Product : Bluetooth LE ID Badge will be integrated in the user's manual to provide end-users with transmitter operating conditions for satisfying RF exposure compliance.

The appropriate information can be drawn from the test report no: *HA181049-RA* and the accompanying calculations:

According to KDB 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v06, the 1-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100MHz to 6GHz at test separation distances of 50mm are determined by:

$$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW})/(\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \times [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}] \leq 3.0 \text{ for 1-g SAR, where}$$

min. test separation distance: 5 mm

Frequency: 2.480 GHz

$$(0.5358 \text{ mW}/5\text{mm}) \times \sqrt{2.480 \text{ GHz}} = 0.168756 < 3$$

Result of Calculation:

The result of calculation is far below 3 . Therefore, SAR test is not required.
