

RF EXPOSURE EVALUATION

1. PRODUCT INFORMATION

2. EVALUATION METHOD

According to 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v05

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances ≤ 50 mm are determined by:

$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}] \leq 3.0$ for 1-g SAR and ≤ 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR.

Where $f(\text{GHz})$ is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz

Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation

3. CALCULATION

$P_t = 0.773 \text{ dBm} = 1.19 \text{ mW}$

The value of the Maximum output power P_t is referred to the test report of the CFR47 §15.247.

The result for RF exposure evaluation $\text{SAR} = (1.19 \text{ mW} / 5 \text{ mm}) \cdot [\sqrt{2.441(\text{GHz})}] = 0.37 < 3.0$ for 1-g SAR and ≤ 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR.

FM $P_t = -48.26 \text{ dBm} = 0.000015 \text{ mW}$

The value of the Maximum output power P_t is referred to the test report of the CFR47 For frequencies below 100 MHz and test separation distances ≤ 50 mm, the power threshold determined by the following:

$P_{\text{max}} = 0.5 \cdot 474 \cdot [1 + \log(100/f)] \text{ mW}$, where f is MHz

For 88.1 MHz, $P_{\text{max}} = 250 \text{ mW}$. $P_t < P_{\text{max}}$.

For 107.9 MHz, $P = 3 \times 5 / 0.1079^{0.5} = 45.7 \text{ mW}$
 $P_{\text{max}} = 45.7 \text{ mW}$. $P_t < P_{\text{max}}$.

Simultaneous transmission between Bluetooth and FM transmitter:

$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})/x}] \text{ W/kg}$, for test separation distances ≤ 50 mm;

where $x = 7.5$ for 1-g SAR and $x = 18.75$ for 10-g SAR.

$\text{SAR} = (0.37 + 0.000015) / 7.5 = 0.049 \text{ W/kg} < 1.6 \text{ W/kg}$

4. CONCLUSION

The SAR evaluation is not required.
