
# **BEFORE USE**

## Safety Warnings and Precautions

Thank you for purchasing the high-performance digital signage from Displays2go. We have considered the factors to ensure personal safety in product design and have tested rigorously at the factory. However, improper installation and use may result in electric shock and fire.

In order to safely use, maximize performance of the unit and extend the life of the product, please read and follow all instructions carefully before using the product. Keep the instructions for future reference.

We strongly recommend using a surge protector or a power strip with internal circuit breaker to prevent damages to the digital signage.





If any of the following occurs:

- Power outage or instable voltage.
- Abnormal sound or smell from the unit.
- AC power cord is damaged.
- Digital Signage is damaged due to drop, knock or impact.
- Any liquid or foreign matters fall into the enclosure.



Turn off the Digital Signage immediately, pull out the plug from the power outlet, and ask the authorized personnel for maintenance quickly.



If coal gas or other flammable gas leaks, do not pull out the plug of the LCD digital signage or other electrical appliances; instead, turn off the gas valve immediately, and open the doors and windows quickly.





- Cut off the power supply before connecting or disconnecting any cables.


# Assembly

- TOOLS NEEDED: Drill, bubble leveler, measuring tape.
- NOTE: Two people recommended for safe installation.
- NOTE: The hardware bag includes 4 additional slotted screws that are not needed for installation.




Mounting Plate

- Level the mounting plate on the wall, centering the 4 inner slotted holes at the desired location. Mark the locations of the 4 outer screw holes with a pencil.
- 2. Drill 4 pilot holes into the marked locations on the wall.

- 3. Place the mounting plate on the wall and use screws, washers, and wall anchors to secure to the wall.
- 4. Carefully hang the set screws on the back of the unit into the inner slotted holes of the mounting plate.
- 5. Screw antenna into the Wi-Fi port on the side of the unit.



Installation is complete.

# **OPERATION**

## Power On/Off


- <u>Start up</u> by inserting the power cord into unit and connecting to outlet. Flip power switch to ON.
- <u>Power on or off the screen</u>, press the **U** power button on the remote control.
- To shut down, press the power button on the remote control, then flip power switch to OFF.

The power indicator light turns green when the unit is on. When the unit is in standby mode, the light turns red.






#### INTERFACE PANEL (LEFT)




#### POWER PANEL (RIGHT)









### Remote Control

To control the unit, aim the remote control directly at the remote sensor, located on the left side of the unit. The Remote Sensor indicator light on the monitor flashes when receiving a remote signal.




For best performance, bring the remote control close to the sensor and avoid placing objects between the remote control and the sensor or exposing the sensor window to direct sunlight. See the remote control diagram below.

NOTE: The remote requires 2 AAA batteries, not included.




### Settings

Once turned on, the unit automatically displays the home screen, which includes the navigation bar and the App Drawer.



**NOTE**: The navigation bar can be minimized by swiping down. To restore the navigation bar, swipe upward from the bottom of the screen.







#### ANDROID QUICK START GUIDE

Adjust settings by tapping the App Drawer, and launching the Settings app.

#### WI-FI CONNECTION



- Open Settings, and select Network and Internet from the list of settings.
- 2. Select your Wi-Fi network and enter your login credentials. Click Okay.

For Ethernet Connections, plug an Ethernet cable into the Ethernet (RJ45) port of the unit and connect to Internet router. Ethernet network connection is complete.

#### **BLUETOOTH CONNECTION**



- 1. Open Settings, and select Connected Devices.
- Click Pair New Device. Make sure your Bluetooth device is in pairing mode.

For future connections, select the device from the list of previously connected Bluetooth devices.



NOTE: To share files over Bluetooth, you must enable Wi-Fi and Bluetooth Scanning in the Location settings.

#### **SOUND**



1. Open Settings, and select Sound.

From this menu, you can individually control the volume of alarms, calls, notifications, and your media.

You can also change default notification sounds or turn Do Not Disturb on or off.

#### SYSTEM LANGUAGE



- 1. Open Settings, and select System.
- 2. Click System Language, then click Languages.
- 3. Click + Add a language and select a language. It appears as the 2nd installed system language.
- 4. Drag your preferred system language to first position of the list. The system language updates automatically to the first listed language.

#### **SCREENSHOTS**



- 1. Open Settings, and select Screenshot.
- 2. Adjust the screenshot delay and enable or disable the Screenshot button in the navigation bar.

Find recent screenshots in the Google Files app.
Choose the unit, click Pictures, then click Screenshots.

#### **FACTORY RESET**



- 1. Open Settings, and select System.
- 2. Select Advanced Options.
- 3. Click Reset Options.
- 4. Select Erase All Data (Factory Reset). Then click Erase All Data.

#### **DiViEX**

The DiViEX Slideshow App comes pre-installed on this digital product for convenient content management. There are 2 methods for uploading media: saving media files to internal storage, or creating a specific folder on a USB, then inserting into unit. After, open the app to launch a slideshow or adjust picture settings, add filters and stickers, queue music and more!

#### METHOD 1: PLAY MEDIA VIA INTERNAL STORAGE

- 1. Insert USB into the unit.
- 2. Open the File Explorer app and navigate to the location of your files using the toolbar.




- 4. In the File Explorer toolbar, click Editor > Copy.
- 5. Navigate to Internal Memory, then open the 'MediaFolder' folder.
- 6. Copy files to designated folder (i.e., image files to 'Image' folder) by clicking Editor > Paste.
- 7. Open the DiViEX app. Your images and videos appear in the DiViEX slideshow timeline.





#### METHOD 2: PLAY MEDIA VIA USB

- 1. On your computer, create a new folder and name it "MediaFolder".
- 2. In "MediaFolder," create 3 subfolders. Rename them: "Images"; "Videos"; "Music".
- 3. Copy your desired images, videos, and music to the corresponding folder.
- 4. Copy "MediaFolder" to a USB and safely eject USB from computer. Insert into unit, then open DiViEX.
  - NOTE: If DiViEX stops running after pressing play, check:
    - MediaFolder is set up correctly on the USB.
    - All files in MediaFolder are the supported file formats.



#### **PLAYLIST SETTINGS**


Edit the overall playlist settings in the Settings tab. Once settings are adjusted, click PLAY or adjust further in the Edit or Music tab.

E. SAVE / SHARE	Save progress or share playlist. After saving, go back to Settings tab and press PLAY.

#### MUSIC

Choose music from the Music folder to play during slideshow. Press the left arrow (F) to add music to the slideshow playlist. Press the right arrow (G) to remove songs from the playlist. The number of songs in the playlist is shown in the upper left.
