the list.

■ Editing a favorite contact

- 1 On the Bluetooth call screen, tap ☆.
- 2 Tap **Menu ► Edit** and edit the contact.

■ Deleting a favorite contact

- 1 On the Bluetooth call screen, tap ☆.
- 2 Tap **Menu ► Delete**.
- 3 Select a phone number to delete and tap **Delete ► Yes**.

Answering a call

When there is an incoming call, the call notification window appears.



To answer the call, tap **Accept**.

Alternatively, press the [>] button on the steering wheel.

Rejecting a call

To reject a call, tap **Reject**.

Alternatively, press the [>] button on the steering wheel.

 To reject by sending a call-reject message, tap **Messages**.
From the list, select the call-reject message and tap **Send**.

Putting a call on hold

To close the incoming call notification and put the call on hold for a moment, tap **Hold**.

-  • To return to the incoming call window, press the [>] button on the steering wheel.
- The call-reject or auto reply message may not be supported in some phone models.
- You can set to automatically reject an incoming call and send the auto reply message to the caller. ► [See page 13-5 “Configuring Bluetooth connection settings.”](#)
- When a mobile phone is connected to the system, the vehicle’s speaker may be used to output a call tone even after you leave the vehicle. To disconnect the call, disable the Bluetooth connection on the system or turn off the Bluetooth function on the mobile phone.

Using functions during a call

During a call, the following screen appears.

Use the desired option by tapping a button.



- 1 Can turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you.
- 2 Can adjust the microphone volume.
- 3 Displays the keypad screen.
- 4 Used to switch the call to the mobile phone. This option may not be available in some phone models.
- 5 Used to end a call.



- When a caller is in the contact list, the caller's name and phone number appear. Otherwise, only the phone number appears.
- During a call with a Bluetooth connection, you cannot switch to another screen such as AV mode.
- Depending on the phone model, the call volume of the other party may differ.
- Depending on the phone model, the telephone number may not appear.

Switching to another call

You can receive another incoming call while in a call. This option is available only when the connected mobile phone supports the call hold function. The previous call is put on hold.

To switch between two calls, use the desired option.

- Tap **Switch**.
- Tap a displayed phone number.



 This option may not be available in some phone models.

Checking a message

After connecting a mobile phone via Bluetooth, you can check the received messages through the system screen and listen to voice messages converted from the text messages. This option is available when a mobile phone is connected via Bluetooth. You can also send the brief reply message registered in the system.

- 1 On the Bluetooth Call screen, tap .
- 2 Select a message from the list.
- 3 Check the message.

Using the connection menus

You can use the menus for Bluetooth messages.

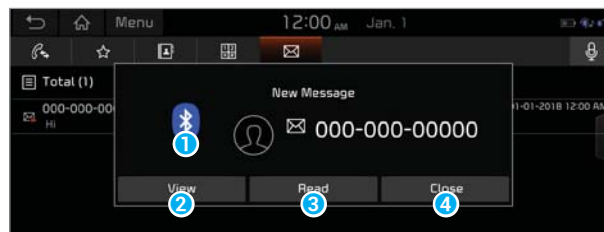
On the Bluetooth message screen, tap **Menu** and use the desired option.

- **Change Device:** Can change the connected device. This option is available when multiple Bluetooth devices are registered.
- **Privacy Mode:** Can hide the lists for contacts, recent calls, favorites, and messages on the screen.
- **Message Settings:** Displays the message settings screen.

- **Bluetooth Preferences:** Can configure the Bluetooth connection settings. ▶ See page 7-2 “Bluetooth function.”
- **Bluetooth Settings:** Can change the Bluetooth settings.
- **Split Screen:** Can turn on or off the split screen mode.

Checking a new message

When a message is received, the new message notification window appears.

To check the message, tap **View**.



- 1 Can see the sender.
- 2 Can see the message details.
- 3 Reads out the message through the speakers in the vehicle.
- 4 Used to close the notification window.

 The message notification window does not appear when the privacy mode is enabled or the message notification is turned off.

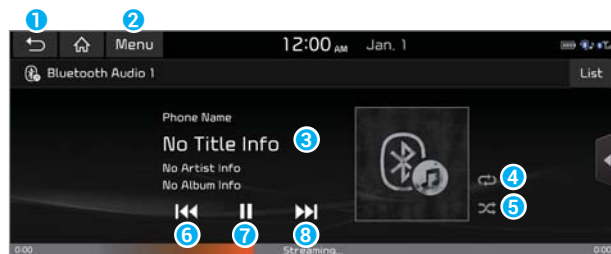
Listening to music via Bluetooth

You can connect a Bluetooth audio device to listen to music on the device through the vehicle's speaker.

1 On the control panel, press the [MEDIA] button.

 When multiple media are connected, press the [MEDIA] button once more, and on the media selection window, tap **Bluetooth Audio**.

Can play the previous file by double-tapping the icon.
- ⑦ Can pause or resume playback.
- ⑧ Can play the next file.

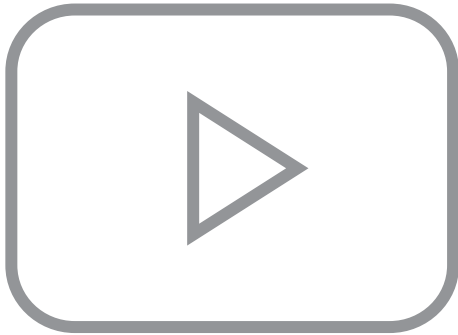
-  The player can be manipulated in the same way as in the media player. ▶ See page 8-3 “Manipulating the Media Player.”
- The operations may differ depending on the connected Bluetooth device or phone model and the music player application.

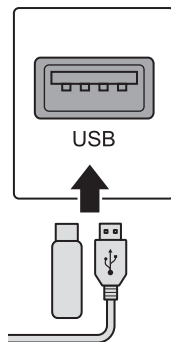

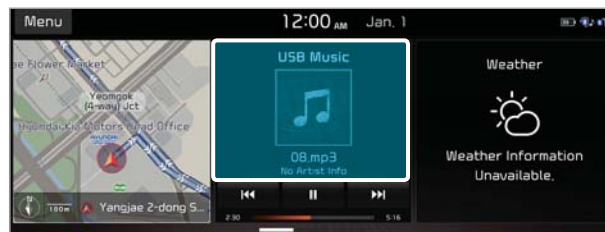

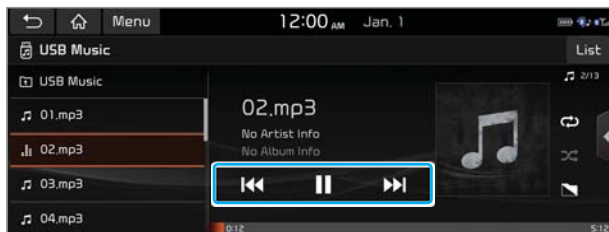

- On the control panel, tap and hold the [**<SEEK**] or [**TRACK>**] button.
- On the steering wheel, press and hold the [**⏮**] lever.

 When you run the Media Player with a Bluetooth audio device connected, you can rewind or fast-forward playback by using the buttons on the control panel or steering wheel.

Resuming playback of the current music or video

Playing the previous or next music or video

- When there is no operation for 5 seconds, the search stops and the system displays the information of the playing content.

Setting to repeat playback

Tap  repeatedly.

Each time the icon is tapped, the playback repetition modes are toggled and the activated mode icon appears on the screen.

 The active mode differs depending on the playing media or list.

Setting to do random playback

Tap  repeatedly.

Each time the icon is tapped, the random playback mode is turned on and off. When the random playback mode is active, the screen displays the random playback mode icon.

-  • The active random playback mode differs depending on the playing media or list.
- The random playback does not support for video files.
 - For more information about media sources, see descriptions for each media source. The Bluetooth audio mode is described in the chapter, “Bluetooth.”

Using the USB mode

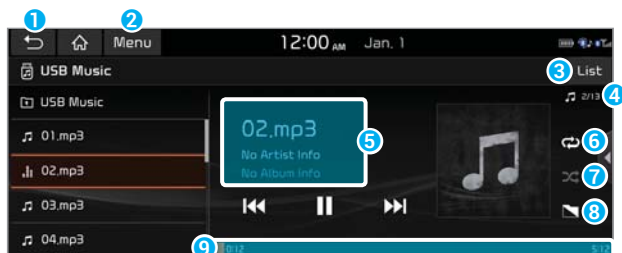
In USB mode, you can play media files on a mobile device such as USB storage or MP3 player.

 Check that the device is compatible and the media file formats are available. ▶ See page 15-7 “USB mode.”

Listening to music

- 1 Connect a USB device to the multimedia USB port in your vehicle.
 - 2 Use the desired method. Media Player appears in full screen.
 - On the Home screen, tap the AV info area.
 - On the control panel, press the [**MEDIA**] button.

- ❻ Can set the repeat playback mode.
- ❼ Can set the random playback mode.
- ❽ Can delete the file that is playing.
- ❾ Can see the duration of the playing song and the current playback position.



Caution

- Be sure to start the engine before connecting a USB device. When you start the engine after connecting a USB device, the USB device may get damaged.
- Be careful of static electricity when connecting or removing a USB device. It may cause a system failure.
- Be careful for your body or any object not to contact the multimedia USB port. It may cause an accident or system failures.
- Do not repeatedly connect and remove the USB connector within a short time. It may cause device errors or system failures.
- Do not use a USB device for purposes other than playback. When you connect a USB for charging or heating, the system performance may decrease or it may cause system failures.



- When connecting a USB storage, do not use a separate extension cable and directly connect to the multimedia USB port. When you connect a USB storage via a USB hub or extension cable, the device may not be recognized.
- Push the USB connector all the way into the multimedia USB port. When the connector is not fully inserted, a communication problem may occur.
- Noise may occur when removing a USB device from the system.
- You can play only the files that have been encoded in the standard format.
- The following USB devices may not be recognized or may not work properly.
 - Encrypted MP3 players
 - USB devices that are not recognized as removable disks
- USB devices may not be recognized depending on the device status.
- Some USB devices may not be supported due to compatibility issues.
- USB device recognition may take longer than usual depending on the device type, capacity, and file formats on the device.
- Some devices may not be charged through USB connection. It depends on the USB specifications.
- You can delete files in the USB storage devices formatted in FAT16/32. The deleted files are moved to the “Hidden_” folder.

Seeing the music file list

- 1 On the USB music playback screen, tap **List**.
- 2 Tap the screen to open a folder, or move to another category to play the desired music file.



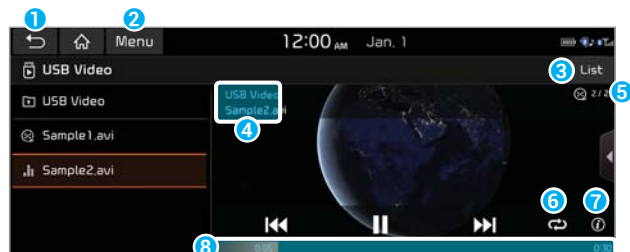

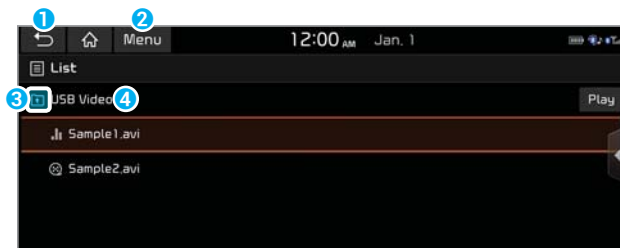

Radio screen

The radio screen provides various functions while listening to radio broadcasts.



- 1 Used to return to the previous screen.
- 2 Used to run any of related menus.
 - **Station List:** Can see the list of available radio stations.
 - **Auto-sort Presets:** Can sort the presets list according to the order of radio station frequencies.
 - **Reorder Presets:** Can change the channels on the presets list by dragging.
 - **Delete Presets:** Can delete a registered channel from the presets list.
 - **Sound Settings:** Can configure system sound settings.
▶ See page 13-8 "Configuring the sound settings."
 - **Split Screen:** Can turn on or off the split screen mode.
- 3 Select a radio mode.
- 4 Activate the HD Radio mode.
- 5 You can also use radio commands for voice recognition.
▶ See page 11-7 "Radio commands."

- 6 Displays the presets list. When you select a desired channel from the list, you can listen to the corresponding radio broadcast. When you tab and hold the current channel, the channel is added to the presets list.
 - 7 Displays the frequency and other information of the current channel.
 - 8 Can register the current frequency to the presets list. When you tab the icon once again, the icon is disabled and the frequency is deleted from the presets list.
 - 9 Split Screen: Can turn on or off the split screen mode.
 - 10 You can listen to each channel for a short time and select a desired channel.
- The broadcast station names and local information are displayed using GPS data. Those information may not appear when there is no GPS data received.
 - The displayed broadcast station names may not match the actual ones.

Changing the radio mode

Use the desired method.

The radio mode changes in the order of **FM** ► **AM** ► **SiriusXM**.

- On the radio screen, press the [**Band**] button repeatedly.

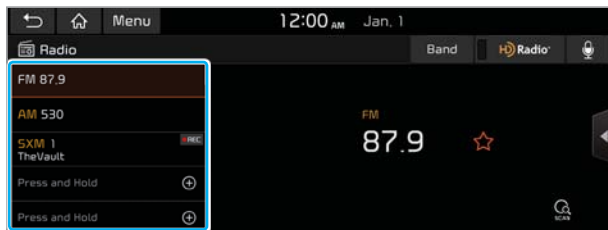
Selecting a channel

Selecting a channel from the presets list

Use the desired method.

- On the radio screen, tap a desired channel from the presets list.
- On the steering wheel, press the [$\wedge/\vee$] lever.

You can listen to the previous or next channel in the presets list.



Moving to the previous/next channel

You can move to the previous or next channel nearest to the current channel.

On the control panel, press the [**<SEEK**] or [**TRACK>**] button.



- Only the channels with good reception are searched.
- To move to another frequency range faster, press and hold the [**<SEEK**] or [**TRACK>**] button. When the pressed button is released, you can listen to the previous or next channel nearest to the current channel.

Selecting a channel by the frequency

When you know an accurate frequency, turn the [**TUNE/FILE**] knob on the control panel to change the frequency.

Using the scan function

You can listen to each broadcast briefly and select a desired one.

- 1 On the radio screen, tap .
Only the channels with good reception can be listened for 5 seconds in turn.
- 2 When you find the desired broadcast, tap .
You can listen to the scanned channel continuously.

Registering the current channel

When you register the current channel, you can easily select it later.



- You can register up to channels.
- To arrange the presets according to the order of frequencies, tap **Menu ▶ Auto-sort Presets**.

Registering a channel into the selected preset number

While listening to a broadcast, tap and hold an empty preset number with no channel on the radio screen.

The current channel is registered into the selected preset number.



When you tap and hold a preset number occupied by a channel, the assigned channel is replaced by a new one.

Registering the current channel on the radio screen

While listening to a broadcast, tap ☆ in the middle of the screen.

The current channel is registered to the first empty preset in the presets list.



When the current channel is already assigned and you tap the ☆ icon, the channel is deleted from the list.

Editing the channel list

Changing the order of registered channels

- 1 On the radio screen, tap **Menu ► Reorder Presets**.
- 2 In the presets list, tap and hold the ≡ icon next to the channel to change its sequence and then drag it to another position.
- 3 Tap the ↩ button.
The presets list is updated with the sequences changed.

Deleting a registered channel

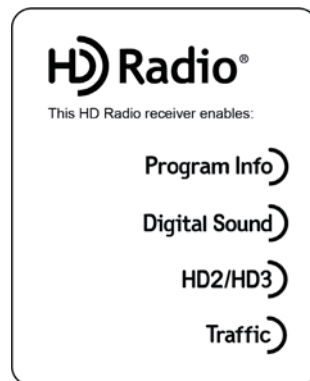

Digital Sound

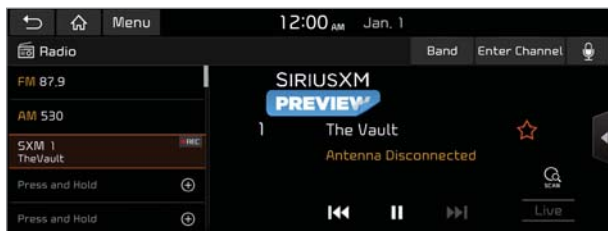
Listening to SiriusXM™ radio

You can listen to radio channels provided by SiriusXM, a satellite radio service. Various kinds of channels, such as music, sports, and news, are available via streaming or live broadcast.



- SiriusXM service requires a subscription (sold separately) after the three-month trial included with the vehicle expires. Voice recognition function

With the voice recognition function, you can access various functions for multimedia without manipulating the screen or buttons. This function prevents driver distraction and dangerous situations.

Use voice commands to access various functions easily.

-  • The system can recognize the specified voice commands. ▶ See page 11-5 “List of voice commands” or the [voice recognition help](#).
- Note the following for accurate delivery of command when saying it.
 - Pronounce a command accurately and naturally like a conversation.
 - Keep the correct posture and say a command toward the microphone. The microphone is embedded in the upper area of the rear-view mirror.
- Voice recognition is automatically ended when:
 - You make or receive a call.
 - A media source is connected or disconnected.
 - The front or rear cameras operate (* if equipped),
 - The **[RADIO]** or **[MEDIA]** button is pressed to perform another function.
 - Rerouting or other unexpected action is made due to deviation from the route during guidance.



- Voice recognition may not work properly when:
 - The sunroof or windows are open so the wind is strong.
 - The fan speed of the air conditioner or heater is high (level 3 or below is recommended).
 - The vehicle is passing through a tunnel.
 - The vehicle is driving on an unpaved road and its noise and vibration are loud.
 - Noise is loud due to a heavy rain or storm.

Voice recognition screen

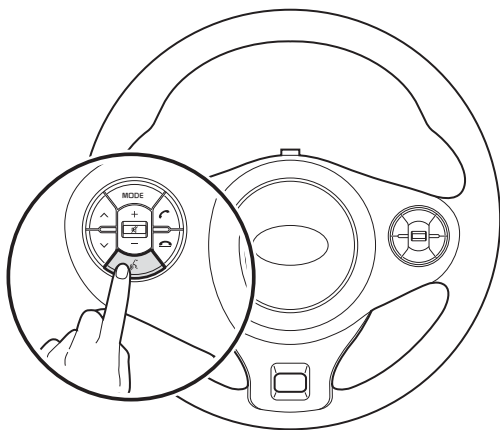

Running the voice recognition

1 On the steering wheel, press the [⏏] button.

Voice recognition starts along with voice guidance.

 To skip the voice guidance, press the [⏏] button on the steering wheel.



2 When a beep sound is heard, say a command to perform (e.g. navigation, music, call). ▶ See page 11-5 “List of voice commands” or the voice recognition help.

The recognized command appears in text at the top of the screen and the corresponding function is performed.

-  • When an additional command is required to perform, the commands that can be followed in the next step appear on the screen. Say a command or tap a command.
- When there are several similar commands, say a command number to perform.

3 To end the voice recognition, perform one of the following options:

- In standby mode for voice recognition, say "Exit."
- On the steering wheel, press and hold the [🔊] button.
- On the voice recognition screen, tap **Exit**.

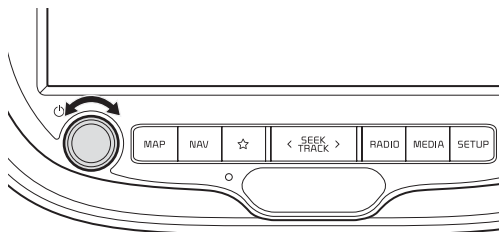


- When the [🔊] button is pressed in standby mode for voice recognition, the standby time is extended.
- When the voice recognition is not available in the multimedia system, press the [🔊] button on the steering wheel and use the voice recognition on your smartphone via phone projection. ► See page 9-1 :Phone Projection."

Adjusting the voice guidance volume

Adjust the voice guidance volume when the system volume is so low or high and it interferes with your driving.

When the voice recognition is active, turn the [VOL] knob on the control panel.

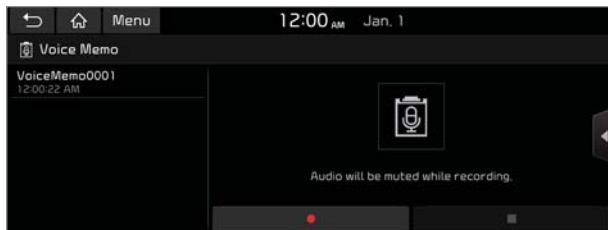

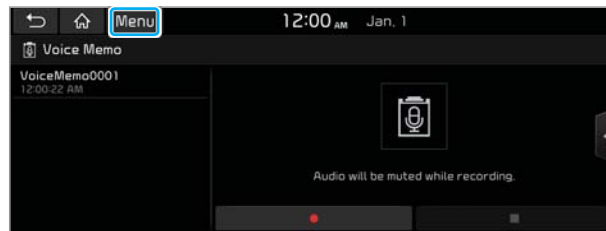

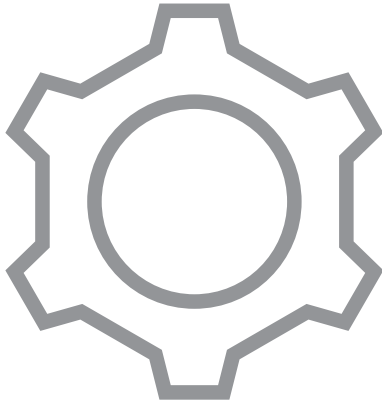

You can change the settings for driving and related environments.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Vehicle**.
- 2 Select and then change the settings.

Head-Up Display	Can configure the head up display settings such as display height and brightness.
Driver Assistance	Can configure various functions that assist the driver while driving, such as smart cruise control and safety options.
Drive Mode	Can change the drive mode or set the display mode.
Economical	Can configure driving-related options that can save energy.
Lights	Can configure the settings for vehicle lights.
Door/Trunk (or Tailgate)	Can configure the settings for door and trunk controls.

Cluster	Can configure information displayed on the instrument cluster panel, such as service interval notification, display information, and initialization.
Convenience	Can configure the settings for rear-seat occupant alert, wireless charging, and boarding convenience.
Seat/Steering	Can configure convenience functions such as seat position change alert, heater & ventilation features, and boarding.
Digital Key	Can use the digital key to lock or unlock the doors and start the engine.
Reset	Can reset all options and menu settings in the vehicle.



- Available settings may differ depending on the vehicle model and specifications.
- Depending on the climate system, some functions may not be supported.

Configuring the climate system settings

You can change the settings of the climate system.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Climate**.
- 2 Select and then change the settings.

ADS (Auto Defog System)	When the sensor detects fog on the windshield that is generated by temperature difference, it automatically turns on the air conditioner to blow cool air toward the windshield for removal.
SMART VENT (Smart Ventilation)	When the humidity increases in the vehicle with the climate system off, it automatically vent the air out to maintain a pleasant indoor environment.
CO2 Ventilation	When the carbon dioxide increases in the vehicle with the climate system on, it automatically vent the air out to maintain a pleasant indoor environment.
Lock Rear Climate Controls	Can prevent the rear-seat occupants from controlling the climate system.
Rear Climate Controls	Can adjust the climate system on the rear seat.

Smart Defogging	Can set to automatically adjust the wind direction and position or vent the air out at specified intervals to prevent fogging on the windshield.
Automatic Ventilation	When the temperature difference between inside and outside increases, automatic ventilation is made after a specific period of time.

This option is used to send a reply automatically when rejecting an incoming call or edit the auto reply message. This option may not be available in some phone models. • Ignore Text Messages: Can set not to display the text message notification.
Message Settings	• Message Filter: Can reject the incoming text messages with special characters or from the specified phone numbers. • Auto-Reply Message: Can edit the auto-reply message. This option may not be available in some phone models.
Bluetooth System Info	Can see and edit the Bluetooth information of the system.
Privacy Mode	Used to hide your contacts, recent calls, and favorites on the screen.
Reset	Can delete all registered Bluetooth devices and reset Bluetooth settings. All data for Bluetooth devices are also deleted.

Using the phone projection function

You can use the phone projection to connect your smartphone to the vehicle for easy access. ► See page 9-1 “Phone Projection.”



- Some setting options appear when a smartphone is connected to the system.
- The auto-reply messaging may not be available depending on the smartphone model.
- To edit or delete a message, pull over the vehicle at a safe place and access the messaging function on your smartphone. You cannot edit or delete a message from the system.
- When an iPhone is connected to the system, there are some restrictions when receiving messages as follows:
 - Only the sender name appears when the sender information is saved.
 - Otherwise, only the phone number appears.
 - You cannot use the auto-reply message function.
 - When the incoming message notification or lock-screen view option is off, messages cannot be received.

Configuring the system settings

You can customize the settings for notifications and button actions.

1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Advanced**.

2 Select and then change the settings.

Return to Map: Set Time	Can set to automatically return to the map screen when a specified period of time elapses after the AV mode screen appears during route guidance.
TUNE Knob Function	Can change the the [TUNE/FILE] knob's function on the map.
Custom Button	Can set the frequently used functions to custom buttons. When you tap a custom button (☆) on the control panel, the corresponding function is immediately performed.
Steering Wheel Mode Button	Can set an AV mode to run when the [MODE] button is pressed on the steering wheel.

Home Screen	Can change the Home screen configuration and layout. • Edit Home Widgets: Can edit the types and arrangement of home widgets. • Edit Home Icons: Can edit the arrangement of home icons. • Edit Home Layout: Can select a home layout type.
Split Screen Settings	Can set the functions to display on the split screen and change their arrangement.
Media Change Notifications	Can display the notification at the top of the screen when the playback content is changed after another screen appears during playback.
My Data	Can export location data in the system to a USB device and can import the data from a USB device.

Configuring the sound settings

You can change the sound settings such as speaker volume and sound effects.

- Available settings may differ depending on the vehicle model and specifications.
- Some functions may not be available depending on the multimedia system and amplifier specifications in the vehicle.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Sound**.
- 2 Select and then change the settings.

Position	Can select a position where sound is best audible in the vehicle. Move the position indicator by tapping the desired spot on the seat image or using the arrow buttons. To set the sound to be centered, tap  .
Volume	Can adjust the volume for each system function including phone projection.
Tone	Can adjust the output level for each band.

Priority	• Navigation Guidance: Can set to enable the navigation sound to be heard first when using both the navigation system and AV system. • Proximity Warning: Can set to enable the warning alarm to be heard first by decreasing the audio volume when a warning alarm occurs while parking the vehicle. • Navigation During Calls: Can set to enable the navigation sound to be heard first during a call. • Start-up Volume Limit: Can set to automatically decrease the audio volume when starting the engine.
Navigation Volume	Can select a method to adjust the navigation volume during route guidance. • Use Map Screen Volume Buttons: Can adjust the navigation volume by using the volume control button on the map screen. • Use Map Screen Volume Buttons or Volume Knob: Can adjust the navigation volume by using the [VOL] knob on the control panel.

Advanced (*if equipped)	Can change the system sound settings and apply various sound effects. Available sound effects may differ depending on the specifications of the amplifier.
Voice Type	Can select a type of the system guidance voice.
Reset	Can reset the sound settings.

 To turn on or off the touch sound on the screen, tap **Beep** at the top of the screen.

Configuring the voice recognition settings

You can change the settings for voice recognition.

- 1 On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► Voice Recognition**.
- 2 Select and then change the settings.

Use Network	Can set to use the server-based voice recognition. This option is available when you have subscribed to the UVO service.
Informational Advisories	Can set whether to hear the voice recognition guidance briefly or in detail. You can also turn off the navigation voice guidance.

Updating the system software and map

You can update the navigation map and multimedia system to the latest version. For update, make sure the Smart Updater Plus program has been installed on the computer.

Installing Smart Updater Plus

- 1 Run the Internet browser on the computer and access the company website at <http://www.kia.com>.
- 2 Click **Customer Service ► Vehicle Care Service ► Navigation Update**.
- 3 See the system update information. Download and install the Smart Updater Plus installation program.

 For system requirements for installing the program and details on how to install it, visit the company website.

Updating the software and map

- 1 Connect a USB device to the computer and run Smart Updater Plus for downloading the update files.
- 2 Follow the instructions on the screen to download the update files.
- 3 Remove the USB device from the computer and then connect it to the USB port in your vehicle.
- 4 Start the engine to turn on the system.



You can perform update without starting the engine by simply locating the start switch to “ON.”



Caution

- Perform update with the start switch “ON” when the battery is sufficiently charged by driving the vehicle. When the battery is discharged while updating, the system may get damaged with the update stopped.
 - Note that the battery may be discharged easily in winter.
 - The battery may also be discharged easily when the vehicle is not used for a long time. Caution is required.
- When you start the engine while updating with the start switch “ON,” power supply to the system may be cut off.

5 Check that the software version is correct and tap **OK**.

System update starts.

Caution

- It may take a while (tens of minutes) to finish the system update depending on the amount of data.
- Do not turn off the system or remove the connected device while updating. When the system is turned off or the storage device is removed from the system while updating, it may cause data or system damage.



- On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► General ► System Info ► SW Info ► Update** and manually start the update.
- After the navigation map and voice recognition data are updated, the system update is followed. You cannot use rear cameras during system update.
- After the update is finished, the system automatically restarts and the version on the System Info screen is changed.
- For assistance concerning the update, contact the KIA Motors Customer Service Center.
- When update is not performed automatically after the system is turned on, the changes are not applied to the map. For this reason, the road names, POI names, speed limits, or other map information may not be the latest depending on the creation time of the update files.

Scheduling the update

The system can be updated when the vehicle is not in use. This can be done by downloading the latest data to a USB device connected to the system and scheduling the update.

1 With the engine started, display the All Menus screen and then tap **Setup ► General ► System Info ► SW Info ► Update**.

2 Set the update time and tap **OK**.

When scheduling the update is finished, the status indicator icon appears.



- You can set to start the update within 12 hours or less after the engine is stopped.
- To immediately start the update, select **Install Now**.

3 Position the start switch to “OFF” to turn off the vehicle.



- Make sure that a USB device with update files is connected to the system before stopping the engine.
- When you set the update time to “0,” the update notification window appears and then the update starts.
 - To close the notification window and proceed with the update, tap **Yes**.
 - To cancel the update, tap **No**.
- Once the update has started, you cannot cancel it. After the update, the system automatically turns off.
- When you start the engine, the update complete notification appears to show the update result. After the update, the version appears on the System Info screen.
- When you turn on the system while updating, you can see its progress.
- Scheduled update is canceled when:
 - Low battery is defected after the engine is stopped.
 - The storage device with the update files is removed from the system.
 - The engine is started before the update scheduled time.

When you encounter a system trouble, see the following table to check and resolve the issue.

When the trouble persists even after taking the suggested actions, contact the company's service center or service agency.

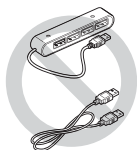
Sound and video issues

Q How can I update the map?

A Update the map by downloading the latest map data to a USB device. ▶ See page 13-10 “Updating the system software and map.”

Q Guidance is made by bypassing the route or the speed camera alerts are late.

A Select another route after setting the route options. On the navigation screen, tap  ▶ **Route ▶ Route Options** and set the route options.

When the system is not updated, update the software and map and then perform search again. ▶ See page 13-10 “Updating the system software and map.”

Bluetooth

Q Which functions can I use via Bluetooth?

A You can use the hands-free call function with a mobile phone connected. You can also play music after connecting an audio device such as MP3 player or mobile phone. ▶ See page 7-5 “Sending or receiving a call via Bluetooth” and 7-15 “Listening to music via Bluetooth.”

Q How can I register a Bluetooth device?

A On the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ▶ Device Connections ▶ Bluetooth ▶ Bluetooth Connections ▶ Add New**. From the Bluetooth device to be connected, search for the vehicle system and register it. Use the Bluetooth device to enter or approve the authentication number displayed on the system. Then the device is added to the list of Bluetooth devices in the system and automatically connected to the system. ▶ See page 7-2 “Bluetooth function.”

Q I bought a new mobile phone and want to replace my old phone with the new one to connect the system. How can I register the new phone to the system?

A An additional device can be registered in the same way as in registration of a new device. You can register up to 6 devices in the list of Bluetooth devices. To delete a previously registered device, tap **Delete Devices** from the list of Bluetooth devices, select the device to delete, and then tap **Delete**. ▶ See page 7-2 “Bluetooth function.”

Q How can I access the list of contacts while using a Bluetooth phone?

A Approve access to the contacts when connecting your mobile phone to the system via Bluetooth. The list of contacts on the phone is downloaded to the system. To see the downloaded list of contacts, press the [📞] button on the steering wheel and tap [📞] on the call screen. You can search for a contact and make a call to the contact, or add the contact to the favorites. ▶ See page 7-5 “Sending or receiving a call via Bluetooth.”

AV functions

Q Which AV functions are available with the system?

A There are AV functions available such as listening to radio and music/video playback using a media player (for USB or Bluetooth audio). For more details, see the related chapter.

Q I want to move to the previous or next song while driving. Without manipulating the buttons on the system screen, is it possible to do that?

A You can move to the previous or next song simply by pushing the [^/∨] lever on the steering wheel.

Broadcast reception

Q I turned on the radio while driving but I hear no sound but noise.

A Depending on the location, obstacles may cause reception to deteriorate.

Radio reception rate may also drop when an on-glass antenna is mounted on the rear window and the window is tinted with metallic window films.

UVO (* if equipped)

Q Which functions are available with UVO?

A To ensure pleasant and comfortable driving, UVO provides various functions such as safety functions, vehicle care functions, and remote controls.

Q How can I subscribe to the UVO service?

A You can subscribe to the service and activate your user account by visiting a local dealership, UVO Center, or KIA Motors Company website or by using the UVO Settings menu from the vehicle. To subscribe to UVO via the vehicle system, display the All Menus screen, tap **Setup ► UVO ► Activate UVO**, and then follow the displayed instructions.

When you encounter an error or failure during subscription and account activation, contact the UVO Center for assistance.

Self-inspection method upon failure

Q The system does not operate properly. What shall I do?

A Inspect the system after referring to Troubleshooting Guide. ▶ See page 14-2 “Solutions for each symptom.”

When the system failure persists after inspection, press and hold the Reset button to reset the system.

When the symptom persists, contact KIA Motors Company’s service center or service agency.
