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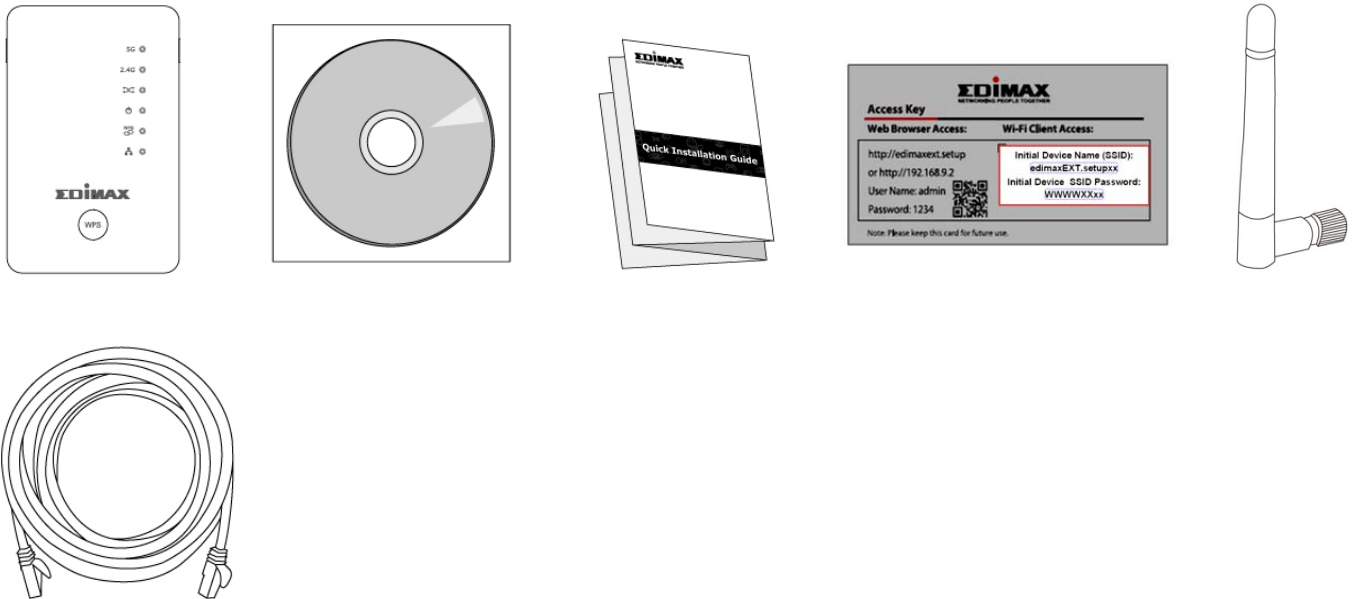
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I. Product Information

RE23S are Wi-Fi roaming extenders. After setting up your roaming network, your Wi-Fi devices (smartphones, tablets etc.) will automatically connect to the best available Wi-Fi signal as you move around.

I-2. System Requirements

- Wi-Fi extender/Wi-Fi bridge mode: Existing 2.4GHz and/or 5GHz wireless network.
- Access point mode: Cable/DSL modem.
- Computer with 2.4GHz 802.11/b/g/n Wi-Fi adapter, and web browser for software configuration.
- Smartphone setup: iOS 4.3 or Android 4.x and above.

II. Initial Setup

First you need to link **one** RE23S to your router by Wi-Fi or Ethernet cable:

- (i) Simply plug in and use the WPS button (push for 3s on each device). The RE23S will automatically link to your router and use the **same Wi-Fi name and password as your router**. That's it – ready to add more extenders.

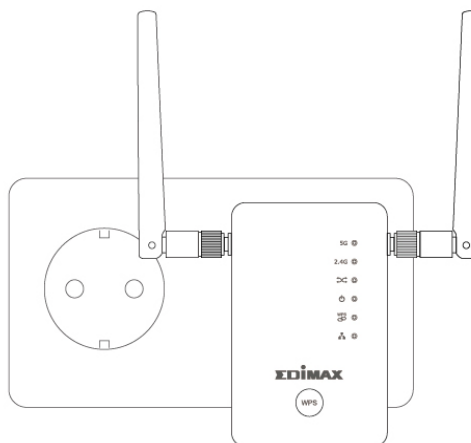
Or

- (ii) Just plug in and connect the RE23S to your router with an Ethernet cable. The RE23S will automatically link to your router and use the **Wi-Fi name and password on your access card**. That's it – ready to add more extenders.

Or

- (iii) You can setup **any Wi-Fi name and password you prefer**. (Recommended if your router doesn't support roaming). Follow the steps below for the on-screen iQ Setup wizard instead:

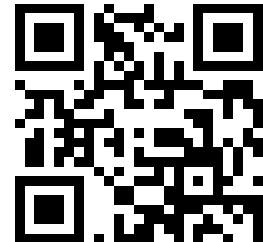
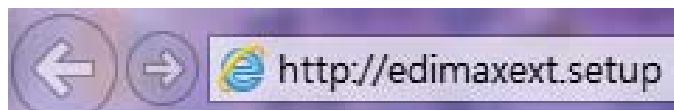
- 1.** Plug one RE23S into a power socket and wait for the **green LED to flash**.



- 2.** Use a Wi-Fi device to connect to the SSID **EdimaxEXT.Setup **** (The Wi-Fi SSID and password are printed on the Access Key Card and the last two characters are unique to your device).



3. Open a web browser and enter the URL ***http://edimaxext.setup*** or scan the QR-Code below and click **Get Started**.



 ***If you cannot access <http://edimaxext.setup>, please make sure your computer is set to use a dynamic IP address. For more information please refer to the user manual.***

- 4.** Select **Yes, I need a Wi-Fi Extender** to continue setup wirelessly, or **Change to a Different Mode** and then **Access Point Mode** if you want to link your RE23S to your router with an Ethernet cable.



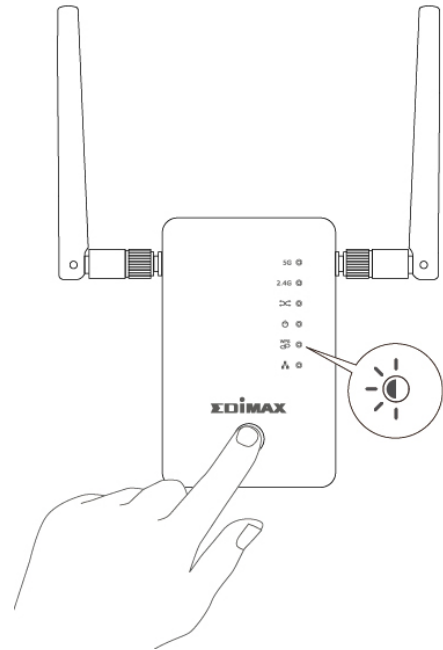
- 5.** Follow the on-screen instructions for your selected mode to complete setup. You can configure the product for 2.4 GHz and/or 5GHz Wi-Fi and then you're ready to add more extenders.

III. Adding More Extenders & WPS

Adding more RE23S roaming extenders to your network is easy with the WPS button. Additional extenders automatically follow the Wi-Fi settings of the first RE23S linked to your router.

WPS can also be used to link the first RE23S to your router for first-time setup.

- 1.** Press the WPS button on your linked extender (or router for first-time setup) for **3 seconds**.
- 2.** **Within two minutes**, press and hold the WPS button for **3 seconds** on the new extender.
- 3.** Please wait while the devices will establish a connection. **This can take up to 2 minutes**.



- 4.** Both extenders' **green** and **orange** LEDs should display on for 30 seconds to indicate a successful connection. (If not, please restart each device and try again).

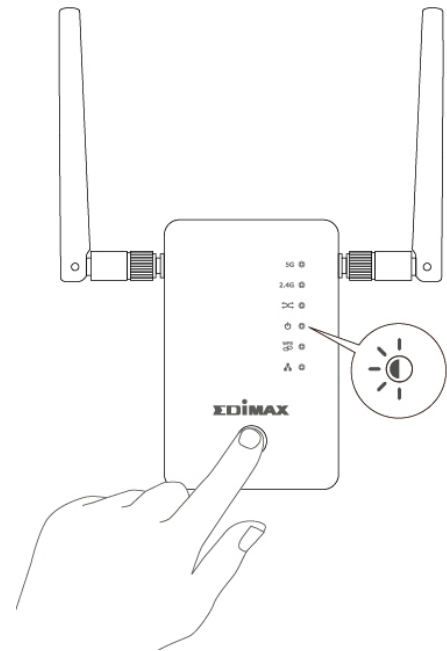


Check your router's documentation for WPS instructions.

IV. Reset

If you experience problems with your extender or if you want to change the extender to a different operating mode, you can reset the device back to its factory settings. This resets **all** settings back to default.

- 1.** Press and hold the reset button for at least 10 seconds and release when the **green** LED is **flashing**.
- 2.** Wait for the extender to restart. After a period of time the extender is ready for setup when the **green** LED is **flashing again**.

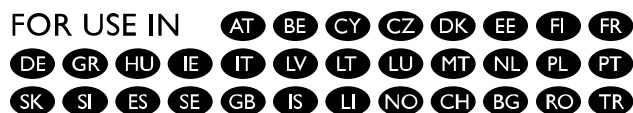

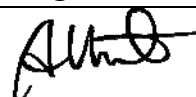
