




↑WARNING: TO AVOID BATTERY LEAKAGE

- Be sure to insert the batteries correctly, and always follow the toy/game and battery manufacturers' instructions.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- 3) Always remove weak or dead batteries from the product.
- 4) Remove the battery if the product is is left unused for a long period of time.
- 1,Put 2"AA"size batteries into the car and 2"AA"size batteries into the remote control as pictured.
- 2. Turn the black switch on the bottom of the car to "ON".
- 3. The car is now ready for use. Use the knob on the left side of the remote control to go forward
- & backward and the knob on the right side of the remote control to go left & right.
- 4 Use the knob on the middle button of the remote control to accelerate
