Hi Joe

As this has not been granted yet, please keep this email confidential.

In 1999 the FCC granted a UNII device under the above ID. The device however, was not granted under the NII equipment code nor under the spread spectrum/UNII scope. It appears to be under the A2 – low power transmitters (except spread spectrum) operating above 1GHz.

The applicant now wishes to add an antenna to the grant under a PC2. The FCC server will obviously not allow the PC2 to be processed as the original grant in not an NII equipment code nor was it granted under scope A4. I suppose ATCB could get into the system by selecting A2 and proceeding with the PC2. However, this would not be correct and would probably cause other problems. The client has an email from the FCC on the ability to do this under a PC2 (see attached referenced document) and would like to proceed as soon as possible to do so.

How should ATCB continue? Should we let the FCC reclassify this device and proceed when notified under scope A4? Or should ATCB proceed under the A2 scope as this appears to be what the original UNII device was granted under????

Please respond as quickly as possible as the applicant seeks the PC2 as soon as possible Thanks
