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Overview

This document is for a user who wants to install CB-G-IN-01, 03 CARD Bus in Notebook/PC desk, the user can read the document to configure his wireless PC Card.

Software Requirement

OS: Windows95,98,2K,NT,XP

Software Package: USI_driver_11g_V1-0-8.zip

Hardware Requirement

CB-G-IN-01, 03 CARD Bus.

PC running in win95,98,2k,NT,XP.

Cardbus controller in PC or PCMCIA interface in Notebook

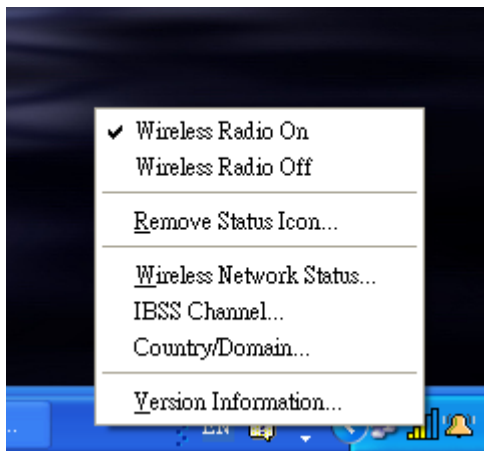
Installation

- Install the driver in your host.
- Insert PC Card in to the PC Card slot of host PC (Note: connect PC Card to PC Desk via adapter of pcmcia – cardbus)

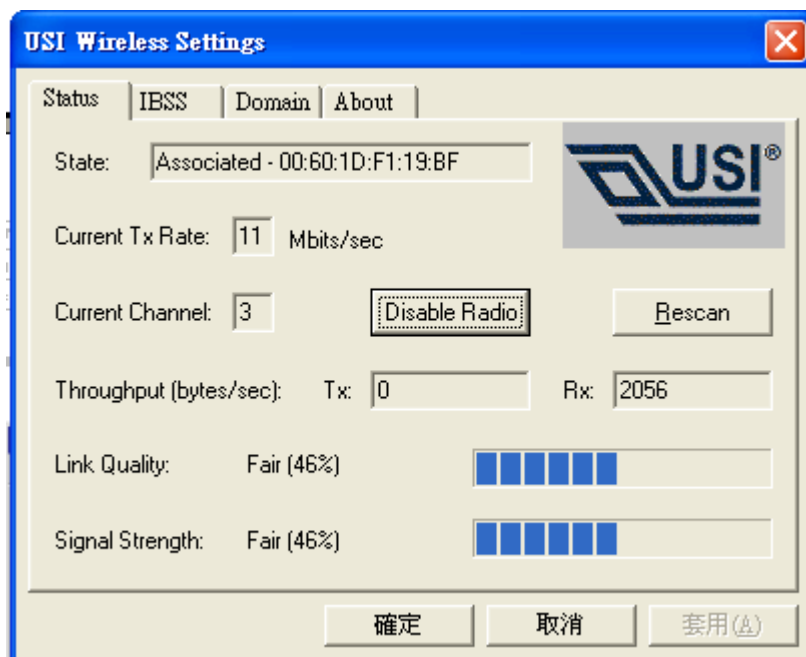
Execute the Configuration Program

There are two ways to start the configuration program.

- After installation driver, insert the card into PC host, the program will be executed automatically, and display a tray icon



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IMPORTANT NOTE: To comply with the FCC RF exposure compliance requirements, no change to the antenna or the device is permitted. IMPORTANT NOTE:

FCC Radiation Exposure Statement:

This equipment complies with FCC radiation exposure limits set forth for an uncontrolled environment. This equipment should be installed and operated with minimum distance 20cm between the radiator & your body.

This transmitter must not be co-located or operating in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter.

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This device is intended only for OEM integrators under the following conditions:

- 1) The antenna must be installed such that 20 cm is maintained between the antenna and users, and
- 2) The transmitter module may not be co-located with any other transmitter or antenna.

As long as 2 conditions above are met, further transmitter test will not be required. However, the OEM integrator is still responsible for testing their end-product for any additional compliance requirements required with this module installed (for example, digital device emissions, PC peripheral requirements, etc.).

IMPORTANT NOTE: In the event that these conditions can not be met (for example certain laptop configurations or co-location with another transmitter), then the FCC authorization is no longer considered valid and the FCC ID can not be used on the final product. In these circumstances, the OEM integrator will be responsible for re-evaluating the end product (including the transmitter) and obtaining a separate FCC authorization.

End Product Labeling

This transmitter module is authorized only for use in device where the antenna may be installed such that 20 cm may be maintained between the antenna and users (for example : access points, routers, wireless ADSL modems and similar equipment). The final end product must be labeled in a visible area with the following: "Contains TX FCC ID: IXMCBGIN01 ".

Manual Information That Must be Included

The OEM integrator has to be aware not to provide information to the end user regarding how to install or remove this RF module in the users manual of the end product which integrate this module.

The users manual for OEM integrators must include the following information in a prominent location " IMPORTANT NOTE: To comply with FCC RF exposure compliance requirements, the antenna used for this transmitter must be installed to provide a separation distance of at least 20 cm from all persons and must not be co-located or operating in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter.
