The MicroPalm is a Class A device according to the label on the back of the unit which states:

"This equipment complies with requirements in Part 15 of FCC Rules for a Class A computing device. Operation of this equipment in a residential area may cause unacceptable interference to radio and TV reception requiring the operator to take whatever steps are necessary to correct the interference."

I should also emphasize that the MicroPalm is only a sample of the type of device that may be used in conjunction with the URFI. Other handheld computers and laptop/portable computers may also be used. The URFI is analogous to a RF modem for computers.
