

## RF Exposure Evaluation

### LIMIT

The criteria listed in the following table shall be used to evaluate the environment impact of human exposure to radio frequency (RF) radiation as specified in 1.1310(e)

Note: f = frequency in MHz

### EVALUATION METHOD

Transmission formula:  $Pd = (Pout * G) / (4 * \pi * r^2)$

Where

**Pd** = power density in mW/cm<sup>2</sup>, **Pout** = output power to antenna in mW, **G** = gain of antenna in linear scale;

**Pi** = 3.1416, **R** = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm
