



# **Allegro Wall Mount unit**

## 1. Background


The Allegro Wall Mount unit is now at validation phase. It was agreed that in order to shorten the validation cycle, MM will get R&D samples for testing.

## 2. Document scope


This document presents the issues that can be tested by MM.

### 3. Installation


- Step 1 Wall mount spacer assembly
  - o Put a t-wrap in the spacer, the t-wrap is needed for tightening the communication cable to the spacer, so in case the cable is pulled it will not be cut out from the unit.
  - o Connect the spacer to the wall.



• Spacer orientation -




- Step 2 Wall mount unit attaching:
  - o Tighten the cable to the wall mount spacer with the t-wrap.
  - o Attach the wall mount unit to the wall mount spacer by the aid of the guiding pins and 2 screws (supplied).

## 4. Unit operation by means of Tech tool

- The unit is opened to communication with tech tool, however it is closed to communication with base station.
- At this phase, the communication between the wall mount unit and various encoders can be checked.
- Test can be done as following
  - o Connect the desired encoder to the communication cable.
  - o Get the reads by the tech. tool.

#### 5. RF Tests

- Unit can be checked in RF chamber:
  - o Send command to the unit (e.g. get read) by the tech tool.
  - o Measure the RF power of unit reply.
  - o The above is done at low power.
  - o High power tests not supported in current version of Tech tool.

## 6. Working with Base station

- Before doing so, the Harmony should be modified to recognize the Allegro wall mount this issue should be coordinated before the tests.
- Once done perform the following:
  - Activate the unit by a magnet
    - Put a magnet on the red sign for 6 seconds.
    - Take the magnet out.
    - Unit should register in 2-3 minutes.
- Once registered, unit is handled by the Harmony as regular end unit.
