If you received your phone in the mail or purchased it from a Sprint PCS Center, your phone is already activated and simply needs to be unlocked. (See "Unlocking Your Phone" on the following page.)

Activating Your Phone

From a working phone, call Sprint PCS Customer Care toll-free at 1-888-715-4588 (in Southern California call 1-888-PCS-6699). A Sprint PCS Customer Advocate will collect your information and help you select your Sprint PCS Service Plan. Once you've made all your selections, he or she will guide you through the activation process. The call typically takes about 30 minutes, but may take longer at peak times. Your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint PhoneTM will be ready for use about one hour after you complete your call.

What you should have handy:

- 2. The original packaging for your phone
- 3. Your Social Security number or Tax ID number

Unlocking Your Phone

If you received your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ in the mail, you may need to unlock it before making calls.

- 1. Move the On/Off Switch near the antenna to the ON position.
- 2. Highlight Uril took and press OK.
- 3. Enter your four-digit lock code. For security purposes, the code will not be visible as you type.

Note: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of your Social Security number, the last four digits of your Sprint PCS

Phone Number or 0000.

Getting to Know Your Phone

- Dual-band capability provides access to other PCS CDMA and analog cellular networks where Sprint PCS has implemented roaming agreements (page 10)
- Data/Fax feature offers wireless modem capabilities for your personal computer in digital mode (page 74)
- Sprint PCS Wireless WebSM Browser provides Internet access in digital mode (page 61)
- Built-in Scheduler and Call Alarms remind you of events and important calls (page 51)
- Ninety-nine Phone Book entries store 300 phone numbers (up to 9 phone numbers per entry) (page 40)
- Graphical icons and text prompts inform you of messages, events and the status of your phone (page 7)
- A Mouse Key provides easy navigation through menu options (page 5)
- Assign one of twenty-five ringer tones to any Phone Book entry (page 46)

View of Phone

- Antenna: Fixed antenna provides optimum reception for 800 and 1900 MHz frequencies.
- Power On Indicator/Dual-Color LED: Illuminates green when the phone powers on or when you receive incoming calls.
 Flashes red when you have messages or scheduled alarms.
- 3. Headset Jack: Provides connection for an optional headset.
- Voice Services: Lets you record memos and use voice commands.
- Volume Control keys: Adjust the Ring Volume in the Main Menu or the Voice Volume during a call. The keys also scroll through months in the Calendar or pages in the MiniBrowser.
- 6. Mouse Key: Allows quick and easy scrolling through the menus.
- 7. OK: Lets you place a call, receive a call, end a call or select menu options.
- 8. CLR: Lets you clear an entry or back-up in the menu.
- 9. Power/End: Lets you power the phone on or off and end calls.



Installing and Removing the Battery

To install the battery, insert the bottom of the battery into the opening on the back of the phone. Then, push the battery down until the latch clicks.

To remove the battery, press down on the latch and remove the battery from the phone.

Turning Your Phone On and Off

To turn your phone on, move the On/Off Switch (near the antenna) to the ON position. Your phone performs a short self-test before letting you know it is operational.

If your phone does not turn on, make sure the battery is installed correctly and is adequately charged or has external power (via the AC Adapter, Cigarette Lighter Adapter or Hands-Free Car Kit).

To turn your phone off, move the On/Off Switch to the OFF position.

Main Menu

When your phone acquires Sprint PCS Service, the Greeting (a banner of text), the current time and date and the Main Menu are displayed. If you are in a Sprint PCS or authorized analog cellular provider's service area, you are ready to send and receive calls.

Setting the Time in Analog Mode

If your phone cannot find Sprint PCS Service, you can enter the current time. If you have events or Call Alarms scheduled, you will not be notified if the time is not entered.

To set the time, enter the current time using the keypad and press OK.

To wait five minutes to see if your phone finds Sprint PCS Service, highlight wait and press OK.

Power Save Mode

When the phone is in an area without service for 15 minutes, it stops searching for service and enters into the Power Save Mode. When your phone activates this feature, Power Save is displayed on your screen. The phone automatically checks for service periodically, or you can check manually by pressing any key.

Menu Navigation

The Mouse Key lets you scroll circularly through menus quickly and easily.

Left Down

As you navigate through a menu, the options are highlighted (Highlighted Text Example). Select an option by highlighting it and pressing OK. The scroll bar at the right of the menu keeps track of your position in the menu at all times.

For example, if you want to view your last incoming call:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Call Logs and press

 OK. (It may already be highlighted.)
- 2. Press the Mouse Key down to highlight Incoming Log and press OK.

If you have received any calls, they are displayed on the screen.

Entering Characters Using the Keypad

To enter a letter, punctuation or number when creating Phone Book or Scheduler entries, press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase. Characters scroll in the following order:

After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds. You can also advance the cursor by pressing ## or entering a character not on the same key.

If you make a mistake, press * to move the cursor left or CLR to erase a character. To clear the entire entry, press and hold CLR for two seconds.

Display icons are the symbols your phone uses to communicate important information. They are as follows:

Antenna

The antenna on your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ provides maximum reception without the inconvenience of extending or retracting it.

WARNING -- CHOKING HAZARD -- ANTENNA MAY BECOME DISLODGED

Attempting to remove or repeated twisting of the antenna will loosen the materials securing it into place and may reduce the child restraint nature of the antenna. Once the antenna is loosened or removed, only an authorized Sprint PCS Representative can restore the antenna's original integrity. Do not attempt to remove or twist the antenna.

Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. The number of bars in the Signal Strength icon informs you of the current strength. The more bars, the stronger the signal.



Battery Capacity

Your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone[™] is equipped with a Lithium Ion (LiIon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The battery provides approximately 3.25 hours of continuous digital talk time (60 minutes in analog) or approximately 130 hours of continuous digital standby time (15 hours in analog).

Note: Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

When the battery reaches 5% of its capacity, the battery icon blinks. When there is about one minute of talk time left, the phone sounds an audible alert every 30 seconds and then powers down.

If the battery's charge is completely run down, it takes 2 to 3 hours to fully recharge. It is not necessary to let the battery completely run down before recharging.

To charge your batteries, use only Sprint PCS-approved charging accessories.

Using the AC Adapter

To charge the battery, plug the AC Adapter into a standard wall outlet and connect it to the phone via the I/O Connector on the bottom of the phone. Alternatively, you can place the phone in the charging cradle provided with your phone and connect the AC Adapter to the back of the cradle.

The Battery Charge Status icon flashes during charging. When the battery is fully charged, the battery icon stops flashing.

Using Your Phone

Placing a Call

When the phone is turned on, check the Signal Strength icon to see if you are in a Sprint PCS Service Area or authorized PCS CDMA or analog cellular provider's service area.

- 1. Open the Flip.
- 2. Enter the phone number, highlight and press OK.

 Tip! When dialing long distance, it is not necessary to dial a

 "1" before the area code.
- 3. When you are finished with your call, highlight Frid C=11 and press OK. If the phone is in Active Flip Mode (see page 77), closing the Flip will also end the call.

Roaming With Your Sprint PCS Phone™

Your Sprint PCS Phone™ is dual-band, which means you can use it to make and receive calls in many places.

- In any city where Sprint PCS provides service.
- On other PCS CDMA networks and conventional analog cellular networks where Sprint PCS has implemented roaming agreements.

Note: When using your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ in Analog Mode, the handset may feel warm due to the higher transmission power requirements. This behavior is normal for the analog operation.

When you use your phone outside the Sprint PCS Network, it's called roaming. If you're roaming in areas where agreements are in place with PCS CDMA or conventional analog cellular providers, you will pay the roaming rate plus long-distance charges, where they apply. (See "Display Icons" on page 7 for network indication icons.) Always dial using 10 digits (area code + number) when calling from outside your Sprint PCS Home Service Area. (See "Roaming" on page 49.)

Note: In areas where roaming agreements are not in place, you may still be able to make (but not receive) calls using a credit card. This is called manual roaming.

Setting Your Phone's Mode

Your Sprint PCS Phone[™] allows you to control your ability to roam. (See "Set Mode" on page 49.)

Calling Experience

When you use your phone on other PCS CDMA networks, your calling experience and call quality will be quite similar to what you experience when making calls within the Sprint PCS Network. Although certain calling features may not be available, your phone calls are still private and secure.

When you use your phone on analog cellular networks, your experience will be different. Cellular roaming will be similar to the quality provided by conventional analog cellular carriers today. Although you will still have the convenience of being able to make and receive calls, here are some differences you can expect:

 You are more likely to experience static, cross-talk, fade-out and dropped calls.

- Some calling features (such as Caller ID and voicemail message indicator) that are standard within the Sprint PCS Network may not be available.
- You will experience the same security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog cellular services today.
- Battery life will be shorter when you use your phone for cellular roaming than when you use it on a PCS CDMA network.

If you're on your phone and leave a Sprint PCS Service Area, your call will be dropped. When reentering a Sprint PCS Service Area while on a roaming call, turn your phone off and on again to acquire Sprint PCS Service.

If you need customer service for any reason while using your phone outside the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network, just dial 611 from your Sprint PCS Phone. However, because you're outside the Sprint PCS Network, you may reach the local service provider's customer service instead of Sprint PCS Customer Care. To be sure that you reach Sprint PCS Customer Care, dial 1-888-211-4PCS.

Correcting Dialing Mistakes

To delete one digit at a time, press **CLR**. To delete all digits, press and hold **CLR**.

Redialing Last Outgoing Number

With Call Logs highlighted, press and hold OK for 2 seconds.

Dialing Options

When you enter numbers in the Main Menu, dialing options are displayed. To display a Phone Book entry, enter its entry number. To use the 4-Digit Dial option, enter the last four digits of a phone number in your Phone Book.

To select an option, highlight it and press OK

- Call Dials the phone number.
- Roam Confirm Reminds you that you are making a call on an analog cellular network. (See "Call Guard" on page 50.)
- Roam Call Dials the phone number using the current PCS CDMA or analog cellular network.
- Save Saves the phone number in your Phone Book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on the following page.)
- Find Displays phone numbers in your Phone Book that contain the entered numbers. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 15.)
- Hard Pause Inserts a Hard Pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- 2-Second Pause Inserts a two-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 15.)
- Exit Returns to the Main Menu.

- A Phone Book Entry Displays the Phone Book entry. To dial the entry's speed-dialing number, press and hold OK. To dial an alternate number, highlight it and press and hold OK.
 - Tip! To speed dial a Phone Book entry from the Main Menu, press and hold the entry's number. If the entry number is two digits, enter the first digit, then press and hold the second digit. (This feature will not work when the Roam Confirm option is enabled.)
- 4-Digit Dial Dials the phone number in your Phone Book that ends with the four digits you enter. (See "4-Digit Dialing" on page 16.)

Saving a Phone Number

- 1. Enter the phone number.
- 2. Highlight Save and press OK.
- 3. Select a label by highlighting Home, work, Mobile, Fager, Faz, Data or No Label and pressing OK.

Note: Phone numbers labeled Fax or Data can only be dialed through a personal computer.

- 4. Enter a name for the entry, select an existing entry or highlight Save mod Hame and press OK. (See "Entering Characters Using the Keypad" on page 6.)
- Press OK to save the entry in the first available location.
 (You can also enter an entry number or highlight an empty location and press OK.)

Finding a Phone Number

You can search for Phone Book entries that contain a specific string of numbers.

To find a phone number:

- Dial one or more digits. The more numbers you enter, the more the search narrows.
- 2. Highlight Find and press OK.
- 3. To display an entry, highlight it and press OK. To speed dial a number, highlight it and press and hold OK.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a Hard Pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press OK. If you select a 2-Second Pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

To dial or save a phone number with pauses:

- 1. Enter the phone number.
- 2. Highlight Hand Fause or 2-Second Fause and press
 OK. Hard Pauses are displayed as a "P" and 2-Second
 Pauses as a "T."
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Highlight Call or Save and press OK.

If you enter a Hard Pause, highlight Send Tones and press

OK to send the next set of numbers.

4-Digit Dialing

Enter four digits to display the 4-Digit Dialing option. If you select 4-Digit Dial, your phone dials the phone number in your Phone Book that ends with the four digits you entered.

To use 4-Digit Dialing:

- 1. Dial the last four digits of an entry's phone number.
- 2. Highlight 4-Digit Dial and press OK

Note: 4-Digit Dialing dials the first number in your Phone Book matching the four digits.

In Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options in addition to the Main Menu.

To select an option, highlight it and press OK

- End Call Ends the call.
- Send Tones Sends the next set of numbers after a
 Hard Pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With
 Pauses" on the previous page.)
- Mute or Unmute Select Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone.

- Dial 3-Way Call Lets you dial another phone number. (See "Three-Way Calling" on page 30.)
- Flash Answers an incoming Call Waiting call or connects the third party for Three-Way Calling.

Incoming Call Notification

Depending on your settings, your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates
- The LED flashes green
- The backlight illuminates
- The screen displays an incoming call message
- The phone number of the caller is displayed if the phone number is available
- The caller's name is displayed if the phone number is in your Phone Book

The following options are also displayed. To select an option, highlight it and press OK.

- Answer Answers the call.
- Silent Ringer Mutes the ringer.

Note: You can also mute the ringer by pressing the up or down Volume Control key or **CLR**.

Answering Calls

To answer incoming Sprint PCS calls, open the Flip (in Active Flip Mode) or press OK.

Note: If you open the Flip (in Active Flip Mode) and then press OK, you will hang up on the caller.

To answer incoming roam calls, highlight firswer and press OK.

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Log and Caller ID information are displayed on your screen. To return to the Main Menu, press and hold CLB. To dial the number, press and hold OK.

Note: You cannot dial phone numbers identified as No ID, Restricted, Data or Fax calls.

End of Call Options

After receiving or making a call to a phone number not in your Phone Book, the phone number (if the number is available), the duration of the call and End of Call menu options are displayed.

To select an option, highlight it and press OK

- OK Returns to the Main Menu. (You can also press CLR.)
- Call Dials the number again.
- Save Phone # Saves the phone number in your Phone Book.
 (See "Adding a New Entry" on page 43.)

After receiving or making a call to a phone number in your Phone Book, the other party's name and phone number, the duration of the call and the following menu options are displayed.

To select an option, highlight it and press **OK**.

- OK Returns to the Main Menu.
- Call Dials the number again.
- Alternate #s Displays the Phone Book entry (if the entry has alternate phone numbers). To dial an alternate number, highlight the phone number and press and hold OK.

Sprint PCS Wireless WebSM Connection

The Sprint PCS Wireless WebSM Connection Kit (purchased separately) lets you link your laptop PC to your Sprint PCS Phone[™] so you can send and receive e-mail, faxes and browse the Internet. To purchase this accessory, visit a Sprint PCS Center, dial # A C from your Sprint PCS Phone or dial 1-800-974-2221. For information on receiving data or faxes, see page 74.

Handy Tips

Adjusting the Volume

To adjust the Ring Volume, press the up or down Volume Control keys in the Main Menu. The current Volume setting is displayed.

To adjust the incoming Voice Volume, press the Volume Control keys up or down during a call. The current Volume setting is displayed.

Displaying Your Sprint PCS Phone Number

To display your phone number:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Phone Book and press
- 2. Highlight My Phone # and press OK.

Changing the Backlight Setting

The backlight illuminates when you press a key or receive a phone call.

To change the backlight setting:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Display and press OK
- 2. Highlight Back Light and press OK.

Note: Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Editing the Greeting

The Greeting is displayed above the time and date on the display screen (except during PCS CDMA or Analog Cellular Roaming).

To edit the Greeting:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Display and press OK.
- 2. Highlight Greeting and press OK.
- Highlight Change and press OK.
- 4. To delete one character at a time, press **CLR**. To delete all characters, press and hold **CLR**.
- 5. Enter your new Greeting using the keypad. (See "Entering Characters Using the Keypad" on page 6.)
- 6. Highlight Save and press OK.

Adjusting the Contrast

To adjust the contrast setting:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Display and press OK.
- 2. Highlight Contrast and press OK.

3. Highlight Highest, High, Medium, Low or Lowest and press OK. When you highlight an option, a preview of the Contrast setting is displayed.

Creating a Phone Book Entry

 Tip! If you save phone numbers with their area codes, you can still dial them from your Phone Book when you travel outside your Sprint PCS Home Service Area.
- 5. Select a label by highlighting Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Fax, Data or No Label and pressing OK.

Note: Phone numbers labeled Fax or Data can only be dialed through a personal computer.

6. Press OK to save the entry in the next available memory location. (You can also enter an entry number or highlight an empty location and press OK.)

Calling a Phone Number in Your Phone Book

To dial a phone number in your Phone Book:

- 1. Display a Phone Book entry. (See "Finding a Name" on page 40 or "Finding an Entry Number" on page 41.)
- 2. To speed dial the entry's default number, press and hold OK. To dial an alternate number, highlight the number and press and hold OK.

Setting the Ring Volume to Vibrate

The vibrating ringer lets you receive incoming calls without disturbing others.

To set the phone to Vibrate Mode, press the down Volume

Control key until Ring Volume Vibrate is displayed.

The phone will vibrate and -Vibrate On- is displayed above the Main Menu.

Note: When the phone is in Vibrate Mode and attached to an accessory (Desktop Charger, Hands-Free Car Kit, etc.), it uses the Standard Ring Type to alert you of incoming calls.

To set the phone to Vibrate Mode using the Main Menu, see "Adjusting the Volume" on page 65.

Accessing Sprint PCS Voicemail

To speed dial your voicemail, press and hold ...

Note: The phone number for your Sprint PCS Voicemail box is stored in the first Phone Book entry. If you edit the entry, this option may not work.

To dial your voicemail from the Main Menu, highlight Messages and press and hold OK.

To access your voicemail from a phone other than your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint PhoneTM:

- 1. Dial your Sprint PCS Phone Number.
- 2. When the voicemail system answers, press and enter your pass code.

Note: You are charged for air time when accessing your voicemail box.

Setting Up Your Sprint PCS Voicemail

Sprint PCS Voicemail allows callers to leave a message when you don't answer your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint PhoneTM. We suggest you set up your voicemail box soon after your phone is activated.

The first time you access the voicemail system (see "Accessing Sprint PCS Voicemail" above) from your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint PhoneTM, it prompts you to:

- 1. Create your own personal pass code. Make sure that you pick a number that is easy to remember.
- 2. Record your name announcement.
- Create the greeting callers hear when they reach your voicemail.
- Choose whether or not to activate One-Touch Message Access.
 If you select One-Touch Message Access, you do not have to enter your pass code to access voicemail messages.

Note: One-Touch Message Access is available when you call from your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ in your Sprint PCS Home Service Area.

New Message Alerts

When you receive new voicemail, page/text or Browser messages, your phone rings briefly, the LED flashes red and the icon is displayed.

If it is a voicemail message, the following options are displayed. To select an option, highlight it and press OK.

- OK Clears the message. (You can also press CLR.)
- Call Dials your voicemail box.

If it is a page/text message, the following options are displayed. To select an option, highlight it and press OK.

- Read Displays the message.
- Call Dials the phone number of the sender (if applicable).

Exit – Returns to the Main Menu. (You can also press CLR.)

Note: If you are out of Sprint PCS Service Area coverage, you are not notified of new messages. You will be notified when you reenter a Sprint PCS Service Area.

Retrieving Page/Text Messages

To retrieve page/text messages:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Messages and press OK.
- 2. Highlight Fage Text and press OK.

 Tip! You can also access page/text messages from the Main Menu by pressing the Mouse Key left.

- Save Phone # Saves the phone number in your Phone Book (if applicable).
- Prepend Prepends the phone number (if applicable). (See "Prepend Dialing" on page 36.)
- Erase Message Deletes the message.
- Read Displays the message again.
- Exit Returns to the Main Menu.

Text Message options:

- Call Dials the phone number of the sender (if applicable).
- Alternate #s Displays the Phone Book entry (if the sender's phone number is in your Phone Book and the entry has alternate phone numbers). To dial an alternate number, highlight the phone number and press and hold OK.
- Save Phone # Saves the sender's phone number in your Phone Book (if applicable).
- Extract #s Extracts phone numbers (if there are numbers contained in the text message). (See the following chapter.)
- Prepend Prepends the phone number (if applicable). (See "Prepend Dialing" on page 36.)
- Erase Message Deletes the message.
- Read Displays the message again.
- Exit Returns to the Main Menu.

Extracting Phone Numbers From Text Messages

To extract a phone number from a text message:

- 1. While displaying a text message, press OK to view the Text Message options.
- 2. Highlight Extract #s and press OK. All the phone numbers contained in the message are displayed.

Note: If there are no phone numbers to extract from the message, the option does not display.

- 3. Highlight the number you want to call or save and press OK.
- 4. Highlight Call, Next (to display the following number),
 Save Phone # or Prepend and press OK.

Erasing All Page/Text Messages

Sending a Page or Text Message to Your Phone

Page/Text Message Storage

Your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ can store up to 20 page/text messages. When the message memory is 75% full, a warning message prompts you to erase messages to obtain more memory space.

Caller ID

Caller ID displays the phone number of the person calling you (if the number is available). When you receive a call from a phone number stored in your Phone Book, the entry's name is also displayed.

If you call someone from your dual-band Sprint PCS
Touchpoint Phone™ who has Caller ID, your phone number is
displayed on their phone. To block your phone number for a
particular outgoing call, press ★ 6 7 before dialing
the phone number.

Call Waiting

If you receive an incoming call while you are on another call, you hear a beep and the person's Caller ID information is displayed.

To answer the call, highlight Flash and press OK. To toggle between the two callers, highlight Flash again and press OK.

If you do not want to be interrupted during a call, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing 700 before dialing the phone number. When the call is finished, Call Waiting automatically reactivates.

To permanently disable Call Waiting for all calls, contact Sprint PCS Customer Care.

Three-Way Calling

Three-Way Calling lets you talk to two people at the same time.

To conference in a third caller when you are on a call:

- 1. Highlight Dial 3-Way Call and press OK.
- 2. Enter the phone number, highlight 3-Way Call and press OK.
- 3. When the call is answered, highlight Flash and press OK to begin your Three-Way Call.

Note: You can also initiate a Three-Way Call during a call by dialing a phone number from your Phone Book, Call Logs or Page/Text messages.


The first phone number you enter when creating a Phone Book entry is used as the default speed-dialing number.

To change the default speed-dialing number for a Phone Book entry:

- 1. Display a Phone Book entry.
- 2. Highlight Edit and press OK
- 3. Highlight Set Speed Dial and press OK.
- Highlight the number you want to make the speed-dialing number and press OK.

Roaming

Roaming Menu



Your new phone is dual band, meaning you can use it on the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network as well as on other CDMA or analog cellular networks where roaming agreements have been implemented.

Set Mode

Choose from three different settings on your dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint PhoneTM to control your roaming experience:

- Analog only This setting forces the phone to seek an analog roaming system when Sprint PCS Service is not available.
 This setting is not saved the next time the phone is turned on.

Call Guard

This feature reminds you when you make or receive a roaming call. It also requires you to take an additional step before placing or answering a roaming call. This additional step is not required when you make or receive calls while on the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network.

To turn the Call Guard feature off:

- 1. From the Main Menu, highlight Roaming and press OK.
- 2. Highlight Call Guard and press OK.
- 3. Highlight Off and press OK

To place roaming calls with Call Guard on:



Event Notification

When an event alarm is scheduled, the event description, time and date and following menu options are displayed.



Sprint PCS Wireless WebSM Browser

MiniBrowser Menu



Your Sprint PCS Phone comes equipped with a MiniBrowser which makes it possible to use Sprint Wireless Web Services. Each time you make a call using your MiniBrowser, your phone connects to the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network. Any time the ricon is visible on your phone's display, you are connected to the Sprint PCS Nationwide Network and are billed accordingly. Your connection will be terminated after a certain period of network inactivity and you will be reconnected to the network if you begin using your MiniBrowser again. When reviewing your monthly invoice, you may find that you are billed for several small network connections within a single wireless web browser session. This is normal.

Starting Your Phone's MiniBrowser

1. From the Main Menu, highlight MiniBrowser and press OK .

Note: The first time you access the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser, you will go through a setup process that takes 3 to 5 minutes.

- 2. A reminder of charge will appear momentarily.
- 3. After a few seconds, the Sprint PCS Home Page is displayed on your phone's screen. To select an option, highlight it and press OK. Or, enter the number next to the option.

Ending the Sprint PCS Wireless Web Browser Session

Press the Mouse Key left or right, highlight Exit and press OK.

Navigating Through the MiniBrowser

While using the wireless web browser, you will find that on-screen items may be presented in the following ways:

- Numbered options (some options may not be numbered)
- Links (embedded in content)
- Text or numeric input
- Simple text

You can act on the options or the links by making use of the softkeys.

Softkeys

Softkeys appear on the bottom row of your phone's display. To navigate to different screens or select special functions, press the Mouse Key left or right to highlight a softkey, then press OK.

Note: Softkey functions may change depending on the web page you are viewing.

Scrolling Up/Down by Item and by Page

If a web page's content does not fit in your phone's display area, press the Mouse Key up or down to scroll line by line. Or, press the up or down Volume Control key to scroll page by page.

Back to Previous Page

To back up to a previously displayed web page, press CLR

Entering Text, Numbers and Symbols

See "Entering Characters Using the Keypad" on page 6.

Clearing Entered Text, Numbers and Symbols

When entering text or numbers, press **CLR** to clear the last character. Press and hold **CLR** to completely clear the input field.

Using Links

Links have several purposes, including jumping to a different page, or even initiating a phone call from some sites. Linked web pages are identified by text in brackets "[Web link]."

To go to a link, highlight the text and press OK

Initiating a Phone Call

You may initiate a phone call from the Browser if the site you are using supports the feature (the phone number may be highlighted and the left softkey will appear as "Call"). The Browser connection will be terminated when you initiate the call. After you end the call, your phone will return to the screen from which you initiated the call.

Using Bookmarks

To bookmark a web site:



You can charge your phone (even during a call) in your vehicle using the Cigarette Lighter Adapter. The Cigarette Lighter Adapter charges the Standard Battery in approximately 2.5 hours and the Extended Battery in approximately 3.5 hours.

Battery Care and Storage

For optimum battery performance, follow these guidelines:

- Only use Sprint PCS-approved batteries and charging devices. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers will void your warranty and may cause damage.
- To avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures ranging from 32 degrees Fahrenheit to 113 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Do not use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in a high-humidity area, such as a bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by burning.
- Keep the metal contacts at the top of the battery clean.
- Do not allow the battery contacts to touch metal materials.
- Do not attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- Do not use the battery if it is visibly damaged.
- Keep the battery out of the reach of children and pets.
- You may need to recharge the battery if it has not been used for a long time.
- Keep the battery away from water, such as pools, spas or the ocean.

Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs to be replaced.

The dual-band Sprint PCS Touchpoint Phone™ batteries are Lithium Ion (LiIon); please dispose of properly. In some areas, the disposal of rechargeable batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your Sprint PCS Phone™ is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. Your phone transmits in the frequency range of 1851.25 MHz to 1908.75 MHz and receives in the frequency range of 1931.25 MHz to 1988.75 MHz in digital mode and transmits in the frequency range of 869.04 MHz to 893.97 MHz and receives in the frequency range of 824.04 MHz to 848.97 MHz in analog mode. The power level can reach a maximum of 200mW. When your phone is in use, the system handling your call controls the power level.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, you should always follow any special regulations in a given area. Be sure to turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Phone Use While Driving

Talking on the phone while you're driving may divert your attention from the road and is illegal in some states. Remember: SAFETY comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Focus on driving, not talking.
- Use a Hands-Free Car Kit (optional accessory).

Turn Your Phone Off Before Boarding An Aircraft

You should turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, US Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crewmember to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Radio Frequency Safety

In 1991-1992, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics
Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards
Institutes (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for
safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More
than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities,
government health agencies and industries developed this

updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted a hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

The design of your phone complies with these updated standards. Of course, if you want to limit RF exposure even further than the updated standard, you can choose to control the duration of your calls and operate your phone in the most power-efficient manner.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electrical equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from PCS phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating and entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. You should also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices (such as pacemakers and hearing aids) to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Pacemakers

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six inches be maintained between a hand held wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. Persons with pacemakers:

- Should always keep the phone more than six inches from their pacemaker when the phone is turned ON.
- Should not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.

If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid provider.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Turn your phone OFF in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals

or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

FCC Notice

The phone may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the phone if such interference cannot be eliminated.

Blasting Areas

Turn your phone OFF when in a "blasting area" or in areas posted: "Turn off two-way radio." Obey all signs and instructions. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Turn off your phone when you are in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. It is rare, but your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include fueling areas such as gas stations; below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders; and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

Do not transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in

the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) must comply with the National Fire Protection Standard (NFPA-58). For a copy of this standard, contact the National Fire Protection Association, One Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02269, Attn: Publication Sales Division.

Restricting Children's Access To Your Phone

Your phone is not a toy and should not be played with by children. They could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your telephone bills.

WARNING -- CHOKING HAZARD -- ANTENNA MAY BECOME DISLODGED

Attempting to remove or repeated twisting of the antenna will loosen the materials securing it into place and may reduce the child restraint nature of the antenna. Once the antenna is loosened or removed, only an authorized Sprint PCS Representative can restore the antenna's original integrity. Do not attempt to remove or twist the antenna.
