I have a few comments on this Application.

1. Please note that in accordance with CFR Part 2.925(a)(1) states that the "FCC Identifier consisting of the two elements in the exact order specified in §2.926...shall be preceded by the term FCC ID in capital letters on a single line, and shall be of a type size large enough to be legible without the aid of magnification." Please note that the FCC identifier as shown on the label is not on a single line as required by the rules. Please correct the FCC ID label to comply with this requirement. In lieu of placing the FCC ID on a line by itself, you may "block-in" the ID number (i.e. place a block around the ID to separate it from any other item).
2. Please note that the operational description states that there is no antenna connector. The internal photos of the device clearly show the card with antenna connectors, and it clearly shows the antenna cable with the matching connector. Perhaps you mean that there is not external antenna connector to connect an external antenna. Please clarify the operational description in this respect.
3. Please note that on page 9 of the SAR report the explanations for mode 5 and 6 are 'jumbled'. Please correct.
