Safety precautions

Using your Notebook PC



This Notebook PC should only be used in environments with ambient temperatures between 5°C (41°F) and 35°C (95°F).



Refer to the rating label on the bottom of your Notebook PC and ensure that your power adapter complies with this rating.



Do not leave your Notebook PC on your lap or near any part of your body to prevent discomfort or injury from heat exposure.



Do not use damaged power cords, accessories, and other peripherals with your Notebook PC.



While powered on, ensure that you do not carry or cover your Notebook PC with any materials that can reduce air circulation.



Do not place your Notebook PC on uneven or unstable work surfaces.



You can send your Notebook PC through x-ray machines (used on items placed on conveyor belts), but do not expose them to magnetic detectors and wands.



Contact your airline provider to learn about related inflight services that can be used and restrictions that must be followed when using your Notebook PC in-flight.

Caring for your Notebook PC



Disconnect the AC power and remove the battery pack (if applicable) before cleaning your Notebook PC. Use a clean cellulose sponge or chamois cloth dampened with a solution of nonabrasive detergent and a few drops of warm water. Remove any extra moisture from your Notebook PC using a dry cloth.



Do not use strong solvents such as thinners, benzene, or other chemicals on or near your Notebook PC.



Do not place objects on top of your Notebook PC.



Do not expose your Notebook PC to strong magnetic or electrical fields.



Do not use or expose your Notebook PC near liquids, rain, or moisture.



Do not expose your Notebook PC to dusty environments.



Do not use your Notebook PC near gas leaks.

Proper disposal



Do not throw your Notebook PC in municipal waste. This product has been designed to enable proper reuse of parts and recycling. The symbol of the crossed out wheeled bin indicates that the product (electrical, electronic equipment, and mercury-containing button cell battery) should not be placed in municipal waste. Check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.



Do not throw the battery in municipal waste. The symbol of the crossed out wheeled bin indicates that the battery should not be placed in municipal waste.

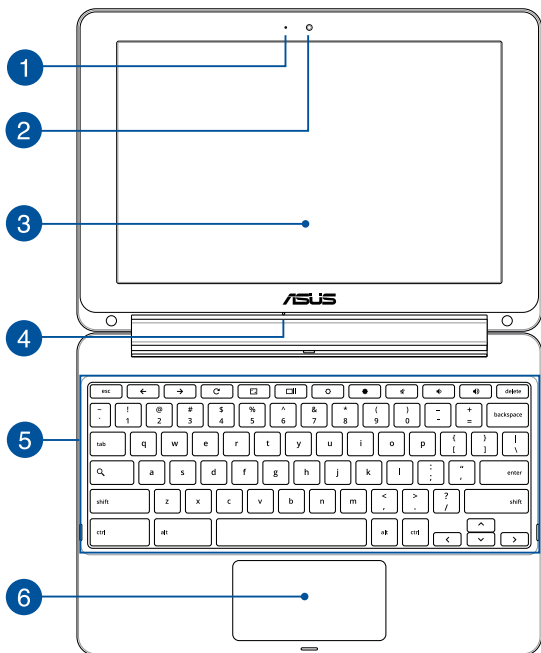
Chapter 1:

Hardware Setup

Getting to know your Notebook PC

Top View

NOTE: The keyboard's layout may vary per region or country. The Notebook may also vary in appearance depending on the Notebook PC model.



1 Camera indicator

The built-in camera allows you to take pictures or record videos using your Notebook PC.

2 Camera

The camera indicator lights up when the built-in camera is in use.

3 360°-adjustable touch screen panel

Your Notebook PC's touch screen panel can be adjusted all the way into a 360° angle. This feature allows you to quickly turn your device from a Notebook PC into a touch-enabled tablet PC.

This high-definition touch screen panel provides excellent viewing features for photos, videos, and other multimedia files on your Notebook PC. It also allows you to operate it using touch screen gestures.

NOTE: For more details on how to turn your Notebook PC into a tablet device, refer to the *Using the touch screen panel as a tablet* section in this manual.

4 Microphone

The built-in microphone can be used for video conferencing, voice narrating, or simple audio recording.

5 Keyboard

The keyboard provides full-sized QWERTY keys with a comfortable travel depth for typing. It also enables you to use the function keys, allows quick access to Chrome™ OS, and controls other multimedia functions.

NOTE: The keyboard layout differs by model or region.

6 Touchpad

The touchpad allows the use of multi-gestures to navigate onscreen, providing an intuitive user experience. It also simulates the functions of a regular mouse.

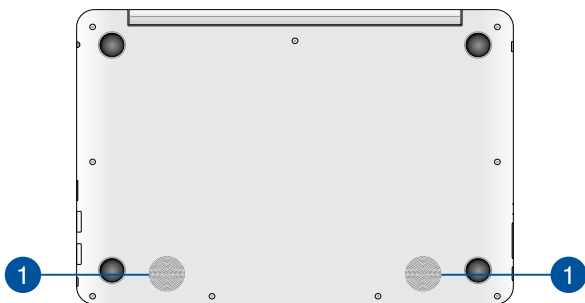
NOTE: For more details, refer to the *Using touchpad gestures* section in this manual.

Bottom

NOTE: The bottom side may vary in appearance depending on model.

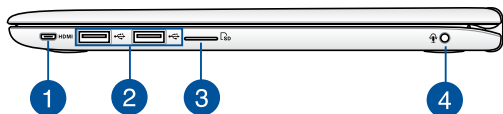
WARNING! The bottom of the Notebook PC can get warm to hot while in use or while charging the battery pack. When working on your Notebook PC, DO NOT place it on surfaces that can block the vents.

IMPORTANT! Battery time varies by usage and by the specifications for this Notebook PC. The battery pack cannot be disassembled.



- 1 Audio speakers**
The built-in audio speakers allow you to hear audio straight from your Notebook PC. Audio features are software-controlled.

Right Side



1 Micro HDMI port

This port is for a micro HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) connector and is HDCP compliant for HD DVD, Blu-ray, and other protected content playback.

2 USB 2.0 ports

These USB (Universal Serial Bus) ports are compatible with USB 2.0 or USB 1.1 devices such as keyboards, pointing devices, flash disk drives, external HDDs, speakers, cameras, and printers.

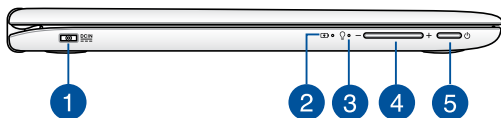
3 MicroSD card slot

This Notebook PC comes with a built-in memory card reader slot that supports microSD card, microSDHC card, and microSDXC card formats.

4 Headphone output/Microphone input combo jack port

This port allows you to connect your Notebook PC to amplified speakers or headphones. You can also use this port to connect your Notebook PC to an external microphone.

Left Side



1 Power (DC) input port

Insert the bundled power adapter into this port to charge the battery pack and supply power to your Notebook PC.

WARNING! The adapter may become warm to hot while in use. Do not cover the adapter and keep it away from your body while it is connected to a power source.

IMPORTANT! Use only the bundled power adapter to charge the battery pack and supply power to your Notebook PC.

2 Two-color battery charge indicator

The two-color LED provides a visual indication of the battery's charge status. Refer to the following table for details.

Color	Status
Solid Green	The Notebook PC is plugged to a power source and the battery power is between 95% and 100%.
Solid Orange	The Notebook PC is plugged to a power source, charging its battery, and the battery power is less than 95%.
Blinking Orange	The Notebook PC is running on battery mode and the battery power is less than 10%.
Lights off	The Notebook PC is running on battery mode and the battery power is between 10% to 100%.

3 Power indicator

The power indicator lights up when the Notebook PC is turned on and blinks slowly when the Notebook PC is in sleep mode.

4 Volume button

This button turns the volume up or down on your Notebook PC.

5 Power button

Press the power button to turn your Notebook PC on or off. You can also use the power button to put your Notebook PC to sleep or hibernate mode and wake it up from sleep or hibernate mode.

In the event that your Notebook PC becomes unresponsive, press and hold the power button for at least four (4) seconds until your Notebook PC shuts down.



Chapter 2:

Using your Notebook PC

Getting started

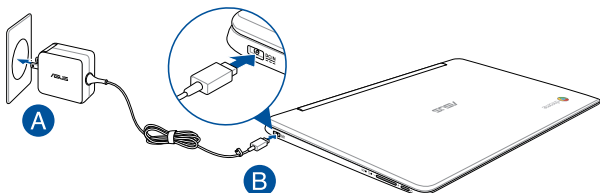
Charge your Notebook PC

- A. Plug the AC power adapter into a 100V~240V power source.
- B. Connect the DC power connector into your Notebook PC's power (DC) input.



Charge the Notebook PC for **three (3) hours** before using it in battery mode for the first time.

NOTE: The power adapter may vary in appearance, depending on your model and region.



IMPORTANT!

Power adapter information:

- Input voltage: 100-240V AC
 - Input frequency: 50-60Hz
 - Rating output current: 2A (24W)
 - Rating output voltage: 12V

IMPORTANT!

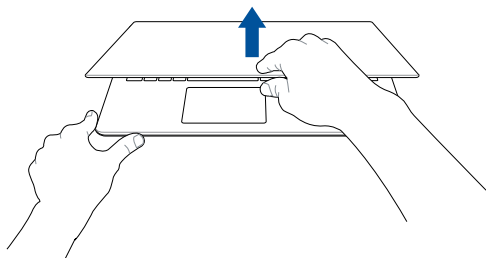
- Locate the input/output rating label on your Notebook PC and ensure that it matches the input/output rating information on your power adapter. Some Notebook PC models may have multiple rating output currents based on the available SKU.
 - Ensure that your Notebook PC is connected to the power adapter before turning it on for the first time. We strongly recommend that you use a grounded wall socket while using your Notebook PC on power adapter mode.
 - The socket outlet must be easily accessible and near your Notebook PC.
 - To disconnect your Notebook PC from its main power supply, unplug your Notebook PC from the power socket.

WARNING!

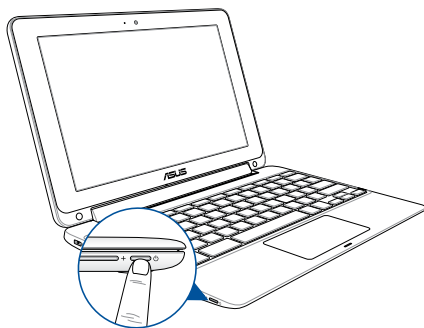
Read the following precautions for your Notebook PC's battery.

- Only ASUS-authorized technicians should remove the battery inside the device.
 - The battery used in this device may present a risk of fire or chemical burn if removed or disassembled.
 - Follow the warning labels for your personal safety.
 - Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
 - Do not dispose of in fire.
 - Never attempt to short-circuit your Notebook PC's battery.
 - Never attempt to disassemble and reassemble the battery.
 - Discontinue usage if leakage is found.
 - The battery and its components must be recycled or disposed of properly.
 - Keep the battery and other small components away from children.

Gestures for the touch screen panel and touchpad

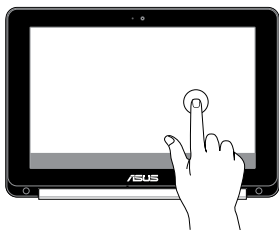
Gestures allow you to launch programs and access the settings of your Notebook PC. Refer to the following illustrations when using hand gestures on your touch screen panel and touchpad.

NOTE: The following screenshots are for reference only. The touch screen panel's appearance may vary depending on model.

Using touch screen panel gestures

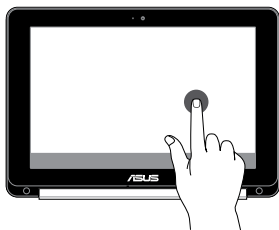
The gestures allow you to launch programs and access the settings of your Notebook PC. The functions can be activated by using the hand gestures to your Notebook PC's touch screen panel.

Tap



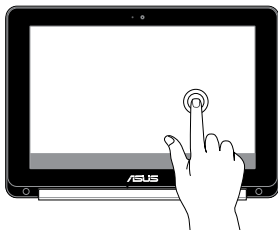
Tap to select an item and launch it.

Double tap



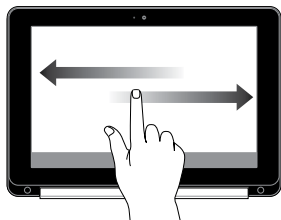
Double tap to select a block of text.

Tap and hold



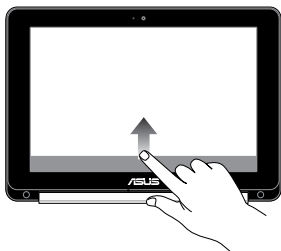
Tap and hold an item until a menu appears (if available), and you may tap to select an action from the menu.

Slide to the right or left



Slide to the right or left to go backward or forward through your web browsing history.

Bottom edge swipe



Slide your fingertip upward from the bottom edge of the screen to toggle on and off the auto-hide taskbar.

Pinch or stretch



Use two of your fingertips to pinch or stretch on the screen to zoom out or zoom in.

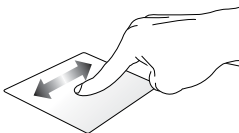
Gestures for the touchpad

Gestures allow you to launch programs and access the settings of your Notebook PC. Refer to the following illustrations when using hand gestures on your touchpad.

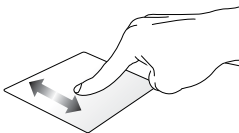
Moving the pointer

You can tap or click anywhere on the touchpad to activate its pointer, then slide your finger on the touchpad to move the pointer onscreen.

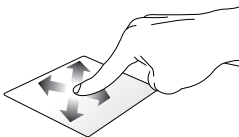
Slide horizontally



Slide vertically

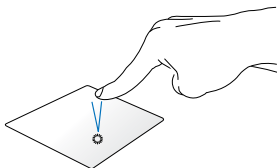


Slide diagonally



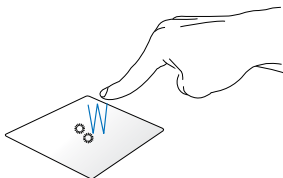
One-finger gestures

Click/Tap



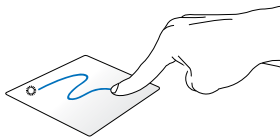
Click/Tap on the touchpad to launch and activate apps and programs.

Double tap/Double click



Double-tap/Double-click on an active screen to minimize or maximize it on your display panel.

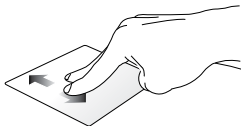
Drag and drop



Click/Tap on an active screen then slide the same finger without lifting it off the touchpad. To drop the screen to its new location, lift your finger from the touchpad.

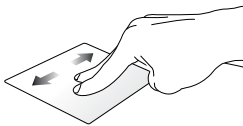
Two-finger gestures

Two-finger scroll (up/down)



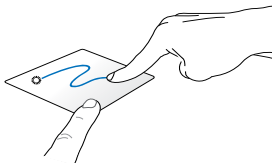
Slide two fingers to scroll up or down.

Two-finger scroll (left/right)



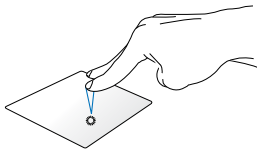
- Slide two fingers to scroll left or right.
- While browsing a web page, slide two fingers to the left or right to go back or move to the next web page visited.

Drag and drop



Select an item then press and hold the touchpad. Using your other finger, slide down the touchpad to drag and drop the item to a new location.

Two-finger click/tap



Click/Tap two fingers on the touchpad to simulate the right-click function.

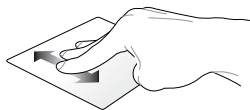
Three-finger gesture

Swipe left/Swipe right



If you opened multiple tabs on your web browser, swipe three fingers left or right to switch between these tabs.

Swipe down



Swipe down to see an overview of all the screens currently opened on Chrome™.

Using the keyboard

The following shortcut keys on your Notebook PC's keyboard can be used to launch programs and functions while using your Chrome™ OSoperating system.

Moves to the next page



Reloads your current web page



Activates full-screen mode for the currently opened screen.



Switches to the next window



Decreases display brightness



Increases display brightness



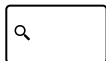

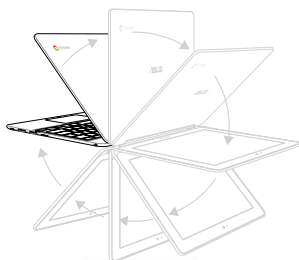

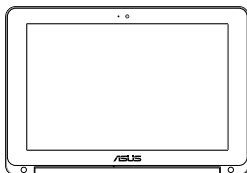
To use your Notebook PC's touch screen panel as a tablet device, you may adjust it all the way into a 360° angle as shown below.

Chapter 3:

Working with Chrome™ OS

Starting for the first time

When you start your Notebook PC for the first time, a series of screens appear to guide you in configuring your Chrome™ operating system.

To start your Notebook PC:

1. Press the power button on your Notebook PC. Wait for a few minutes until the setup screen appears.
2. From the setup screen, select your preferred option from the drop-down button beside the following items:

- **Select your language**
- **Select your keyboard**
- **Select a network**

Once finished, click **Continue**.

3. Carefully read the **Google Chrome OS Terms** then select **Accept and continue**.
4. In the following sign in screen, input the **Email** and **Password** of your Google account. If you don't have a Google account yet, you may create one by clicking on the **create a Google Account** link.

If you want to skip this sign in process, you may also click **browse as Guest** to proceed.

5. Once the setup process is complete, the web browser is launched and you may start working on Chrome™ OS.

Sign-in area

After turning on your Notebook PC, the sign-in screen appears so you can choose to work on Chrome™ OS using either of the following options.

IMPORTANT! Ensure you have Internet connection before choosing any of the following sign-in options.

Browse as Guest

This option is recommended if you simply want to browse online or let others use your Notebook PC. Downloaded files, browser history, and cookies are not stored once you sign out as guest.

User account

Use this option to access apps and other programs offered in Chrome™ OS and save downloaded files, apps, and browser histories right into your user account.

Signing in to your user account

Select the user account you want to use then type your password on the **enter password** field.

Adding a user account

Refer to the following steps if you want to add a new user account:

1. Click **Add user** on the bottom part of the sign-in area.
2. In the following screen, input the new **Email** and **Password** you would like to add as a user account. Your email account must be Gmail. To create a new Google account, click the **create a Google Account** link.
3. Click **Sign in**.

Using your desktop

Apps list

Start working on your Notebook PC by launching apps that can be accessed after signing in to your user account. These apps enable a variety of functions that can help you maximize the features of your Notebook PC.

To launch the app list, click  on the launcher.

NOTE: When browsing as a guest, only the  icon appears on your launcher.

Adding apps on the launcher

To add more apps on the launcher:

1. Click .
2. Right-click on the app you want to add on the launcher then select **Pin to shelf**.

Deleting apps from the launcher

To delete any of the apps you currently have on the launcher:

1. Right-click on the app you want to delete.
2. Select **Unpin**.

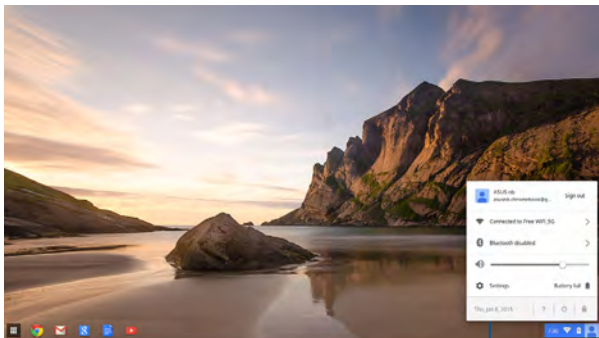
Configuring the app settings

To configure your app's appearance once launched:

1. Right-click on the app you want to configure.
2. Select any of the following options:
 - **Open as regular tab**
 - **Open as pinned tab**
 - **Open as window**
 - **Open maximized**

Status area

At a glance, the status area displays an overview of your Google user account information. It also allows you to change the settings of your Notebook PC and your current user account.



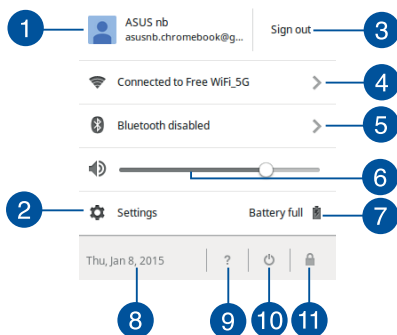
Status area

Launching the status area

To launch the status area, click anywhere on the status area box on the lower right corner of your desktop screen.

Inside the status area



1 User account

This shows the Google user account currently used.

2 Settings

Click this option to access your Chrome™ OS settings.

3 Sign out

Click this option to sign out from the current user account.

4 Network

Click this option to view your current network connection, available network connections, and the network settings.

5 Bluetooth

Click this option to enable or disable your Bluetooth feature and manage other Bluetooth devices.

- 6 Volume**
Drag the volume slider to the right or to the left to turn the volume up or down on your Notebook PC.
- 7 Battery status**
This shows the current battery life percentage of your Notebook PC. It also calculates the remaining time before your battery becomes discharged or fully-charged again.
- 8 Date and time**
Click this option if you want to adjust the date and time settings of your Notebook PC.
- 9 Chromebook help**
Click this option to access the Chromebook help center.
- 10 Shutdown**
Click this option to sign out of your current log in session and turn off your Notebook PC.
- 11 Lock**
Click this option to lock your current session and return to the sign in area.

Connecting to the Internet

Internet connection is a must for you to work on Chrome™ OS via your Notebook PC. Connect to the Internet wirelessly using a Wi-Fi connection.

Enabling your Wi-Fi connection

To enable your Wi-Fi connection:

1. Launch the status area.
2. Select **No Network > Turn Wi-Fi on...**

Switching to a new Wi-Fi network connection

By default, your Notebook PC uses the Wi-Fi network you chose during the setup process when you used your device for the first time. In case you need to choose a new network connection, refer to the following:

1. Launch the status area.
2. Select your current Wi-Fi network connection.
3. Select your new Wi-Fi network connection from the current list of networks then type in the corresponding password, if necessary.

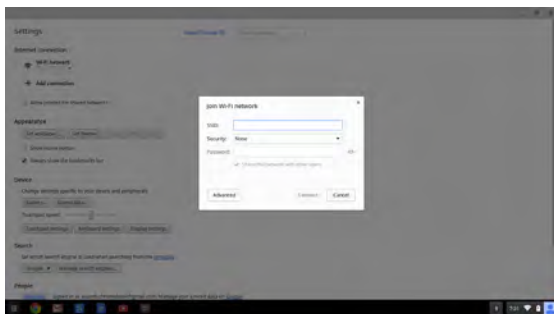
Adding a network connection

To add a new network connection to your list of networks:

1. Launch the status area.
2. Click **Settings**.
3. Under **Internet connection**, select **Add connection**.



4. Choose **Add Wi-Fi...** or **Add private network...** then input the necessary details to setup your new network connection.



5. Click **Connect** to start connecting to the Internet using this new network connection.

Chrome browser

The Chrome browser is your main tool to go online. Aside from the Internet, this browser also displays most of the applications launched in the Chrome™ OS.

To launch the Chrome browser, click  on the launcher.

Inside the Chrome browser



1 Previous and next web page icons

Press these icons to go back to the previous page or go to the next web page.

2 Reload

Click this to reload the current web page.

- 3 Tab**
The tab allows you to launch multiple sites or applications on your Chrome browser.
- 4 Close**
Click this option to close the current tab.
- 5 New tab**
Click this option to launch a new tab on your Chrome browser.
- 6 Address bar**
The address bar displays the current file path or website address of the tab you are viewing. You may also use the address bar to search the web by typing down your search word then press .
- 7 Bookmark**
Click this to bookmark the current web page you are viewing.
- 8 Minimize/Maximize**
Click this to maximize or minimize your Chrome browser.
- 9 Close**
Click this to close your Chrome browser.
- 10 Settings**
Click to customize the settings of your Chrome browser.
- 11 Scroll bar**
Move this bar up or down to scroll up or down the web page.

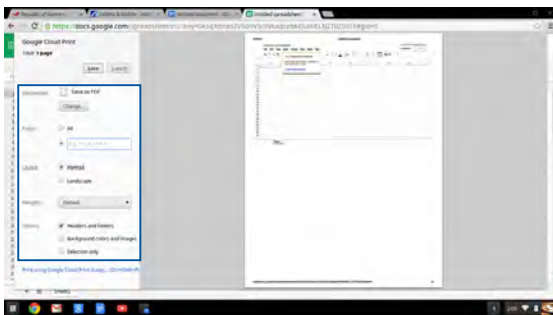
Printing documents

Using the print feature of your Notebook PC's Chrome™ OS, you can save files in PDF format or create hard copies via Google Cloud Print.

Saving PDF files

To save your file in PDF format:

1. Open the file you want to print then press ctrl + p.
2. On the left side of your screen, select the settings you want to modify such as the **Pages**, **Layout**, **Margins**, and **Options**.



3. When finished, click **Save**.

4. In the next screen that appears, select which location you want to save your file as a PDF then type in your preferred file name in the **File name** box.



5. Click **Save** to create the pdf file into the location and exit.

Google Cloud Print

If you need to create file printouts from your Notebook PC, you may do so using the Google Cloud Print feature. Google Cloud Print allows you to create hard copies using these key ingredients: cloud-based technology, an active Internet connection, and a cloud print enabled printer.

Refer to the following information for details on how to use this feature.

Using Cloud Ready printers

If your printer already supports Google Cloud Print, refer to its user guide to start using it with your Notebook PC.

NOTE: If your printer does not appear on the list, you may refer to the *Connecting a classic printer to Google Cloud Print* section in this manual.

Connecting a classic printer to Google Cloud Print

Classic printers are printers that do not automatically support Google Cloud Print and needs to be manually setup for use with Google

To use a classic printer with your Notebook PC, you need to connect the said printer to Google Cloud Print via a compatible Windows® computer.

IMPORTANT!

- Ensure that you are running a Windows® XP or higher on your computer. When using Windows® XP, ensure that the Windows XP Service Pack 3 (SP3 is already installed.
 - You must install the printer to your compatible Windows® computer first before connecting it with Google Cloud Print.
 - Ensure that your computer has an installed Google Chrome browser.
-

To connect classic printers to Google Cloud print:

1. Connect your preferred printer to your computer then turn on both devices.

IMPORTANT! Ensure that your printer is already installed to your computer before proceeding with the next steps.

2. Connect your computer to the Internet then open your Google Chrome browser.
3. Click  > **Settings**.
4. Click **Show advanced settings...**

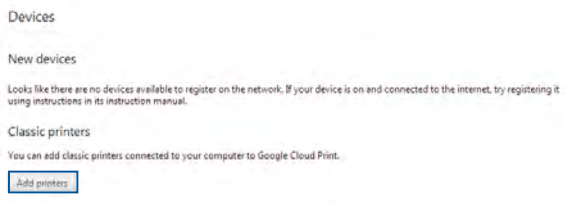

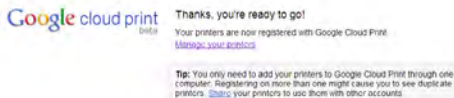

6. Under **Classic Printers** click **Add printers.**



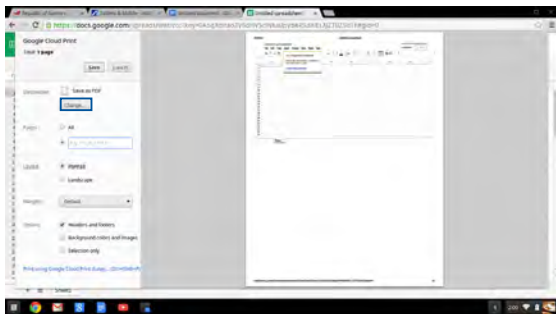
7. Sign in using your Google account.
8. In the next screen, click the printer that you want to connect to Google Cloud Print then click **Add printers.**
9. The following screen appears when you have successfully set up your printer with Google Cloud Print.



Using Google Cloud Print to create printouts

After successfully connecting your printer with Google Cloud Print, you can start printing files from your Notebook PC using the following procedures:

1. Open the file you want to print then press ctrl + p.
2. Under the **Destination** option, click **Change...**



3. From the list of registered printers, click the printer you want to use.
4. Configure any additional print options you may want to use then click **Print**.

Managing your files

Manage and store files on your Notebook PC using the **Files** app and **Google Drive** app on the Chrome™ OS.

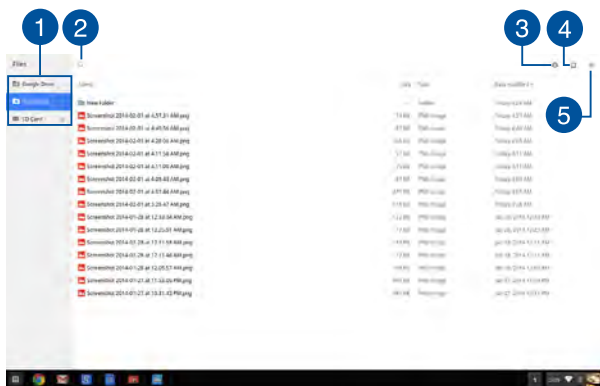
Using these apps, you can store and edit various files such as documents, images, audios, and videos while working on your Notebook PC. You may also save and access these files via Google Drive's cloud storage system.

Files app

The Files app allows you to see all the files that have been downloaded to your Notebook PC and those that are stored on your Google Drive. It also shows all connected external devices to your Notebook PC.

To launch the Google Drive app, click  > .

Inside the Files app



1 File locations

This column shows you the currently available file locations. This also shows all the external storage devices that are currently connected to your Notebook PC.

2 Search

Click on the search button to enable the search box. To use the search box, type the file name you want to locate then press



3 Settings

Click this button to customize the settings of your currently active file location.

4 Minimize/Maximize

Click this to maximize or minimize your Chrome browser.

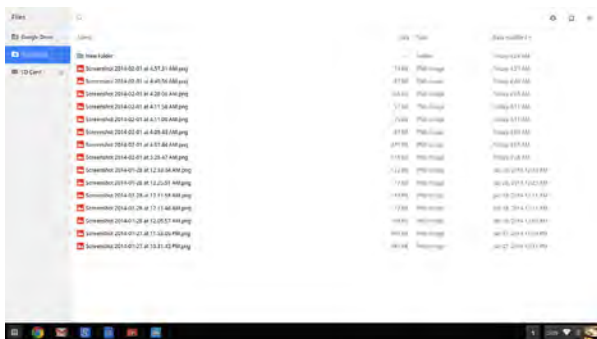
5 Close

Click this to close your Chrome browser.

Accessing files stored on your Notebook PC

The Downloads folder inside the Files app is where your Notebook PC stores all types of files downloaded online or saved on your Notebook PC.

To access these files, simply launch the Files app then select the Downloads folder and click the file you want to open.



Moving files to another folder

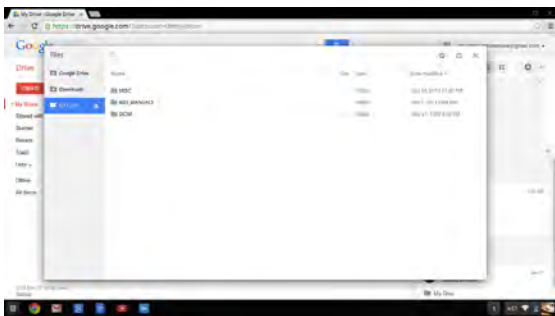
If you want to move files from one location to another inside the Files app, refer to the following procedures:

1. Open the file location where the file is currently placed.
2. Select the file(s) you want to move then drag and drop the file(s) into the new file location.

Unmounting devices

To ensure that your devices are safely disconnected from your Notebook PC, unmount them first via Files app using the following steps:

1. Click  >  .
2. Select the device you want to unmount then click  .



3. Once the unmounted device no longer appears on the file locations column, you may remove the device from your Notebook PC.

Creating a new folder

if you want to create a new folder inside any of the current file locations of your Notebook PC, refer to the following steps:

1. in the Files app screen, select the file location where you want to create a new folder.
2. Press  +  to create a new folder.

Google Drive

Google Drive is a 15 GB cloud storage system you can access on your Notebook PC via your Google account. It allows you to sync and access your files across other devices such as mobile phones, tablet PCs, and other Notebook PCs.

There are two ways in which you can access Google Drive on your Notebook PC: via the Files app or by launching the Google Drive app.

Launching Google Drive via the Files app

Google Drive under the Files app allows you to see all the files that are currently stored in your Google Drive. It also allows you to quickly move files from the Downloads folder into your Google Drive.

To launch Google Drive via the Files app:

1. Click  >  .
2. Select **Google Drive** to view all the files currently stored in it under the following categories:
 - **Google Drive** - Lists all stored files
 - **Offline** - Lists all files that can be accessed offline
 - **Shared with me** - Lists all files that are shared from other Google accounts
 - **Recent** - Lists all recently opened files

Moving your downloads to Google Drive

By default, all the files downloaded on your Notebook PC are stored inside the **Download** app. You can move these files to your Google Drive using the following procedures:

1. Click  >  .
2. Click **Downloads** then select the Google docs, files, or folders that you want to move then drag and drop these selected items into **Google Drive**.

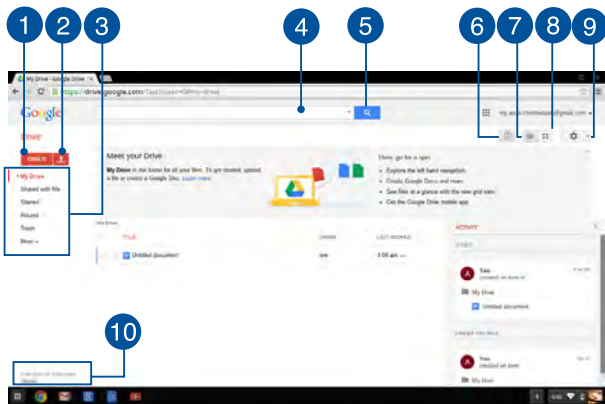
Launching the Google Drive app

By accessing the Google Drive app, you can customize its settings and maximize the use of Google Drive.

IMPORTANT! Ensure that you are connected to the Internet when launching the Google Drive app.

To launch the Google Drive app, click  >  .

Inside the Google Drive app



1 Create

Click this option to create a new file that is automatically saved in your Google Drive.

2 Upload

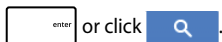
Click this option to upload files or folders from another location into your Google Drive.

3 File locations

This column shows you the currently available file locations inside your Google Drive.

4 Search box

Type the name of the file, folder, or Google document that you want to find you want to locate inside Google Drive then press



5 Search

Click this button to start searching for the indicated file name.

6 Details and activity

Click this option to show the activity log of your Google Drive account and the details of your **My Drive** file location.

7 Switch to list

Click this option to rearrange your files to a list view.

8 Switch to grid

Click this option to rearrange your files to a grid view.

9 Settings

Click this button to customize the settings of your Google Drive.

10 Google Drive storage details

Click this option to view and customize the storage system of your Google Drive.

Resetting your Notebook PC

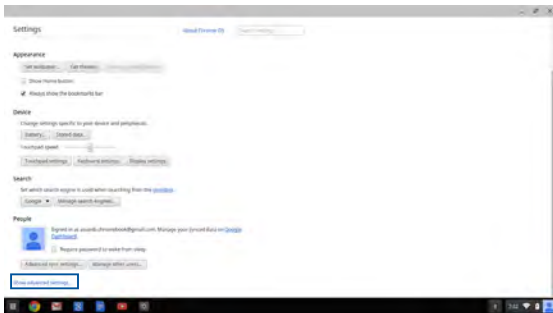
In case you need to reset your Chrome™ OS to its default settings, you may do so using Powerwash.

Using Powerwash

WARNING!

- Backup all your data before performing this option.
 - All data stored locally in your Notebook PC are deleted when using Powerwash. However, your Google Drive accounts and other data synchronized with these accounts are not going to be affected.

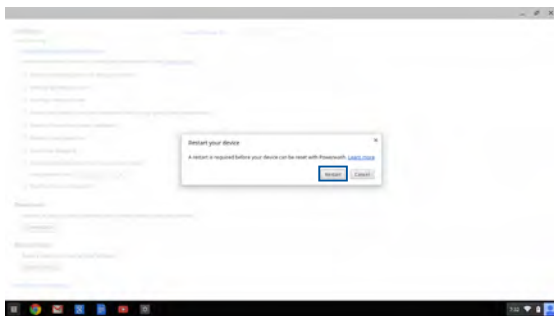
1. Launch the status area then select **Settings**.
2. Scroll down then click on the **Show advanced settings...**



3. Click **Powerwash**.



4. When prompted, click **Restart**.



5. In the **Powerwash your Chrome device** window, click **Reset** to proceed.

Turning your Notebook PC off

Using the power button on your Notebook PC

Appendices

Internal Modem Compliance

The Notebook PC with internal modem model complies with JATE (Japan), FCC (US, Canada, Korea, Taiwan), and CTR21. The internal modem has been approved in accordance with Council Decision 98/482/EC for pan-European single terminal connection to the public switched telephone network (PSTN). Overview

On 4th August 1998 the European Council Decision regarding the CTR 21 has been published in the Official Journal of the EC. The CTR 21 applies to all non voice terminal equipment with DTMF-dialling which is intended to be connected to the analogue PSTN (Public Switched Telephone Network).

CTR 21 (Common Technical Regulation) for the attachment requirements for connection to the analogue public switched telephone networks of terminal equipment (excluding terminal equipment supporting the voice telephony justified case service) in which network addressing, if provided, is by means of dual tone multi-frequency signalling.
