

## Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi R^2}$$

where: S = power density

P = power input to the antenna

G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 47.40 (dBm)

Maximum peak output power at antenna input terminal: 54954.09 (mW)

Antenna gain(typical): 0 (dBi)

Maximum antenna gain: 1 (numeric)

Prediction distance: 200 (cm)

Prediction frequency: 1900 (MHz)

MPE limit for uncontrolled exposure at prediction frequency: \_\_\_\_\_\_1 (mW/cm^2)

Power density at prediction frequency: 0.109328 (mW/cm<sup>2</sup>)

Maximum allowable antenna gain: 9.612699 (dBi)

Note: The antenna will be on a fixed outdoor structure and much further than the 2 meters used in this scenario
