R20/22/24

Openers Equipped with Learn Code Button (1995 to present)

- Press then release the "Learn Code" button on the OPENER hanging in your garage (LED will blink rapidly)
- 2. Press then release the button you wish to program on the remote transmitter (LED will stop blinking)
- 3. Press then release the same button on the remote transmitter (the LED will go out)
- Press the same button on the remote one more time. The garage door will open indicating successful programming.

**Repeat the steps above if you wish to program multiple remotes (or a multi-button remote to multiple doors). If a remote loses it's "program" repeat the steps above.

For Openers Equipped with Program/Set Button (2010 to present)

- 1. Locate the Program/Set Button and the indicator LED on the OPENER hanging in your garage.
- 2. Hold the Program/Set Button until the LED turns blue and then release. The LED will then blink purple.
- Press then release the button you wish to program on the remote transmitter (the LED will stop blinking)
- Press then release the same button on the remote transmitter (LEDs will turn off after blinking blue)
- Press the same button on the remote one more time. The garage door will open indicating successful programming.
- 6. * *Repeat the steps above if you wish to program multiple remotes (or a multi-button remote to multiple doors). If a remote loses it's "program" repeat the steps above.


