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## 2. Antenna requirement

Refer to 47 CFR Part 15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The antenna is a **Ceramic Antenna** which permanently attached, and the best case gain of the antenna is **2.4dBi**. It complies with the standard requirement.






