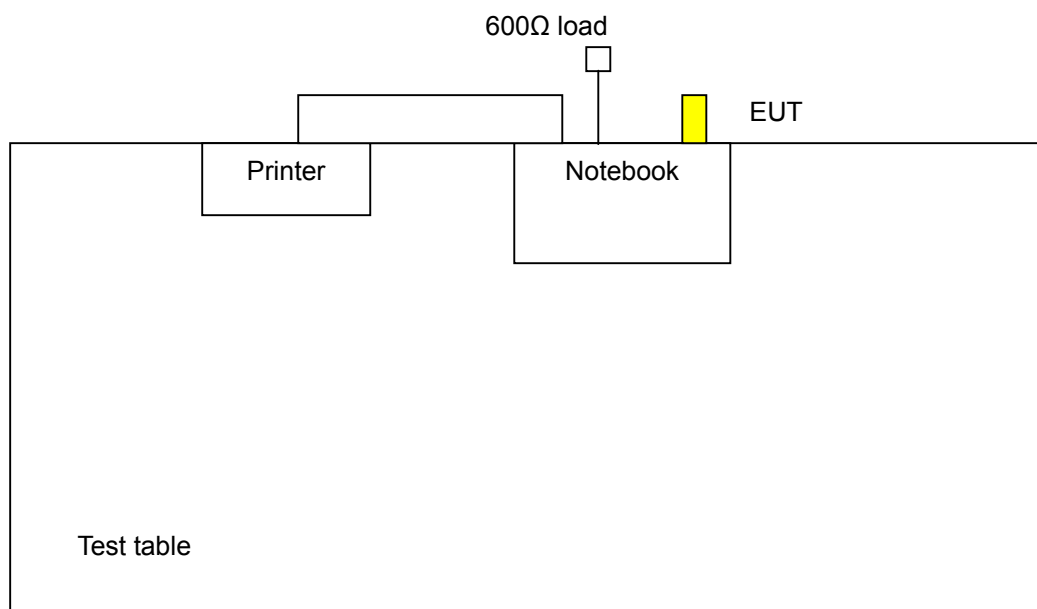

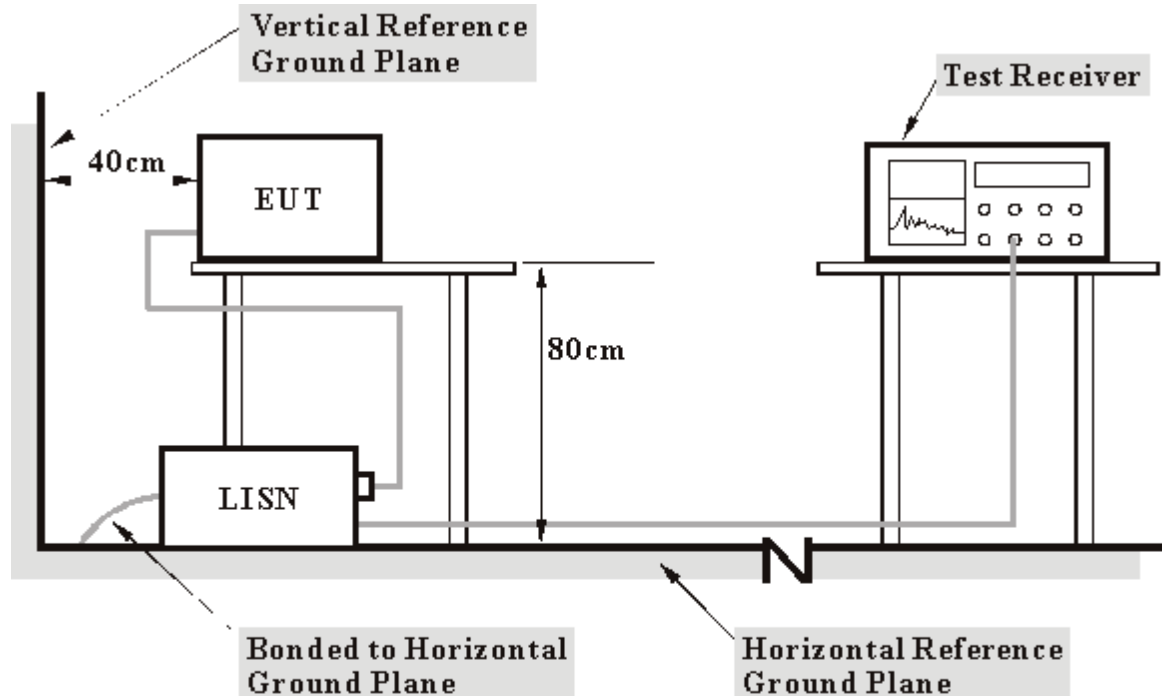
#### 4.1.3 TEST PROCEDURES

- a. The EUT was placed 0.4 meters from the conducting wall of the shielded room with EUT being connected to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (LISN). Other support units were connected to the power mains through another LISN. The two LISNs provide 50 ohm/ 50uH of coupling impedance for the measuring instrument.
- b. Both lines of the power mains connected to the EUT were checked for maximum conducted interference.
- c. The frequency range from 150kHz to 30MHz was searched. Emission levels under (Limit - 20dB) was not recorded.

- Steps c ~ d were repeated.

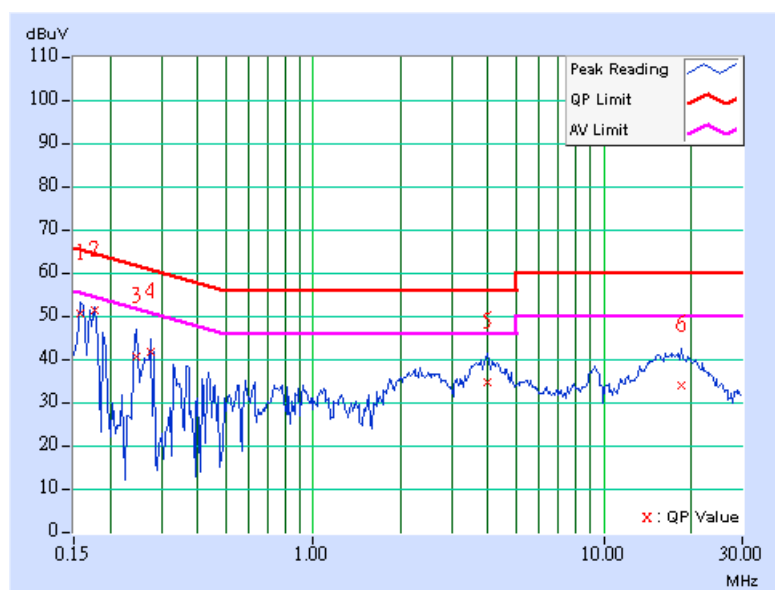

#### 4.2.3 TEST PROCEDURES

1. Check the calibration of the measuring instrument (SA) using either an internal calibrator or a known signal from an external generator.
2. Turn on the EUT and connect its antenna terminal to measurement via a low loss cable. Then set it to any one measured frequency within its operating range and make sure the instrument is operated in its linear range.
3. Set the SA on MaxHold Mode, and then keep the EUT in hopping mode. Record all the signals from each channel until each one has been recorded.
4. Set the SA on View mode and then plot the result on SA screen.
5. Repeat above procedures until all frequencies measured were complete.

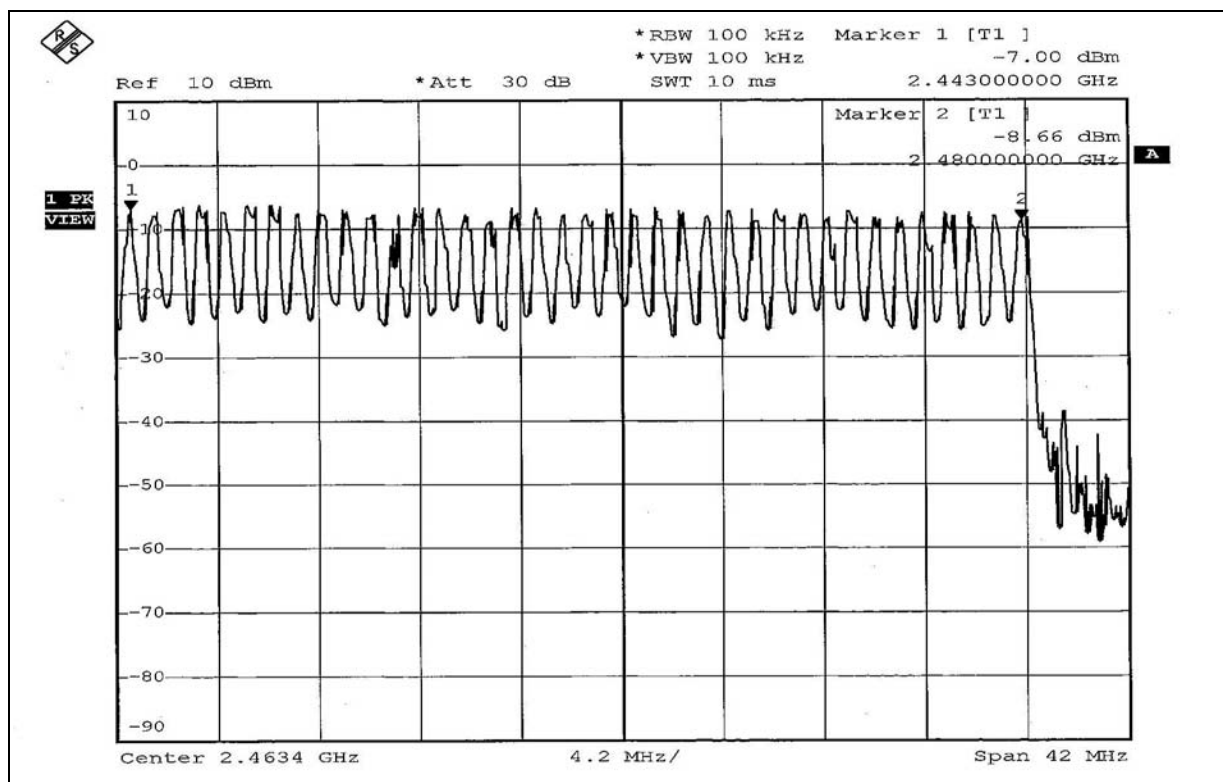

- b. The EUT was set 3 meters away from the interference-receiving antenna, which was mounted on the top of a variable-height antenna tower.
- c. The antenna is a broadband antenna, and its height is varied from one meter to four meters above the ground to determine the maximum value of the field strength. Both horizontal and vertical polarizations of the antenna are set to make the measurement.
- d. For each suspected emission, the EUT was arranged to its worst case and then the antenna was tuned to heights from 1 meter to 4 meters and the rotatable table was turned from 0 degrees to 360 degrees to find the maximum reading.
- e. The test-receiver system was set to Peak Detect Function and Specified Bandwidth with Maximum Hold Mode.
- f. If the emission level of the EUT in peak mode was 10 dB lower than the limit specified, then testing could be stopped and the peak values of the EUT would be reported. Otherwise the emissions that did not have 10 dB margin would be re-tested one by one using peak, quasi-peak or average method as specified and then reported in a data sheet.

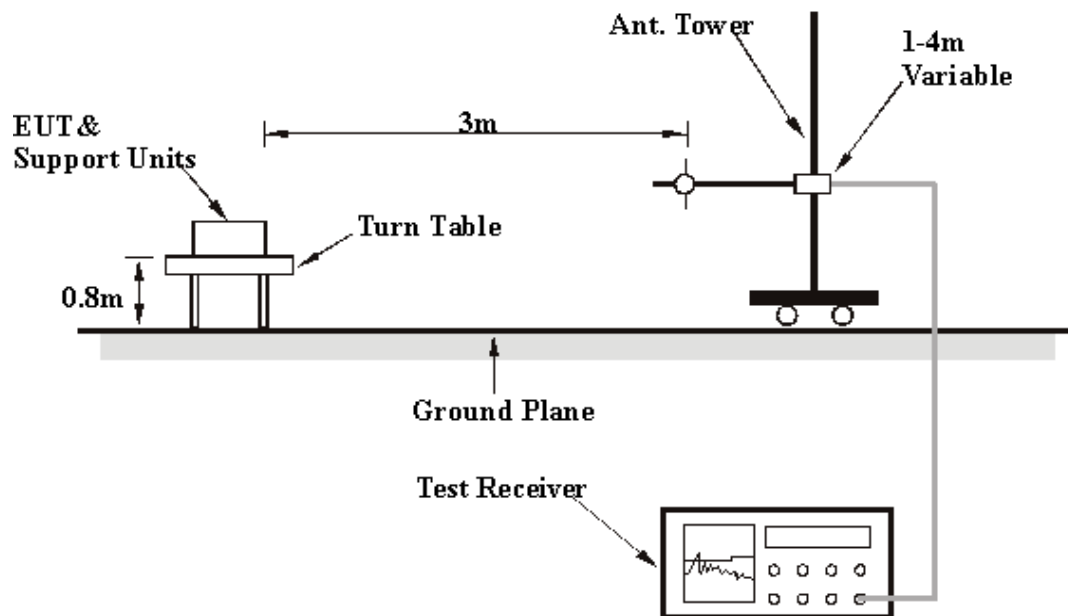

The software provided by client enabled the EUT to transmit and receive data at lowest, middle and highest channel frequencies individually.

#### 4.8.6 TEST RESULTS

The spectrum plots are attached on the following 4 images. D2 line indicates the highest level, D1 line indicates the 20dB offset below D2. It shows compliance with the requirement in part 15.247(d).

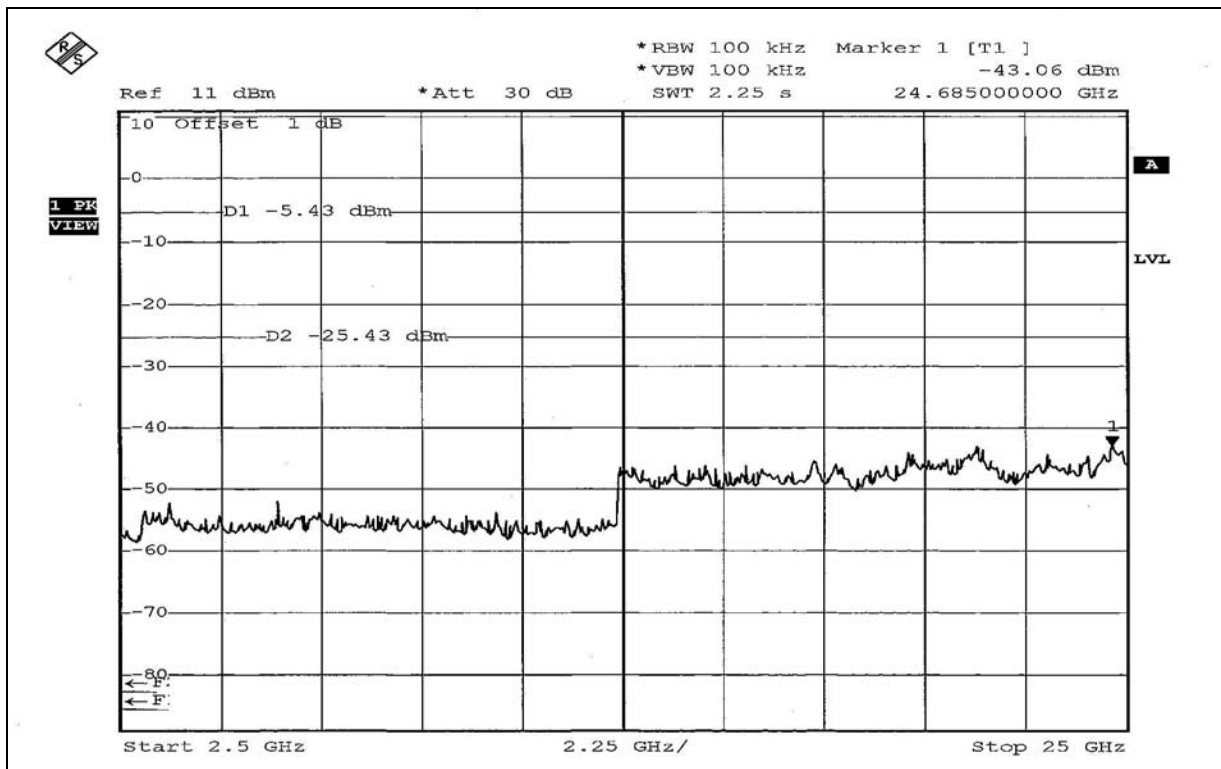
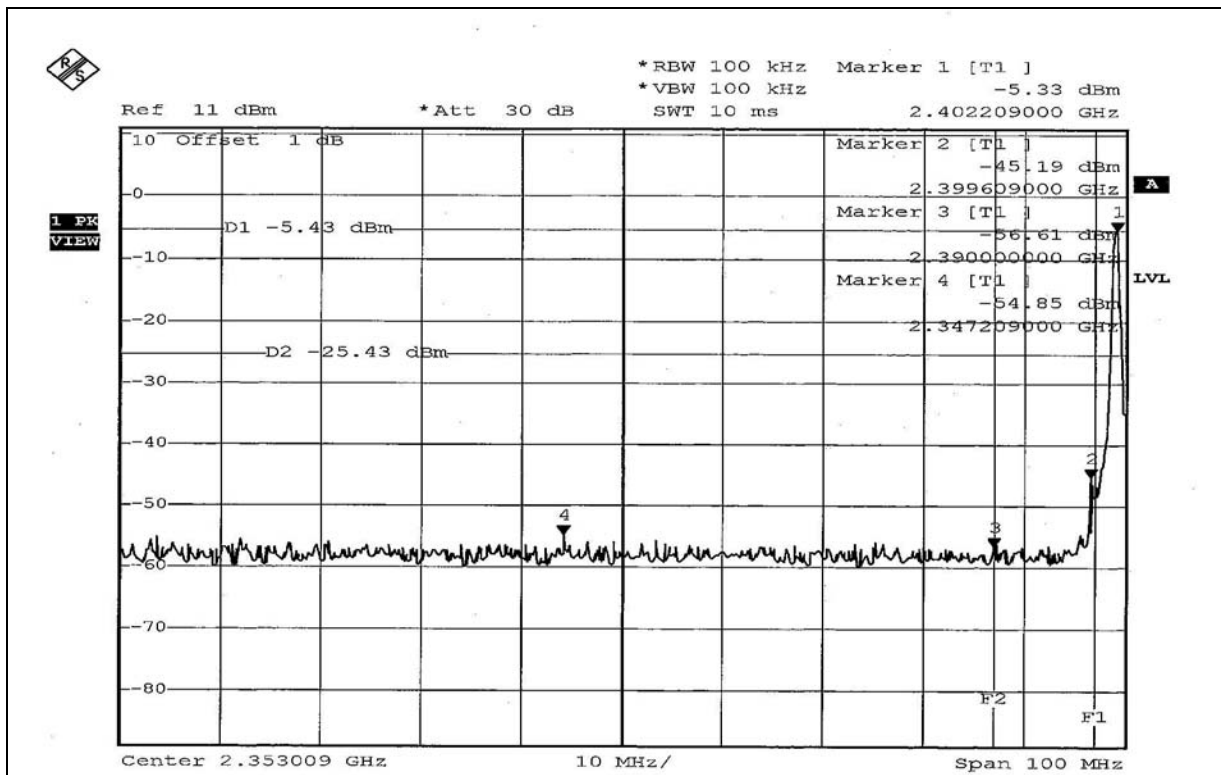
**NOTE 1:** The band edge emission plot on page 57 shows 49.52dBc between carrier maximum power and local maximum emission in restrict band (2.3472GHz). The emission of carrier strength list in the test result of channel 0 at the item 4.7.7 is 93.57dBuV/m (Peak), so the maximum field strength in restrict band is  $93.57 - 49.52 = 44.05$ dBuV/m which is under 74 dBuV/m limit.

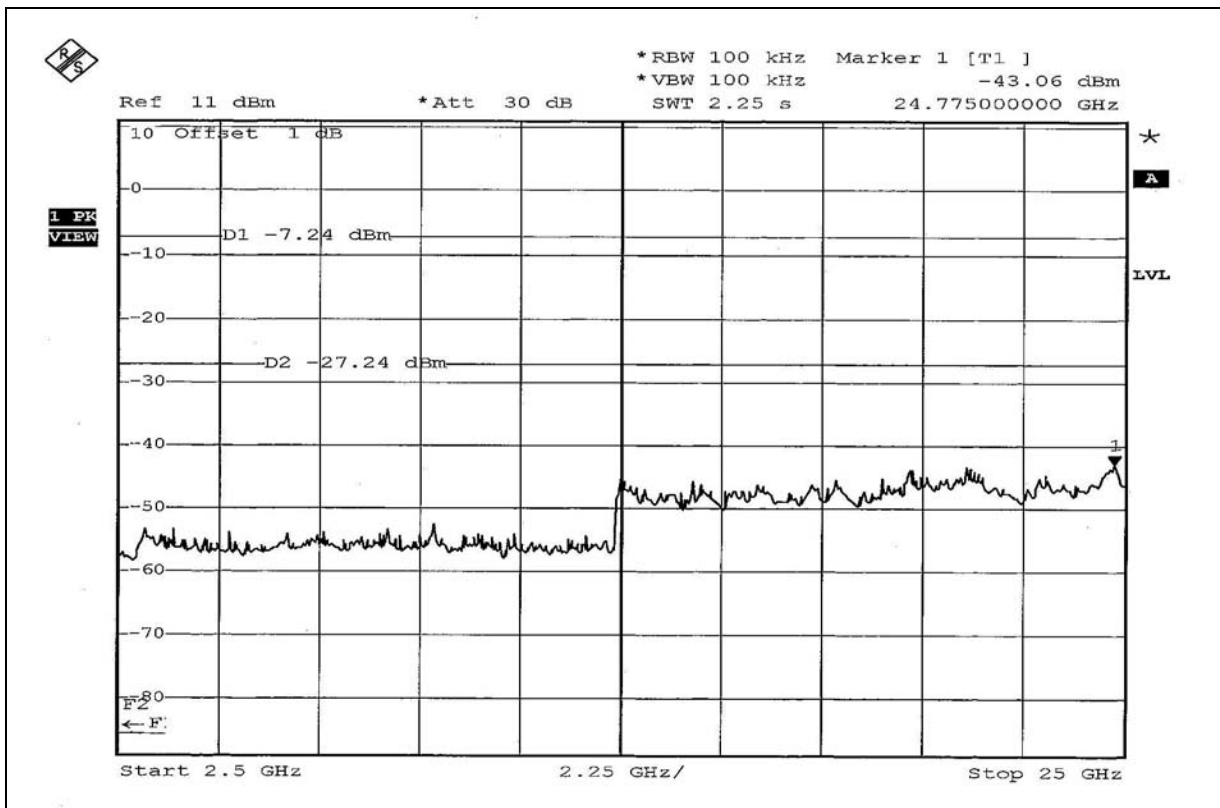
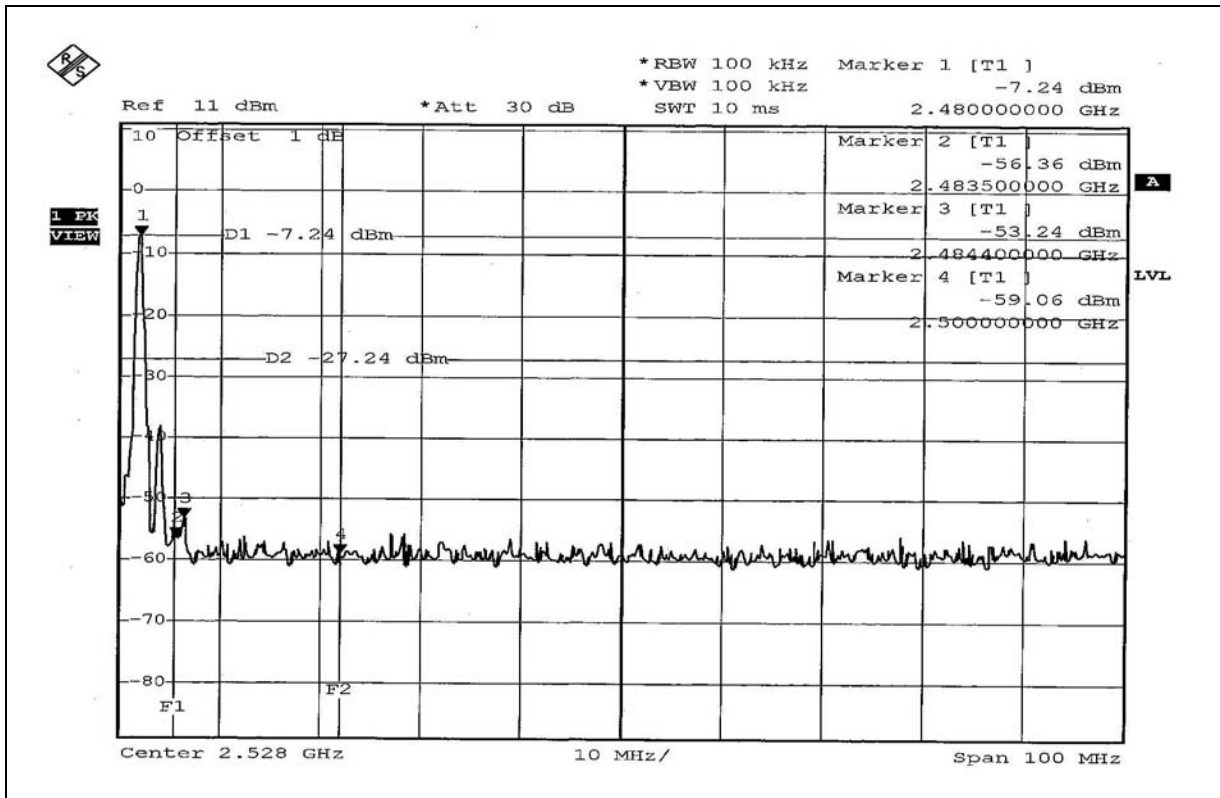

The emission of carrier strength list in the test result of channel 0 at the item 4.7.7 is 63.57dBuV/m (Average), so the maximum field strength in restrict band is  $63.57 - 49.52 = 14.05$ dBuV/m which is under 54 dBuV/m limit.

The emission of carrier strength list in the test result of channel 78 at the item 4.7.7 is 93.09dBuV/m (Peak), so the maximum field strength in restrict band is  $93.09 - 46.00 = 47.09$ dBuV/m which is under 74 dBuV/m limit.

The band edge emission plot on page 58 shows 46.00dBc between carrier maximum power and local maximum emission in restrict band (2.4844GHz). The emission of carrier strength list in the test result of channel 78 at the item 4.7.7 is 63.09dBuV/m (Average), so the maximum field strength in restrict band is  $63.09 - 46.00 = 17.09$ dBuV/m which is under 54 dBuV/m limit.

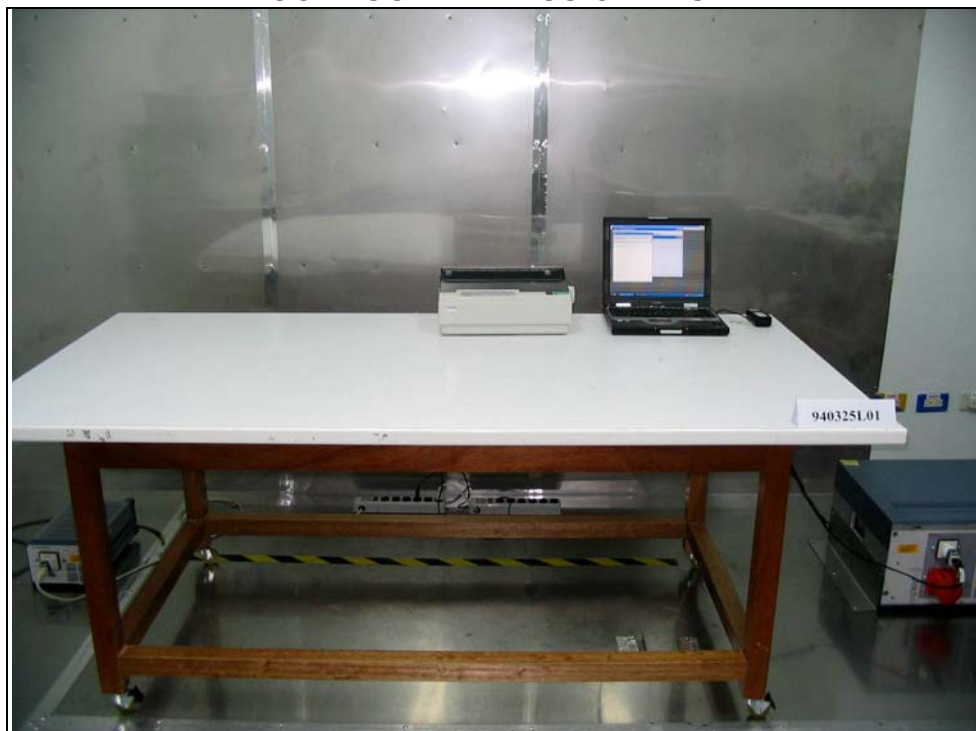

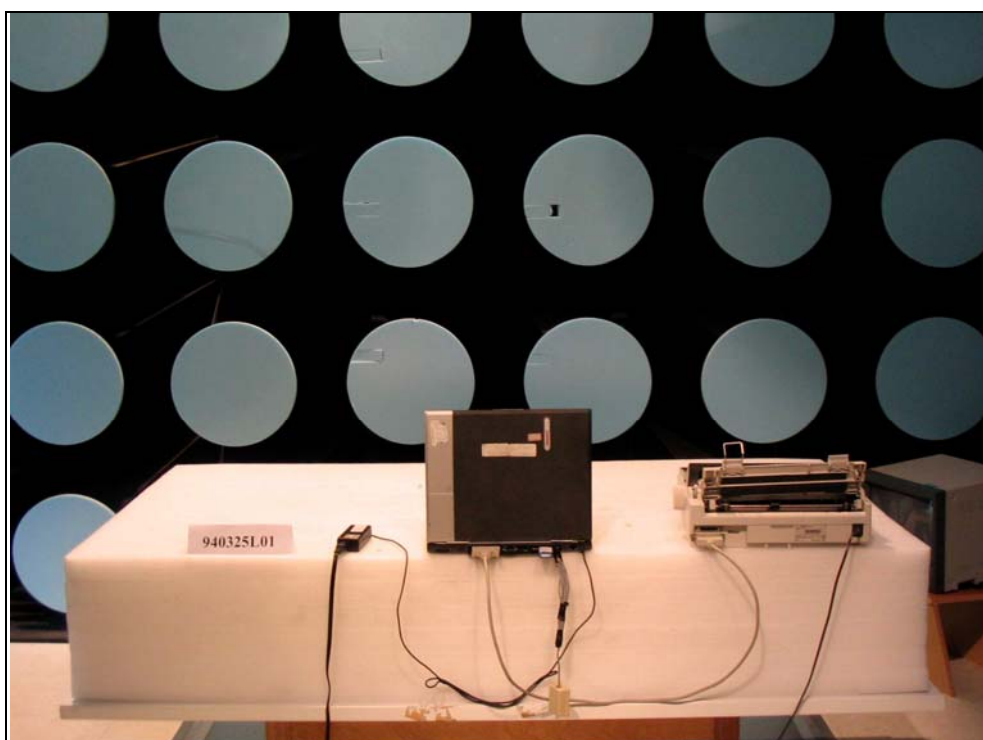
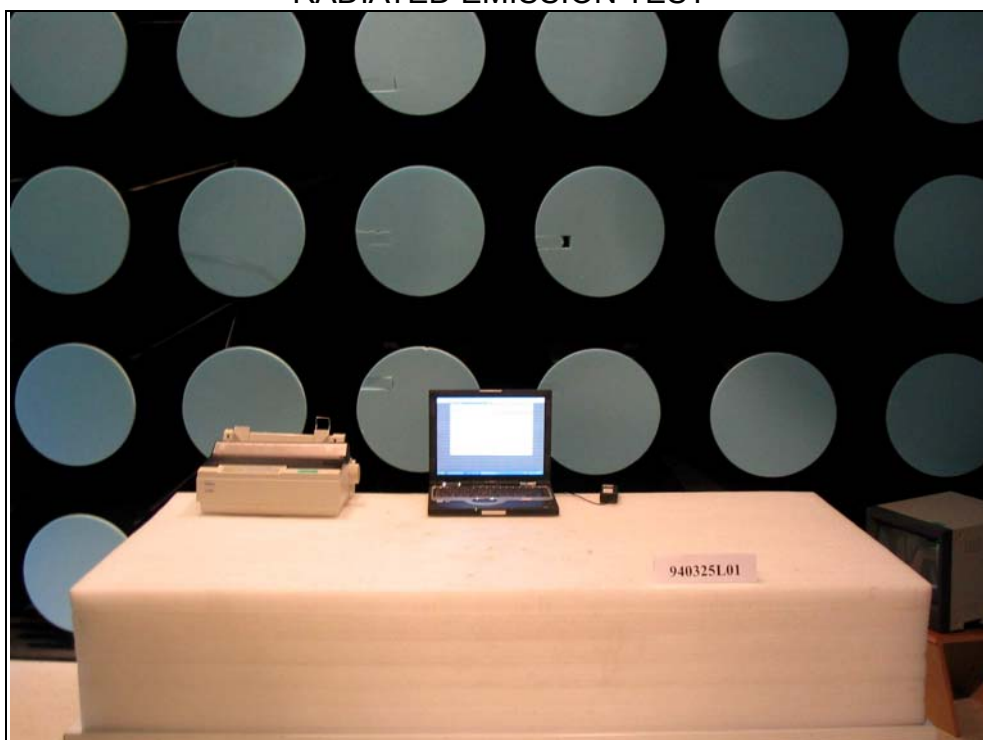
The antenna used in this product is Chip antenna without antenna connector. The maximum gain of this antenna is 1dBi.
