

## Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi R^2}$$

S = power density where:

P = power input to the antenna

G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 26.00 (dBm)

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 400 (mW)

Antenna gain(maximum): 15.5 (dBi)
