After a review of the submitted information, I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

Administrative Issues:

- 1) The block diagram should show the frequencies of all oscillators in the TX device (CFR 2.1033(a)(5)). Please update the block diagram to include this information.
- 2) Page 35 appears to only show peak data for Vertical 9848 MHz. Page 46 appears to only show peak data for Horizontal 9648 MHz and Vertical 9648 MHz. Page 47 appears to only show peak data for Horizontal 9748 MHz. Page 48 appears to only show peak data for Vertical 9848 MHz. Since these measurements exceed the average limits, the correct limit of -20 dB from the fundamental should be applied to these frequencies (not 74 dBuV/m) that DO NOT fall in restricted bands. Please correct.
- 3) Page 47 appears to only show peak data for Horizontal 7311 MHz and Vertical 7311 MHz. Average measurements are necessary since these fall in restricted bands. Compliance must be shown for these points to both the peak and average limits.
