

INDUSTRY CANADA INFORMATION

"NOTICE: The Industry Canada label identifies certified equipment. This certification means that the equipment meets telecommunications network protective, operation and safety requirements as prescribed in the appropriate Terminal Equipment equipment will operate to the user's satisfaction.

Before installing this equipment, users should ensure that it is permissible to be connected to the facilities of the local telecommunications company. The equipment must also be installed using an acceptable method of connection. The customer should be aware that compliance with the above conditions may not prevent degradation of service in some situations.

Repairs to certified equipments should be coordinated by a representative designated by the supplier. Any repairs or alterations made by the user to this equipment, or equipment malfunctions, may give the telecommunications company cause to request the user to disconnect the equipment.

Users should ensure for their own protection that the electrical ground connections of the power utility, telephone lines and internal metallic water pipe system, if present, are connected together. This precaution may be particularly important in rural areas.

Caution: Users should not attempt to make such connections themselves, but should contact the appropriate electric inspection authority, or electrician, as appropriate."

"NOTICE: The Ringer Equivalence Number (REN) assigned to each terminal device provides and indication of the maximum number of terminals allowed to be connected to a telephone interface. The termination on an interface may consist of any combination of devices subject only to the requirement that the sum of the ringer Equivalence Numbers of all the devices does not exceed 5."

READ THIS BEFORE INSTALLATION

Your telephone conforms to federal regulations, and you can connect it to most telephone lines, However, each device you connect to the phone line draws power from the phone line. We refer to this power draw as the device's ringer equivalence number, or REN. The REN is shown on the label of your phone.

If you are using more than one phone or other devices on the line, add up all the RENs. If the total is more than five, your phone might not ring in rural areas, a total REN of three might impair ringer operation.

FCC STATEMENT

This telephone complies with part 68 of FCC Rules. You must, upon request, provide the FCC Registration Number and the REN to your phone company. These numbers are located on the label of your phone.

Note: You must not connect your phone to any of the followings:

- · Coin-operated systems
- Patty-line systems
- · Most electronic key phone systems

Your telephone operates on standard radio frequencies, as allocated by the FCC. Even though the access protection code prevents unauthorized use of your phone line, it is possible for other radio units operating on similar frequencies within a certain area to unintentionally intercept your conversations and/or cause interference. This lack of privacy can occur with any cordless phone.

RINGER EQUIVALENCE NO. (REN) :

THE R.E.N IS USEFUL IN DETERMINING THE QUANTITY OF DEVICES YOU MAY CONNECT TO YOUR TELEPHONE LINE AND STILL HAVE ALL OF THOSE DEVICES RING WHEN YOUR TELEPHONE NUMBER IS CALLED. IN MOST, BUT NOT ALL AREAS, THE SUM OF THE REN'S OF ALL DEVICES CONNECTED TO ONE LINE SHOULD NOT EXCEED FIVE (5.0). TO BE CERTAIN OF THE NUMBER OF DEVICES YOU MAY ONNECT TO YOUR LINE, AS DETERMINED BY THE REN, YOU SHOULD CONTACT YOUR LOCAL TELEPHONE COMPANY TO DETERMINE THE MAXIMUM REN FOR YOUR CALLING AREA.
