




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Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL





Never attempt to grease or oil the E-stop assembly. Cleaning and readjusting of the Estop assembly is allowed by certified SPEAG personnel only and is part of the calibration procedure.

Important Note:

To prevent damage of the DAE probe connector pins, use great care when installing the probe to the DAE. Carefully connect the probe with the connector notch oriented in the mating position. Avoid any rotational movement of the probe body versus the DAE while turning the locking nut of the connector. The same care shall be used when disconnecting the probe from the DAE.




Frequency Response of E-Field


(TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide:R22)

Receiving Pattern (ϕ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)

Dynamic Range f(SAR_{head})






Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ±0.6% (k=2)
