Chapter 1 Getting Started

Welcome to your new inkBOOK!

This short guide will help to describe you the features and functionality of your inkBOOK. Some functionalities may not be available based on your country of residence or location or inkBOOK model. Please always visit www.inkbook.eu/support for more information about specific features, or ask us a question on help@inkbook.eu

First turning on and Setting up your inkBOOK

We do recommend that before starting please connect your inkBOOK to power source 5V 3A (5W - 15W USB) maximum or to your computer. Done? Thanks, so here we go!

Setting up your inkBOOK takes a few simple and easy steps:

1. While still on cable please turn your inkBOOK on.
2. Select the language and follow the settings on screen.
3. Connect to a wireless network, introduce your WiFi password.
4. Your inkBOOK will now prompt you about firmware update. **Please make sure you are still connected by cable to power source** and accept update. That may take a while (if there is no update that means your inkBOOK has already the newest firmware).
5. Now when your inkBOOK reboots you are ready to enter the world of millions wonderful stories!



inkBOOK Controls

Here they are, just a few to remember:




Turning On: To turn on your inkBOOK press the Power button located on the back for 2 seconds.

Turning Off: To turn off your inkBOOK press and hold the Power button for 5 seconds until the “Shutting down” message appears..

Changing pages: To change a page in a book, press Next Page or Previous Page buttons

Sleep Mode: Your inkBOOK will go into sleep mode automatically after a few minutes of inactivity. The static screensaver uses no battery power. By pressing the Power button for 1 second you invoke dialog window in which you can sleep your device or take a screenshot of current screen.



Charging your inkBOOK: Please connect one end of the attached cable to USB Power Port and the other end to your USB charger. Please use maximum the chargers 5V 3A (5W - 15W USB).

Connecting your inkBOOK to computer: You can use the USB cable you will find in a box to connect your inkBOOK to a computer for transferring files.

Screen Refreshing/ Flashing - understanding inkBOOK display technology

Your inkBOOK uses a high-resolution display technology called electronic paper and manufactured by E Ink Corporation. The display is reflective, which means you can read it clearly even in bright sunlight. Electronic paper uses ink just like books and newspapers, but it displays the ink particles electronically with the help of electric current.

On occasion, your screen may appear to flash, especially when you use it in applications. This is part of the process of REFRESHING the e-reader display.

By default, your inkBOOK features fast, smooth page turns, minimising the number of refreshments (whole screen flashes). The applications provided with inkBOOK software are specially modified to take full advantage of electronic ink technology.

However, it is possible that when using other third party Android applications (including those from inkPLUS or using internet, the e-reader may flash more often or the image may not be displayed properly - strange artifacts may remain on the screen. In order to clear it perform a

full refresh action by tapping  button on toolbar.

Status Indicators

Like most Android based devices inkBOOK uses status bar in top part of the screen to inform user about current state and current events.




Following status indicators may appear:

Keyboard

The screen based keyboard will appear when you need it for programming, searching, browsing internet, filling in forms, making annotations or so.



When you finish typing press  button to close keyboard and invoke related action (eg: start searching or open website address). In order to close keyboard press BACK button.

WiFi Connectivity


To set up a WiFi connection for the first time just do during the tutorial, which runs when you turn your inkBOOK for the first time.

You can also go to Settings  (from Applications  or by tapping on top Status Bar) and choose Wi-Fi .

The screen shows all available WiFi networks - if it does not please make sure WiFi is on by

pressing OFF/ON switch  .

Now choose and tap on selected network name and enter password to connect.



If desired network is not visible try pressing refresh  button several times.

Menu button  provides access to advanced Wi-Fi settings:

- Add network - connects to closed SSID networks by allowing to enter network name manually
- Wi-Fi preferences - allows to set up more options
- Saved networks - displays the list of saved network


Public network notice:


Lots of public Wi-Fi networks required additional opt-in and acceptance of terms and conditions through web browser. In case this is required the notification will be displayed. Tap on Notification concerning Wi-Fi connection in order to go to Wi-Fi provider landing page and get access to the network.

In some cases such authorisation can not be obtained - eg. special java script features or GMS services. In this case please contact admin of such a network for assistance or use other WiFi network.

Settings for your inkBOOK

Settings are available from Applications menu by clicking on  .





WIFI

Allows to turn on/off the WiFi and shows its status.

BLUETOOTH

Allows to turn on/off the Bluetooth and connect to headphone or speaker which supports Bluetooth.

SCREEN BRIGHTNESS

Allows to adjust light settings and turn ON/OFF Dark Mode

Send2inkBOOK

Allows to access your personal e-mail address to receive e-books on your device. If you wish to have a quick and easy way of transferring e-books that you have just purchased to your inkBOOK, this tool is for you. After accepting the terms of use your inkBOOK will create for you an e-mail address (please be connected to WiFi during that

process) to which you can send an e-book as an attachment. You can copy it or scan the QR code with that address.

Then just synchronise your device and the e-book will be waiting for you on home screen and in Library

Some content providers and services do have “Send-by-mail” service on their websites, so it is enough just to type your Send-to-inkBOOK e-mail.

Applications

Displays list of installed applications and allows you to manage them.

Text to Speech

Here you have the access to TTS settings: preferred engine, language and voices.

Google Translate

Here you have access to translations settings and download offline languages.

Language

Here you can choose the language you want to be set in the system.

Date & Time

Date and time settings.

Battery

Displays battery status and allows you to set Sleep Mode and Shutdown time.

Accessibility

Access to settings related to UI and Text size for users with disabilities.

Account Manager

Creation and management of user’s accounts on your device.

Screensavers

Here you can set up the picture which should be displayed when inkBOOK is in sleep mode.

Memory

Information of available memory of your device.

USB Settings

Here you can set between different connection modes when inkBOOK is plugged into computer using USB cable.

inkBOOK information

Here you can check information about your device and check for system updates.

Switch OFF your inkBOOK

If you plan not to use your inkBOOK for a very long time, here's the option to switch it off.


Restore factory settings

Restoring your inkBOOK to factory settings and erasing all data from the device.
IMPORTANT: this step is irreversible!

Chapter 2 Navigation

Home Screen

From this screen you have access to currently read book and three recently added books. By clicking on the “Library” button you can go directly to your Library.



Quick Access screen allows you to open frequently used options and Settings list by clicking on “More settings” button.


Chapter 3 Managing your e-books

Library

IMPORTANT! To have your e-books visible in the LIBRARY YOU NEED TO SAVE THEM IN "BOOKS" FOLDER OR SEND VIA SEND2inkBOOK.

If you have them in your folder please move this folder to "Books" catalogue, other ways they will not be visible in the Library.

Library is a place where your books will appear. If the e-book is properly made the metadata displaying covers, titles, authors etc. will appear. The icons  and  allow you to display your ebooks as you prefer, as thumbnails or bars with additional information.



Sorting

In order to sort your book collection press  button and choose preferred sorting parameters.

Finding

If the book you have just added is not there yet, you can search for it by clicking on the magnifying glass icon .

Accessing a title menu

As you can see on the picture above when books are displayed as bars, there is a lot of information you can get. After a cover your inkBOOK will display a title, an author and a progress of reading.

The indicator in the shape of heart shows if the book is your **favorite** one and 3 dots  gives you access to the **further menu**.

By clicking on  you will be able to **see even more information** about e-book as well as **manage your e-book**.



Collection

You can now add or remove your ebook from a collection. Collection is a list that groups books as you like.

Customizing your text display

Comic books

Android operating system allows you to install applications which you may use for reading the comics. Please note, that the buttons will not work in such apps.

Audiobooks

All your Audiobooks are available by clicking on “Audiobooks” tab in the Library.

Reading

On your inkBOOK you can read ebooks in many formats. To read just click on book cover icon on home screen or in Library.

More than 300 million people in the world speak English and the rest, it sometimes seems, try to. It would be charitable to say that the results are sometimes mixed.

Consider this hearty announcement in a Yugoslavian hotel: "The flattening of underwear with pleasure is the job of the chambermaid. Turn to her straightaway." Or this warning to motorists in Tokyo: "When a passenger of the foot heave in sight, tootle the horn. Trumpet at him melodiously at first, but if he still obstacles your passage, then lootle him with vigor." Or these instructions gracing a packet of convenience food from Italy: "Besmear a backing pan, previously buttered with a good tomato sauce, and, after, dispose the cannelloni, lightly distanced between them in a only couch."

Clearly the writer of *that* message was not about to let a little ignorance of English stand in the way of a good meal. In fact, it would appear that one of the beauties of the English language is that with even the most tenuous grasp you can speak volumes if you show enough enthusiasm—a willingness to tootle with vigor, as it were.

To be fair, English is full of booby traps for the unwary foreigner. Any language where the unassuming word *fly* signifies an annoying insect, a means of travel, and a critical part of a gentleman's apparel is clearly asking to be mangled. Imagine being a foreigner and having to learn that in English one tells a lie but the truth, that a person who says "I could care less" means the same thing as someone who says "I couldn't care less," that a sign in a store saying ALL ITEMS NOT ON SALE doesn't mean literally what it says (that every item is *not* on sale) but rather that only some of the items are on sale, that when a person says to you, "How do you do?" he will be taken aback if you reply, with impeccable logic, "How do I do what?"

The complexities of the English language are such that even native speakers cannot always communicate effectively, as almost every American learns on his first day in Britain. Indeed, Robert Burchfield, editor of the *Oxford English Dictionary*, created a stir in linguistic circles on both sides of the Atlantic when he announced his belief that American English and English English are drifting apart so rapidly that within 200 years the two nations won't be able to understand each other at all.

Now you can enjoy what inkBOOK is made for - a magic world of stories hidden in books.

Navigating in ebooks

Press right or left lower button to turn page forward (you can also tap on the right side of the screen).

Press right or left upper button to turn page back (you can also tap on the left side of the screen).

You can magnify or decrease the font size by using 2 fingers on the ebook page. Tap in the middle of a screen to access reading options.

Ebook font and page settings


As you will spend hours on reading it is very important to set up your inkBOOK reading preferences. To access those options just tap in the middle of a screen.

Now you can choose from 4 different option folds at the bottom of the screen.


First one allows you turn ON/OFF progress bar and go to selected page of the book..



The second fold takes you directly to e-book table of content and allows you to move quickly to desired chapter. Of course it will work only if the open e-book has such a thing as table of content and hyperlinks to chapters - for details please contact your publisher.



Third fold allows you to play with fonts and page layouts. Here possible settings depending on e-book format you are reading. Some formats may not have all options enabled.



Font size and style can be easily selected in the first tab “Font”

Tab “Layout” allows you to set Alignment, Margins, Interline. Letter spacing and Word spacing.

The “More” tab allows you to change screen orientation and TTS options (if TTS engine is installed and selected in Settings).

Bookmarks, highlights and notes.

Your inkBOOK will always remember where you have finished reading your book recently. So, do not bother, an used ticket, a lover's letter, or an old restaurant bill is not needed to mark the last reading page. You do not need also to create a bookmark for that.

All your bookmarks, highlights and notes you can find in the 4th tab of reading settings menu.



Create bookmarks only if you need to return to certain page.

How to create a **bookmark**? Nothing simpler, just tap in the middle of the screen while reading e-book, the menu will pop up and touch  icon above near the book title . It is done!

If you want to work with the part of the text you need first to select that part. Just touch and hold the text of interest. Now you can adjust selection range by dragging the quote markers.

It is up to you what you want to do with such selected text. As you can see there is a toolbar displayed next to the text you have selected.

1. Make a note by touching  icon
2. To save your highlight tap 
3. Touch  to copy your text of interest
4. Look up for text in internet by selecting  which will open the web browser.
5. Access Text to Speech by touching  for reading aloud.

Dictionary

As your inkBOOK is an android device you can instal any dictionary you like, but...

We have a recomendation: **Install the most powerful dictionary in the world from inkBOOK Plus in two clicks.** How to do that you will find in next chapter.

You can enjoy a very powerful dictionary on your inkBOOK - Google Translate™ Dictionary. This dictionary will work online as well as offline if you decide to download certain languages.

The dictionary is also able to translate not only words, but also whole sentences or selected text fragments.

As you can see in the chapter above we have made it very easy to use the Dictionary - just select the word or a text and tap the dictionary icon.

To be able to translate certain languages offline please access Dictionary Settings and decide which dictionaries to download.

Chapter 5 Other features

Using your inkBOOK with computer

Plug your inkBOOK to a computer to charge or transfer data. To connect use the USB cable delivered with your inkBOOK. Some computers will need additional software to transfer data between computer and your inkBOOK.

Please remember to use “safely remove storage device” function before you disconnect. Please also remember, that charging your inkBOOK through computer USB will take much more time than charging it with more powerful charger (max 3A).

Installing dictionaries and applications from “inkPLUS”

To make life easy we have installed on your inkBOOK a depot of most desired applications for E ink. You can access it by connecting to WiFi and choosing the inkPLUS from Applications.


In “My apps” you will find all your installed apps.

“Recommended” displays the list of most interesting and helpful apps.

All the rest you can find in “Other” section.

You can scroll the apps in each section horizontally or just tap on the section name and display apps in the list view mode.

The  icon in the app tile informs you that app update is available to install.
