For DSSS Transmitter

The DSSS and BLE transmitter, the aggregated (power density/limit) is smaller than 1, and the MPE of 2 collocated transmitters is compliant.

NOTE: FCC ID for the pre-certified BLE module is X8WBT840F. BLE does not transmit simultaneously with the Spread Spectrum Transmitter.
