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1 Executive Summary

1.1 Scope

This report is intended to document the status of conformance with the requirements of the CFR 47 Part 15.247: 2017 based on the results of testing performed on 10 APR 2018 to 13 APR 2018 on the HSA-15UA-AA Model HSA-15UA-AA manufactured by Harman International Industries Incorporated. This report only applies to the specific samples tested under the stated test conditions. It is the responsibility of the manufacturer to assure that additional production units of this model are manufactured with identical or EMI equivalent electrical and mechanical components. This report is further intended to document changes and modifications to the EUT throughout its life cycle. All documentation will be included as a supplement.

1.2 Purpose

Testing was performed to evaluate the EMC performance of the EUT in accordance with the applicable requirements, procedures, and criteria defined in the application of regulations and application of standards listed in this report. The 2412 MHz to 2462 MHz frequency band is covered in this document.

2.2 Test Facilities

All of the test facilities are located at 1279 Quarry Lane, Pleasanton, California 94566, USA. The 5015 Brandin Ct. Fremont CA 94538, USA location is considered a Pleasanton annex.

2.2.1 Emission Test Facility

The Semi-Anechoic chamber and AC Line Conducted measurement facility used to collect the radiated and conducted data has been constructed in accordance with ANSI C63.7:1992. The site has been measured in accordance with and verified to comply with the theoretical normalized site attenuation requirements of ANSI C63.4-2014, at a test distance of 3 and 5 meters. The site is listed with the FCC and accredited by A2LA (Lab Code Testing Cert #3331.02). The 3/5-meter semi-anechoic chamber used to collect the radiated data has been verified to comply with the theoretical normalized site attenuation requirements of ANSI C63.4-2014, at a test distance of 3 meter and 5 meters. A report detailing this site can be obtained from TÜV Rheinland of North America.

2.2.2 Immunity Test Facility

ESD, EFT, Surge, PQF: These tests are performed in an environmentally controlled room with a 3.7 m x 4.8 m x 3.175 mm thick aluminum floor connected to PE ground.

For ESD testing, tabletop equipment is placed on an insulated mat with a surface resistivity of 10^9 Ohms/square on a 1.6 m x 0.8 m x 0.8 m high non-conductive table with a 3.175 mm aluminum top (Horizontal Coupling Plane). The HCP is connected to the main ground plane via a low impedance ground strap through two 470-k Ω resistors. The Vertical Coupling Plane consists of an aluminum plate 50 cm x 50 cm x 3.175 mm thick. The VCP is connected to the main ground plane via a low impedance ground strap through two 470-k Ω resistors.

For EFT, Surge, PQF, the HCP and VCP are removed.

RF Field Immunity testing is performed in a 7.3m x 4.3m x 4.1m anechoic chamber.

RF Conducted and Magnetic Field Immunity testing is performed on a 4.8m x 3.7m x 3.175mm thick aluminum ground plane.

All test areas allow a minimum distance of 1 meter from the EUT to walls or conducting objects.

2.3 Measurement Uncertainty

Two types of measurement uncertainty are expressed in this report, per *ISO Guide To The Expression Of Uncertainty In Measurement*, 1st Edition, 1995.

The Combined Standard Uncertainty is the standard uncertainty of the result of a measurement when that result is obtained from the values of a number of other quantities; it is equal to the positive square root of the sum of the variances or co-variances of these other quantities, weighted according to how the measurement result varies with changes in these quantities. The term *standard uncertainty* is the result of a measurement expressed as a standard deviation.

2.3.1 Sample Calculation – radiated & conducted emissions

The field strength is calculated by subtracting the Amplifier Gain and adding the Cable Loss and Antenna Correction Factor to the measured reading. The basic equation is as follows:

2.4 Calibration Traceability

All measurement instrumentation is traceable to the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). Measurement method complies with ANSI/NCSL Z540-1-1994 and ISO Standard 17025:2005. Equipment calibration records are kept on file at the test facility.

3 Product Information

3.1 Product Description

The Harman HSA-15UA-AA, is a car OBD sensor for use in a motor vehicle. The device has the capability of operating in the following frequency bands: LTE 2, LTE 4, LTE 5, LTE 12, WCDMA 2, WCDMA 5 and WiFi 2.4 GHz.

3.2 Equipment Configuration

A description of the equipment configuration is given in the Test Plan Section. The EUT was tested as called for in the test standard and was configured and operated in a manner consistent with its intended use. The placement of the EUT system components was guided by the test standard and selected to represent typical installation conditions.

In the case of an EUT that can operate in more than one configuration, preliminary testing was performed to determine the configuration that produced maximum radiation.

The final configuration was selected to produce the worst case radiation for emissions testing and to place the EUT in the most susceptible state for immunity testing.

3.3 Operating Mode

A description of the operation mode is given in the Test Plan Section. In the case of an EUT that can operate in more than one state, preliminary testing was performed to determine the operating mode that produced maximum radiation.

The final operating mode was selected to produce the worst case radiation for emissions testing..

3.4 Unique Antenna Connector

An intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this Section. The manufacturer may design the unit so that a broken antenna can be replaced by the user, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited. This requirement does not apply to carrier current devices or to devices operated under the provisions of CFR47 Parts 15.211, 15.213, 15.217, 15.219, or 15.221.

3.4.1 Results

Harman OBD II has integral antennas which cannot be removed without making the device unusable for transmission.

4 Emissions

Testing was performed in accordance with CFR 47 Part 15.247: 2017. These test methods are listed under the laboratory's A2LA Scope of Accreditation. This test measures the levels emanating from the EUT, thus evaluating the potential for the EUT to cause radio frequency interference to other electronic devices. Procedures described in section 8 of the standard were used.

4.1 Output Power Requirements

The maximum output power requirement is the maximum equivalent isotropic radiated power delivering at the transmitting antenna under specified conditions of measurements in the presence of modulation.

The maximum output power and harmonics shall not exceed CFR47 Part 15.247 (b):2017 and RSS 247: 2017 Sect. 5.4.4, and Sect. 6.2.4.

The maximum transmitted powers are

Band 2400-2483.5 MHz: 1 W

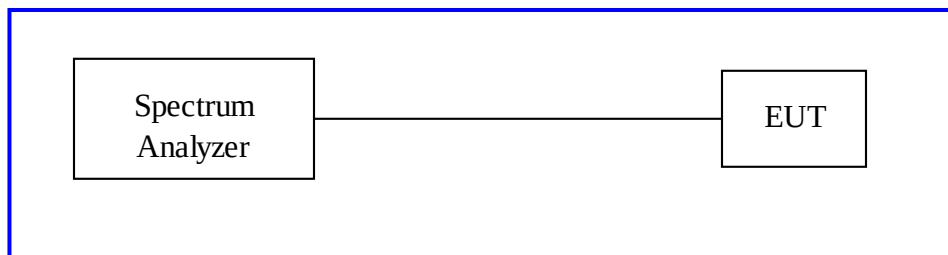
4.1.1 Test Method

The ANSI C63.10-2013 Section 11.9.2.2.2 and KDB 558074 D01 v04 section 9.2.2.6 conducted method was used to measure the channel power output. The measurements were conducted on 3 channels in each operating range per CFR47 Part 15.247(b): 2017 2400 MHz to 2483.5 MHz. The device was connected to a CMW500 which was used to set the frequency, modulation, data rate etc; traffic was generated using the CMW500. The device was connected to the spectrum analyzer with the following setting:

1. Span ≥ 1.5 times the OBW
2. Sweep Trigger = Free Run
3. RBW = 1 % to 5 % of the OBW not to exceed 1 MHz
4. VBW $\geq 3 \times \text{RBW}$
5. Sweep Points $\geq 2 \times \text{span/RBW}$
6. Detector = RMS
7. Trace Mode = Max Hold

The trace was allowed to maximize, and the analyzers power integration function was used to calculate the power. All measurement system losses have been accounted for and inputted into the analyzer.

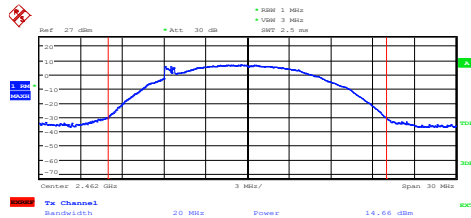

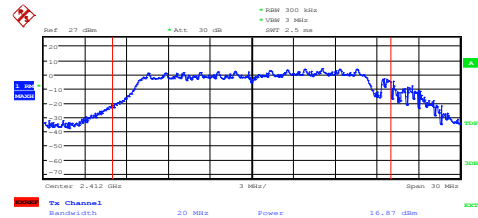

4.2 Occupied Bandwidth

The occupied bandwidth is measured at an amplitude level reduced from the reference level by a specified ratio. The reference level is the level of the highest amplitude signal observed from the transmitter at the fundamental frequency.

The 99% bandwidth is the bandwidth in which 99% of the transmitted power occupied.

The minimum 6 dB bandwidth shall be at least 500 kHz.

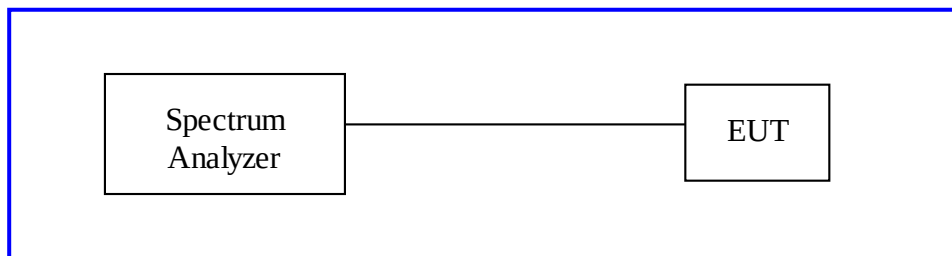
4.2.1 Test Method

The conducted method was used to measure the occupied bandwidth according to ANSI C63.10:2013 Section 11.8 and KDB 558074 v04. The measurement was performed with modulation per CFR47 15.247(a) (2) 2017 on three operating between frequency range; 2400 MHz to 2483.5 MHz. The device was connected to a CMW500 which was used to set the frequency, modulation, data rate etc; traffic was generated using the CMW500. The device was connected to the spectrum analyzer with the following setting:

1. RBW = 100 kHz
2. VBW = 3xRBW
3. Detector = Peak
4. Sweep = auto couple

The trace was allowed to maximize and the peak emission was determined. The bandwidth was measured from the two outermost amplitude points that were attenuated by 6 dB. All measurement system losses have been accounted for and inputted into the analyzer.

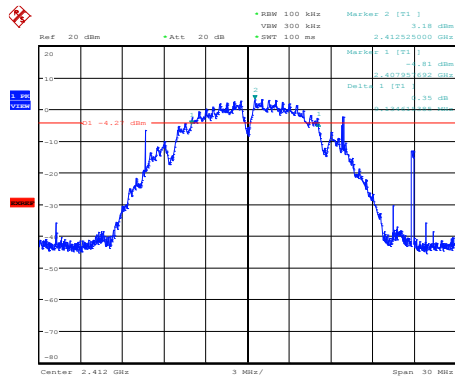

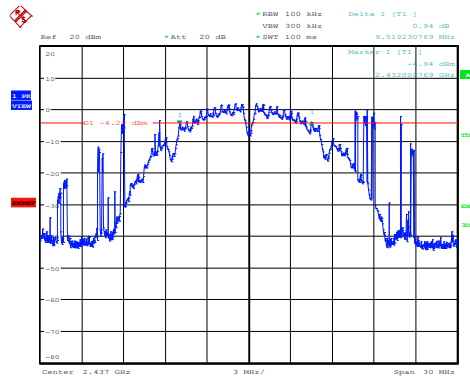

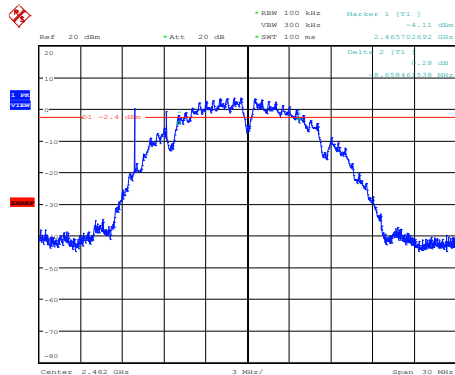

11b – 2437 MHz Bandwidth



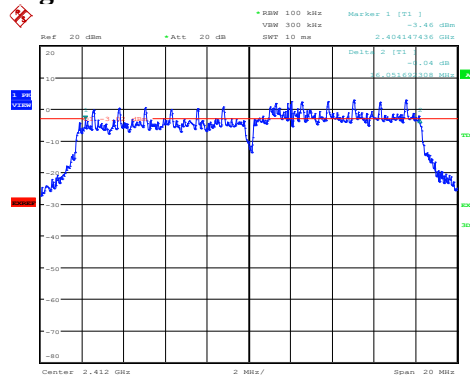

4.3 Peak Power Spectral Density

According to the CFR47 Part 15.247 (e), the power spectral density conducted from the intentional radiator to the antenna shall not be greater than 8 dBm in any 3 kHz band during any time interval of continuous transmission.

4.3.1 Test Method

The conducted method was used to measure the channel power output per ANSI C63.10-2013 Section 11.10.3 and KDB section 10.2 Method of PKPSD. The measurement was performed with modulation per CFR47 Part 15.247(e). The device was connected to a CMW500 which was used to set the frequency, modulation, data rate etc; traffic was generated using the CMW500. The device was connected to the spectrum analyzer with the following setting:

1. Span = 1.5 x DTS Bandwidth (to start)
2. RBW = 100 kHz
3. VBW $\geq$ 3 x RBW
4. Detector = Peak
5. Sweep time = auto couple
6. Trace Mode = Max Hold

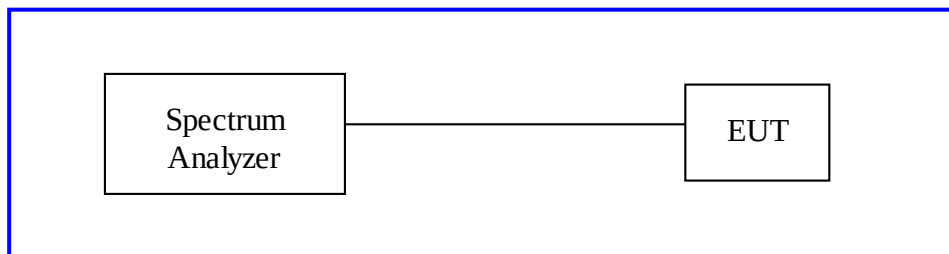
The trace is allowed to maximize and the peak marker function is used to find the peak power spectral density. If this value exceeds the 8 dBm/kHz the analyzer RBW (no less than 3 kHz) is reduced and the measurement repeated. The final PSD is calculated to dBm/3 kHz when an RBW is not set to 3 kHz with the following function:

$$\text{RBW Correction Factor} = 10 \text{ Log (Analyzer RBW/3 kHz)}$$

$$\text{Corrected PSD (dBm/3 kHz)} = \text{Measured PSD} - \text{RBW Correction Factor}$$

All measurement system losses have been accounted for and inputted into the analyzer.

4.4 Out of Band Emissions

§2.1051 The radio frequency voltage or powers generated within the equipment and appearing on a spurious frequency shall be checked at the equipment output terminals when properly loaded with a suitable artificial antenna. Curves or equivalent data shall show the magnitude of each harmonic and other spurious emission that can be detected when the equipment is operated under the conditions specified in §2.1049 as appropriate. The magnitude of spurious emissions which are attenuated more than 20 dB below the permissible value need not be specified.

§15.247(d) In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the frequency band in which the spread spectrum or digitally modulated intentional radiator is operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20 dB below that in the 100 kHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, based on either an RF conducted or a radiated measurement, provided the transmitter demonstrates compliance with the peak conducted power limits. If the transmitter complies with the conducted power limits based on the use of RMS averaging over a time interval, as permitted under paragraph (b)(3) of this section, the attenuation required under this paragraph shall be 30 dB instead of 20 dB. Attenuation below the general limits specified in §15.209(a) is not required. In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands, as defined in §15.205(a), must also comply with the radiated emission limits specified in §15.209(a) (see §15.205(c)).

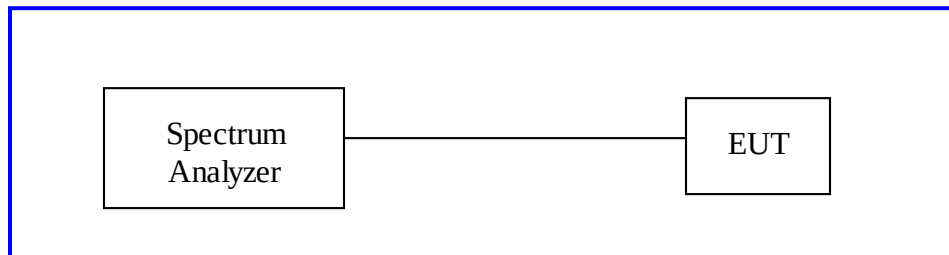
4.4.1 Test Method

KDB 558074 D01 v04 section 11 was used. The device was connected to a CMW500 which was used to set the frequency, modulation, data rate etc; traffic was generated using the CMW500. The 30 dBc level was determined from the maximum PSD measurement made in the previous section. The device was directly connected to a spectrum analyzer with the following settings:

1. Span set to encompass 30 MHz to the 10th harmonic of the fundamental frequency
2. RBW = 100 kHz
3. VBW = 300 kHz
4. Detector Peak
5. Sweep Time = auto couple
6. Trace Mode = max hold

The trace was allowed to maximize and maximum emissions reported. All measurement system losses have been accounted for and inputted into the analyzer.

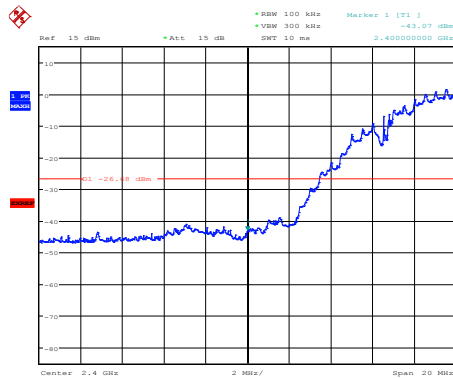

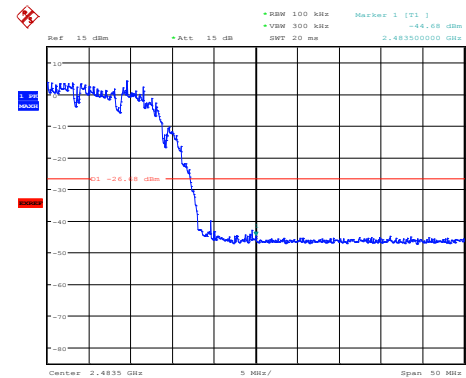

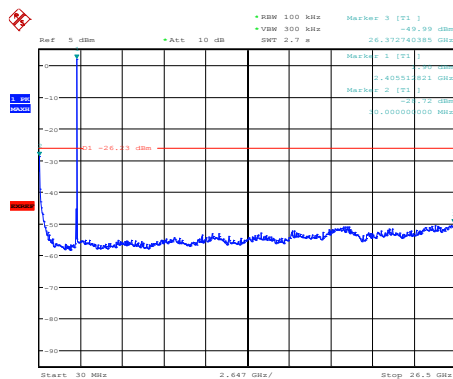
11b – 2412 MHz Bandedge



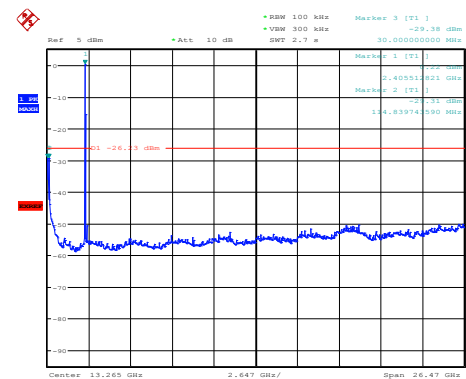
11b – 2462 MHz Bandedge



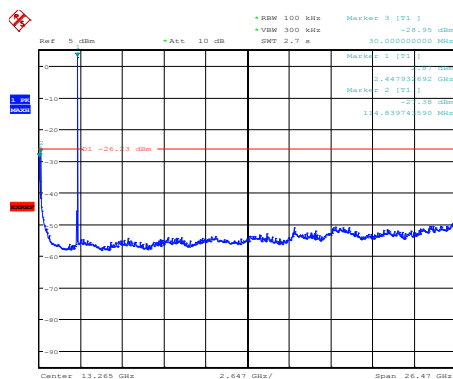
11b – 2412 MHz Conducted Emissions



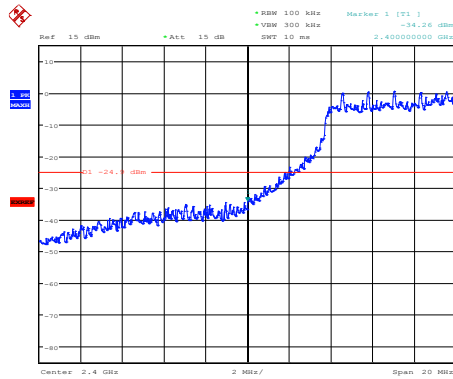
11b – 2437 MHz Conducted Emissions

4.5 Transmit Spurious Emissions

Transmitter spurious emissions are emissions outside the frequency range of the equipment when the equipment is in transmit mode; per requirement of CFR47 15.205, 15.209, 15.247(d), RSS 247 Sect.5.5.

4.5.1 Test Methodology

4.5.1.1 Preliminary Test

A test program that controls instrumentation and data logging was used to automate the preliminary RF emission test procedure. The frequency range of interest was divided into sub-ranges to yield a frequency resolution of approximately 120 kHz and provide a reading at each frequency for no more than 12° of turntable rotation. For each frequency sub-range the turntable was rotated 360° while peak emission data was recorded and plotted over the frequency range of interest in horizontal and vertical antenna polarization's.

Preliminary emission profile testing was performed inside the anechoic chamber. The EUT was placed on a 1.0m x 1.5m non-conductive table 80cm (<1 GHz) and 150cm (>1 GHz) above the floor. The EUT was positioned as shown in the setup photographs. The receiving antenna was placed at a distance of 3m at a fixed height of 1m. Measurement equipment was located outside of the chamber. A video camera was placed inside the chamber to view the EUT.

4.5.1.2 Final Test

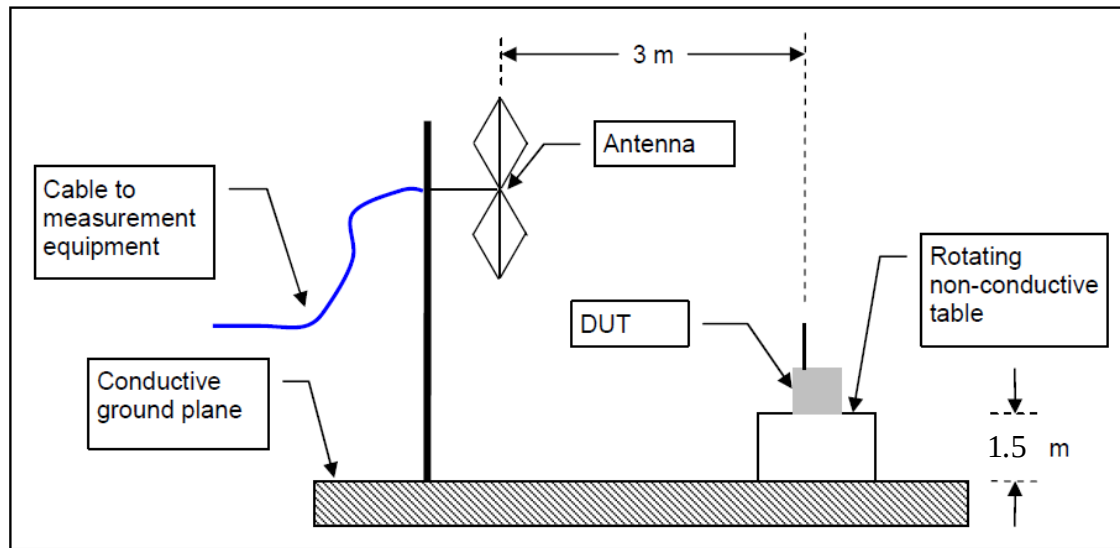
For each frequency measured, the peak emission was maximized by manipulating the receiving antenna from 1 to 4 meters above the ground plane and placing it at the position that produced the maximum signal strength reading. The turntable was then rotated through 360° while observing the peak signal and placing the EUT at the position that produced maximum radiation. The six highest emissions relative to the limit were measured unless such emissions were more than 20 dB below the limit. If less than six emissions are within 20 dB of the limit, then the noise level of the receiver is measured at frequencies where emissions are expected. Multiples of all oscillator and microprocessor frequencies were also checked.

Final testing was performed on an NSA compliant test site. The EUT was placed on a 1.0m x 1.5m non-conductive table 80cm (<1 GHz) and 150cm (>1 GHz) above the ground plane. The placement of EUT and cables were the same as for preliminary testing and is shown in the setup photographs.

4.6 AC Conducted Emissions

Testing was performed in accordance with ANSI C63.4: 2014. These test methods are listed under the laboratory's A2LA Scope of Accreditation.

This test measures the levels emanating from the EUT's AC input port, thus evaluating the potential for the EUT to cause radio frequency interference to other electronic devices.

The AC conducted emissions of equipment under test shall not exceed the values in CFR47 Part 15.207: 2017 and RSS Gen: 2017 Sect. 8.8.

4.6.1 Test Methodology

A test program that controls instrumentation and data logging was used to automate the AC Power Line Conducted emission test procedure. The frequency range of interest was divided into sub-ranges such as to yield a frequency resolution of 9 kHz. Each phase and neutral of the AC power line were measured with respect to ground. Measurements were performed using a set of 50µH / 50Ω LISNs.

Testing is performed in Lab 5. The setup photographs clearly identify which site was used. The vertical ground plane used in the semi-anechoic chamber is a 2m x 2m solid aluminum frame and panel, and it is bonded to the horizontal ground plane.

In the case of tabletop equipment, the EUT is placed on a 1.0m x 1.5m non-conductive table 80cm above the ground plane and 40cm from a vertical ground reference plane. The rear of the EUT was positioned flush with the backside of the table and directly over the LISNs. The power and I/O cables were routed over the edge of the table and bundled approximately 40cm from the ground plane. Support equipment was powered from a separate LISN.

4.6.1.1 Deviations

There were no deviations from this test methodology.

4.6.2 Test Results

No testing is required because EUT is DC powered and not connected to AC mains (Car Use only).

4.7 Maximum Permissible Exposure – Not Applicable

4.7.1 Test Methodology

In this section, we try to prove the safety of radiation harmfulness to the human body for our product. The KDB 447498 D01v06 General RF Exposure Guidance is followed. The Gain of the antenna used in this calculation is declared by the manufacturer, and the maximum average power input to the antenna is measured. Using the general SAR test exclusion guidance in Section 4.3 of KDB 447498 D01v06, we show that the device meets the SAR exclusion threshold found in Appendix A of KDB 447498 D01v06 and the SAR exemption limits found in table 1 of RSS-102 Issue 5.

ISED accepts the KDB 447498 D01v06 Procedure.

4.7.2 FCC KDB 447498 D01v06 – General SAR Test Exclusion Guidance

The SAR exclusion threshold conditions are listed:

1) The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances ≤ 50 mm are determined by the following formula:

$$\text{Exclusion Threshold} = [P / d] * [\sqrt{f}]$$

Where

P = max power of channel (including tune-up tolerance) in mW

d = min. test separation distance in mm

f = the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz

Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation

The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison

Limits: ≤ 3.0 for 1-g SAR ≤ 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR

The test exclusions are applicable only when the minimum test separation distance is ≤ 50 mm and for transmission frequencies between 100 MHz and 6 GHz. When the minimum test separation distance is < 5 mm, a distance of 5 mm is applied to determine SAR test exclusion.

4.7.3 EUT Operating Condition

The software provided by Manufacturer enabled the EUT to transmit data at lowest, middle and highest channel individually.

4.7.4 Classification

The antenna of the product, under normal condition, is less than 20cm away from the body of the user. This device is classified as a **Portable Device**.
