





Streaming Introduction


UVC Streaming

- 1. Connect the camera to a computer using a USB cable; ensure that both the computer's USB port and the cable support the 3.0 standard.
- 2. Open the streaming software on the computer.
- Select Hollyland PRO CAM as the video source and Hollyland as the audio source, then start streaming.



Streaming via Switcher

- 1. Connect the camera to a switcher using an HDMI 1.4 or higher cable.
- Tap ______, choose More Settings, and select Extend. It is not recommended to use Mirroring for streaming.
- After the switcher displays video and audio readings, make sure the switcher is connected to the network, enter the streaming URL, and then start streaming.



RTMP Streaming

- 1. Make sure the camera is connected to the network.
- 2. Open the RTMP app, and tap Add to enter the streaming URL to start streaming.

Button Introduction


1. Power Button

Long press for 3s to power on/off the camera.




3. LIVE Button

- · Press once to open the most recently used app.
- Press once on the built-in camera app's interface to take photos or record videos. Make sure an SD card or USB flash drive is inserted.




Indicator Introduction



2. Fn Button

 Press once to show/hide the volume bar.




- 1. Network Indicator
- · Solid green: normal status
- · Solid red: abnormal status
- · Light off: camera in initialization
- 2. Working Status/Power Connection Indicator
- · Solid green: normal status
- · Slowly flashing green: camera in initialization
- · Solid red: abnormal status, for example, storage error and low battery.
- · Slowly flashing red: firmware upgrading
- · Solid yellow: powered by DC power while powered off

Port Introduction


- 1. USB 2.0 Port
- · For connection to Lark series wireless microphones.




- 2. USB-C Port
- For UVC. Connect the camera to a computer using a USB cable. Using a cable lower than USB 3.0 may result in video display issues.



- 3. HDMI Port
- · For connection to TV, capture card, switcher, etc.
- · Mirroring mode: outputs the display from the camera's touchscreen
- · Extend mode: outputs only the audio and video streams (without UI interface).



- 4. Ethernet Port
- · For network connection.
- 5. 3.5mm Jack
- For connection to TRS microphones or line-in devices.



- 6. USB-A 3.0 Port
- For connection to a USB flash drive to store photos or videos or to a mouse or keyboard to control the camera.
- For connection to another camera to add a video source.

Note:

- Do not remove the USB flash drive while the camera is transferring or accessing information. Doing so may result in data loss or damage, even damage to the USB flash drive or camera. Turn off the camera before replacing or removing the USB flash drive. Hollyland is not responsible for any loss caused by misuse of a damaged USB flash drive.
- When shooting regular videos, use a Class 10 or higher USB flash drive. The maximum file size for each video is 4GB.
- If storage errors occur, please check or replace your USB flash drive.




- 7. DC Input
- For power supply. Use the provided power adapter to avoid damage to the camera.



Slot Introduction

- 1. SD Slot
- For inserting an SD card. Insert the SD card into the slot until it clicks into place; press the SD card until you hear a click sound to eject the SD card.







- Note: Do not remove the SD card while the camera is transferring or accessing information. Doing so may result in data loss or damage, even damage to the SD card or camera. Turn off the camera before replacing or removing the SD card. Hollyland is not responsible for any loss caused by misuse of a damaged SD card.
- When shooting regular videos, use a Class 10 or higher SD card. The maximum file size for each video is 4GB.
- If storage errors incur, please check or replace your SD card.
- 2. Battery Slot
 - For battery power supply. Align the charging contacts and insert the battery into the slot to install the battery; press the release button and slide the battery upward to remove the battery.








Hole and Mount Introduction

- 1. 1/4" Threaded Hole
- For securing the camera. Use a tripod to secure the camera via the 1/4" threaded hole with two mounting methods: vertical and horizontal.



- 2. Cold Shoe Mount
- · For mounting external devices.



- Moveable Parts Introduction
- 1. Zoom Ring

- Rotating the zoom ring to the left decreases the focal length.
- Rotating the zoom ring to the right increases the focal length.



- 2. Touchscreen
- Upward: The screen can flip up 180°, do not overflip.
- Leftward: The screen can rotate left 180°, do not overrotate.
- Rightward: The screen can rotate right 130°, do not overrotate.



HollyOS System Introduction

Navigation Gesture

- Swipe down from the top of the screen to access the Quick Settings interface.
- Swipe up from the bottom of the screen to enter the home page.
- · Swipe left or right to return to the previous interface.

Status Bar



- The camera is connected to a Wi-Fi network
- The camera is connected to an Ethernet network.



- The camera is connected to a wireless network card.
- The camera has no network connection
- The USB-C Port is in use.
 - The camera is connected to a wireless microphone.
- The 3.5mm jack is in use.



- The Bluetooth function is enabled.
- A USB flash drive is inserted.
- The camera is powered by DC power.
- The camera is powered by a battery.

Tap to turn on/off the Wi-Fi connection. Tap and hold to enter the Wi-Fi interface

Tap to turn on/off Bluetooth. Tap and hold to enter the Bluetooth interface

- 4 Sound Tap to show/hide the volume bar.
- 5. App Center Tap to view the built-in apps.
- 6. Screen Brightness Bar Adjusts the screen brightness.

- Speaker Volume Bar Adjusts the speaker volume.
- Microphone Gain Bar Adjusts the microphone gain.

Built-In Apps RTMP

- 1. Connect the camera to the network.
- 2. Open the RTMP app 🧮
- 3. Tap Add to enter the streaming URL
- There are two ways to enter the streaming URL.
- Use any app with a QR code scanning feature such as the Camera app in the streaming name and URL and tap Submit. The camera will receive the streaming information, and tap Finish to complete.
- Manually fill in the streaming name and URL on the interface and tap Finish to complete.
- Set resolution, frame rate, and bitrate according to your needs and the network upstream bandwidth on the interface.
- 6. Start Streaming.

Photo/Record

- Open the Photo/Record app to take photos or record videos.
- Tap the settings icon on the Record interface to set resolution, frame rate,

and bitrate according to your needs and the SD card storage capacity.

Note: Photos and videos can only be stored on external devices. Make sure an SD card or USB flash drive is inserted. You can view the corresponding file through the Gallery app or File Manager on the Settings interface.

App Store

A built-in app store is provided so you can download apps as necessary. When connected to the network, VenusLiv V2 alone achieves a smooth livestreaming with the following powerful functions.

- · Zoom in or out.
- · Add overlays.
- Remove the background and add a background.
- Color Correction Magic, perfecting the visuals by adjusting saturation and brightness, etc.

Toolbox

Tap to enter the Toolbox interface to configure scenes, adjust the color, remove the background, add overlays, and enter the More Settings interface to explore more.

Settings Interface Introduction

Click the settings icon on the Quick Settings interface to enter the Settings interface.



- 1. Wi-Fi
- · Tap to enter the Wi-Fi interface.

2. Wired Network

Tap to enter the Wired Network interface.

- Turned on by default. When a network cable is connected, the camera automatically connects to the network.
- Depending on your needs, you can manually input the IP address. Turn off Get IP Automatically, input the IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway, and then click Save. Turn on Get IP Automatically, the camera automatically acquires IP information.
- Depending on your needs, you can manually input the DNS addresses. Turn off Get DNS Automatically, input the primary and secondary DNS addresses, and then click Save. Turn on Get DNS Automatically, the camera automatically acquires the DNS addresses.

3. Bluetooth

Tap to enter the Bluetooth interface.

- Turn on/off Bluetooth based on your needs.
- Tap Device Name to change the name.
- When turned on, the camera will automatically search for nearby Bluetooth devices. Tap the device to be paired in the list and follow the on-screen prompts to complete the pairing. Long press the device, and tap Delete to unpair.

4. File Manager

Tap to view photos and videos stored on external devices.
