According to KDB 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v06, the 1-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100MHz to 6GHz at test separation distances of 50mm are determined by:

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)/(min. test separation distance, mm)]\*[ $\sqrt{f(GHz)}$ ]  $\leq$  3.0 for 1-g SAR, where

min. test separation distance: 5 mm

Frequency: 2.480 GHz

 $(0.5358 \text{ mW/5mm}) \times \sqrt{2.480 \text{ GHz}} = 0.168756 < 3$ 

Result of Calculation:

The result of calculation is far below 3. Therefore, SAR test is not required.
