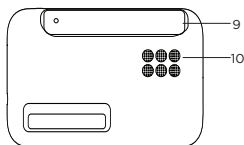
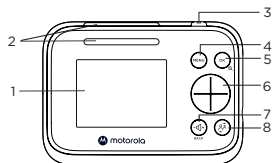
Before you can use the baby monitor, we recommend you insert and fully charge the battery in the Parent Unit, so that it continues to work if you disconnect it from the power supply to carry it to another location. Please read the Safety Instructions on pages 7 - 9 before you install the units.

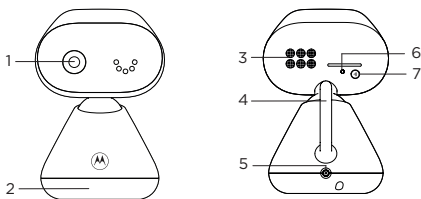

Lights up in blue when the parent unit is powered on and linked to the baby (camera) unit.

## Important guidelines for installing your Video Baby Monitor

- To use your Baby Unit and Parent Unit together, you must be able to establish a radio link between them, and the range will be affected by environmental conditions.
- Any large metal object, like a refrigerator, a mirror, a filing cabinet, a metallic door or reinforced concrete, between the Baby Unit and Parent Unit may block the radio signal.
- The signal strength may also be reduced by other solid structures, like walls, or by radio or electrical equipment, such as TVs, computers, cordless or mobile phones, fluorescent lights or dimmer switches.
- Other 2.4GHz products, such as wireless networks (Wi-Fi® routers), Bluetooth™ systems, microwave ovens or other Baby Monitors, may cause interference with this product, so keep the Baby Monitor at least 5ft (1.5m) away from these types of product, or switch them off if they appear to be causing interference.
- If the signal is weak, try moving the Parent and/or the Baby Unit to different positions in the rooms.

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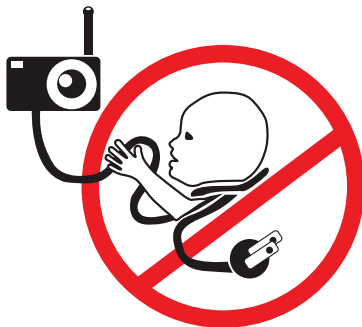
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## 1. Safety Instructions



### **WARNING:**

**STRANGULATION HAZARD** - Keep the unit and adaptor cord more than 3 feet from the crib and out of the baby's reach. **NEVER** place Baby Unit or cords within the crib. Secure the cords more than 3 feet away from the baby's reach. Never use extension cords with AC Adaptors. Only use the AC Adaptors provided.



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## **BABY UNIT SET UP & USE:**

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- Determine a location for the Baby Unit that will provide the best view of your baby in his/her crib.
- Place the Baby Unit on a flat surface, such as a dresser, bureau, or shelf.
- **NEVER** place the Baby Unit or cords within the crib.

### **WARNING**

*This Baby Monitor is compliant with all relevant standards regarding electromagnetic fields and is, when handled as described in the User's Guide, safe to use. Therefore, always read the instructions in this User's Guide carefully before using the device.*

- Adult assembly is required. Keep small parts away from children when assembling.
- This product is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it.
- This Baby Monitor is not a substitute for responsible adult supervision.
- Keep this User's Guide for future reference.
- Do not place the Baby Unit or cords in the crib or within reach of the baby (the Unit and cords should be more than 1 meter away).
- Keep the cords out of reach of children.
- Do not cover the Baby Monitor with a towel or blanket.
- Test this monitor and all its functions so that you are familiar with it prior to actual use.
- Do not use the Baby Monitor in damp areas or close to water.
- Only use the chargers and power adapters provided. Do not use other chargers or power adapters as this may damage the device and battery pack.



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- Only insert a battery pack of the same type.
  - Do not touch the plug contacts with sharp or metal objects.
  - Connect the power adapters to easily accessible electrical outlets.

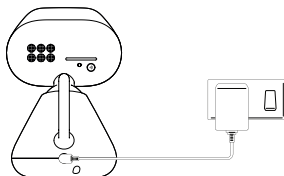

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## 2. Getting Started

### 2.1 Connecting the Power Supply for the Baby Unit

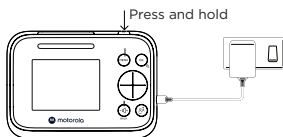


1. Plug the DC plug of the power adapter into the power socket on the rear of the baby (camera) unit and plug the other end of the AC adapter into the wall socket.
2. The baby unit turns on and the power indicator lights up in blue.

#### **WARNING**


Strangulation Hazard. Children have STRANGLED in cords. Keep this cord out of the reach of children (more than 1 meter or 3 feet away). Do not remove the tags from the AC Adapters. Only use the AC Adapters provided.

### 2.2 Connecting the power supply of the Parent Unit



A rechargeable battery is already pre-installed inside the parent unit. When fully charged, you can move the parent unit without losing the link and picture from the baby (camera) unit. When charging the battery for the first time, charge for at least 16 hours continuously.


1. Plug the DC plug of the power adapter into the power socket on the side of the parent unit and plug the other end of the AC adapter into the wall socket.

2. Switch on the AC power and the parent unit will turn on.
3. When the parent unit is fully charged,  will appear steadily on the screen display.
4. Press and hold the power button on the top of the parent unit to turn it on and off.

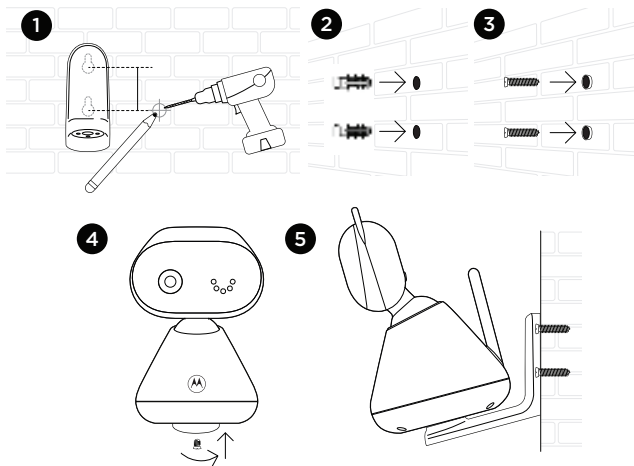
#### Note

Use only the supplied power adapter (DC5V / 1000 mA).

### Pair the baby (camera) unit to the parent unit

We have paired the baby unit to the parent unit in the pack. In case you want to pair an extra camera, press and hold  on the rear of the baby (camera) unit until the LED blinks.

### 2.3 Wall mount the baby (camera) unit



- 
1. Mark the positions of 2 screw holes on the wall. Drill a screw hole at each marking.
  2. Install the supplied wall anchors into 2 screw holes on the wall.
  3. Insert the supplied wall mounting screws into the wall anchors.
  4. Fix and fasten the underside of the baby (camera) unit and the wall mount bracket with the supplied separate screw.
  5. Hang the wall mount bracket on the wall mounting screws on the wall.
  6. Adjust the camera manually if necessary.


















### Note

The pack includes a power adapter with a longer cord which is beneficial for wall mount application, where your wall socket is far from the camera.

## 2.4 Registration (Pairing)

The Baby Monitor is pre-registered to your Parent Unit. You do not need to register it again unless the Baby Unit loses its link with the Parent Unit.

To re-register your Baby Unit, or register a new Baby Unit, follow the procedures below:

1. Press the  button and the menu bar will pop up.
2. Press the  LEFT button or  RIGHT button until  is highlighted, and the  del/  add/  view/  scan menu will pop up.
3. Press the  UP button or  DOWN button to select  add, and press the **OK** button to confirm.
4. Camera  \*<sub>1</sub> /  2 /  3 /  4 will pop up. Press the  UP button or  DOWN button to select the desired Camera, and press the **OK** button to start searching for a camera unit.

**Note:** If a camera is currently paired with the Parent Unit, its camera location (with a \* against it) cannot be selected for a new registration.

5. Press and hold the **PAIR** button on the underside of the Baby Unit until the Parent Unit finds the camera, beeps and **PAIR OK** appears on the screen. The video from the camera will then appear.

### NOTE

A camera can only be registered to one Parent Unit at any one time.

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## 3. Using the Baby Monitor

Please read these instructions carefully, and be aware that this baby monitor is only intended as an aid. It is not a substitute for responsible adult supervision.

### 3.1 Setting Up

- Make sure that the Baby Unit and Parent Unit are both switched on.
- Place the Baby Unit in a convenient location (e.g. on a table) and point the camera lens towards the area you want to monitor.

#### **NOTE**

*Do not place the Baby Unit within reach of a child or baby! If there is interference with the picture or sound, try moving the units to different locations, and ensure that they are not close to any other electrical equipment.*

*If you place the Parent Unit and Baby Unit too close together, you may hear a high pitched noise. This is not a fault. The units are designed to be operated at some distance apart. So move the units further apart.*

### 3.2 Power On or Off the Baby Unit


Slide the ON/OFF switch to the On position to turn on the Baby Unit.


The Power/Link indicator lights up in green.

Slide the Power ON/OFF switch to the Off position to turn off the Baby Unit.

The Power/Link indicator goes off.

### 3.3 Power On or Off the Parent Unit

Press and hold  to turn on the Parent Unit. The Power/Link indicator lights up in green.


Press and hold  to turn off the Parent Unit. The Power/Link indicator goes off.

#### **NOTE**

*If you place the Parent and Baby Units too close together, you may hear a high pitched noise. This is not a fault. The units are designed to be operated at some distance apart, e.g. in separate rooms, so move the units further apart.*

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## 3.4 Night Vision Mode

The Baby Unit has 6 high-intensity infrared LEDs for picking up clear images in the dark. When the built-in photo sensor on the front of the unit detects a low level of ambient light, the LEDs will automatically activate and the screen on the Parent Unit will display in black and white. The  icon will be displayed at the top of the screen.

## 3.5 Turn off Parent Unit LCD Screen

You can turn off the Parent Unit screen without switching off the Parent Unit. When the screen is turned off, you can still hear sound from the Baby Unit.




Press the POWER ON/OFF button  on the Parent Unit to turn off the LCD screen, but still leave the audio monitor on.

Press any key on the Parent Unit to turn on the screen again.

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## 4. Parent Unit Menu Options

### 4.1 Adjust Speaker Volume

You can adjust the speaker volume from Volume 1 to Volume 5, or turn it off. Press  or  on the Parent Unit when it is in camera viewing mode. When the speaker volume is set to off, the screen displays .


### 4.2 LCD Brightness

You can adjust the brightness of the Parent Unit screen from Level 1 to Level 5.









1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode to show the menu options with  displayed in red.
2. Press **OK**, then  or  to adjust the brightness.
3. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

### 4.3 Set Alarm Time on the Parent Unit







You can use the Parent Unit to set the alarm as a reminder for you to take care of your baby.

If an alarm time is selected, the Parent Unit emit multiple beeps repeatedly at the end of the selected 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 hour period, and the alarm icon will appear in the center of the screen. The alarm can be cancelled by pressing any button, except the Power ON/OFF button , on the Parent Unit.

#### *Turn on and set the alarm when it is currently off:*

1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to choose On, then press **OK**.
4. Press  or  to choose 2h, 3h, 4h, 5h or 6h.
5. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.







#### *Turn off the alarm when it is currently on:*

1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to choose Off.
4. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

---

### 4.3.1 Set lullaby

You can play calming sounds on the Baby Unit to comfort your baby.










1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to choose your desired lullaby.
4. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

## 4.4 Monitor the Temperature

Your Baby Unit measures the surrounding temperature. If the detected temperature goes outside a selected temperature range, you can set the Parent Unit to emit an alert tone and show a warning message on the screen. You can change the settings for the temperature format, range, and alert as follows:












### 4.4.1 Temperature Format

You can choose to display the temperature in °F or °C.

1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to scroll to  and press the **OK** button.
4. Press  or  to choose °F or °C.
5. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

### 4.4.2 Temperature Range

You can set the maximum (25 - 39°C/77 - 102°F) and minimum (10 - 24°C/50 - 76°F) values for the temperature, so that when the room temperature goes outside the temperature range, you will receive an alert if the Temperature Alert is set on.

1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to scroll to  and press the **OK** button.
4. Press  or  to scroll to MAX for the maximum temperature, or MIN for the minimum temperature.
5. Press **OK**, then  or  to select the MAX or MIN temperature and press **OK** to confirm your selection.



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### 4.4.3 Temperature Alert

You can set whether to receive a visual and audible alert when the room temperature goes outside the selected temperature range.

1. Press when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press or to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then or to scroll to and press the **OK** button.
4. Press or to choose On or Off.
5. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

### 4.5 Remove a Baby Unit from the Parent Unit

1. Press when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press or to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then or to select the desired Baby Unit (cam 1, 2, 3 or 4).
4. Press **OK**, then press or to choose YES or NO.
5. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

#### NOTE

*You cannot remove a Baby Unit if it is the only one paired.*

### 4.6 Set Screen Off time for the Parent Unit

You can set the screen off time for the Parent Unit after it is in idle mode for a specific time interval.

1. Press when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press or to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then or to select (60mins, 30mins, 5mins or OFF).
4. Press **OK** to confirm your selection.

### 4.7 Zoom, Pan or Tilt

You can zoom in or out while viewing the image from a Baby Unit.

1. Press to zoom in.
2. Press and hold , , or to move the zoomed image left, right, up or down correspondingly.
3. Press to zoom out.







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## 4.8 Pair and Replace a Baby Unit

The Baby Units and Parent Unit provided are already paired. You can add or replace a Baby Unit in your video and audio monitoring system.

You can pair a maximum of four Baby Units to your Parent Unit. Each new Baby Unit must be paired to the Parent Unit before use.


### *To pair and replace a Baby Unit:*

1. Press  when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode.
2. Press  or  to scroll to .
3. Press **OK**, then  or  to choose a desired Baby Unit number, then press **OK**. The pairing mode starts.
4. Turn on the new Baby Unit, and then immediately press and hold **PAIR** until the Power/Link indicator turns on. The unit will beep and the picture from the new camera will appear on the screen.

### **NOTE**

*You cannot choose a Baby Unit number that is already occupied, and it must be removed before the new Baby Unit can replace the existing Baby Unit.*


## 4.9 Multi-Camera Use

You can pair up to 4 cameras with the Parent Unit. If more than one camera is paired with the Parent Unit, you can select which camera to view or set it in Patrol mode , where the Parent Unit automatically cycles through the paired cameras about every 10 seconds.

### **NOTE**

*The audio from a camera can only be heard on the Parent Unit when that camera is selected.*

### *To change the camera being viewed:*

Press **OK** when the Parent Unit is in camera viewing mode to step through the paired cameras, 1, 2, 3, 4, , with the selected option shown on the screen.

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## 6. Help

### No display

- Try recharging the battery pack.
- Reset the parent and baby (camera) units. Unplug both the units' from the wall socket, then plug them back in.
- Check if the parent/baby (camera) unit is switched on.
- Press and hold the power button on the parent unit to switch it on.
- Make sure the correct camera is selected. Change the camera number if necessary.
- Make sure the display of the parent unit is turned on.
- When operating using batteries only, the display will go blank after 5 minutes, 15 minutes or 30 minutes to save power (depending on video settings). The parent unit is still active and will give you audio alerts. You can press any button to reactivate the screen.

### The baby (camera) unit has lost its link with the parent unit.

- The baby (camera) unit is too far away and may be out of range. Move the it closer to the parent unit.
- Disconnect both the parent and baby (camera) units from the power outlet. Wait for about 15 seconds and reconnect them. Allow up to one minute for the parent and baby (camera) units to synchronize.
- Re-register your baby (camera) unit if necessary, see page 13.

### Noise interference on your parent unit

- The baby and parent units may be too close with each other. Move them further apart.
- Make sure there is at least 3 to 6 feet between the parent and baby (camera) units to avoid audio feedback.
- The baby (camera) unit is too far away and may be out of range. Move the it closer to the parent unit.
- Make sure the parent and baby (camera) units are not placed near other electrical equipment, such as a television, computer or cordless/mobile telephone. Move the parent and baby (camera) units 5 feet away from other electrical equipment.
- Use of other 2.4 GHz products, such as wireless networks (Wi-Fi® routers), Bluetooth™ systems, or microwave ovens, may cause interference with this product. Keep the parent and baby (camera) units at least 5 feet away from these types of products, or switch them off if they appear to be causing interference.
- If the signal is weak, try moving the parent and/or baby (camera) units to different positions in rooms.

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**Noise interference on your device**

- To avoid background noise or echoes, ensure there is enough distance between your device and the camera (baby unit).
- Use of other 2.4 GHz products, such as wireless networks (Wi-Fi® routers), Bluetooth™ systems, or microwave ovens, may cause interference with this product. Keep the parent and baby (camera) units at least 5 feet away from these types of products, or switch them off if they appear to be causing interference.

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## 7. General information

### Cleaning and care

#### Important

Always switch off and disconnect the power adaptor before cleaning your video baby monitor.

- Clean your video baby monitor with a slightly damp cloth or with an anti-static cloth. Never use cleaning agents or abrasive solvents.
- Do not clean any part of the video baby monitor with thinners or other solvents and chemicals - this may cause permanent damage to the product which is not covered by the warranty.
- Keep your video baby monitor away from hot, humid areas or strong sunlight, and do not let it get wet.
- Every effort has been made to ensure high standards of reliability of your Digital Audio Baby Monitor. However, if something does go wrong, please do not try to repair it yourself - contact Customer Service for assistance.

#### Disposal of the Device (environment)

At the end of the product life cycle, you should not dispose of this product with normal household waste. Take this product to a collection point for the recycling of electrical and electronic equipment. The symbol on the product, user guide and/or box indicates this.
