5. STANDALONE SAR TEST EXCLUSION CONSIDERATIONS

5.1. FCC

SAR test exclusion in accordance with KDB 447498.

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances \leq 50 mm are determined by:

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW) / (min. test separation distance, mm)]·[$\sqrt{f(GHz)}$] \leq 3.0, for 1-g SAR and \leq 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR, where

- f_(GHz) is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz
- Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation
- The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison

The test exclusions are applicable only when the minimum test separation distance is \leq 50 mm and for transmission frequencies between 100 MHz and 6 GHz. When the minimum test separation distance is < 5 mm, a distance of 5 mm is applied to determine SAR test exclusion.

Conclusion:

The computed value is < 3; therefore, BLE qualifies for Standalone SAR test exclusion.

The minimum antenna to user distance that will be encountered in normal use is 0mm. This results in an exemption limit of 4mW at 2450 MHz.

As the maximum output power is 0.394mW EIRP the DUT qualifies for SAR test exclusion.
