Before using the product, read the contents of this user's manual carefully and use this product safely.

- The screens shown in this manual may differ with the actual screens of the product.
- The design and specification of this product may change without prior notification for product improvement.
- When transferring the vehicle to another individual, include this user's manual so that the next driver can continue its use.

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Start

Name of Each Component

Head unit

Head unit functions may vary for each model.

POWER PUSH or PWR / Volume knob

- Press to turn the power on.
- When power is on, press and hold to turn power off.
- When power is on, press to turn Audio off.
- Turn left/right to control volume.

HOME button (AV only)

- Press to go to the home screen.

PHONE button (AV only)

- Press to go to the phone screen.

MAP button (AVN only)

- Press to display the map screen of the current location.

NAV button (AVN only)

- Press to move to the Navigation menu screen.

b (Reset hole)

- Press with a thin object to reset the unit when it does not operate normally.

☆ (Custom button)

- Press to move to the [Custom button] menu. After setting a desired function, press to use the desired function.

< SEEK/TRACK > (Λ / V) button

When it is pressed for a short time,

- Radio mode: Plays previous/next available frequency or station.
- Media mode: Plays previous/next file.

When it is pressed and held

- Radio mode: Plays previous/next available frequency or station.
- Media mode : Rewinds or fast forwards the file.

RADIO button

- Press to go to the radio screen.

MEDIA button

- Press to go to the available media.

SETUP button

- Press to go to the settings screen.

Tune/Enter knob

- In Radio mode, turn left/right to change the frequency or station.
- In Media mode, turn left/right to change file and press to select the desired file.

Steering Wheel Remote Control

Steering wheel remote control functions may vary for each model.

 / MODE button

- Each time this button is pressed, the Radio or Media mode is changed.
- If the media is not connected, it is changed in the order FM > AM > FM.
- When it is pressed and held, move to Advanced settings "Steering wheel MODE button".

^/V button

When it is pressed for a short time

- Radio mode: Plays previous/next Favourites.
- Media mode: Plays previous/next file.

When it is pressed and held

- AM mode: Plays previous/next available frequency or station
- Media mode: Rewinds or fast forwards the file.

 (Voice Recognition button)

- Press to switch to voice recognition mode.
- To cancel it, press and hold the button again.

 button

Press to operate Bluetooth hands-free function.

- Press to accept a call.
- Press to make a call from last calls.
- Press and hold for redialing.

** button**

- Press to end the phone call during a call.
- Press to reject the call in the incoming call screen.
- Press to end Voice memo recording.

** button**

- Increases or decreases the volume level.

** (Mute)**

- Press to mute the sound. (It will be paused in some media modes.)

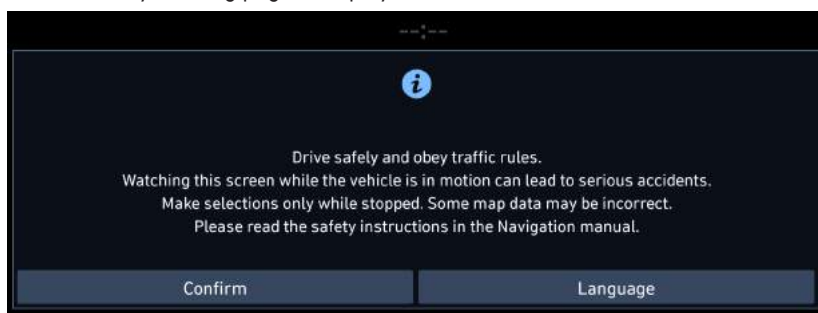
Basic operation

System ON/OFF

The image of this product may be different from the actual product.

Starting the system for the first time

1. Press the Engine Start button. Once the system is turned on, the booting process will start and the safety warning page is displayed.



2. Press [Confirm]. If you want to change the system language, press [Language].

Note

- You cannot operate the system while it is booting up. It may take some time for all of the features to be ready.
- The safety warning page is displayed every time the ignition is turned on. The displayed warnings are related to safety, please closely read and comply with the safety warnings.
- If there is no operation for 10 seconds in the safety warning screen, the system automatically switches to the last played mode.

Turning the system off

Press and hold Power button on the head unit.

To turn the system on again, press power button on the head unit.

Note

Pay attention to the volume setting when turning the system on. A sudden output of extreme volume upon turning the system on could lead to hearing impairment. Adjust the volume to a suitable levels before turning off the system or set the startup volume in sound Settings menu.

AV ON/OFF or Volume Adjustment

AV OFF

Press Power button on the head unit when the AV is ON.

AV ON

Press Power button on the head unit when the AV is OFF.

Adjusting the volume

Turn the Volume knob to control volume.

Note

When you turn the system off, the current volume level is automatically memorised.

Whenever you turn the system on, it operates at the memorised volume level if you do not set the startup volume in sound Sound settings menu.

Resetting the system

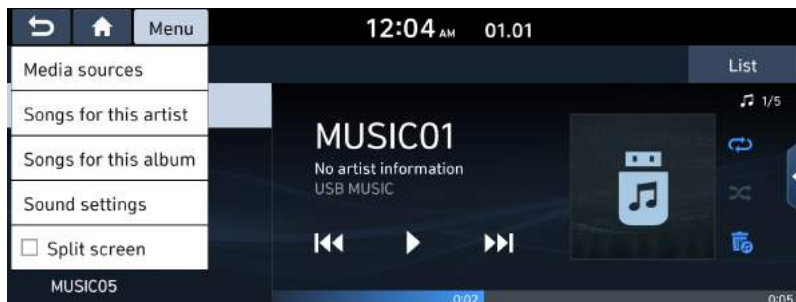
This feature is used to reset the system in the occurrence of an unforeseen error or problem. Press “RESET” hole. (The use of a clip or pin is recommended when resetting the system.)

General Operation of the Menu in available Mode

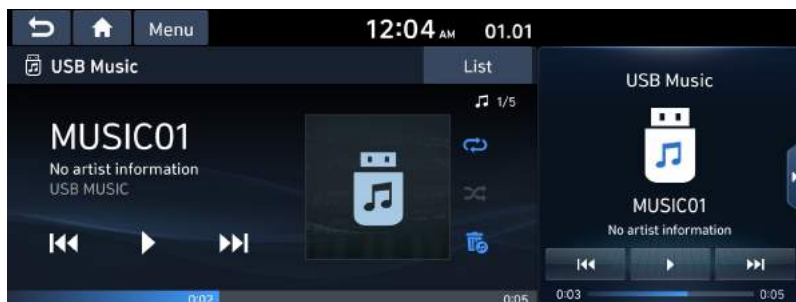
Split screen

This feature is used to set the item to be displayed on the right side of the screen by setting a checkmark on the menu drop-down.

1. Press [Menu] on the submenu screen.



2. Press [Split screen].

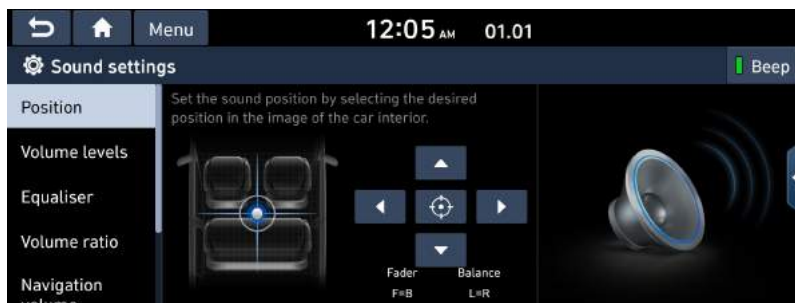


3. You can select the desired item by dragging downwards or upwards on the split screen.

Sound Settings

This menu is used to adjust the sound effects for the whole system.

1. Press [Sound Settings] on the pop-up menu of available mode.

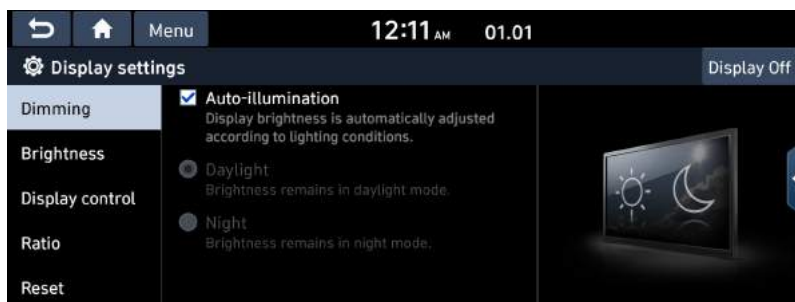

Display Settings

This menu is used to control the display settings for the whole system.

1. Press [Display Settings] on the pop-up menu of available mode.

HOME screen

Configuration for Home screen

The detailed menu in each layout can be adjusted by user.



1 Menu

- Editing the [Edit Home widgets] or [Edit Home icons].

2 Home widget

- You can edit the desired widget on the widget menu.
- Press the area to edit home widget.

3 All menus

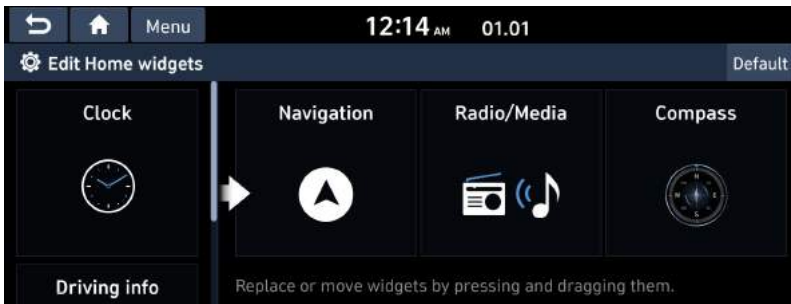
Scroll the Home screen sideways to move to all the items of the system menu.

- [Phone]: Operates bluetooth hands-free and audio function.
- [Android Auto]: Runs android auto function.
- [Favourites]: Moves to the Favourites menu.
- [Media]: Converts to the last played media mode.
- [Map]: Displays the map screen of the current position.
- [Voice memo]: Moves to the voice memo menu.

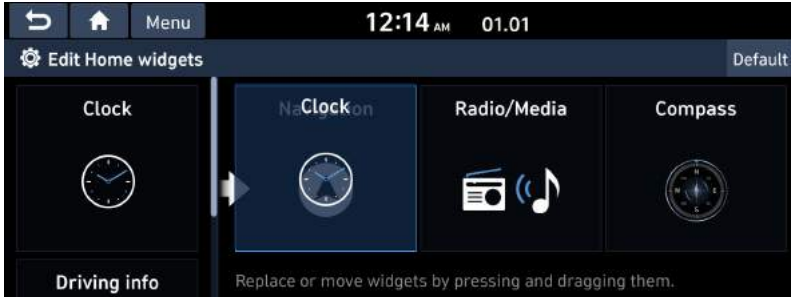
- [Apple CarPlay]: Runs Apple CarPlay function.
- [Radio]: Converts to the last played radio mode.
- [USB Video]: Converts to the last played USB video mode.
- [Navigation]: Moves to the Navigation menu.
- [Settings]: Moves to the settings menu.
- [Climate]: Displays the climate.

Editing Home widgets

1. Press [Menu] > [Edit Home widgets] on the Home screen.



2. Replace or move widgets by pressing and dragging them.



3. Press [↶] on the screen.

Note

- Press [Default] to reset all the Home widgets.
- If supported widgets are 2 or less, Edit Home Widget is not supported.

Basic operation of Home screen

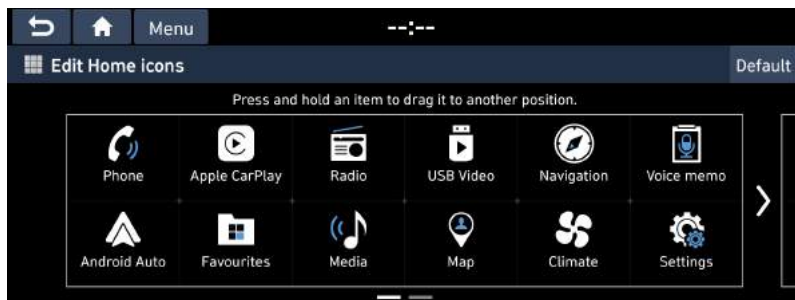
1. Press [] on the screen in any mode.



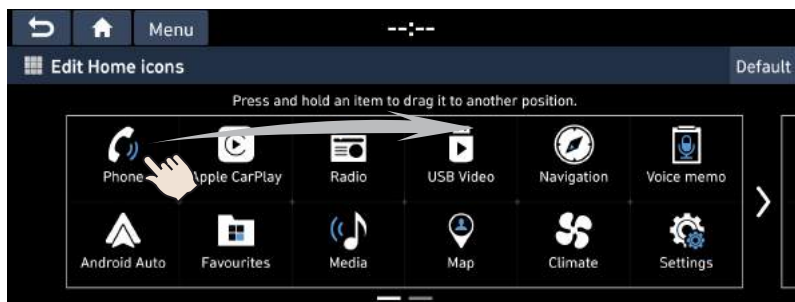
2. Select the desired menu on the Home screen.

Customizing HOME screen

1. Press and hold the desired menu icon on the All Menu screen. Or Press [Menu] > [Edit Home Icons].



2. Select the desired menu item from the list, then drag and drop it to a desired place.



3. Press [↶] on the screen.

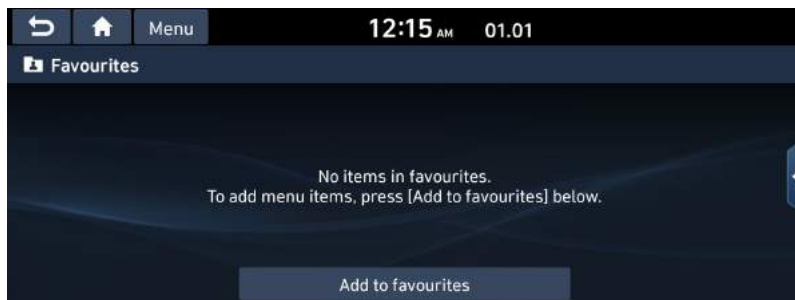

Adding your favourite

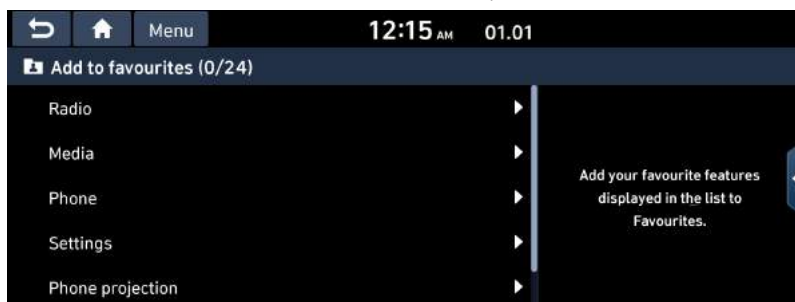
If your favorites menu items have been already saved in the Favorites menu, it can be easily accessed.

1. Press [Favourites] on the Home screen.

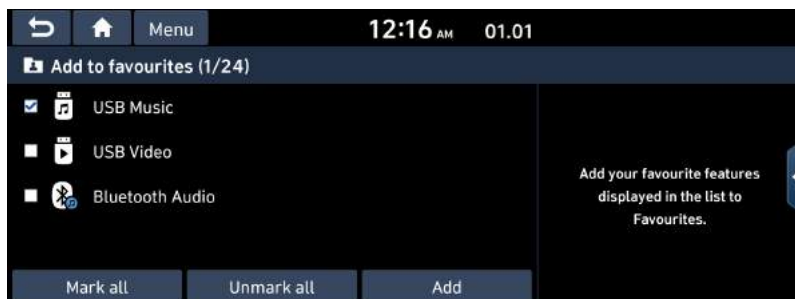


2. Press [Add to favourites].

3. Select one of the categories.



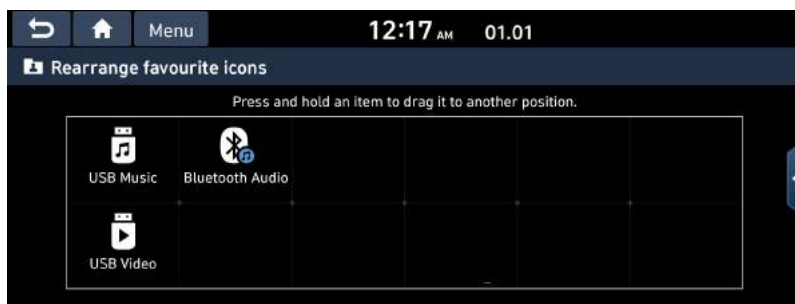
4. Press [Add] > [Yes].

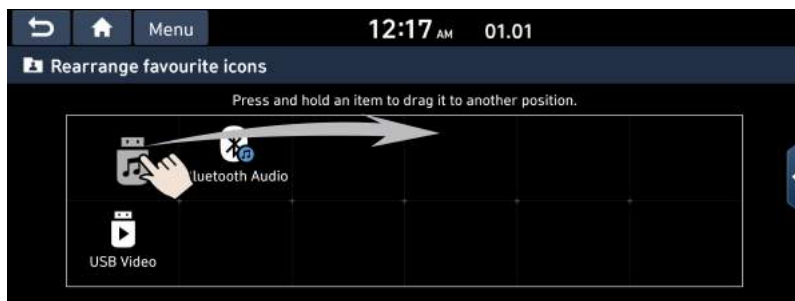

2. Press [Menu] > [Delete].



3. Select the desired items, then press [Delete] > [Yes].
 - [Mark all]: Marks all items.
 - [Unmark all]: Unmarks all items.

Navigation (If Equipped)

Getting started with navigation

Precautions for safe driving

Please observe and comply with local traffic rules and regulations.

- The route displayed for destination guidance is a reference and the route guidance will take you to the vicinity of your destination. The highlighted route is not always the shortest distance, the least congested, and in some case, might not be the fastest route.
- Road, name, POI and speed limit may not always been completely updated.
- The car position mark does not indicate your exact location. This system uses GNSS information, various sensors, and road map data to display the current position. However, errors in displaying your location may occur if the satellite is transmitting inaccurate signals or less than two satellite signals are received. Errors that occur in such conditions cannot be corrected.
- The position of the vehicle within the navigation may differ from your actual location depending on various reasons, including the satellite transmission state, vehicle state (driving location and conditions), etc. Additionally, the car position mark may differ from the actual position if the map data is different from the actual road landscape, such as changes due to the construction of new roads. If such differences occur, driving for a short period of time will automatically correct the position of the vehicle through map matching or GNSS information.

What is GNSS?

The GNSS (Global Navigation Satellite System) is a satellite-based navigation system made up of a network of 32 satellites placed into orbit by the Global Positioning System (GPS) of U.S.A, GLONASS of RUSSIA, etc.

GNSS works in any weather conditions, anywhere in the world, 24 hours a day.

There are no subscription fees or setup charges to use GNSS.

About satellite signals

Your unit must acquire satellite signals to operate. If you are indoors, near tall buildings or trees, or in a parking garage, the unit cannot acquire satellite signals.

Acquiring satellite signals

Before the unit can determine your current position and navigate a route, you must do the following steps:

1. Go outside to an area free from tall obstructions.
2. Turn on the unit. Acquiring satellite signals can take a few minutes.

Operating navigation screen

The navigation system displays various information on the map screen.

Map screen (Program interface when routing)

Press [MAP] or [NAV] > [] to access the map screen.



1 Sound

Sound menu opens by pressing this button.

2 Compass

Context menu opens by pressing this button. In this menu, switches the orientation of the map, the type of card and the skins. When driving, the compass always points to the north.

3 Information panel

A sign of the upcoming maneuver.

There are various turns, distance to the next maneuver in meters or kilometers, etc. on a gray background.

Click on the sign for more route options.

4 Speed limit and camera

In excess of the established speed, displays the speed limit on that road section.

5 Information panel

The estimated total time in a way, the total length of the route, time of arrival at the final point of the route.



6 Main menu opens by pressing this button.

7 Information panel

Shows the name of the street you are currently driving along.

8 Scale button

Zoom in/out.

9 Map view button

Changes the map view perspectives.

Press [] repeatedly to switch them.

10 Clock display

Displays the current time.

11 GPS

GPS/GLONASS connection icon. Press to check GPS information.

Map interface (Program interface when routing)

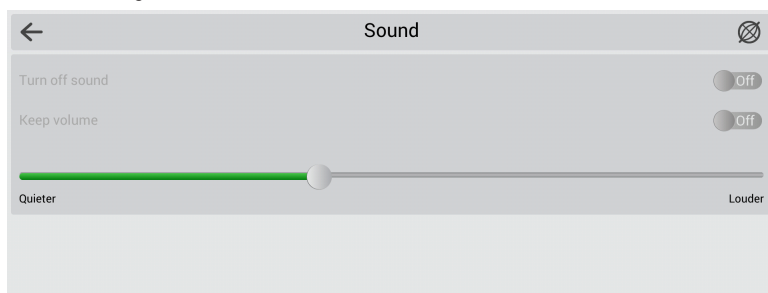
1. In the main menu, press [Find] > [History].
2. Press [] of the desired item.



- [Go!]: Marks the current position on the map as the end of the route.
- [Set start]: Mark becomes the start point on the route. You should turn off your GPS/GLONASS receiver.
- [Route through]: Mark becomes the middle point of the route.
- [Set finish]: Mark on the map becomes the end of the route. And previous end of the route becomes the middle point.

Navigation volume

1. Press  on the map screen.
2. Press [Settings].



3. Set the guidance volume of navigation.

Scrolling the map screen

Drag and drop the map screen to the desired direction, then touch the desired point. Information on the point is displayed on the screen. It can be used as an electronic map.



1 Cursor

Shows the mark menu.

2 Save WP

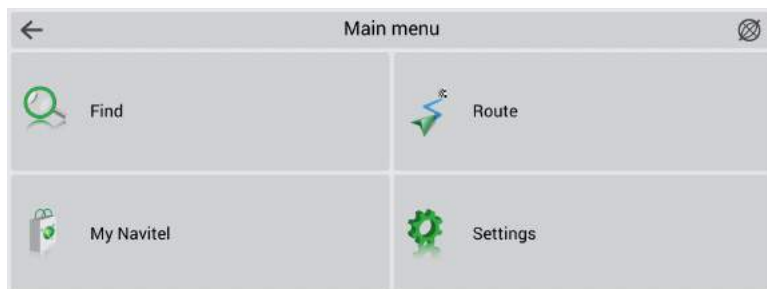
Saves current Way Point.

3 Mark on the map

You can set the mark by tapping on the map. You can save this mark as a waypoint, add it to the route or see object's characteristics the mark was set on.

Main menu

1. Press [NAV] on the head unit or press  on the map screen.



2. Press the desired option.
 - [Find]: This menu implements the search function on various representation of the objects on the map.
 - [Route]: This menu is intended for management functions of the route waypoints.
 - [My Navitel]: In this menu, all currently available Navitel maps are together as well as the program description. The menu “Navitel Navigator” is made for viewing information about the application: version, serial number, license key, copyright, etc.
 - [Settings]: This menu contains some functions and program main settings. Colour and type of some icons may depend on function status and current Skin-file.

Menu operation

All the menus in the navigation system have the following features at the top of the screen.



- : Moves to the previous screen.
- : Moves to the map screen.
- : Agrees to the desired item.
- : Edits the desired item.

Searching for destination

Find

This menu implements the search function on various representation of the objects on the map.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find].



2. Tap on one of the search methods.

By Address

You can find the destination by searching for an address.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [By Address].

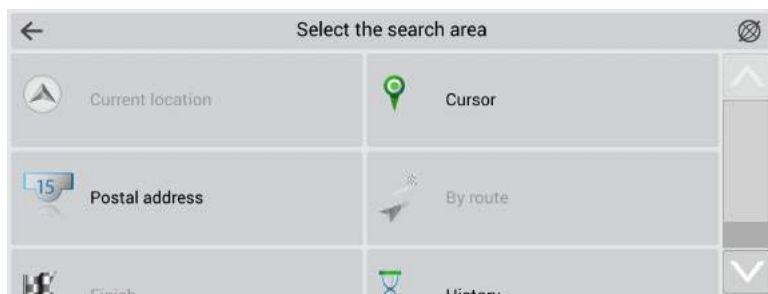


2. Select the name of the country, city/ZIP, street, building or crossing corresponding to the desired destination, then press [Result].
3. Press [GO!].
4. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

Nearest Places

Search nearest to the specified point objects is also performed in a several steps. In addition to object types here is also a history of the nearest objects search.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [Nearest Places].



2. Tap on one of the search methods.
 - [Current location]: Searches the nearest to your current location.
 - [Cursor]: Searches the nearest to your current cursor location.
 - [Postal address]: Searches the nearest to the specified address.
 - [By route]: Searches for the points those are near to the route.
 - [Finish]: Searches for the nearest to the end of the route point objects.
 - [History]: One of the objects from the general searching history can be chosen as a reference point.

Searching for Nearest Places by [Current location], [Cursor], [By route] or [Finish]

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [Nearest Places] > [Current location], [Cursor], [By route] or [Finish].



2. Select one of the categories
3. Select one of the subcategories.
3. Press the preferred Nearest Places.
4. Press [GO!].
5. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

Searching for Nearest Places by [Postal address]

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [Nearest Places] > [Postal address].
2. Follow steps 2-4 of the "By Address".

Waypoints

Waypoints are marked on the map with a special icon and can be used for quick route planning.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [Waypoints].



2. Press [Home] or [Work].
 - [Add waypoint]: This function is that the coordinates of your current position will be assigned to the waypoint created this way.
 - [Export]: This function is used to export the address book to save a file.
 - [Import]: This function is used to import the address book saved in a file.
3. Select the desired position through the destination search function.
4. Press [GO!].
5. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

History

All objects ever found using any types of search. In this type of search objects are sorted by date of search, later found objects are at the top. You can remove items from this list, if you are sure, that you will no longer use them.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [History].



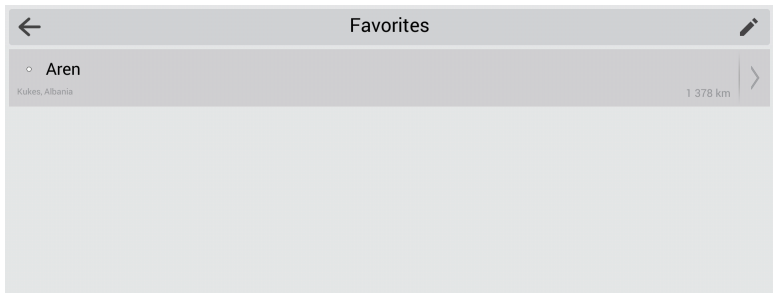
- Press [✏️] > [❌] > [Delete] to delete the desired item.
2. Press the preferred item from the list.
 3. Press [GO!].
 4. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

Favorites

Find the most frequently used in search objects.

As opposed to search “History”, objects in this search are sorted by the number of uses, and not by the date of last use.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [Favorites].

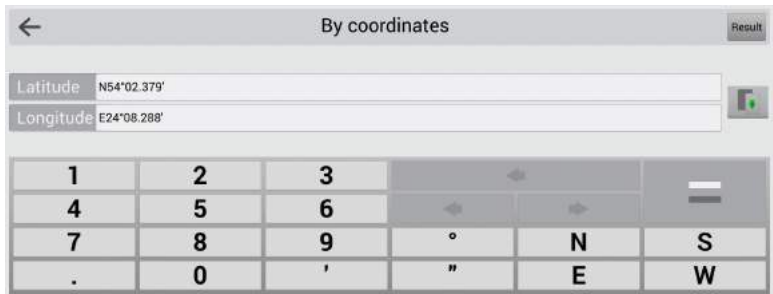


- Press [] > [] > [Delete] to delete the desired item.
2. Press the preferred item from the list.
 3. Press [GO!].
 4. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

By coordinates

You can find a destination by entering the coordinates of latitude and longitude.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [By coordinates].



2. Enter the coordinates and press [Result].
3. Press [GO!].
4. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

On the map

You can find a point manually on the map.

1. Press [NAV] > [Find] > [On the map].



2. Press the desired map area.
3. Press [GO!].
4. After selecting a desired route, press [GO!].

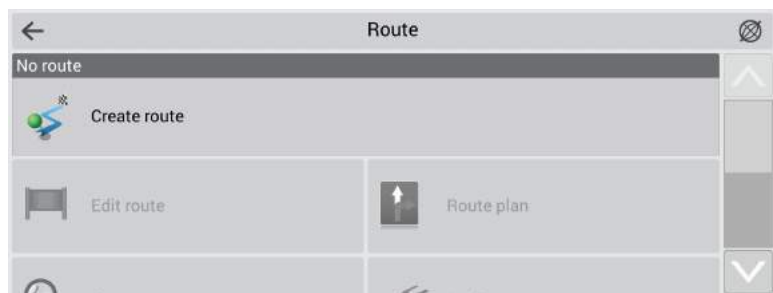
Using the route menu

Route

This section of the guide contains information on how to create or edit routes in the program and explains other possibilities of working with routes.

Create route

To plan a route from your current position up to a specific destination point, follow the steps.
Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Create route].



Edit route

This function edits the selected route.

Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Edit route].

Route plan

The route screen containing the detailed information about all the maneuvers along the road opens.

Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Route plan].

Show route

This function adjusts the map scale so that the entire route is visible on the map.

Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Show route].

Avoid

The function plans a new route saving all the route through points.

Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Avoid].

Demo route

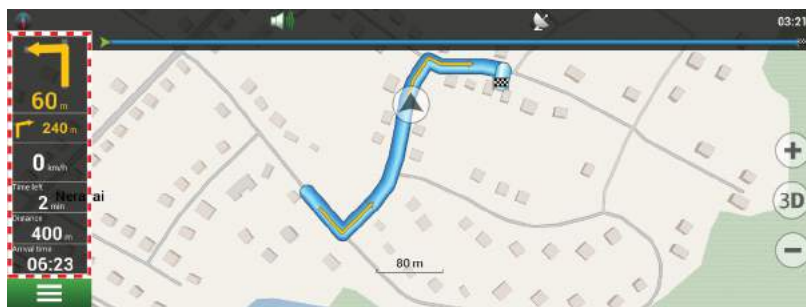
This function begins the simulation movement along the route you have planned.

Press [NAV] > [Route] > [Demo route].

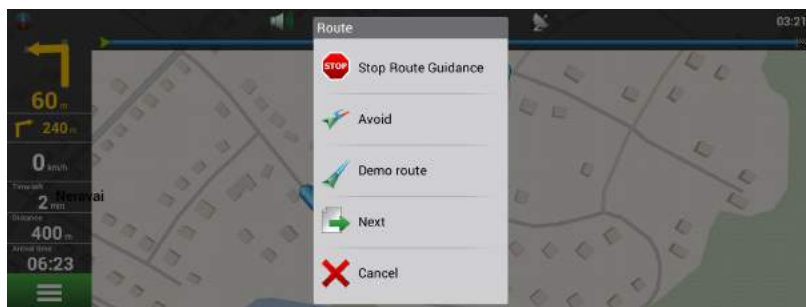
Another method for editing route

To use another method for editing route, follow the steps.

1. On the navigation screen, press the information panel.



2. In the newly opened dialog box, select the appropriate option.

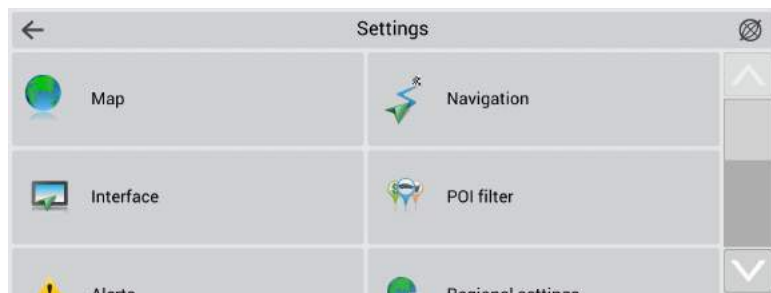


- [Stop Route Guidance]: It'll delete the route. If [Demo route] is active, you will see [Stop demo] instead.
- [Avoid]: Plans a new route saving all the route through points.
- [Demo route]: Begins the simulation movement along the route you have planned.
- [Go Next Via Point]: Deletes the next route point.
- [Show route]: Adjusts the map scale so that the entire route is visible on the map.
- [Settings]: Displays of the navigation screen.
- [Cancel]: Return to the map screen.

Setting for navigation

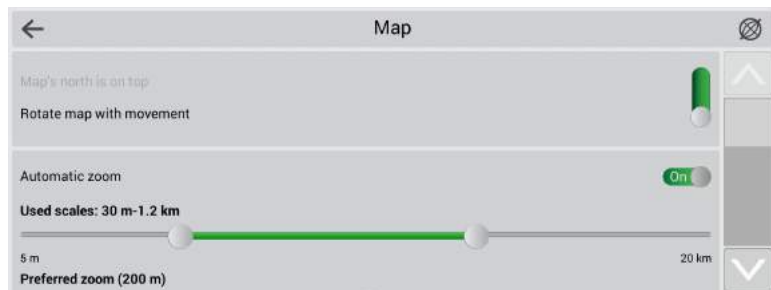
Settings

“Settings” menu contains some functions and program main settings. Color and type of some icons may depend on function status and current Skin-file. Also icon’s color on the “Map” page depends on the interface settings.



Map

This menu contains various map view settings. Most of these settings manage the quality of objects on the map.



Top of the map

- [Map's north is on top]: The top of the map always will focus on the north
- [Rotate map with movement]: Top of the map will point on any part of the world depending on moving direction.

Automatic zoom

In this settings parameters of scale are set while driving depending on the environment and the speed.

- [Used scales]: Select the scale interval. It will be used in automatic scaling.
- [Preferred zoom]: Select the operating mode of automatic scaling: higher or lower detalization.

Visual effects

Visual effects improve the map display, but time of its rendering may increase.

Following visual effects are available: [Smooth motion], [Smooth zoom].

Draw models from

Enables setting of the minimum map scale at which the 3D models must be displayed.

Map tilt

This menu item is used to set the degree of inclination of the maps while viewing it in panoramic mode. To change the setting, move the switch to the left (minimum slope) or right (maximum slope).

Reset position

If the map is moved while navigating, this function returns you to the current location after specified amount of time. Following values are available: 5 seconds, 10 seconds, 15 seconds, 20 seconds and "Never" (Off).

Draw passed route

Displays the passed part of the route on the map in the form of a transparent line.

Show two following maneuvers

Displays 2 following maneuvers instead of only one on the upcoming maneuver sign.

Navigation

The navigation system and a route settings.



- [Route]: Choose routing method: “Route on roads” or “Route on direct line”

Avoid

Choose items you want to avoid when routing: «Toll roads», «Unpaved roads», «Ferry connections».

Guidance prompt

Set the time when system should inform you about the upcoming manoeuvre. The button can be set in the range from «More distance» (the maximum time) to «Less distance» (minimum time).

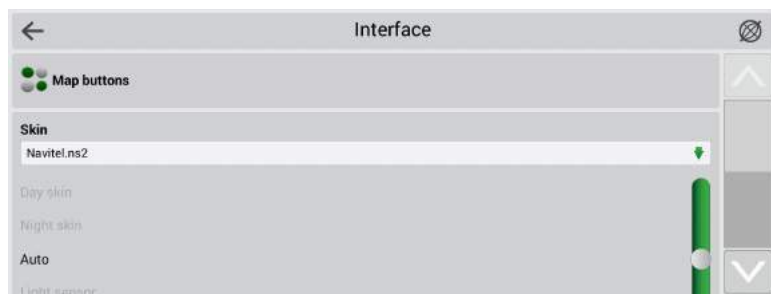
Rerouting

Determine circumstances when the program should try to automatically re-plan the created route. Navitel Navigator provides 2 possible conditions for route recalculation:

- When off-route Here you can set the distance of deviation from the current route, at which the program must start replanning the active route from the current position.

Interface

Interface settings menu will allow you to use the «Map» page and all of its elements effectively.



Map buttons

You can set the display of each button.

Near each icon placed a symbol, that can be different colors depending on the setting of the button. Green color means that the button will be always displayed. Grey color means that the button will not be displayed. Half painted in green color means, that under certain conditions button will not be displayed on the map page. By clicking on the symbol you may disable or enable the display buttons on the map page.

In the left part of each field is a setting button. If you click on it the advanced settings menu will be opened, the item is displayed depending on the current function status. Click on the icon to turn on/off the display of the buttons.

Skin

Select a suitable interface color setting from several color themes available in the program: [Day skin], [Night skin], [Auto], [Light sensor].

- [Auto]: This skin switches between the day and night skins according to the current time. The night skin will also activate when entering a tunnel, if it is present on the map.
- [Light sensor]: This sensor will switch the skin when detecting level of light that differs from the current lighting.

Hide buttons

Determines how long after the last user activity will be lost of the button [Cursor] and [Save], as well as button [Menu] and [Compass], [GPS], etc.

Hide menu

Determines how long after last activity Navitel Navigator switches to the Map page.

Show scroll bar

In this menu item you can turn on/off the display of scroll bars on the right side of the screen.

POI filter

Setting up the display of infrastructure objects on the map.

In the left part of each group and subgroup is the symbol that indicates whether the group displays or not. If the symbol is painted in green color- this means that the group is enabled, half-painted in green some of its subgroups are included, and some not. In case, if the group is turned off completely, the symbol will be grey. By clicking on this symbol, you can enable/disable the display on the map all of the icons of the corresponding group.



In the right part of each group is a setup button. By clicking on it displays page with additional settings:

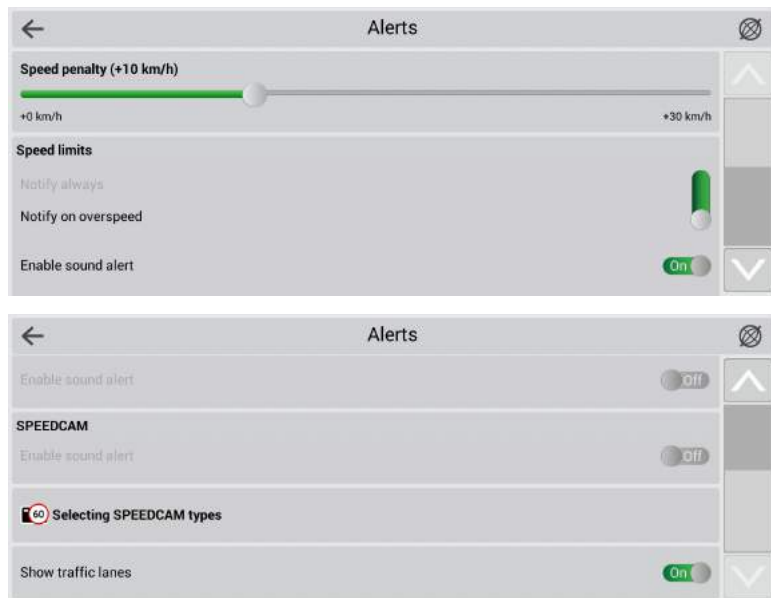


- [Turn off all types]: Turn off the display of all components of the given group/subgroup.
- [Seen on scales]: Lower and upper limits of the scale. You can set icons displaying of this group on the map;
- [Labels seen on scales]: Noting the subitem "Show POI names" you can select the maximum zoom, which will be displaying not only the icons of the group, but also the name of each icon;
- [Restore defaults]: Back to the standard (default) values.

With the help of first group "All types" settings you can set all the icons of the POI. This filter works as the limiter. For example, using it you can turn off the display of icon names. But to display all names it is necessary to install the appropriate mark in the settings of each group.

Alerts

The sound alert and speed camera settings.



Speed limits

Speed limits alert when over speed on specific road section.

- [Enable sound alerts]: When you switch the sound alert on, you can select the sound alert type. The sound alert is ready to alert you with special signals or with a voice.

Speed cams

The camera will warn you about the radar, dangerous intersections, speed bumps and pedestrian crossings.

- [Enable sound alerts]: When you switch the sound alert on, you can select the sound alert type. The sound alert is ready to alert you with special signals or with a voice.

Selecting SPEEDCAM types

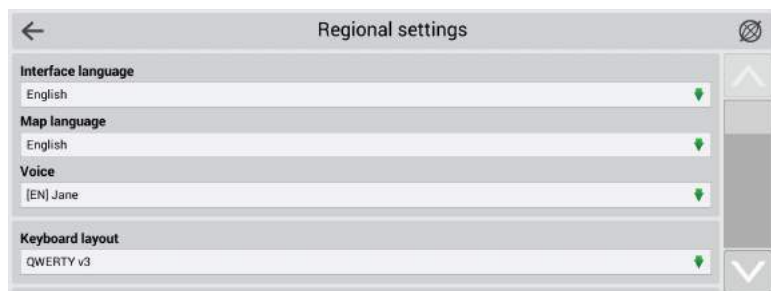
Select the SPEEDCAM objects of which you would like to be alerted by the program.

Traffic lanes

«Show traffic lanes»: sets up the display of traffic lanes, with information about maneuvers at the next intersection.

Regional settings

On page «Regional settings» user can select the language of the program interface, the voice sound (audio), keyboard layout, as well as the units of measurement.



Interface language

Select the program interface language.

Map language

Select the language of the map. The default language is set as the program interface language. In case, if the card does not support this language, national language will be used.

Voice

The voice messages settings, using which the program informs you about different events.

You can change the voice package, clicking on the green arrow in the right part of the field and choosing a different package from the list that appears.

Keyboard

This menu is intended for setting the keyboard layout and selection of supported languages when typing text.

- [Keyboard layout]: Type of keyboard layout, that appears on the display when you click on the text input window.
- [Keyboard languages]: There is a button switching between languages when you click on that will switch the languages available on the keyboard. Check the settings of those languages, which will be included in this sequence.

Measurement units

Select the units of measurement of [Length, speed], [Coordinates], [Address format], [Azimuth], [Elevation/altitude, depth], [Area].

Click on the arrow next to the field to open a list of possible options.

System

Setting up General program functions.



Satellites

[Autodetect settings]: Automatically detect the settings of the program.

GPS On/Off

Turns the GPS receiver on and off.

Time

Menu allows you to setup the time in the program «Navitel Navigator».

- [Update time zone automatically]: If this function is switched on, the time zone will update automatically.

Sound

This menu allows to set the sound in Navitel.

- [Turn off sound]: This function is intended for switching off the sound of the program;
- [Keep volume]: When this function is switched on the volume level in the program will comply with the system settings. Otherwise, the speaker volume can be set independently.

Reset settings

The function is intended to return all system settings to the default values. After choosing this item the program will automatically restart.

Copyrights

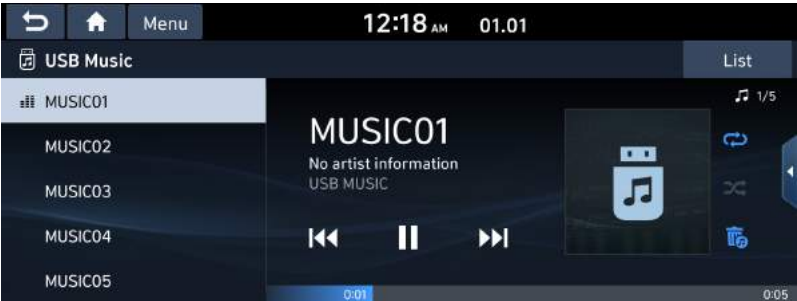
Press to check the copyrights.

Media

Playing USB

Playing USB Music

You can play music files saved in a USB memory device.
Connect an USB device to the USB port. Playback will start automatically.



 Note

- To play USB Music while a different source is playing, press [MEDIA] > [USB Music].
- Press [Menu] > [Songs for this artist] or [Songs for this album] to move to the list menu screen.

Pause

You can pause the playing file.
Press [||] on screen.
Press [▶] on screen to play it again.

Skip

You can play the previous or next file.

Position	Description
Screen	• Press [◀◀ / ▶▶]. • Pressing [◀◀] after 3 seconds of playback time plays the current file from the beginning.

Search

You can rewind/fast forward to a specific point of a file.

Position	Description
Screen	Press and hold [⏮ / ⏭] and then release at the point you want.

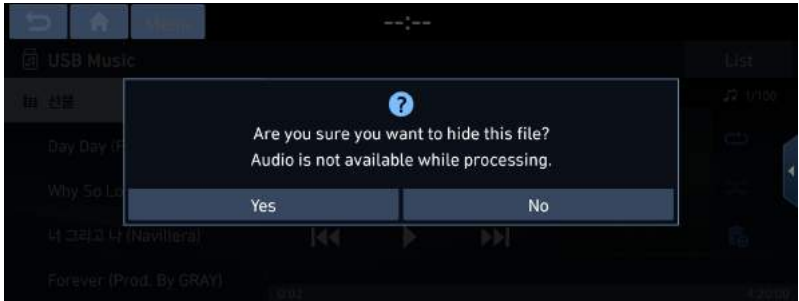

When you drag or touch the desired part on the progress bar, the music of the selected part plays.

Hide current file

You can hide the current playing file in USB.

1. Press [🗑].



2. Press [Yes].

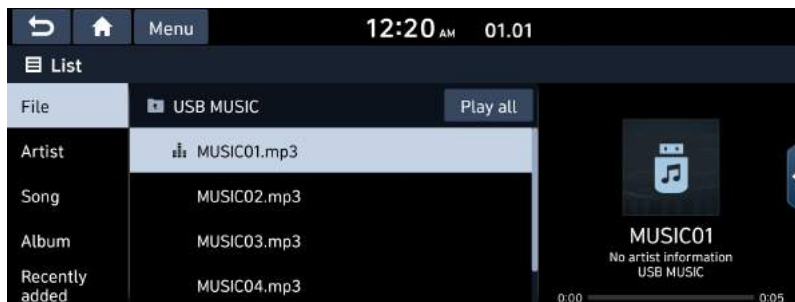
! Note

- Audio is not available while processing.
- Hidden files are stored in the Hide folder and it can be checked on your PC.

List

You can play the desired file by searching for the file list of the USB Menu.

1. Press [List].



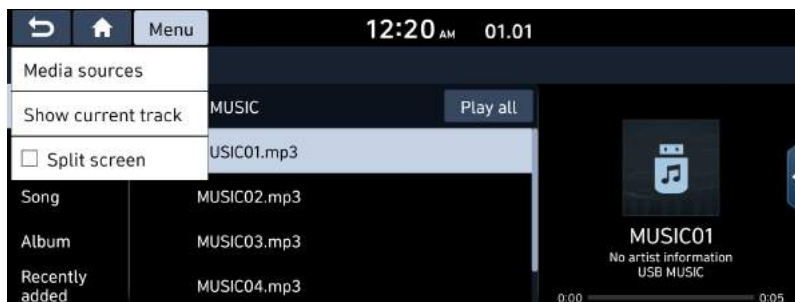
2. Press the desired file after searching for a category.
The category can be sorted by [File], [Artist], [Song], [Album] or [Recently added].

! Note

- Press [] to move to an upper folder.
- If you want to play the entire file in the list, press [Play all].

Using the list menu

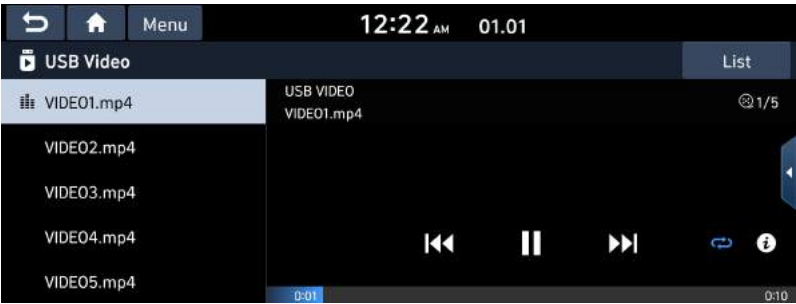
1. Press [Menu] on the list screen.



2. Press [Show current track].
The screen moves to the file list currently playing.

Playing USB Video

You can play video files saved in a USB memory device.
Connect a USB device to the USB port and playback starts automatically.



Note

- To play USB Video while a different source is playing, press [MEDIA] > [USB Video].

- If Bluetooth is disconnected while playing Bluetooth audio, the audio stream will be interrupted.
- The audio streaming function may not be supported in some mobile phones. Only one function can be used at a time between the Bluetooth hands-free or Bluetooth audio function. For example, if you convert to the Bluetooth hands-free while playing Bluetooth audio, the music will be discontinued.
- Playing music from the car is not possible when there are no music files saved in the mobile phone.

RDS PS NAME, etc.), which might lead you to believe a problem exists with your radio. The following conditions are normal and do not indicate radio trouble.

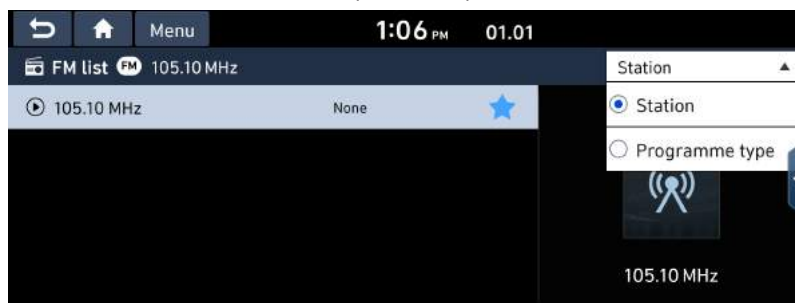

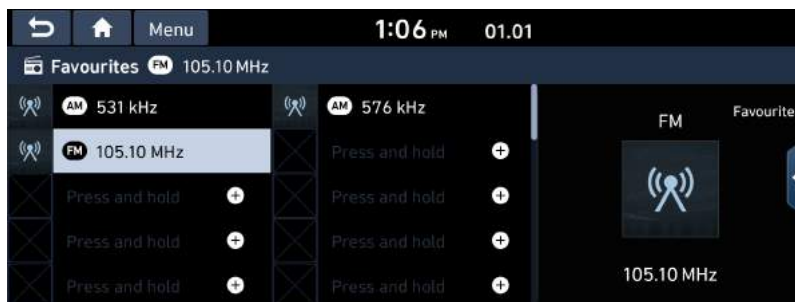

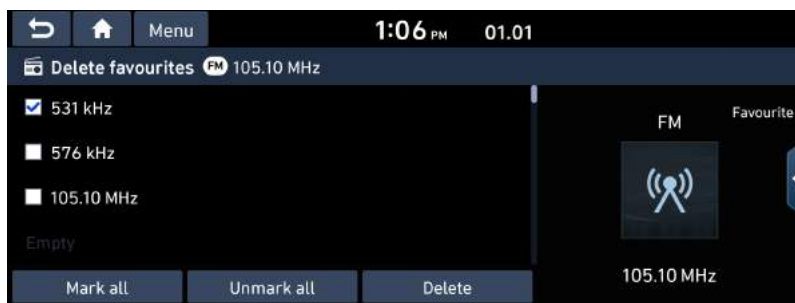

Bluetooth® Wireless Technology

What is Bluetooth Wireless Technology?

- Bluetooth Wireless Technology refers to a short-distance wireless networking technology which uses a 2.45GHz frequency to connect various devices within a certain distance.
- Supported within PCs, external devices, Bluetooth phones, PDAs, various electronic devices, and automotive environments, Bluetooth Wireless Technology to be transmitted at high speeds without having to use a connector cable.
- Bluetooth Hands-free refers to a device which allows the user to conveniently make phone calls with Bluetooth mobile phones through the system.
- The Bluetooth Hands-free feature may not be supported in some mobile phones.

Precautions for Safe Driving

- Bluetooth is a feature that enables drivers to use handsfree while driving. Connecting the head unit with a Bluetooth phone allows the user to conveniently make calls, receive calls, and manage the phone book. Before using Bluetooth Wireless Technology, carefully read the contents of this user's manual.
- Excessive use or operations while driving may lead to negligent driving practices and be the cause of accidents. Do not operate the device excessively while driving.
- Viewing the screen for prolonged periods of time is dangerous and may lead to accidents. When driving, view the screen only for short periods of time.

Cautions upon Connecting Bluetooth Phone

- Before connecting the head unit with the mobile phone, check to see that the mobile phone supports Bluetooth features.
- If you do not want automatic connection with your Bluetooth device, turn the Bluetooth feature off of the Bluetooth device.
- Park the vehicle when pairing the head unit with the mobile phone.
- Some Bluetooth features may occasionally not operate properly depending on the firmware version of your mobile phone. If such features can be operated after receiving a S/W upgrade from your mobile phone manufacturer, unpair all devices and pair again before use.

Pairing and connecting the unit and a Bluetooth phone

To use the Bluetooth feature, make sure the Bluetooth on your phone is turned on. Refer to your phone's user guide.

Using Rear Camera (If Equipped)

About Rear Camera

Turning on the rear camera

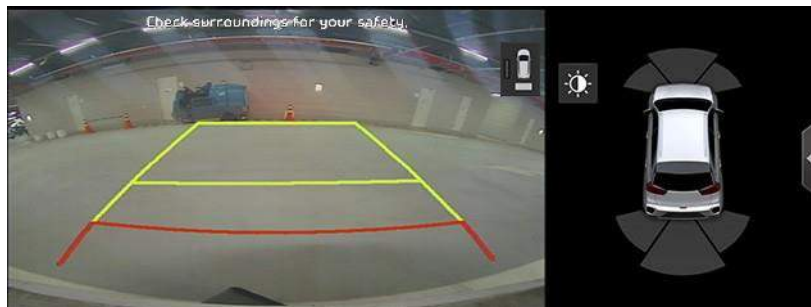

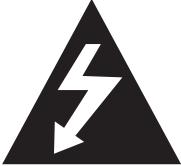

Problem: When the power is turned on, the corners of the screen are dark.

Possible Cause:

- The display appearing somewhat dark after prolonged periods of use is normal with LCD panels. It is not a malfunction.
- If the screen is very dark, contact your nearest dealer for assistance.

Problem: Sound is working from only one speaker.

Possible Cause: Are the positions of Fader or Balance sound controls adjusted to only one side?

Problem: When turning power on, the most recent mode screen is not displayed.

Possible Cause:

- Within modes that play files by reading external sources, such as discs, USB, or Bluetooth® streaming mode, the most recently played mode screen prior to turning off power may not properly load.
- If there is no disc or the corresponding device is not connected, the mode operated prior to the most recent mode will operate.
