#### 4.0 CALCULATIONS:

The AVM-MC1-B utilizes a low power 2.4 GHz radio located approx 1 cm behind the front panel plastic. The following worst case emissions are based on a PPt (Peak Power Total) measurement of 12.8 dBm. And the worst case antenna gain on axis is found to be 3.64 dBi.

**Total radiated power at the Transmitter:** 

Power density at a distance of 10cm from the antenna is:

S = EIRP/
$$4\pi \cdot r^2$$

Where S is Power density in units of mW/cm<sup>2</sup> and EIRP is Equivalent Isotropic Radiated Power in units of mW and r is distance to the center of radiation of the antenna in units of cm

$$S = 44.1 \text{mW/} (4 \pi (10 \text{cm})^2) = .00351 \text{mW/cm}^2$$

### 5.0 CONCLUSION:

Based on the FCC Limits for Maximum Permissible Exposure (MPE) given in Table 1 of reference document (A) this device falls under the required limits.
