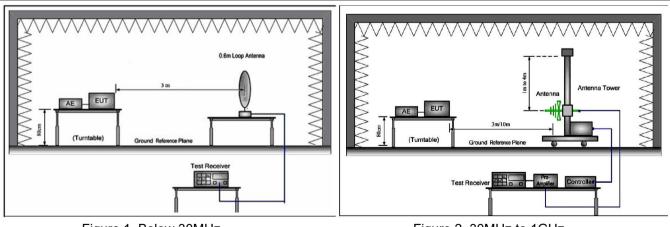
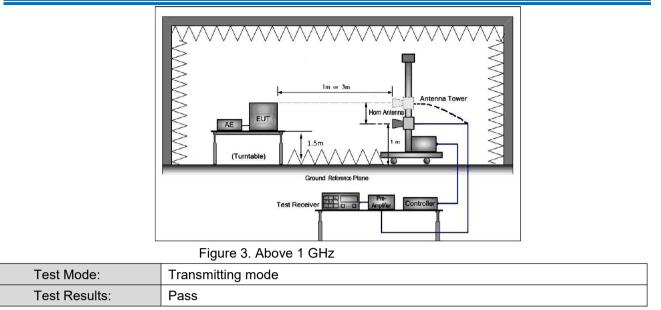


Figure 1. Below 30MHz

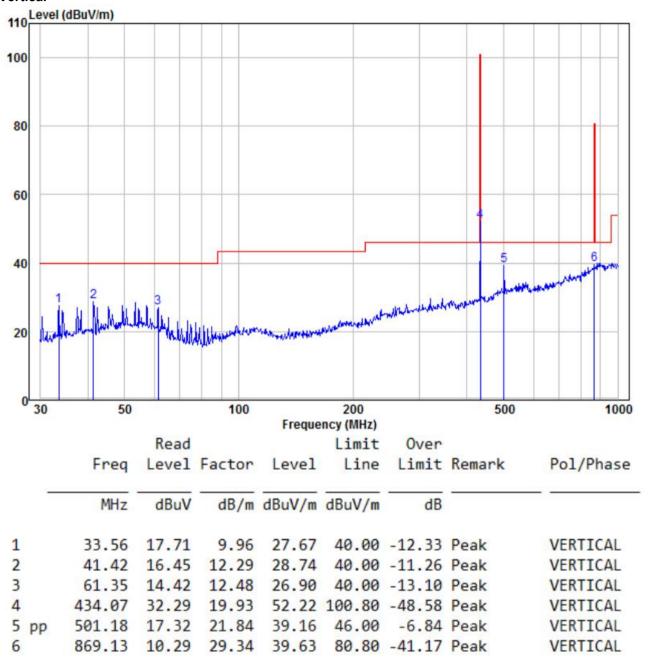

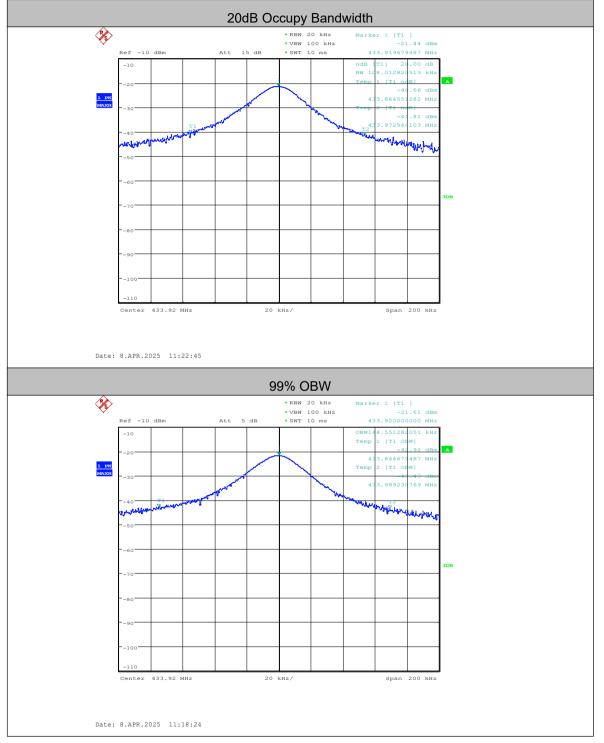

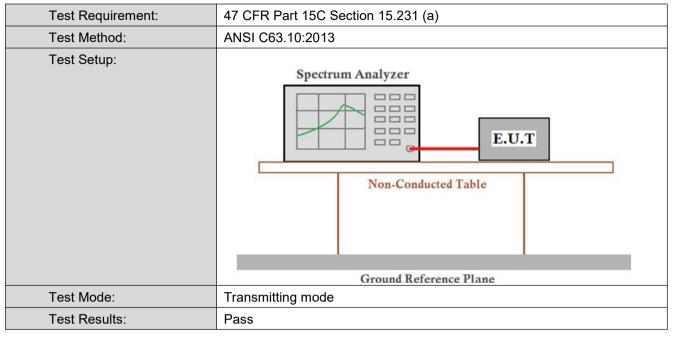

5.4 Dwell time



Requirements:

1. Regulation 15.231 (a) The provisions of this Section are restricted to periodic operation within the band 40.66~40.70 MHz and above 70 MHz.
