
### **13. Power-Cord Protection**

Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

#### 15. Lightning

#### 17. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.



# Power

This set operates on a DC supply provided by the AC adapter, and the voltage is as indicated on the label on the back of the set. Use only the AC adapter supplied with the set and never apply AC power to the set directly. The AC adapter operates on an AC power supply, and the voltage is as indicated on the label of the AC adapter.



- a. Connect the DC plug of the AC adapter to the 12V jack on the rear of the set.
- b. Connect the AC adapter and its power cord.
- c. Connect the power cord to an AC outlet.

In the event of thunderstorms or poweroutages, please pull out the power plug of the AC-DC adapter along with the cable or antenna connector. Do not allow anything to rest upon or roll over the power cord, and do not place the monitor where the power cord is subject to damage.


# Service

# Antenna or Cable Connection

Connect the incoming cable service or antenna cable to the socket marked 75  $\Omega$  on the back of the set. For the best reception, an outdoor antenna should be used.

# Location



Position your set so that no bright light or sunlight falls


directly onto the screen. Care should be taken not to expose the set to any unnecessary vibration, moisture, dust or heat. Also ensure that the set is placed in a position to allow a free flow of air. Do not cover the ventilation openings on the back cover.

The standing angle can be adjusted as shown in pictures. If you wish to install the set on the wall, use the optional wall mounting bracket and secure it firmly to a wall stud, if possible. Do not mount the unit to a wall if its safety cannot be assured.

# Cleaning

Unplug the set before cleaning the face of the LCD Screen. Dust the set by wiping the screen and the cabinet with a soft, clean cloth. If the screen requires additional cleaning, use a clean, damp cloth. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. All the functions can be controlled with the remote control handset.







# Connecting to an Inside Antenna Setup


- Typical wall antenna jack used in apartment buildings, connect the antenna cable as shown below. (Use the correct type of antenna cable for the type of wall antenna jack.)



If you have a 75Ω round cable, insert the bronze wire and then tighten the connection nut. If you have a 300Ω flat wire, connect the twisted wire to the antenna converter and then connect the converter to the antenna jack on the TV.
If using 75Ω round cable, do not bend the bronze wire. It may cause poor picture guality.

# **Connecting to an Outdoor Antenna Setup**


- If you connect an S-VIDEO VCR to the S-VIDEO input, the picture quality is improved; compared to connecting a regular VCR to the Video input.

# Stereo/SAP Broadcasts Setup

- The TV can receive MTS stereo programs and any SAP (Secondary Audio Program) that accompanies the stereo program, if the broadcaster transmits an additional sound signal as well as the original one.
- Mono: The primary language is heard from left and right speakers. Signal mode is mono.
- Stereo: The primary language is heard from left and right speakers. Signal mode is stereo.
- SAP: The secondary language is heard from left and right speakers.



- 1. Press the I/II button repeatedly.
- Select mono sound mode if the signal is not clear or in poor signal reception areas.
- Stereo, SAP mode are available only if included on the broadcast signal.

- 4. To cancel **Off/On Time** function, press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Hold**.
- 5. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to adjust the hour.
- 6. Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to adjust the minute.
- 7. **Only On time function** ; Press the ▲ / ▼ button to adjust volume level and programe number.
- 8. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.

#### Note :

- a.In the event of power interruption (disconnection or power failure), the clock must be reset.
- b. Two hours after the set is switched on by the on time function it will automatically switch back to standby mode unless a button has been pressed.
- c.Once the on or off time is set, these functions operate daily at the preset time. d.The Off Timer function overrides the On Timer function if they are set to the same time.
- e. The set must be in standby mode for the On Timer to work.





# Auto off

If you select **On** on the **Auto off** menu, the set will automatically switch itself to standby mode approximately ten minutes after a TV station stops broadcasting.

- 1. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the TIME menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Auto off**.
- 3. Press the  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.



You don't have to remember to switch the set off before you go to sleep. The sleep timer automatically switches the set to standby after the preset time has elapsed. Press the **SLEEP** button to select the number of minutes. The display 'Sleep O()' will appear on the screen, followed by **10**, **20**, **30**, **60**, **90**, **120**, **180** and **240**. The timer begins to count down from the number of minutes selected.

# Note :

- a.To view the remaining sleep time, press the **SLEEP** button once.
- b.To cancel the sleep time, repeatedly press the **SLEEP** button until the display '[Sleep 04+]' appears.
- c.When you switch the set off, the set releases the preset sleep time.

# Caption

Use the cc button repeatedly to select Captions.

**EZ Mute** shows the selected captions option (if available on program) when the TV sound is muted.

- 1. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Captions**.
- 3. Press the ◀ / ► button to select **Off**, **On** or **Ez Mute**.
- 4. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.

**Note :** It's not available in Component and RGB-PC modes.



- 1. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Captions/Text**.
- 3. Use the ◀ / ► button to select your caption selection. Your choices are: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text 1, Text 2, Text3 and Text4.
- 4. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.





# Lock Menu Options

Parental Control can be used to block specific channels, ratings and other viewing sources.

The Parental Control Function (V-Chip) is used to block program viewing based on the ratings sent by the broadcast station. The default setting is to allow all programs to be viewed. Viewing can be blocked by the type of program and by the categories chosen to be blocked. It is also possible to block all program viewing for a time period. To use this function, the following must be set : 1. Ratings and categories to be blocked. 2. Set a password 3. Enable the lock

# V-Chip rating and categories

Rating guidelines are provided by broadcast stations. Most television programs and television movies can be blocked by TV Rating and/or Individual Categories. Movies that have been shown at the theaters or direct-to-video movies use the Movie Rating System (MPAA) only.

- 1. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the Special menu.
- 2. Press the ▲ / ▼ button to select **Key lock**.
- 3. Press the ◀ / ► button to select **on** or **off**.
- 4. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.

1. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the Special menu. Then, press the ▶ button. • If Lock is already set, enter the password requested. • The TV is set with the initial password "0-0-0-0". 2. Set password: Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Set password**. Press the ▶ button and then enter a four digit password. Enter it again when requested. 3. Setting Lock on/off: Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select **Lock on/off**. Use the  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button to select **on** or **off**. 4. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select type of blocking to be set . 5. Press the  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  button to select type of ratings to block . 6. Only Age block, Content block, and Canadian function ; Press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button and then use  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select type of ratings to block. 7. Press the **EXIT** button to save and return to TV viewing.









# PC in socket (D-Sub jack)

- 1. Connect the signal cable from the monitor output socket of the PERSONAL COMPUTER to the PC input socket of the set.
- 2. Connect the audio cable from the PC to the **PC SOUND** sockets of the set.
- 3. Press the INPUT SELECT button to select PC.
- 4. Switch on the PC, and the PC screen appears on the set.

The set can be operated as the PC monitor.

**Note** : If you have an Apple macintosh, connect the VGA desktop block (not supplied) from the 3 row 15 pin to 2 row 15 pin with the signal cable and connect the VGA desktop block to the Macintosh.

# Note :

- a. If the set is cold, there may be a small "flicker" when the set is switched on. This is normal, there is nothing wrong with the set.
- b. If possible, use the VESA 1,024x768@60Hz video mode to obtain the best image quality for your LCD monitor. If used under the other resolutions, some scaled or processed pictures may appear on the screen. If used to PC vertical frequency 85Hz, some noise can be seen when PIP is on. In this case, set the PC vertical frequency to 60Hz. The set has been preadjusted to the mode VESA 1,024x768@60Hz.
- c. Some dot defects may appear on the screen, like Red, Green or Blue spots. However, this will have no impact or effect on the monitor performance.
- d. Do not press the LCD screen with your finger for a long time as this may produce some temporary distortion effects on the screen.
- e. When the PC screen appears on the set, a message may appear on the screen, and the message will differ according to the Window system version (Win98, 2000). If a message appears click "Next" until the message finishes.
- f. If the message "**out of Range**" appears on the screen, adjust the PC as in the 'Displayable Monitor Specification' section.

# Picture adjustment

You can adjust picture contrast, brightness, horizontal/vertical position, clock, clock phase, auto-configure and reset as you prefer.

- 1. Repeatedly press the **INPUT SELECT** button to select the PC monitor mode.
- 2. Repeatedly press the **MENU** button to select the Special menu.
- 3. Press the  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  button to select the desired picture item.
- 4. Press the ◀ / ► button to make appropriate adjustments.

# **H-Position / V-Position**

This function is to adjust picture to left/right and up/down as you prefer.

### Clock

This function is to minimize any vertical bars or stripes visible on the screen background. And the horizontal screen size will also change.

# **Clock Phase**

This function allows you to remove any horizontal noise and clear or sharpen the image of characters.

# Auto-configure

This function is for the automatic adjustment of the screen position, clock and clock phase. The displayed image will disappear for a few seconds while the Auto-configuration is in progress.

**Note** : Some signal from some graphics boards may not function properly. If the results are unsatisfactory, adjust your monitor's position, clock and clock phase manually.

# Reset

This function allows you to return to the good picture reproduction programmed at the factory and cannot be changed.

# Wxga

To see a normal picture, match the resolution of RGB mode and selection of Wxga(1280x768) mode.

- 5. Press the **OK** button to store it for the PC monitor picture.
  - The display **Stored** appears.
- 6. Press the **MENU** button to return to PC mode.
