SYSTEM TEST CONFIGURATION

EUT Configuration 2.1

The EUT configuration for testing is installed on RF field strength measurement to meet the Commissions requirement and operating in a manner which intends to maximize its emission characteristics in a continuous normal application.

2.2 **EUT Exercise**

The EUT (Transmitter) was operated in the engineering mode to fix the Tx frequency that was for the purpose of the measurements.

Test Procedure 2.3

2.3.1 Conducted Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. According to the requirements in Section 7 & 13 of ANSI C63.4-2003. Conducted emissions from the EUT measured in the frequency range between 0.15 MHz and 30MHz using CISPR Quasi-Peak and Average detector mode.

2.3.2 Radiated Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. The turn table shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emission. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical. In order to find out the max. emission, the relative positions of this hand-held transmitter(EUT) was rotated through three orthogonal axes according to the requirements in Section 8 & 13 of ANSI C63.4-2003.

Fig. 2-1 Configuration of Tested System



4. DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

The EUT has been tested under operating condition.

Test program used to control the EUT for staying in continuous transmitting and receiving mode is programmed.

Channel low (2402MHz) · mid (2441MHz) and high (2480MHz) with 741k highest data rate are chosen for full testing with AC/DC power adaptor, which was the worse condition.

5.2 EUT Setup

- 1. The conducted emission tests were performed in the test site, using the setup in accordance with the ANSI C63.4-2003.
- 2. The EUT was plug-in the AC/DC power adaptor. The EUT was placed on the center of the back edge on the test table. The rear of the EUTwas placed flushed with the rear of the tabletop.
- 3. The spacing between the peripherals was 10 centimeters.
- 4. External I/O cables were draped along the edge of the test table and bundle when necessary.

5.3 **Measurement Procedure**

- 1. The EUT was placed on a table which is 0.8m above ground plane.
- 2. Maximum procedure was performed on the six highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.



Peak Power Output Data Plot (CH Mid)



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

7.1 Standard Applicable

According to §15.247(a)(1)(ii), Frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400MHz-2483.5 MHz and 5725MHz – 5850MHz bands. The Maximum 20dB bandwidth of the hopping channel is 1MHz.

7.2 **Measurement Procedure**

- 1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.
- 2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.



20dB Band Width Test Data CH-Mid



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

100KHz BANDWIDTH OF BAND EDGES MEASUREMENT

Standard Applicable 8.1

According to §15.247(c), in any 100 KHz bandwidth outside the frequency bands in which the spread spectrum intentional radiator in operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20dB below that in the 100KHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands, as defined in \$15.205(a), must also comply with the radiated emission limits specified in 15.209(a).

- 5. Mark Peak, 2.402GHz and 2.480GHz and record the max. level.
- 6. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.
- 7. Radiated Emission refer to section 9.








Test SET-UP (Block Diagram of Configuration) 9.4





Ch Low 3GHz - 26.5GHz



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



Ch Mid 3GHz – 26.5GHz



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




Channel Number



Power Spectral Density Test Plot (CH-Mid)





14. ANTENNA REQUIREMENT

14.1 Standard Applicable

For intentional device, according to §15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device.

And according to §15.246(1), if transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6dBi are used the power shall be reduced by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6 dBi.

14.2 Antenna Connected Construction

The directional gins of antenna used for transmitting is 2.7 dBi, and the antenna connector is designed with permanent attachment and no consideration of replacement. Please see EUT photo for details.
