### **3. Antenna Requirement**

#### **3.1 Standard and Limit**

According to FCC Part 15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section.

This product has an coil antenna, fulfill the requirement of this section.

### 4.1 Standard and Limit

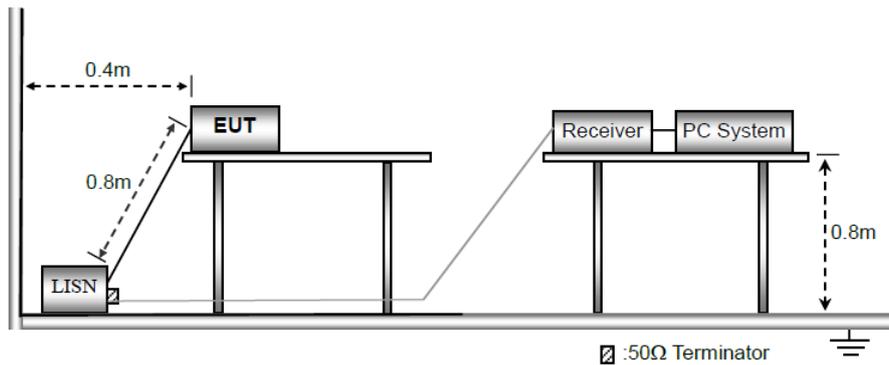
According to the rule FCC Part 15.207, Conducted emissions limit, the limit for a wireless device as below:

### 4.2 Test Procedure

Test is conducting under the description of ANSI C63.10 - 2013 section 6.2.



Test Setup Block Diagram

a) The EUT was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT has been programmed to continuously transmit during test. This operating condition was tested and used to collect the included data.

b) The following is the setting of the receiver

- Attenuation: 10dB
- Start Frequency: 0.15MHz
- Stop Frequency: 30MHz
- IF Bandwidth: 9kHz

c) The EUT was placed 0.8 meters from the horizontal ground plane with EUT being connected to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (LISN). All other support equipment powered from additional LISN(s). The LISN provide 50 Ohm/ 50uH of coupling impedance for the measuring instrument.

d) Interconnecting cables that hang closer than 40 cm to the ground plane shall be folded back and forth in the center forming a bundle 30 to 40 cm long.

e) I/O cables that are not connected to a peripheral shall be bundled in the center. The end of the cable may be terminated, if required, using the correct terminating impedance. The overall length shall not exceed 1 m.

f) LISN is at least 80 cm from nearest part of EUT chassis.

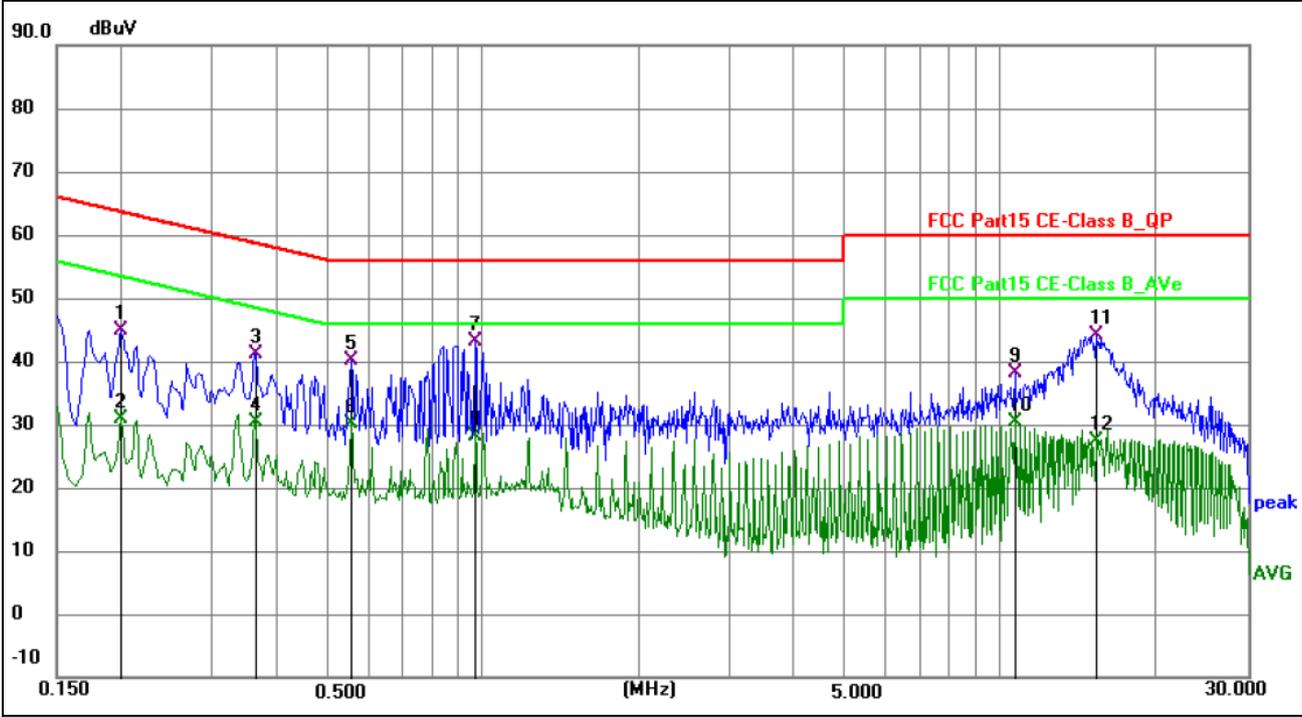

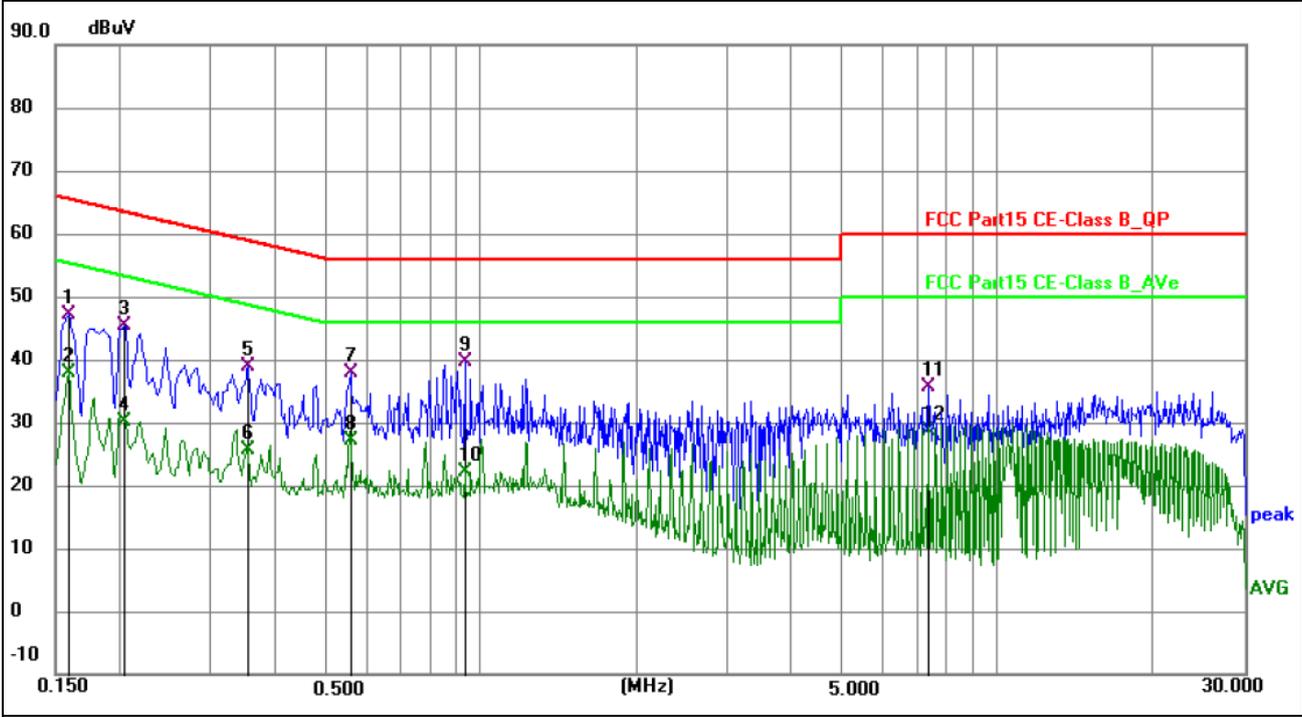

## 5. Radiated Emissions

### 5.1 Standard and Limit

According to the rule FCC Part 15.209, Radiated emission limit for a wireless device as below:

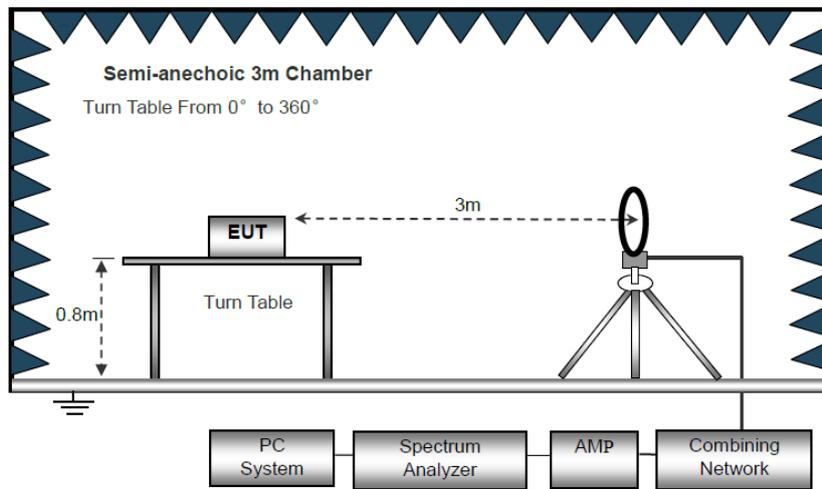

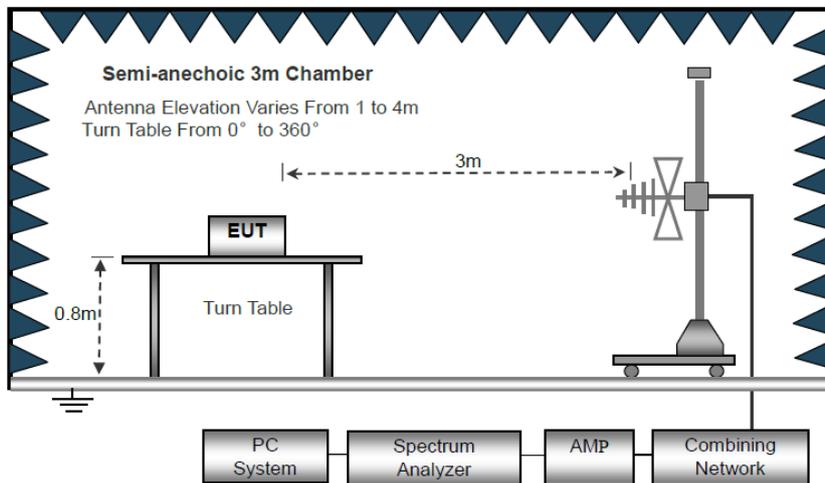

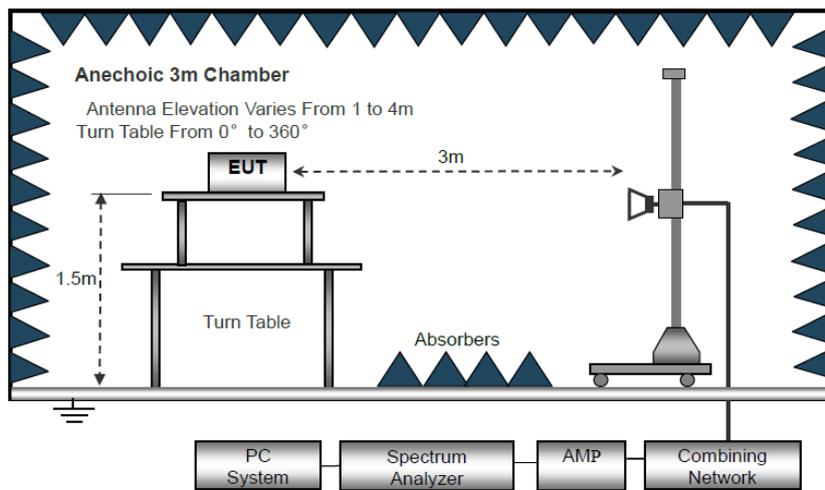

Block Diagram of Radiated Emission Above 1GHz

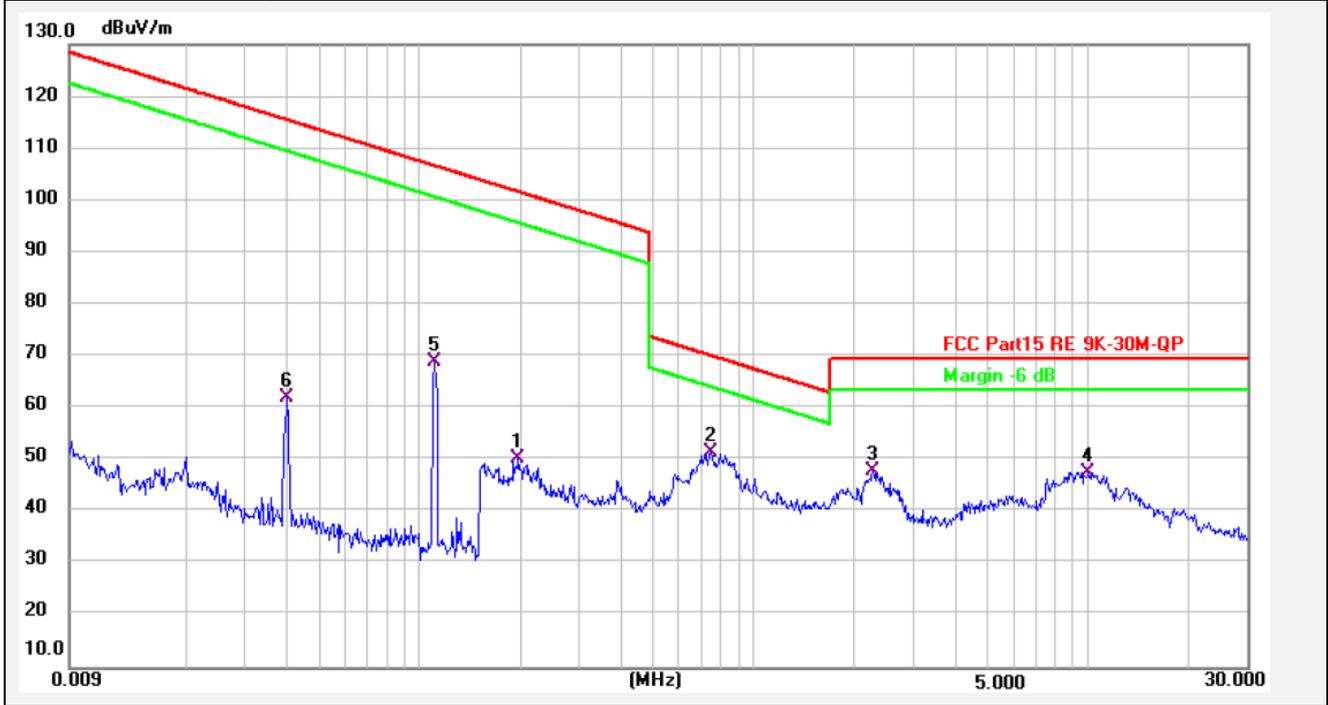
- a) The EUT is placed on a turntable, which is 0.8m above ground plane for test frequency range below 1GHz, and 1.5m above ground plane for test frequency range above 1GHz.
- b) EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna, which is varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emissions.
- c) Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:  
Span = wide enough to fully capture the emission being measured  
RBW = 1 MHz for  $f \geq 1\text{GHz}$ , 100 kHz for  $f < 1\text{GHz}$ , 10kHz for  $f < 30\text{MHz}$   
VBW  $\geq$  RBW, Sweep = auto  
Detector function = peak  
Trace = max hold
- d) Follow the guidelines in ANSI C63.4-2014 with respect to maximizing the emission by rotating the EUT, adjusting the measurement antenna height and polarization, etc. The peak reading of the emission, after being corrected by the antenna factor, cable loss, pre-amp gain, etc., is the peak field strength, submit this data. Each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical.
- e) The peak level, once corrected, must comply with the limit specified in Section 15.209. Set the RBW = 1MHz, VBW = 10Hz, Detector = PK for AV value, while maintaining all of the other instrument settings.
- f) For the actual test configuration, please refer to the related item - EUT test photos.

### **5.3 Test Data and Results**

Based on all mode tested data, the EUT complied with the FCC Part 15.209 standard limit for a wireless device, and with the worst case TM1 as below:

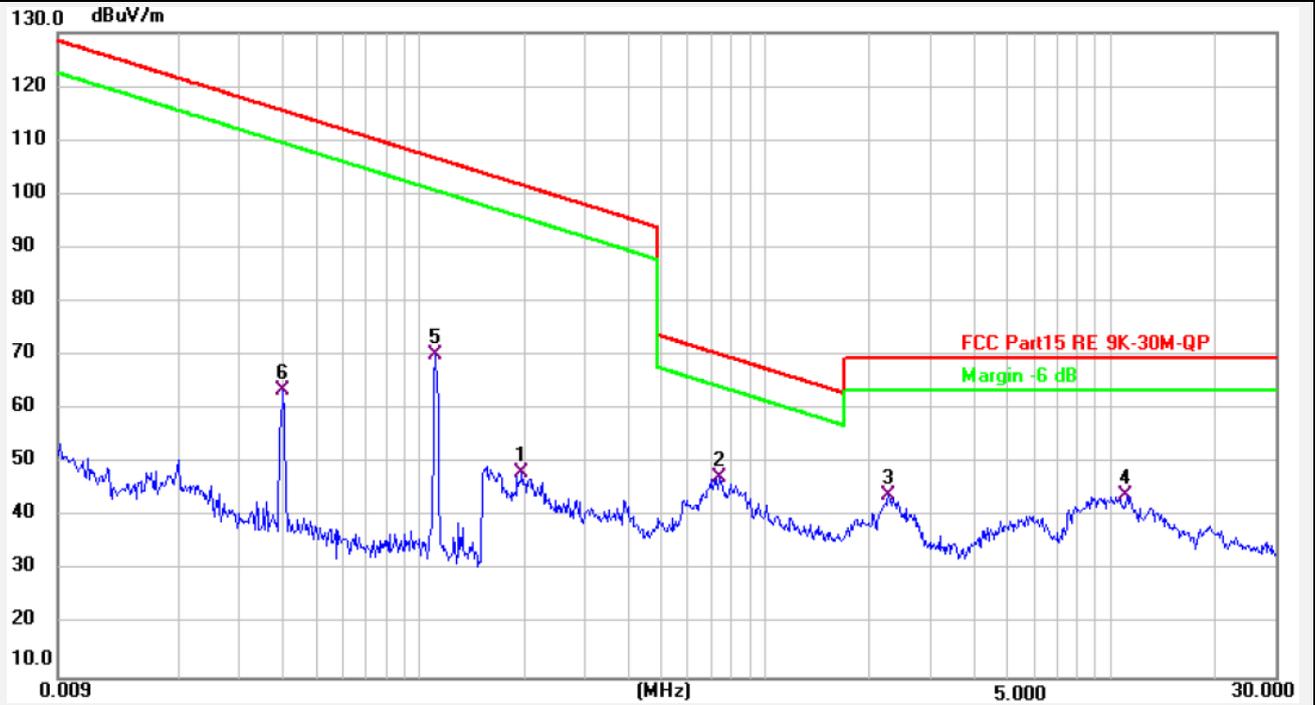

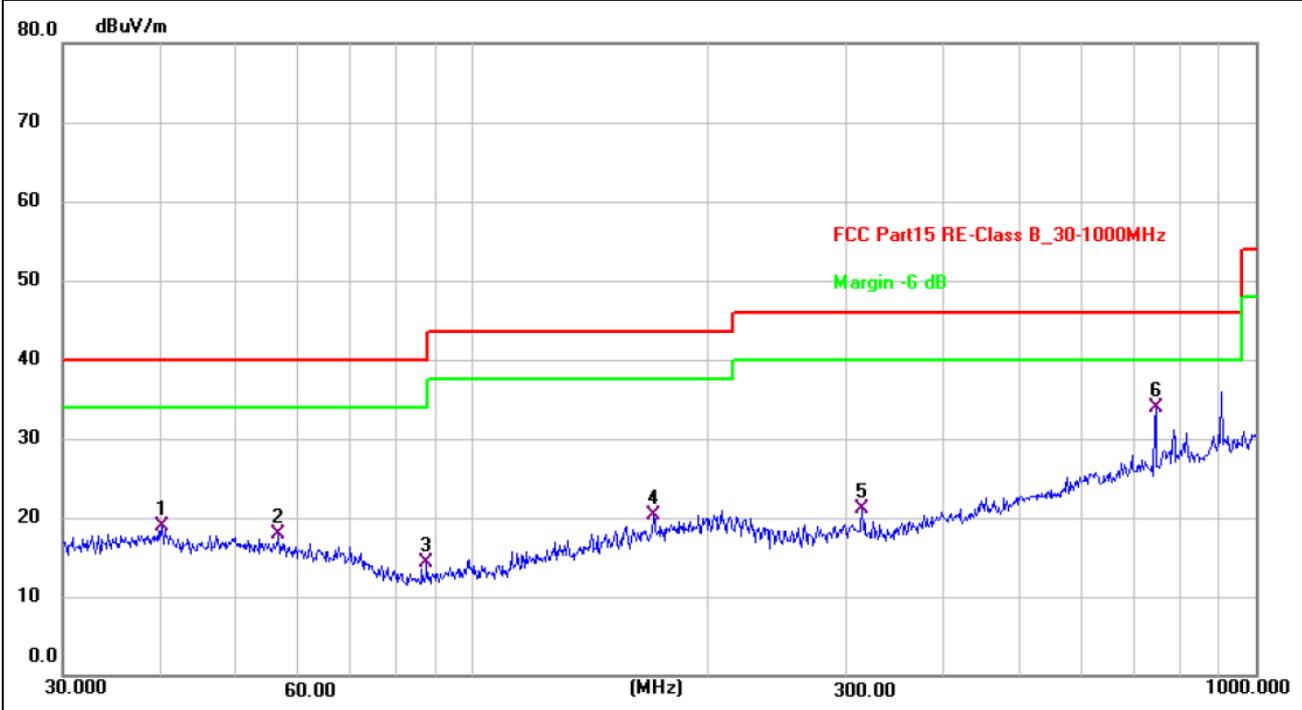

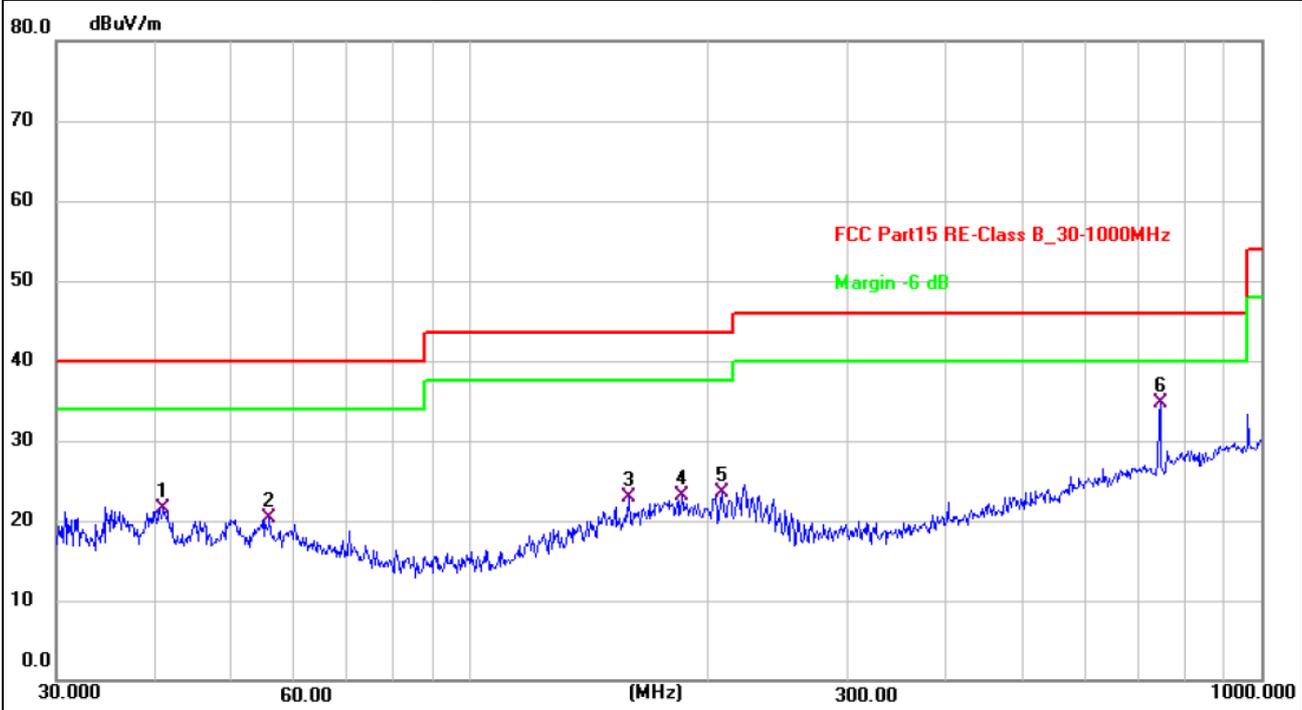

Note 1: this EUT was tested in 3 orthogonal positions and the worst case position data was reported.

Note 2: Testing is carried out with frequency rang 9kHz to the tenth harmonics. The measurements greater than 20dB below the limit from 9kHz to 30MHz.

Note 3: For 9kHz-30MHz, Distance extrapolation factor =  $40 \log(\text{specific distance}/\text{test distance})(\text{dB})$ ;

Limit line = specific limits (dBuV) + distance extrapolation factor.

## 6. Occupied Bandwidth

### 6.1 Standard and Limit

According to 15.215 (c), intentional radiators operating under the alternative provisions to the general emission limits, as contained in §§15.217 through 15.257 and in Subpart E of this part, must be designed to ensure that the 20 dB bandwidth of the emission, or whatever bandwidth may otherwise be specified in the specific rule section under which the equipment operates, is contained within the frequency band designated in the rule section under which the equipment is operated. The requirement to contain the designated bandwidth of the emission within the specified frequency band includes the effects from frequency sweeping, frequency hopping and other modulation techniques that may be employed as well as the frequency stability of the transmitter over expected variations in temperature and supply voltage. If a frequency stability is not specified in the regulations, it is recommended that the fundamental emission be kept within at least the central 80% of the permitted band in order to minimize the possibility of out-of-band operation.

### 6.2 Test Procedure

According to the ANSI 63.10-2013, section 6.9, the emission bandwidth test method as follows.

- 1) Remove the antenna from the EUT and connect to the spectrum analyzer via a low loss RF cable.
- 2) Set the spectrum analyzer to any one measured frequency within its operating range.
- 3) Set RBW = 1% of the 20 dB bandwidth, VBW = RBW.
- 4) Set Sweep = Auto, Detector function = peak, Trace = max hold.
- 5) Set a reference level on the measuring instrument equal to the highest peak value.
- 6) Measure the frequency difference of two frequencies that were attenuated 20dB from the reference level.

Record the frequency difference as the emission bandwidth.

All the trace to stabilize, use the marker-to-peak function to set the marker to the peak of the emission, use the marker-delta function to measure and record the 20dB down and 99% bandwidth of the emission.

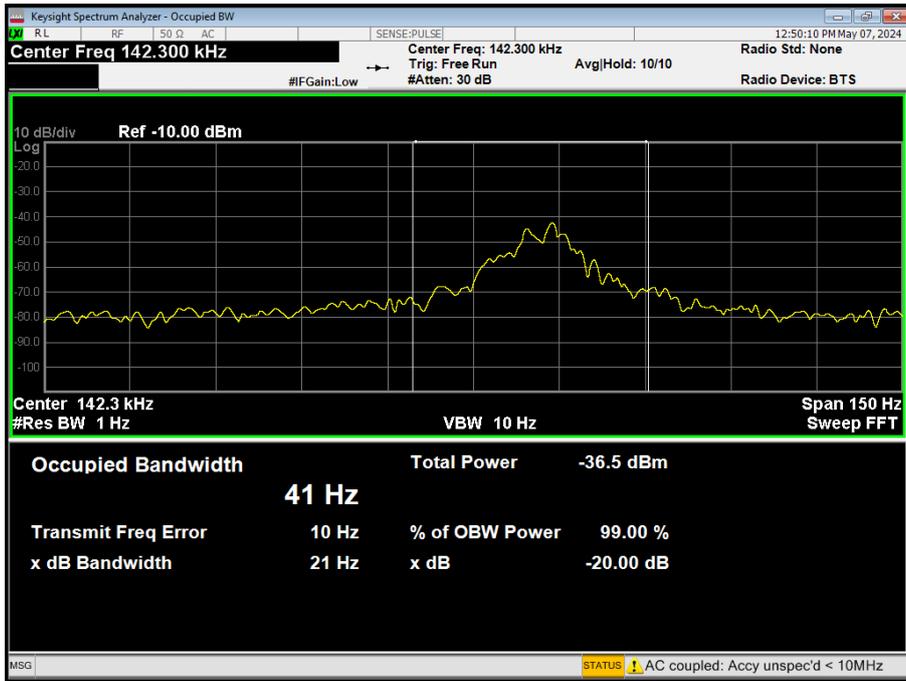


Test Setup Block Diagram
