## WALKIE TALKIE FEATURES:

- 2 x 9 Volt Battery operated
- Power On/OFF switch
- Push to talk, release to listen
- Flexible Antenna for best transmission and reception
- Morse Code signal key or call key

## HOW TO OPERATE:

- To put batteries into one pair of walkie talkie, open battery compartment (fig.) and snap in a 9 Volt battery to each unit. Replace the cover firmly.
- 2. To operate the walkie talkie, switch the power ON/OFF (fig. ) to "ON".
- Press the "Push-To-Talk" button (fig. ) for transmitting and speak in a normal voice level into the microphone (fig. ).
- Release the "Push-To Talk" button (fig. ) for receiving, then just listen from the speaker (fig. 2).
- 5. Morse Code signal key or call key (fig. ) is used to send Morse Code signals or to send a call signal. To send Morse Code signals, push the "Push-To-Talk" button (fig. ), press the Morse Code signal key (fig. ) and quickly release to send a dot (□), or hold key longer to send a dash (-).
- 6. To turn off the power, switch the power ON/OFF (fig. ) to "OFF".

## Caution:

- Your transceiver set have been fully adjusted prior to shipment. Be sure not to touch the internal components other than replacing the battery.
- 2. When the sound becomes weak, it is time to change the battery.
- 3. After use, always turn the ON/OFF switch to the "OFF" position.
- 4. Keep your set in a dry place.
- 5. Take out batteries when walkie talkies are not in use.
- 6. Replacement of batteries must be done by an adult or under adult supervision.
- 7. Recommended for children over 3 years of age.
