

Installing Program

System Requirements

- 1. Computer: Pentium or higher IBM compatibles supporting USB port
- 2. Memory: 128MB or more
- 3. Operating System: Windows 98/ME/2000/XP
- 4. Hard Disk Drive: 1G or more free space
- 5. Playback: Sound card, Speaker
- 6. Recording: Sound card, Microphone



▶ The USB function may not work normally in specific kinds of PC, or some USB hubs which use the power of a PC.

■ Installing Power Voice III

1. Insert Power Voice III Installation CD on your CD-ROM drive. Program installation starts automatically.



2. Press the NEXT button sequentially as directed on the screen to finish the installation.

Power Voice III icon is created on the Windows desktop and the program is registered on START - PROGRAM.



Installing Program





→ Note →

You should restart your PC in order to operate the program normally when the installation has finished.




Warning

To avoid the abnormal installing of USB driver, do not connect your voice recorder to the PC before installing Power Voice III.

Installing USB driver

Windows 98/ME/2000

- Connect the USB cable to the USB port of the PC, when the installation of the Power Voice III has completed.
- Connect your Voice Recorder with the USB cable connected to the USB port of the PC, the installation of USB driver starts and finishes automatically.






Installing Program

Windows XP

- Connect the USB cable to the USB port of the PC, when the installation of the Power Voice III has completed.
- After connecting the USB cable and the recorder, wait for a while. Then the 'Found New Hardware Wizard' message is shown. Select the 'Install the software automatically [Recommended]' then click the 'Next' button.
- Completing the Found New Hardware Wizard, click the 'Finish' button. Then the USB driver installation is completed.
- * The USB driver installed in the above steps is recognized automatically when you use the program next time, you do not need to install the driver again.
- ** Connect your voice recorder to the USB cable after powering on the voice recorder.

™ Note ™

- If the "Cannot find 'CenixFMC 500.inf' file" message is displayed when you install the USB driver, please follow these instructions.
 - Open the Driver folder on the Power Voice III installation CD and select the 'CenixFMC500.inf' file and then press the "OK" button.
 - If the "Cannot find 'CenixFMC 500.sys' file" message is displayed select the Driver folder on the Power Voice III installation CD.
 - 3) Select the 'CenixFMC 500.sys' file.
- When connecting to the PC with a USB cable, the "PC LINK" message is displayed on the LCD screen.
- USB Interface function is available only when the power of the voice recorder is enough.



Removing Program

■ Removing Power Voice III

Method 1:

- 2 Choose Remove on the Install Shield Wizard window and click the Next button.
- 3 Click the "OK" icon on the Confirm File Deletion window and click the Finish button then the program is removed.

Method 2:

- ① Insert the Power Voice III installation CD into your CD Rom drive. Then the uninstall shield starts automatically.
- ② Choose Remove on the Install Shield Wizard window.
- ③ Click the "OK" icon on the Confirm File Deletion window and click the Finish button then the program is removed.

Main Menu



- 1) UP: Returns to the previous position on the explorer window.
- 2 NEW: Creates a new folder.
- ③ CUT: Cuts the folder or file which the user specified and saves to the clipboard temporarily.
- ④ COPY: Copies the folder or file which the user specified and saves on the clipboard temporarily.
- ⑤ PASTE: Pastes the folder or file which the user copied or cut to the position the user specifies.
- 6 DELETE: Deletes the selected folder or file. It is moved to the recycle bin.
- REFRESH: Refreshes and rearranges the contents displayed on the Explorer window.
- ® VIEW: Changes the folder or file displayed on the Explorer window to the large icon, small icon, simple, or detail view.
- (9) MAIL: Sends voice file or other file as e-mail attachment.
- © CONVERT: Changes file type.

(*.CV* file →*.WAV file, or *.WAV file → *.CV* file)

- ① TTS PAD: Runs the TTS PAD. (This function is only for TTS function supported models. For more information on how to use it, refer to the user manual of TTS PAD.)
- EDITOR: Runs the Editor with which you edit the *.WAV file saved in the recorder.
- (3) HELP: Displays help on the main menu of the Power Voice III.

Explorer window



- ① Specifies the file type to display (*.CV*, *.WAV, *.*).
- 2 Displays the drives and folders on the computer.


■ PC Folder window

Displays the folders and files on the location you select.

Screen Structure

Playback tools



- 1 Displays the playback time/recording time of the selected file.
- 2 Displays the information on the selected file.
- ③ Moves fast to the previous part from the current position of the file during playback. One click moves to the previous parts by 3 seconds.
- 4 Playbacks the selected file.
- ⑤ Pauses playback.
- 6 Stops playback.
- Moves fast to the next part from the current position of the file during playback.
 One click moves to the previous parts by 3 seconds.
- ® Playbacks progress bar. Indicates the current playback position during playback. Point to the desired position on the progress bar and click the mouse button to move to and playback from the selected position.
- (9) Volume control.


Folder, Connection status and Upload/Download tools



- ① Displays the voice files saved in the A folder of the recorder.
- 2 Displays the voice files saved in the B folder of the recorder.
- 3 Displays the voice files saved in the C folder of the recorder.

- (5) Displays the MP3 files save in the MP3 folder of the recorder.
- 6 Displays the current connection status of the voice recorder and the PC.
- Transfers the files saved in the voice recorder to the PC (Upload).
- ® Transfers the files saved in the PC to the voice recorder (Download)

- 1 Displays the whole capacity of the memory.
- 2 Displays the current memory capacity used in the voice recorder.
- 3 Displays the available memory capacity on the screen.


■ Recorder Flash Window



Displays the files saved in the A, B, C, D or MP3 folder and the name, size, time, type, and date of the files.

You can transfer the files saved in your voice recorder to a PC.

- Connect the voice recorder to the PC and select the folder on the PC to save the transferred files.
- 2. Select the file(s) to upload to the PC in the Flash window of the recorder.
- Click the Upload icon (). The selected file(s) is transferred and saved to the PC.



™ Note *

Description of file extension Classified to a *.CV* format according to the recording mode recorded in the voice recorder.

HQ mode: *.CVH SP mode: *.CVS

(The available recording modes vary according to the product model.)

Downloading Files from PC to Voice Recorder

You can transfers the files saved in a PC to your voice recorder.

- Connect the voice recorder to the PC and select the folder on the voice recorder to download the transferred files to.
- Select the file to transfer to the voice recorder on the PC folder window.
- 3. Click the Download icon (). The selected file(s) is transferred and saved to the voice recorder.



rar Note ™

- Only voice files (*.CV* type) can be transferred to the voice folders of the voice recorder.
- ▶ The D folder can save the files of various extensions.

(You can use it as a portable storage device.)

Please save MP3 files in the MP3 folder.



- Do not remove the USB cable during transferring or deleting files, and formatting. It may cause a corruption of the memory or the data saved in the voice recorder.
- Do not turn the PC power off while your voice recorder is connected to the PC. It may cause a corruption of the data saved in the voice recorder.

Deleting File

■ Deleting file

Deletes the files saved in the PC or voice recorder.

· Deleting files saved in the PC

Method 1: Select one file or more you wish to delete on the Flash window of the PC and then click the right button of the mouse and click Delete to delete the selected file(s).

Method 2: Select one file or more you wish to delete on the Flash window of the PC and then press the Delete key on the keyboard to delete the selected file(s).

· Deleting files saved in voice recorder

- 1. Select the file you wish to delete on the Flash window of the voice recorder.
- 2. Press the right button of the mouse and click Delete to delete the selected file.

▶ According to memory capacity of the voice recorder or condition of the PC, deleting time can be varied.



▶ The file(s) you deleted on the Flash window of the voice recorder cannot be recovered and is also deleted from Caution the voice recorder.

> Make sure to decide carefully and check the file(s) you select to delete.



Deleting File

■ Formatting

Deletes all the files saved in the voice recorder.

- 1. Press the right button of the mouse on the Flash window of the voice recorder.
- 2. Click the Format icon to delete all the files saved in the voice recorder.




- According to file size or condition of the PC, formatting time can be varied.
 - The deleted files cannot be recovered. Please backup important files.
 - ▶ Do not remove the USB cable during transferring or deleting files, and formatting.



Caution It may cause a corruption of the memory or the data saved in the voice recorder.

> Do not turn the PC power off while your voice recorder is connected to the PC.

It may cause a corruption of the data saved in the voice recorder.





Using as External Device (USB Storage Function)

■ Using the D folder as an External Device (USB Storage Function)

The method of transferring files between the PC and the voice recorder is same with the case of voice file.

→ Note →

- ▶ The files being used in the PC cannot uploaded/downloaded (Example: *.EXE, *.DLL, other files being used).
- ▶ Since there is no limit in the name, extension, and type of the files to save in the D folder, you can save voice files to it. However, we recommend to save voice files to the A, B, or C folder for better and easier management.
- ▶ Downloaded files to the D folder cannot be played on the voice recorder.
- ▶ The product shares a specific amount of memory with voice file, therefore, the capacity of the D folder is determined according to the size of the voice file.
- ▶ For efficient use of the D folder, compress the files to save.



File Playback

Playback

You can listen to the voice file saved in the PC using the speaker of the PC or earphone.

- Method 1: Select the file you wish to playback on the PC folder window and then double-click to start playback.
- Method 2: Select the file you wish to playback on the PC folder window and then press the playback icon () to start playback.



Method 2: Select the file, and press the playback icon





File Conversion/Reverse Conversion

■ Converting File (*.CVS,CVH ⇒*.WAV)

Converts *.CVS.CVH file to *.WAV file.

- 1. Select the file you wish to convert on the PC folder window.
- 2. Press the CONVERT() button of the main menu.
- The Convert Dialog window is displayed and the selected file is converted to the *.WAV file. Then it is saved to the current folder.




■ File Reverse Conversion

Converts *.WAV file to *.CVS file.

- 1. Select the file you wish to convert on the PC folder window.
- 2. Press the CONVERT() button of the main menu.
- Then the selected file is converted to the *.CVS file and saved to the current folder.

₩ Note *

- The conversion is of loss compression, therefore the conversion or reverse conversion of more than one time may cause damage to the clearness of original sound. Avoid frequent conversion or reverse conversion. If necessary, keep the original file separately.
- ► According to file size or condition of the PC, converting time can be varied.
- *.CVT file cannot be converted.



Sending Mail

You can send voice file or other file as e-mail attachment.

■ When sending *.CV* file as e-mail attachment

.CV file is converted to *.WAV file and the converted file is attached to e-mail. Method 1

Converts *.CV* file to *.WAV file and attaches to e-mail.

- Select the file you wish to send as e-mail attachment on the Flash window of the PC.
- 2 Click the MAIL icon (2) on the main menu.
- 3 The Converting box appears and the selected file is converted.
- (4) When converting has finished, the Send Mail window appears. After writing the mail, press the Send button to send the voice file you attached via e-mail.

Method 2

Attaches *.CV* file to e-mail without converting.

- Select the file you wish to send as e-mail attachment on the Flash window of the PC.
- ② Click the right button of mouse select Send To → Mail Recipient.
- ③ When the Send Mail window appears, write the mail, and then press the Send button to send the voice file you attached via e-mail.

■ Note ■

- ► If the mail recipient doesn't have the Power Voice III, it is impossible to listen to the attached *.CV* file.
- ▶ Sending mail is available only when you connected to the Internet.

Joice Recorder

The Editor edits the file you recorded using the voice recorder and uploaded to the PC.

Opening Editor

Choose a file that you want to edit and click the EDITOR icon (##) on the main menu of the Power Voice III.

Playback

- 1. Select the file you wish to playback.
- Press the PLAY () button on the playback tool bar to playback the selected file.
- Press the STOP () button to stop the playback and press the PAUSE () button to stop the playback temporarily.

▶ If you wish to playback only a specific section, set it as the editing block and click the PLAY button.

Joice Recorder

Using Editor

■ Recording (Creating a New *.WAV file)

- 1. Connect a microphone to the microphone jack on the sound card of the PC.
- Click the New () button, a dialog box is displayed as shown in the following figure.

- 3. Select the HQ or SP and click the OK button.
- 4. The New Graph box appears. Click the Recording button to start recording.
- 5. When the recording is completed, click the STOP button.

Adding Recording to the existing *.WAV file

- 1. Connect a microphone to the microphone jack of the sound card of a PC.
- 2. Select the position to add an additional recording.
- Press the Recording () button to start recording.
- 4. When the recording is completed, press the STOP button.



Additional recording is available in two modes, Record Mix and Record Clear.

Using Editor

Main Menu

You can create a new file, open an existing file, save, cut, copy, paste the file content by using the Main Menu.

1 NEW: Creates a new *. WAV file.


If you click the NEW icon, a dialog box appears. Set the Frequency, Channels (mono, stereo), Bit (8/16 Bit) in the dialog box to create a new *.WAV file.

② OPEN: Selects the file you wish to edit.

Loads the selected file on the SEL1 or SEL2.

- ③ CLOSE: Closes the current file opened on the SEL1 or SEL2.
- 4 SAVE: Saves the file edited on the SEL1 or SEL2.
- (5) SAVE AS: Saves the file on the SEL1 or SEL2 as a different file.
- (6) PART SAVE: Saves only the block selected on the SEL1 or SEL2 as a different file.
- (7) UNDO: Cancels the current changes and return to the very previous state.
- ® REDO: Performs again the work you have undo.
- 9 CUT: Cuts the part you selected from the file.
- 10 COPY: Saves the selected part to the memory temporarily.
- ① PASTE: Pastes the data saved in the memory temporarily to the position you selected.
- @ HELP: Displays help on the Editor.


■ Data Graph Box



- ① When opening a file, its entire waveform is displayed be SEL1 with fitted to the width of SEL1. Click the mouse left button and drag to the left or the right to set the selection (editing block).
- ② The Red button indicates the disabled state. The Blue button indicates the enabled state.
- ③ Drags to the left or the right with the mouse left button is hold down to view the waveform of the previous or next data.
- ① Displays the time, minute, second of the file to edit in the unit of millisecond. Drag to the left or the right with the mouse left button is hold down to expand the selection.


The time is displayed as follows:

Note ■

- Specifying Editing Block (Selection): Drag to the left or the right with the mouse left button is hold down on the Data Graph box or the Whole File View box. The editing block (selection) is specified and is displayed in white color.
- ▶ Releasing Editing Block: Click the mouse left button on the current editing



Using Editor

Additional Editing Tool Bar



- ① Sets the editing block and click the ZOOM+ button to enlarge it with fit to the width of the Data Graph box.
- ② Reduces the size of the editing block on the Data Graph box you have enlarged with ZOOM+ button
- 3 Displays the Graph Box in the full screen mode.
- ④ Amplifies the sound when it is too low and the displayed waveforms are almost horizontal (when there is almost no distinctive waveforms).
- S Lowers the sound when he sound is too loud and the displayed waveforms fills the Data Graph box too tightly.
- ® Selects the desired part (set the editing box) and clicks the SILENCE button to mute the selected block during playback.


- Play to end : Playbacks the whole data from its first to

- Record Clear: When recording, deletes the existing data and records only the current data.
- Record Mix: When recording, mix the current data with the existing data to create a composite sound.

Paste Style: Sets the data pasting method.

- Add Paste : Adds the clipboard data to the existing data.
- Mix Paste : Mixes the clipboard data to the existing data to create a composite sound.



■ Playback/Recording Tool Bar



- 1) Playback : Playbacks the selected file.
- 2 Pause: Stops playback temporarily.
- ③ Stop : Stops playback.
- 4 Recording: Saves as *.WAV type file. You can select a frequency band you wish.

■ Volume



- Volume control for SEL1 during playback and recording.
- ② Volume control for SEL2 during playback and recording.

Volume Height Display



- Displays the height of the sound source of the file being played back on the SEL1.
- ② Displays the height of the sound source of the file being played back on the SEL2.

■ File Information Box



- The start position to you clicked the mouse left button to set the editing block on the Data Graph box.
- ® The last position of you clicked the mouse left to set the editing block on the Data Graph box.
- ② ⑤ The start position displayed on the Data Graph box.
- ② ⑥ The last position displayed on the Data Graph box.
- ③ The name of the file loaded on the Data Graph box you are pointing to with the mouse.
- 4 The type of the file loaded on the Data Graph box you are pointing to with the mouse.








Before Using

■ Inserting Battery



- 1. Push the battery cover slightly and slide it in the arrow direction.
- 2. Insert two "AAA" alkaline batteries. Make sure that the polarities (+, -) are correct.
- 3. Close the battery cover.



- ▶ Make sure to replace the batteries in stop mode.
- Warning ➤ Make sure that the polarities (+, -) are correct.
 - Do not mix a new battery with old one.




- ▶ Battery lifetime is subject to battery type and the volume you use.
- Recharged battery drops down the playback time remarkably and the product may not operate normally.
- ► The power is turned off automatically for efficient use of the battery if you do not use the product for more than 1 minute.
- ▶ When you do not use the product, set the HOLD switch to ON
- to prevent unwanted consumption of the battery due to misuse of the buttons.



Before Using

■ Powering On/Off

- 1. Set the HOLD () button to OFF (HOLD OFF).
- 2. Press the F/DFUN/PAUSE/DISPLAY() button shortly once to turn the power on.
- 3. Press the FI/DFUN/PAUSE/DISPLAY(W) button longer once to turn the power off.



™ Note ™

- The power is turned off automatically if there is no operation for 1 minute.
