According to KDB 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance

At 100 Mb to 6 Gb and for test separation distances \leq 50 mm, the SAR test exclusion threshold is determined according to the following

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW) / (min. test separation distance, mm)] $x [\sqrt{f(Ghz)}] \le 3.0$

1. SAR test exclusion threshold

Frequency: 2 480 Mb (min. separation distances = 0 mm) SAR test exclusion thresholds $(5 \text{ mm}) = 3 \times 5 / (\sqrt{2.480}) = 9.525 \text{ mW}$

Max. tune-up tolerance (mW)	SAR Test Exclusion Thresholds (5 mm) (mW)
3	9.525

Calculation value: $3 \text{ (mW)} / 5 \text{ (mm)} \times \sqrt{2.480} = 0.945$

So, Calculation value ≤ 3.0

Remark:

- -Max. conducted power (mW): maximum tolerance power of EUT (4 dBm)
- -Max. conducted power 2.512 (nW) is less than 3 (nW), so 3 (nW) was calculated.
- -When the minimum test separation distance is $< 5\,$ mm, a distance of $5\,$ mm is applied to determine SAR test exclusion.

2. Conclusion: No SAR is required.
