Limits for Maximum Permissible Exposure (MPE)

f = frequency in MHz

Friis transmission formula: Pd = (Pout*G)/(4*pi*r²)

Where

Pd = power density in mW/cm², Pout = output power to antenna in mW;

G = gain of antenna in linear scale, Pi = 3.1416;

 \mathbf{R} = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm

Pd id the limit of MPE, 1 mW/cm². If we know the maximum gain of the antenna and the total power input to the antenna, through the calculation, we will know the distance r where the MPE limit is reached.

Test Procedure

Software provided by client enabled the EUT to transmit and receive data at lowest, middle and highest channel individually.

EIRP=EMeas+20log(dMeas)-104.7

EIRP is the equivalent isotropically radiated power, in dBm

EMeas is the field strength of the emission at the measurement distance, in dB μ V/m

dMeas is the measurement distance, in m
