


- 1. Read Instructions: All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.

BATTERY INSTALLATION OF REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. Slide and lift the battery door.
- Install 2 x AAA 1.5V carbon-zinc batteries (included) into the battery compartment as indicated by the polarity markings.
- 3. Close the battery door.




Caution:

- 1. Use only the size and type of battery specified.
- Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated in the battery compartment, a reserved battery may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of battery together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old battery with fresh one.
- If the batteries in the device are consumed or the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible leakage.
- Do not try to recharge the battery not intended to be recharged; it can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's instructions)
- 6. The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- 7. Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.
- 8. Remove and immediately recycle or dispose of batteries from equipment not used for an extended period of time according to local regulations.

Remote control operation range


- . When there is an obstacle between the remote and the receiver, the unit may not operate.
- When direct sunlight, an incandescent lamp, fluorescent lamp or any other strong light shines on the REMOTE SENSOR of the unit, the operation of the remote may be unstable.




PLACEMENT AND MOUNTING

1. Placing the device on a table - Ventilation


When placing the Soundbar on an entertainment center, bookshelf, or any type of enclosed space, be sure to allow at least 2-3 inches of space around the Sound Bar for ventilation. If the Sound Bar is enclosed in a tight space, without ventilation, heat generated from the Sound Bar could produce a potential heat hazard.



2. The Installation Distance




2.1 Mounting to a wooden wall



(screws not included)

- A. Mark the position of the mounting screws on the wall using a pencil.
- B. Drill the screws directly into the marks that you have made on the wall and leave approx. 0.3 inches length to hook the sound bar.
- C. Put the sound bar onto the mounting screws. Make sure they are firm and stable.
- 2.2 Mounting to a brick wall



(screws and plastic fixing plug are not included)

- A. Mark the position of the mounting screws on the wall using a pencil.
- B. Drill 2 holes on wall with a powerful electric drill.
- C. Insert the fixing plug and hammer into the holes.
- D. Secure the screws into the fixing plug and leave approx. 0.3 inches length to hook the sound bar.
- E. Put the sound bar onto the mounting screws. Make sure they are firm and stable.

GENERAL OPERATION

- 1. Connect the AC/DC adapter to the unit and the indicator in front of the unit will light red.
- Press U button on unit or remote control to power on the unit and the sound "Power on" and "Bluetooth" (default mode) can be heard; press and hold the same button for about 3 seconds to power off and a sound "Power off" can be heard.
- 3. Press Vol+ or Vol- button on unit or remote control to adjust the volume level.
- 4. Press the MODE button on unit or remote control to switch to different mode.
- 5. During playback:
 - Press the Mute button on remote control to turn on or off the sound.
 - Press the EQ button on remote control repeatedly to change the EQ effect(Music/ Movie/ Bass/ News/ Game); press and hold the EQ button to switch to default EQ effect.
 - · Press the BASS button can change to BASS effect.
 - Press the TREBLE button can change to TREBLE effect.
- 6. When play in Bluetooth mode:
 - Press and hold Id or ► button to skip to previous or next track; press the same button on remote control can also skip tracks.
 - Press >II button on unit or remote control to play or pause the track.

Note:

- It defaults Bluetooth mode when the unit is turned on.
- It will enter standby mode without signal input in 15 minutes, the indicator will turn to red and you can hear "Power off".
- When the unit is muted, the indicator will blink.

AUX FUNCTION

- Connect one end of AUX cable to the AUX port of the unit, the other end to the 3.5mm earphone jack or AUX out port of external device.
- Power on the unit and switch to AUX mode as previously mentioned and you will hear a sound "Auxiliary", the indicator will light green.
- 3. Start the playback on external device.

Note:

• The **I**I, **I** and **I** button on both the unit and remote control do not work in this mode.

HDMI ARC FUNCTION

- 1. Connect one end of HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI ARC port of the unit, the other end to the HDMI ARC port of TV.
- 2. Power on the unit and switch to HDMI mode as previously mentioned and you will hear a sound "HDMI", the indicator will light white.
- 3. Start the playback on TV.

Note:

- The TV must have ARC capability and be connected to HDMI ARC port.
- If there is no audio output(only picture) or sound when your TV is connected to the unit, please check the TV audio setting and try to set the audio output to other format.
- The ►II, K< and ►► button on both the unit and remote control do not work in this mode.

OPTICAL FUNCTION

- Connect one end of Optical cable (not included) to the OPTICAL port of the unit, the other end to the OPTICAL OUT port of TV or DVD player etc.
- Power on the unit and switch to OPTICAL mode as previously mentioned and you will hear a sound "OPTICAL", the indicator will light purple.
- 3. Start the playback on TV or DVD player.

Note:

- If there is no audio output(only picture) or sound when your TV or DVD player is connected to the unit, please check the TV audio setting and try to set the audio output to other format.
- The ►II, I and ►►I button on both the unit and remote control do not work in this mode.

BLUETOOTH FUNCTION

- 1. Power on the unit as previously explained.
- 2. To switch to Bluetooth mode:
- · Press the MODE button on unit or remote control repeatedly;
- Or press the BT button on remote control.

When change to Bluetooth mode, the indicator in front of unit will blink in blue and a sound "Bluetooth" can be heard.

- 3. Power on the external Bluetooth device and activate Bluetooth mode to search for the unit.
- 4. When the Bluetooth name Hearth & Hand 06 appears, select it and make connection.
- A sound "Bluetooth is paired" can be heard when connected successfully and the indicator will stay solid blue.
- 6. To disconnect the current connection, press and hold the BT button on remote control and "Bluetooth is disconnected" can be heard; press the BT button to reconnect the Bluetooth device.

Note:

 The unit will be automatically connected with the last connected Bluetooth device if both are activated Bluetooth function and in working range.

		paired/connected device.
Remote Control not functioning	Out of range	Point the remote control to the remote sensor on the unit within 16 feet, +/-30 degrees.
	The battery in the remote control is drained	Replace with new battery.
Bluetooth reception failure	The external device is too far from the unit	Put the external BT device close to the unit.
	Have not paired	Pair the unit with the BT Device as the procedures stated in this manual.
	Have paired but no audio and Blue light keep flashing	 Unmute the volume on Soundbar. Reconnect your BT device or restart the Soundbar.
